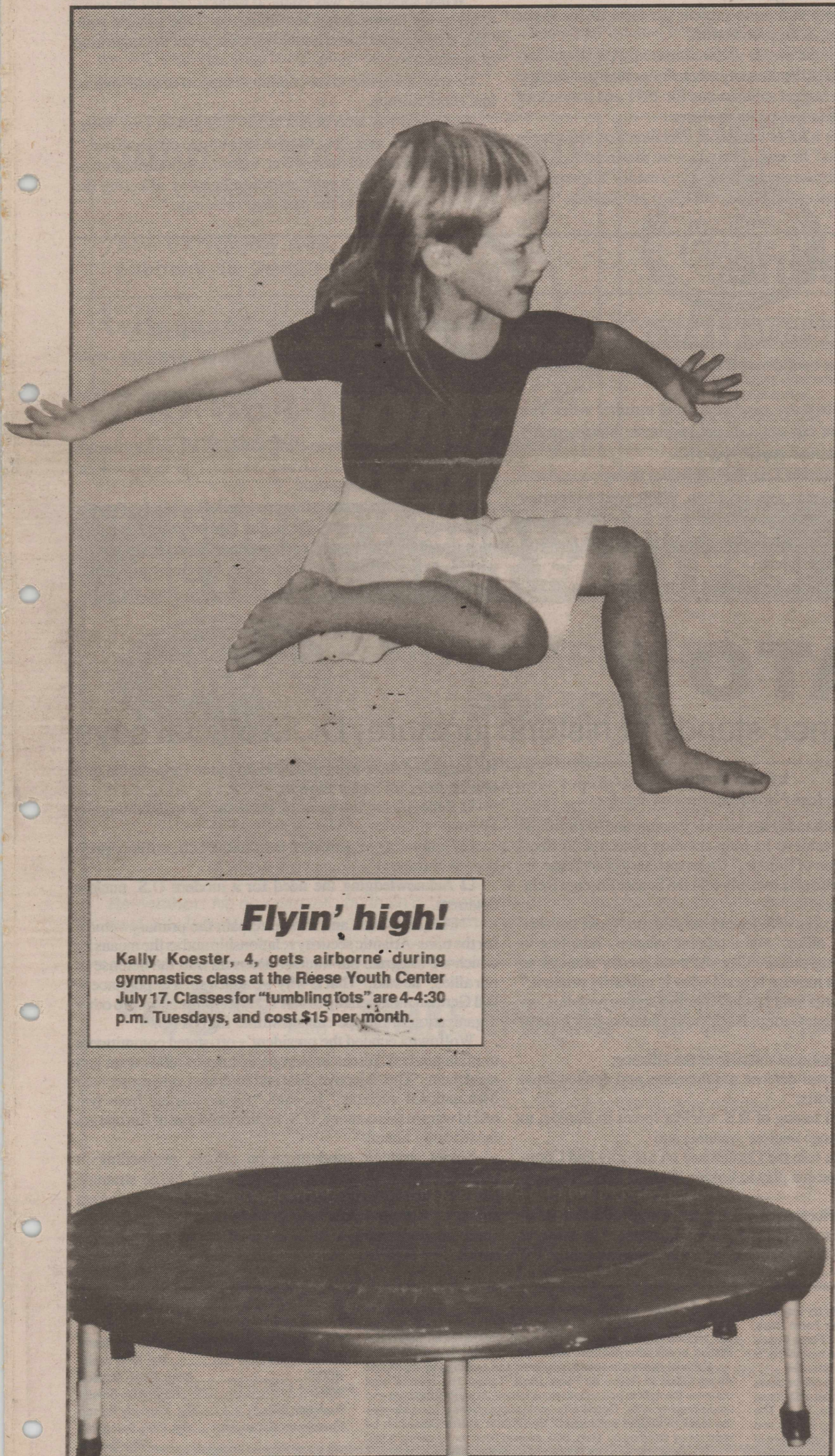

Getting DOWN

T-37 success with timeline earns day off for two units

Once again, T-37 squadron members "take a back seat to no one."

Wing members will not see any airborne Reese T-37s today (except for cross country launches) as aircraft and crews are given a day off for their efforts to exceed the Reese timeline.

As of Monday, the two T-37 squadrons totaled 5.7 days, or about 570 sorties, ahead of Reese's proposed flying timeline. "That's 2.5 days, or 250 sorties, ahead of last year's flying," said Lt. Col. Bo McRee, 35th Flying Training Squadron commander.

