Air Force 'goes plastic'

Some Air Force travelers will soon be able to use government-issued charge cards when traveling for official business.

Officers, master through chief master sergeants and civilians holding grade scale 9 and above, who are likely to travel more than twice a year, are eligible for Diners Club credit cards. Other Air Force employees may be included in the program at the discretion of their unit commander.

The program starts April 1 at Reese. The Air Force program started Jan. 1 and should be in full swing by June. Policies outlining specific procedures are still being finalized.

The deputy secretary of defense directed that eligible Air Force travelers be offered the charge card to both improve the federal government's cash management program and minimize the cash advanced to government travelers without causing a personal financial burden.

Card use is restricted to buying items or services needed for official travel, such as commercial lodging, rental cars and registration fees. It can't be used for commercial transportation unless a traffic management office is not available.

The Air Force is in the process of getting base billeting and morale, welfare and recreation facilities to accept the card. Officials in the Reese Accounting and Finance Office say these facilities are expected to start accepting the card in the fall.

Benefits to card users include no interest or late charges and no foreign currency conversion fees. The card also offers personal check-cashing

SP gets 'in STEP'

Kennel master earns sixth stripe

The 64th Security Police Squadron's kennel master, MSgt. Scott Towe, was presented master sergeant stripes Tuesday through the Stripes for Exceptional Performers Program.

Sergeant Towe has helped to educate youths of all ages through his drug detection demonstrations and anti-drug briefings.

His knowledge and experience of working with the military working dog enabled him to design a MWD summary and validation report computer program.

According to Capt. Danny Thomas, SPS commander, Sergeant Towe's program has been adopted for use throughout Air Training Command.

Sergeant Towe is also the Reese narcotics custodian responsible for maintaining training aids, such as heroin, cocaine, hashish and marijuana, valued at more than \$16,000. He uses these drugs to acquaint the MWDs with various narcotic scents.

Sergeant Towe assisted the Wilson and Tahoka County Police Departments in developing drug dog programs. Both Texas law enforcement agencies have attributed successful drug busts to the sergeant's program.

Sergeant Towe also manages the squadron's 21 micro-computers. He initiated and continues to maintain the SP's electronic

bulletin board system, which is used for electronic mail, data files and program transfers. In addition, he provides the computer security training for squadron members.

He has assisted several wing units with their computer management, to include providing mishap boards with computer support and programming the 64th Supply Squadron

commander's computer with system security. "Sergeant Towe is very professional in everything he does, and his promotion selection proves it," Captain Thomas commented.

With 124 credits and a Community College of the Air Force degree in criminal justice, Sergeant Towe is striving towards completion of a bachelor of science degree.

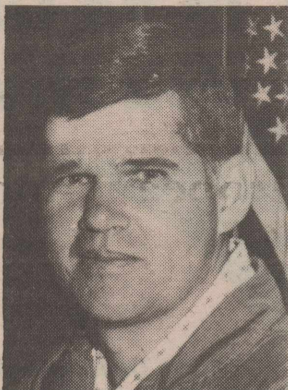

Captain Habig was recently selected for the Air Force Test Pilot School and has performed superbly in a variety of key positions at Reese. Before moving up to Standardization/Evaluation, he was the Student Branch Side Chief and a seasoned class commander. Most important, he has been a superbly skilled instructor pilot, using his extensive knowledge as an experienced F-16 fighter pilot to good use on our flightline. He, and his wife Betty Ann, have been great supporters of the Reese community and involved in many activities.

Another standout performer is Capt. Kathy Doby, our Wing IP of the Year. She will be at Randolph Saturday night at the "Tops in Ops" banquet as our candidate for ATC's best. A flight commander in the 54th FTS, Capt Doby came to us from the Strategic Air Command tanker force and quickly became a stellar performer as a T-38 IP. The best thing about this recognition for our top performers is that as good as they are, the competition for these awards was extremely keen. You see, we have many standout performers in our three flying squadrons whose accomplishments should be a source of great pride for all of us in the 64 FTW. As commander, I depend daily on the skill and dedication of my IPs, who are the "heart and soul" of our flying training mission. As a group, they are eager, talented and devoted to our goal of producing the world's best military pilots. Because of them, Reese sets high standards in the pilot training business.

