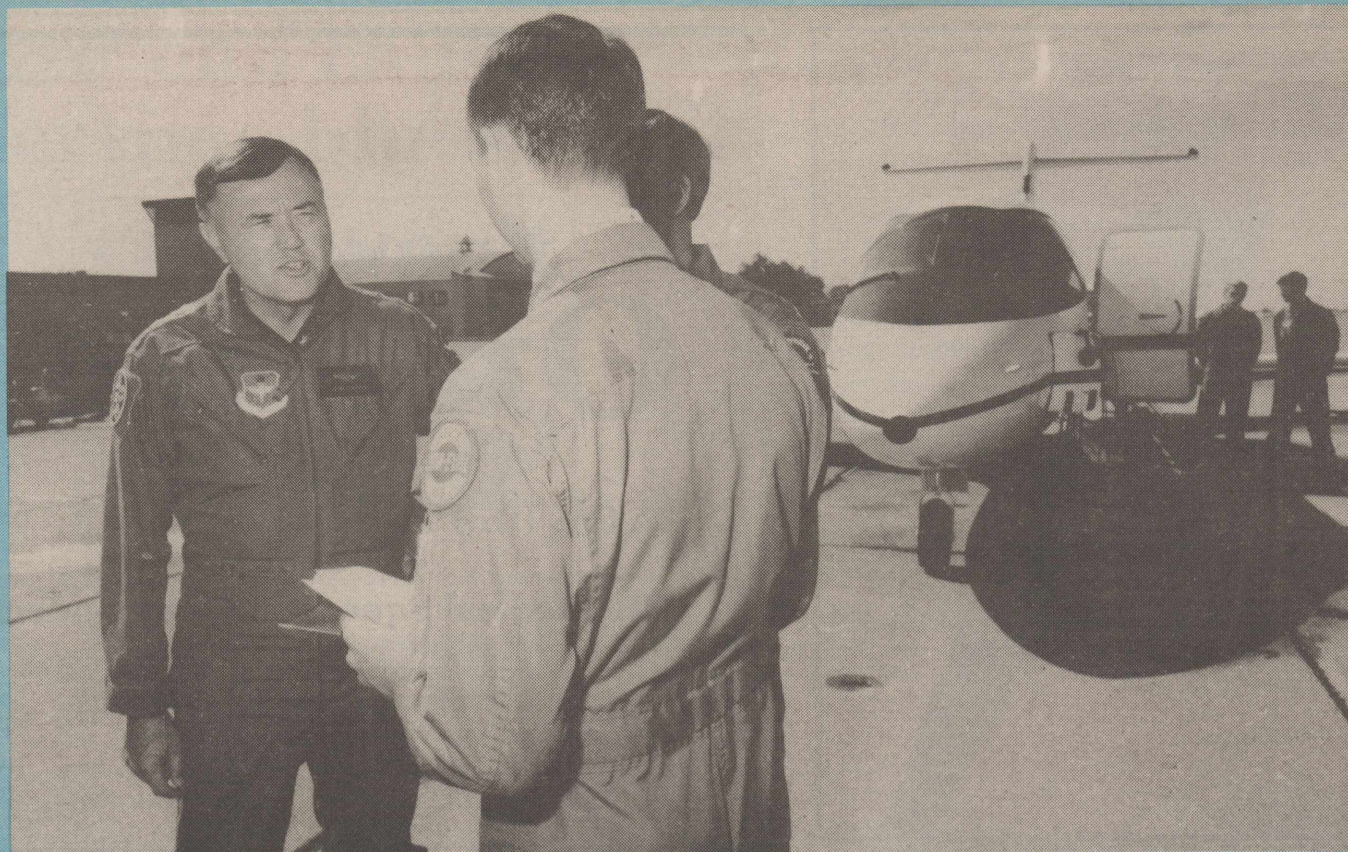

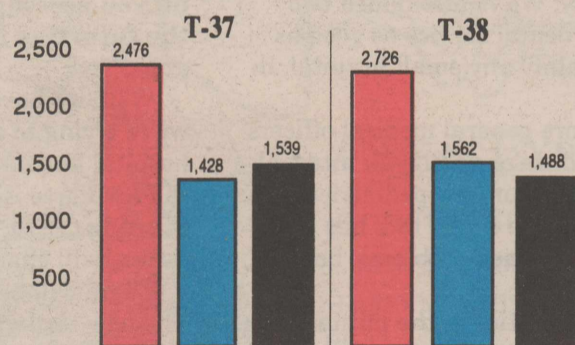

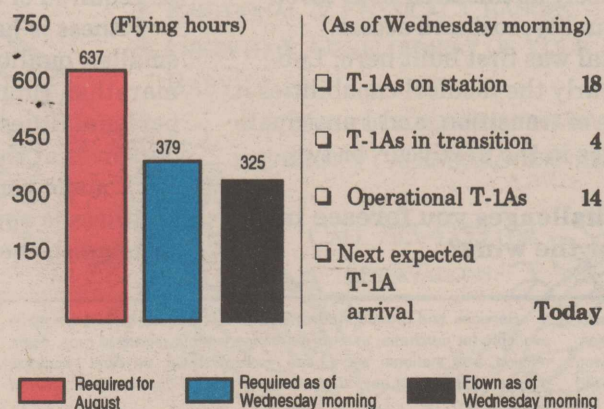

## CES gets new commander

Colonel Korslund bid his fare-

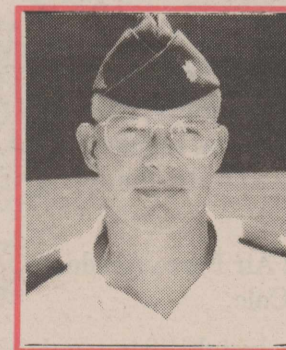
well to the troops with memories of 15 degrees below zero campouts and thanks of support by everyone in civil engineering.

#### What are your impressions of Reese and your squadron since arriving here?

Well, I had envisioned this area as flat, dry and quite hot all the time but have been pleasantly surprised that there is usually a nice breeze blowing. Being a runner, I thought it would be impossible to run during lunch (because of the heat) but it's actually been pleasant.

My impression of the base is that the people here are very friendly and they have a very positive attitude about the hospital. My impression of the hospital staff is that they have been through a bit of a rough period, and are now anxious to get that behind them and improve things. We've made a lot of strides in that regard with our Quality Improvement Program.

# One on one

#### What are some of your goals for the medical squadron?

My short-term goal is to get us ready for our Health Services Inspection in October. We have quite a bit of homework to do before then. I think that this inspection will give us an idea of exactly where we are and what areas we need to improve.

Long term, I'd like to instill in everyone here the desire to improve. There isn't a single area in the hospital that couldn't be doing things better — and that includes my office. I need to set the example. Total quality in the hospital is everyone's responsibility, but it starts with me.

#### What changes or improvements are planned for the hospital?

Well, our new general surgeon just started handling cases recently. We've also added two new dentists; we offer dental service as good as any hospital, and certainly any small hospital, in the Air Force.

We've added two more general medical officers to the staff as well, and we're adding an internal medicine specialist soon. Our new pediatrician, who arrived about the same time I did, has been out for a while with some back problems, but we expect him back shortly.