"Although there were many reasons for why we are ahead, the main factor was the unusually good weather," said Lt. Col. Billy Hill, 33rd FTS commander. "During June, we encountered about a 10-day period of light winds and clear skies that enabled the jets to be flown from sunup to sundown.

"The maintainers' efforts and quick turn-around of jets combined with the timely scheduling by wing and squadron schedulers enabled more flying to be performed. Those

factors added to the weather and the sustained high amount of flying by instructor pilots was what brought the flying so far ahead."

Not only did the increased amount of flying aid the timeline, it also helped the students by getting them into the air almost daily. The students' flying hours weren't increased — the schedules were just restructured so each student was flying about four times a week.

"By flying daily, the students become more confident and perform better, therefore reducing the need to redo sorties or check rides," said Colonel Hill.

"Other benefits of being ahead is that our crews don't have to fly on the weekends and the average duty day can tend to be a little shorter," added Colonel McRee. "The time down also provides some breathing room for the maintainers to prepare the fleet for next week's launches.

Both squadron commanders hope to maintain their current timeline standing through mid-October, when the weather starts its winter change and daylight hours shorten.

"Although, if we have more days like Monday (with a thick fog) we won't necessarily be behind but we could be set back," pointed out

MAJCOMs which will be on

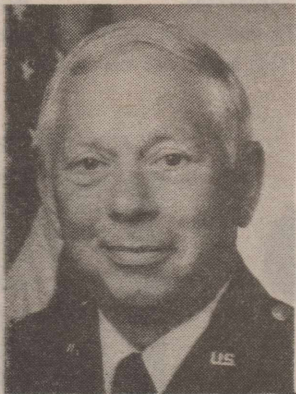

New Air Force chief of staff looks at coming challenges

Four years worth of peace and stability, that is what the new chief of staff of the Air Force hopes to accomplish during his tenure.

Gen. Michael J. Dugan was sworn in as the chief of staff of the Air Force June 29.

"I've inherited, clearly, the best Air Force in the world," General Dugan said. "And my biggest challenge is to see that four years from now, when my term of office is up, my successor inherits the best Air Force in the world."

The 13th chief of staff said his role will differ somewhat in character from his last assignment as U.S. Air Forces in Europe commander in chief.

"My role on behalf of the people of the Air Force is to interface with the political environment in Washington, and to interface with the joint environment in the Joint Chiefs of Staff process," General Dugan said.

A top priority will be to present the facts to Air Force people early on, as they are known.

"I witnessed the events at Zweibrucken (AB, West Germany) very closely last January when the secretary of defense announced the budget submissions for 1991 and announced that Zweibrucken was going to close.

"There were a lot of rumors at Zweibrucken and people were concerned," he said. "People were disturbed."

When the closure announcement was made, "80 percent of the concern went away; 80 percent of the people said, 'Well,

I'm going to be PCS'd before then anyway,'" General Dugan said. "The other 20 percent said, largely, 'I can deal with this. Individually and organizationally, I can plan with that information.'

"Air Force people are pretty shrewd," he said. "If they have the facts, they can start making plans on how to deal with personal problems, organizational problems and operational problems.

"One of my first efforts (as chief of staff) will be to see that we get the facts out to the troops as early as we can, and that they get to deal with the same facts and the same knowledge the policy makers are working with in Washington."

To make sure the important news gets to the Air Force audience, General Dugan plans to take full advantage of public affairs activities.

As USAFE commander in chief, General Dugan issued a series of messages, called "The Latest Word," to get important news out to the field.

"When something was going to happen, we got the latest word to the troops today, not tomorrow," the general said. "We'll look for the same kind of process, if not the same kind of vehicle here."

He would also like to see continued support of the activities in Central Europe.

The world has seen democracies established over there, General Dugan said, "but they're still fragile democracies."

"The Air Force's contribution, indeed, the contribution of all the U.S. military forces, was significant in affecting the changes we've seen in the past year in Europe."

NATO

Alliance stands at historic juncture, DOD official says

"NATO stands today at a historic juncture and has a unique opportunity to achieve its long-standing objective to overcome the division of Europe," Undersecretary of Defense for Policy Paul Wolfowitz recently told the Senate Foreign Relations Committee.

NATO's success will depend, he said, on "close collaboration with our allies...and a careful balance—adapting to change and being prepared for the even greater changes to come, while not moving beyond what is militarily prudent."

Mr. Wolfowitz said a wide-ranging strategy review ordered by President George Bush would address four critical issues:

- A future political mission of the alliance;
- Conventional defense requirements and conventional arms control efforts;
- Continued basing of U.S. nuclear forces in Europe, to include short-range nuclear systems; and
- The future role the Conference on Security and Cooperation in Europe can play in linking Warsaw Pact nations to the West.