Many people don't realize the scope of our operation here. We routinely fly over 300 sorties a day out of Reese—more flights than a fighter wing would fly in its entire ORI. It's not an easy job. There's constant pressure and you're constantly under the spotlight when your student is performing in the pattern. And the days are long, averaging almost eleven hours every duty day. Not quite the "silk-scarf" image we have of the pilots' lives, but our instructors love the challenge and get great satisfaction seeing their students develop into skilled Air Force pilots.

So when we see a Kathy Doby or Chris Habig recognized as outstanding performers, we can really take note. They're moving in pretty good company. Reese IPs are known throughout the command for their professionalism and attitude. We should all be proud of the way they conduct their business for the 64 FTW.

'Not one step back'

Reese IM aims to serve wing's computer needs

"Not One Step Back in Office Automation and Customer Service" is the Reese Information Management Branch's theme for this year. As chief of information management, I have instructed each of my branches to find more efficient ways of doing business, utilizing the computer equipment.

As budget cuts mean being resourceful, it's important for everyone to realize the value of automation in the office environment. Today's office requires that we all have some working knowledge of computers and that we can apply that knowledge to improve both information and work flow.

Information management has taken the first steps to ensure a better trained and more knowledgeable work force at Reese.

One of the best and least expensive sources of assistance and knowledge is often those around us. With this in mind, we've established a computer users group that is open to everyone here. Through group meetings, we've discovered we have several "computer hackers" with a wide variety of software/hardware experience.

This valuable knowledge is just waiting to be tapped. The group meets once a month and meetings are announced in the base bulletin and newspaper. Courses in programs such as DOS (disk operating system), Enable, DBASE, Wordstar and PCTOOLS are on the horizon.

We realize that a wide variety of computer systems and

software exists wing-wide, but we have to limit the courses in which we provide training. However, we are receptive to suggested courses and will do our best to meet your needs or requests.

Also, we are in the process of acquiring additional computer equipment to establish an office automation center. The center will be for general base use and will provide a variety of database, graphic, spreadsheet and word processing software. The equipment itself will include personal computers, laser printer, plotter and optical character reader.

This center will be a great asset, but only to the extent of our knowledge and ability to apply the technology to our daily jobs. That's where you come in.

Wing members must perform at their best and contribute while meeting mission requirements. Besides the training and equipment to be provided by information management, additional courses in computer technology, computer programming and office automation are available through the Reese Education Center. They are available to the entire Reese community so we strongly encourage everyone to enroll in them.

Since we now live in an information-based society, there will be a greater need for people to receive information management training. We can assist you in meeting your training needs. For more information, contact the plans and programs branch at 3437.

Support of Catholic mission

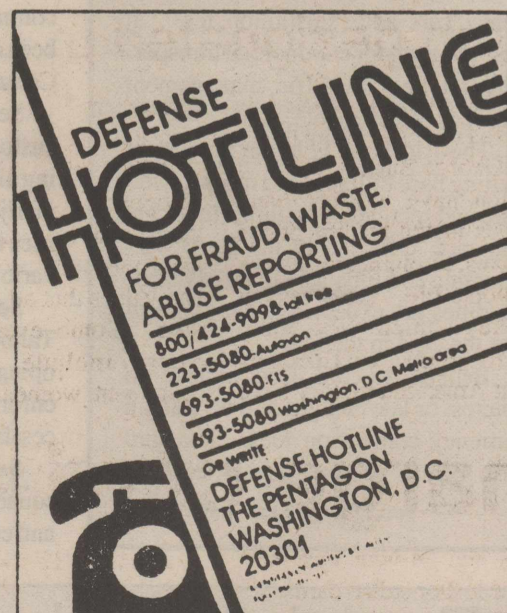
I've received many words of praise concerning the recent Catholic mission and the associated visit by Father Jim Becherer, the guest speaker at our National Prayer Luncheon.

Death on Wheels

Two-wheel fun can lead to grim fate

It's 3 p.m. Bill Scofield is riding his motorcycle down Fourth Street.

The wind whips his hair back off his forehead. He notices the warmth of the sun and hopes that the ride will help put a little color on his legs.

As he passes Frankford Avenue, he revs the engine, thinking to himself how much he enjoys riding.