Mr. Wolfowitz said alliance leaders must maintain military capability, respond to Warsaw Pact changes to date and consider where NATO should be when changes occur.

He suggested three principles should guide formulation of a new strategy for a new Europe:

- Recognizing the bedrock necessity of maintaining the alliance
- Continuing to provide a substantial U.S. military presence in Europe
- Acknowledging the need for a modern U.S. nuclear deterrent.

"NATO has been and should remain the primary vehicle for the trans-Atlantic security relationship and as the means by which we integrate our nuclear deterrent into the defense of our allies," he said. "That is why we attach such importance to full German membership in NATO after unification. No other organization in Europe can substitute for NATO."

Wolfowitz echoed the president's oft-stated commitment to maintain U.S. forces in Europe as long as allies want and need them. "The objective, first and foremost, is to protect our own national interests," he said. "As we learned from two world wars in this century, U.S. security and that of Europe are inextricably linked."

Soviet strategic modernization efforts, proceeding at unabated speed, must be matched, he said. "U.S. strategic nuclear forces provide the backbone of NATO's deterrent strategy. Nuclear forces help provide insurance against the unanticipated changes or a reversal of today's positive trends."

WIC

Nutrition program moving to
Family Support Center

The Women, Infants, Children Program will move into the Reese Family Support Center, Bldg. 310, Aug. 6.

The program has been operating in Bldg. 75 and has been very beneficial for base people. This is a good time to explain the WIC program, since some people may not fully understand it.

WIC is a health program that teaches people about good nutrition and provides nutritious foods to supplement diets. Infants get 31 cans of formula, infant cereal after four months and juice after six months. Women and children get milk, cheese, cereal, eggs, juice and dried beans, and sometimes peanut butter is given.

The value of the food is about \$40-\$60 per month.

Who is eligible for WIC? Women who are pregnant, post partum or breast feeding. Children under the age of 5 and most infants qualify.

How is eligibility determined? WIC requires written proof of income for everyone living in the household regardless of whether or not they are related to the applicant or provide financial support. Written proof is required showing that the applicant lives in Lubbock county. Proof can be utility bills, phone bill, and so on.

Normally, E-4 and below will qualify. A current leave and earning statement is required. Off-base housing allowance is not counted as income, but everything else is. An example of an eligible family would be a family of four making less than \$23,495 annually. Participation in WIC is free. You do not pay anything.

On the first visit, it will take about one to two hours to process your case. This includes a clerk gathering information about income, household and client's diet, as well as some other paperwork. Then the WIC nurse will check growth and blood iron. Next, a nutritionist reviews these

results and explains them to you.

From then on, you will come every other month to attend a nutrition education class and to receive your food cards. This will take about one hour. Every six months, a longer appointment is necessary to check income, residence, diet and nutritional status to see if you or your child can continue in the WIC program.

Infants stay on WIC until they are 1. WIC doesn't affect food stamp recipients or benefits of any other program. Citizenship is not a requirement for WIC—people from other countries may qualify. Proof of social security numbers for every person over the age of 14 living in the household is required.

If you are interested in participating in the WIC program and would like more information about how to apply, you can go to the Lubbock Children's Health Clinic at 102 Ave. J, 8 - 11 a.m., Monday through Friday. You may also call WIC at 763-5906 and ask to speak to Judy Bradley, who is responsible for the WIC program at Reese. She currently comes out to Reese once a month to administer the program.