It's now 5 p.m. Mary Scofield is driving down Fourth Street.

As she drives along, the wind blows her hair back off her shoulders. She notices how her vision is blurring slightly from the tears welling in her eyes.

Thirty minutes earlier, she identified her husband's body — what was left of it, anyway. He had lost control of his motorcycle after hitting a patch of gravel during a turn. His exposed legs were cut to ribbons as he skidded 20 feet with the bike on top of him.

He might have survived that injury, though. He might have survived the broken bones and internal injuries as well. What did him in was the curb that stopped his slide — when it suddenly impacted with his unprotected head.

As tragic as the above may seem, it's not uncommon. And according to Reese safety officials, we're approaching the time of year when such incidents are more likely to occur.

"With spring getting near, Reese cyclists are going to want to take to the road," said Paul Compton, chief of Reese's Ground Safety Office. "Before they do, there are some things they must do to ensure their safety."

"Our cyclists are required to go through motorcycle safety training. The course, which is conducted downtown, is eight hours for experienced riders and 17 hours for inexperienced riders."

"But I've been riding for years. Why do I have to

go?" you ask.

"I've been riding motorcycles for 30-plus years, and I still was able to learn some things when I attended," said Jon Hataway of ground safety. "The key to the course is practicing afterwards. Inexperienced riders in particular should find an area where they can go afterwards and practice the techniques they've learned."

Aside from the educational benefits of the course, military riders of all street-legal, two-wheel vehicles (other than bicycles and dirt bikes designed only for off-road use) must attend the course if they want to ride on or off base. In addition, any civilians other than contractors must take the course before they can register on base.

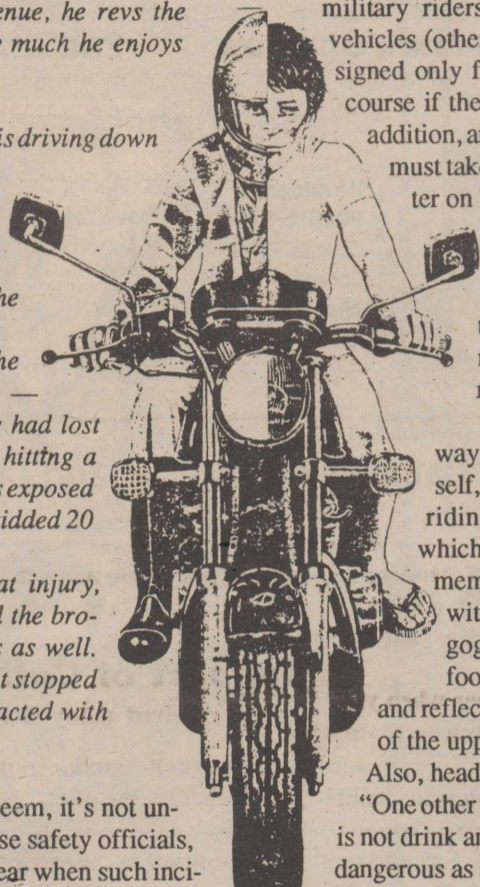
"Once a person takes the course, that doesn't mean they can lend their bike to an untrained driver," Mr. Compton noted. "The course certifies the rider — not the bike."

According to Mr. Hataway, a motorcycling enthusiast himself, there are other requirements for riding on base. The requirements, which also apply off base for military members, are: long trousers, a helmet with a face shield or shatterproof goggles, shoes that cover the entire foot, gloves which cover the palm, and reflective material on the front and back of the upper body (from sunset to sunrise). Also, headlights must always be used.

"One other thing people absolutely have to do is not drink and drive," Mr. Compton said. "As dangerous as alcohol is when driving a car, it's much worse with a two-wheel vehicle. Motorcycles in particular are terribly unforgiving of carelessness."

"Riders must keep in mind is that they have to watch out for the 'other guy' and drive defensively," TSgt. Charles Wagner of safety said. "Ninety-nine percent of all the motorcycle accidents I've investigated have not been the cyclist's fault."

"Unfortunately, almost as many have involved fatalities."

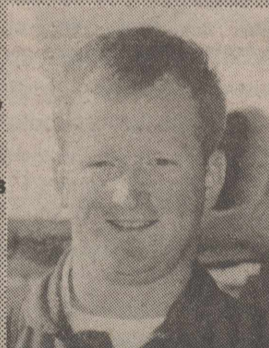



The sky's the limit

Reese IP picked for test pilot school

As Air Force planes would take off and land, 3-year-old Christopher Habig would watch them from his yard, picturing himself in the cockpit.

By the end of this year, Capt. Christopher Habig will be well on his way to becoming an Air Force test pilot. His selection to attend the Air Force Test Pilot School at Edwards AFB, Calif., takes the 41st Flying Training Squadron flight examiner one step closer to his boyhood dream of reaching the stars.

As Christopher grew up, his interest in airplanes and flying also grew. Around age 8,

he dreamed of space and of someday becoming an astronaut for the National Aeronautics and Space Administration.

When he was in ninth grade, Christopher decided he wanted to fly for the Air Force. At 16, he began taking private flying lessons and at 17, he got his civilian pilot license. Upon graduation from high school, Christopher was accepted to the Air Force Academy — one more step in the direction of space exploration.

In 1983, 2nd Lt. Habig began undergraduate pilot training at Sheppard AFB, Texas. A year later he was flying F-16s at Hill AFB, Utah. He flew fighters for three years before becoming a Reese T-37 instructor pilot.

IP cited by Daughters of American Revolution

Capt. Christopher Habig, 41st Flying Training Squadron, was recently selected to receive the Texas Society's Daughters of the American Revolution Armed Services Award.

Captain Habig is recognized as a "professional performer" by the Air Training Command inspector general and everyone who works with him, according to Col. Monroe S. Sams Jr., 64th Flying Training Wing commander.

"His attention to detail and ability to work with others, have made him a successful flight examiner, class commander, T-37 instructor pilot and wing spin pilot," the colonel said.

"He excels in everything he does — from flightline instructing and supervising class commanders to evaluating IPs and standardizing wing programs," he added.

In lieu of his job knowledge, judgement and flying skills, the captain was chosen as a wing spin pilot. In this position, he is responsible for the spin training of more than 100 IPs. Done in a T-37, he goes up with an IP and spends approximately 40 minutes in continual nose-dive spins — designed to familiarize pilots with spinning.

In addition to his daily duties, Captain Habig also acts as a liaison officer for the wing Host Family Program and the Tactical Air Command.

At first, Captain Habig was disappointed with his assignment. He would often ask himself, "How could flying a T-37 compare to the demands of a single-seat fighter?" But once he got to the 41st FTS (then the 64th Student Squadron), he found out just how important it is to be an instructor.

"There's a lot of hard work involved to instruct tomorrow's pilots," said Captain Habig. "Although I would have rather stayed with F-16s, I'm glad I had the opportunity to instruct — I hold a lot of respect for other IPs."

In addition to being a T-37 IP, Captain Habig has also been a class commander, a student branch chief, flight examiner and wing spin pilot. In December, the captain will be leaving Reese to attend the year-long test pilot school. Fulfilling a dream he's had since he became a pilot.

"I believe that it was because of my varied background — in fighters and trainers — that

I was selected to attend this school," Captain Habig commented. Only 25 pilots throughout the Air Force are chosen to attend the school each year.

After graduation, Captain Habig will be testing new and revised aircraft equipment and jets to ensure they meet Air Force standards. "I will test the equipment in all facets of operation. By pre-testing, future pilots can be confident of their aircraft and and concentrate on their primary mission," he added.

According to the information Captain Habig received from previous test pilot students, most of the pilots' testing is performed in the air; ground testing is normally done by equipment engineers. "The description of this job used to be viewed as possessing unknown dangers. With today's technological advancements, the majority of equipment malfunctions and defects can either be detected before they become a threat, or an