WIC is funded by the U.S. Department of Agriculture, administered by the Texas Department of Health, and managed locally by the Lubbock Children's Health Clinic. WIC is an equal opportunity program. 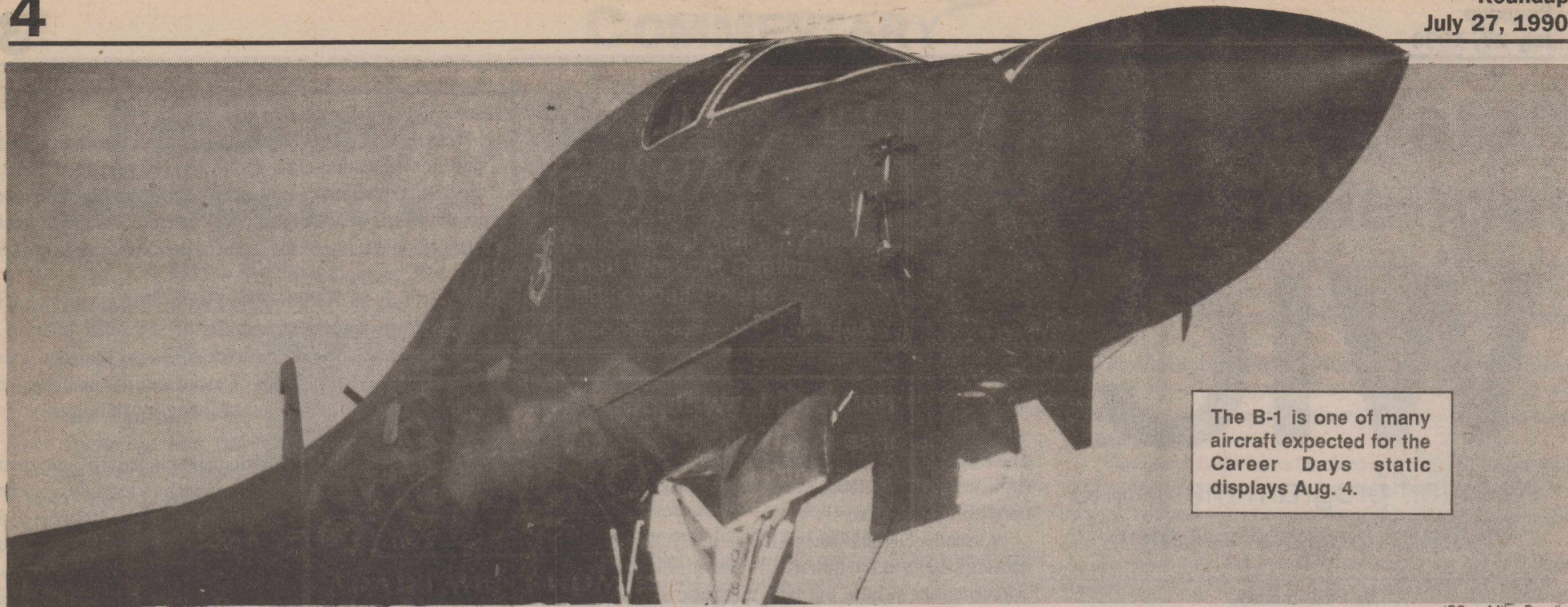

hand include Air Training Command, Tactical Air Command, Strategic Air Command and Military Airlift Command. In addition, a team will be here from Holloman AFB, N.M., to brief students on fighter lead-in training.

Penny for your thoughts?

MSS officer turns idea into cash

A penny for your thoughts. How about \$1,300 for a suggestion?

That's exactly what happened to 1st Lt. Nancy Dye. The 64th Mission Support Squadron member earned \$1,300 for a suggestion she made on the Fast Payback Capital Investment Program.

"We had a GS (General Schedule)-5 position in our office which hadn't been filled in several years," said the assistant chief of the Reese Military Personnel Office. "I suggested that the slot be 'killed,' and in return, the base got funding for six new computers."

The computers are being used by the Morale, Welfare and Recreation Division. In addition to

the advantages the computers provide to MWR, the change will save the Air Force \$22,000 over the first year of implementation.

Lieutenant Dye's award wasn't quick in coming. When she was notified of the award in June, it was two years since she first put in the suggestion.

"When I first put the suggestion together, there was a lot of paperwork and research involved," said the lieutenant. "The suggestion went into all the details involved in the change, such as the cost of operating the computers (vs. the cost of funding a GS-5 position). It was a real complicated formula.

As for the \$1,300, Lieutenant Dye said she plans to put it in savings for the time being.

SUGGESTIONS FOR PREPARATION OF LUNCHES

1. Freeze a small can of juice and pack it with your lunch. As it thaws, it will keep everything cool.
2. Use a hearty, satisfying bread, like whole wheat, pumpernickle, oatmeal or rye. For variety, try buns, bagels or pita bread.
3. Freeze sandwiches for the week. Frozen sandwiches save last minute preparation and stay safe longer in hot weather. Meat, chicken, turkey and peanut butter freeze well. Mayonnaise does not freeze.
4. Wrap vegetables like lettuce and tomatoes separately in a baggie. They will stay fresher and won't make your sandwich soggy. You can add them just before eating.
5. Meat sliced thin and stacked is easier to bite than one thick slice on a sandwich.
6. Spread margarine or mayonnaise to the edge of the slice of bread so the moist filling won't make the bread soggy.
7. Score an orange and wrap in clear plastic to make peeling easier.
8. Cut sandwiches in quarters, they are easier to eat.