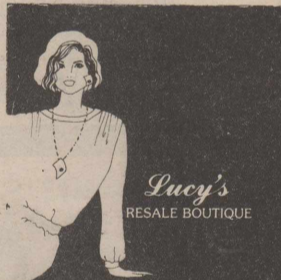

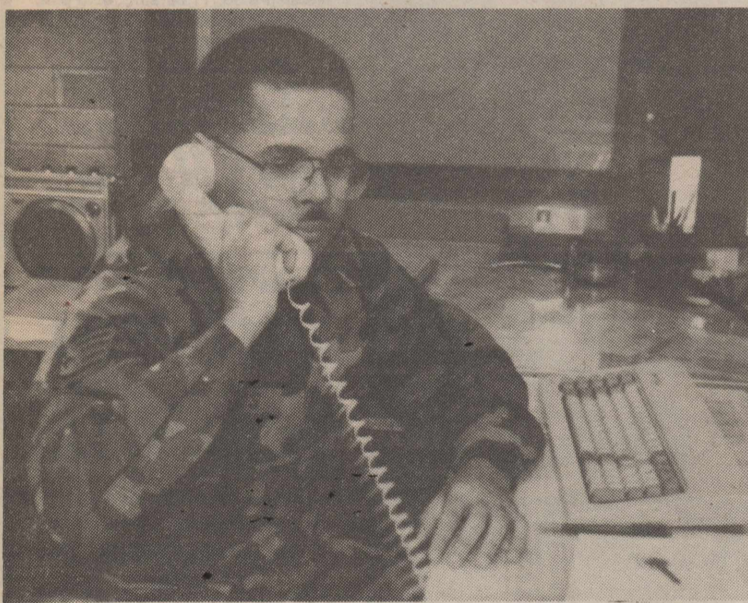

Reese already reaches 50 percent of AFAP goal

Wing members are once again showing their generosity by donating \$10,400 (as of Tuesday) for the 1990 Air Force Assistance Fund Campaign. Barely into the second week of the campaign, Reese people have given 56.4 percent of the \$17,771.00 allotted for the base. Some units have already exceeded their goal by 200 percent.

In past AFAP campaigns, Reese has always exceeded its goal. Last

year, Reese people donated \$24,429 which was 125 percent of the goal. The biggest year for Reese was in 1987 when \$37,184 was raised for 204 percent of the goal. This year seems to be no exception, judging by the early response to the campaign.

Unlike other campaigns, AFAP helps the Reese community directly. Typically the amount that Reese people receive from the Air Force Aid Society, an AFA beneficiary, is three times the amount they contribute. This year, we hope more educational loans/grants will be given to Reese people in addition

to emergency assistance.

The society not only assists people at Reese. Last year after the devastation of Hurricane Hugo, the society gave grants totaling \$114,382 to people at Shaw AFB and Charleston AFB, S.C.

alternate way can be found to bypass the problem," he pointed out.

Prior to his start date, Captain Habig will visit the school for a 10-day evaluation period. During the evaluation, he will be given test flights, most likely in a T-38. "The school likes to see pilots fly something they aren't really familiar with," the T-37 pilot said. "This helps to prepare the students for

their future training." Throughout the school-year, the captain along with the other students will fly approximately 40 different aircraft.

During his evaluation time, the captain will be also allowed to sit in on classes and see what goes on. Afterwards, he has the option to decline his acceptance—"Which I won't," he stated.

After graduation, he will either

stay at Edwards and continue to test the jets or he will move to Eglin AFB, Fla., where he will evaluate weapons systems.

Captain Habig believes that the direction he's been going in may someday get him to the stars. "Maybe after Edwards, I'll go to NASA to be a shuttle pilot," Captain Habig said with a boyish smile.

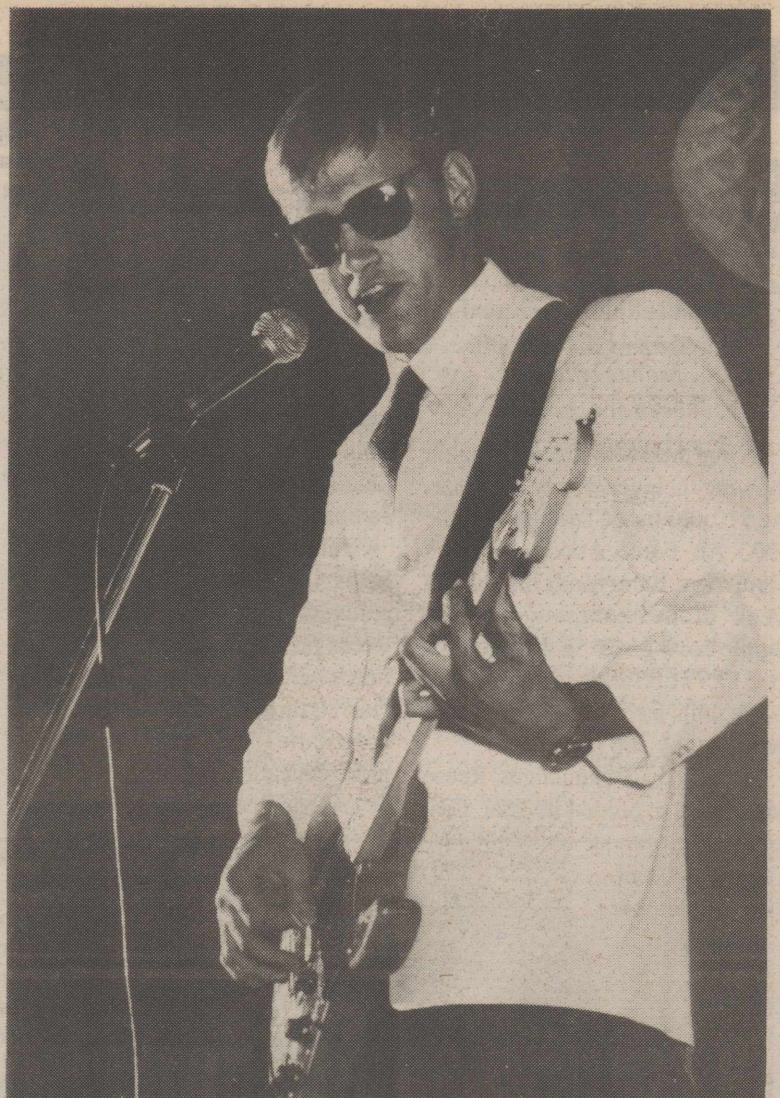

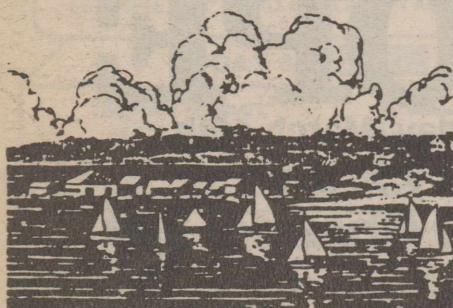

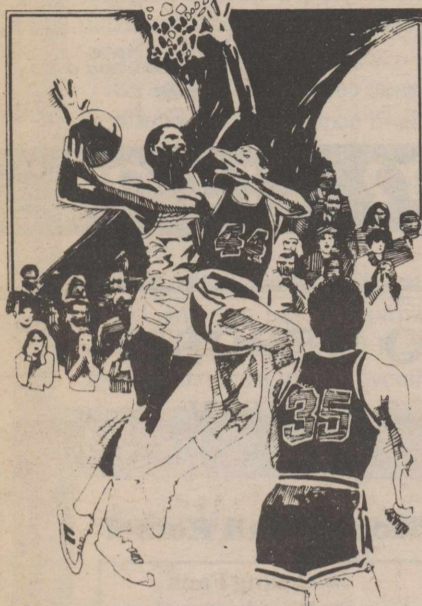
Led by Robby Marr and McGee, the 41st defense tightened and with 9:39 on the clock trailed by only eight points.

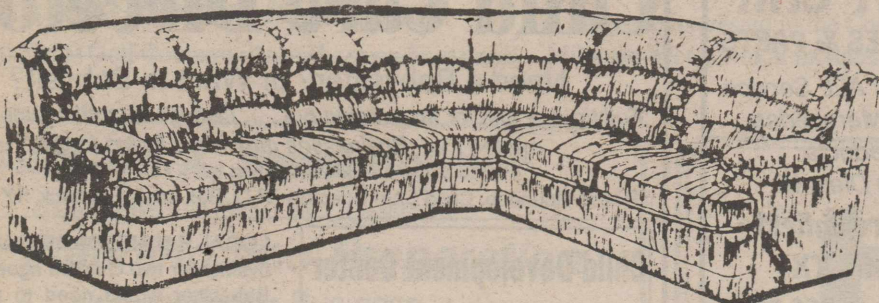