Like other medical facilities in the military, we will be taking a hard look at what we can do better. Right now, for example, we have 24-hour service through the emergency room. Our command surgeon, Brig. Gen. (Dr.) Paul Carlton, has asked us to look closely at this area with three factors in mind -- quality, cost and access.

When the hospital was first built here, Lubbock didn't have nearly the medical capabilities it has now. It's a time of transition, and I anticipate there will be changes in the next year or two.

#### What are the challenges you foresee in providing care for the wing?

Wow, that's a huge one! I think the challenge for any organization on base, including ourselves, to get into the quality mode of thinking is a huge challenge. In many ways it is different from the military way of thinking. The emphasis is on gradual, substantive improvement from month to month, not doing it in huge increments or in a superficial way.

I think it's important that people buy into the concept, and it's important that these concepts are "packaged" in the right way so that people don't look at change as meaning only cuts in service, but rather changes to improve service.

#### Being an avid runner and a doctor, you obviously are committed to physical fitness. What fitness programs or initiatives do you recommend and what do you see in the future as far as "keeping the force fit" goes?

Well, we have a "wellness" program that we're trying to get off the ground both in the hospital and on base. It fits nicely with where the Air Force is going with its new fitness test. Starting Oct. 1, the way the Air Force measures fitness will change.

There will be no more mile-and-a-half run. The new test will be done on a (stationary) bicycle and take about 20 minutes. It won't be a "gut it out" thing like the run was. This test will measure changes in pulse and determine how fit you are. A minimum level of fitness will be required of everyone.

Fitness is here to stay. It's going to be a smaller, quality force. We don't all have to be marathon runners, but we need to have enough personal fitness and stamina to maintain ourselves at the level the Air Force requires. Each major command will establish what level of fitness is appropriate for its personnel to accomplish the mission.

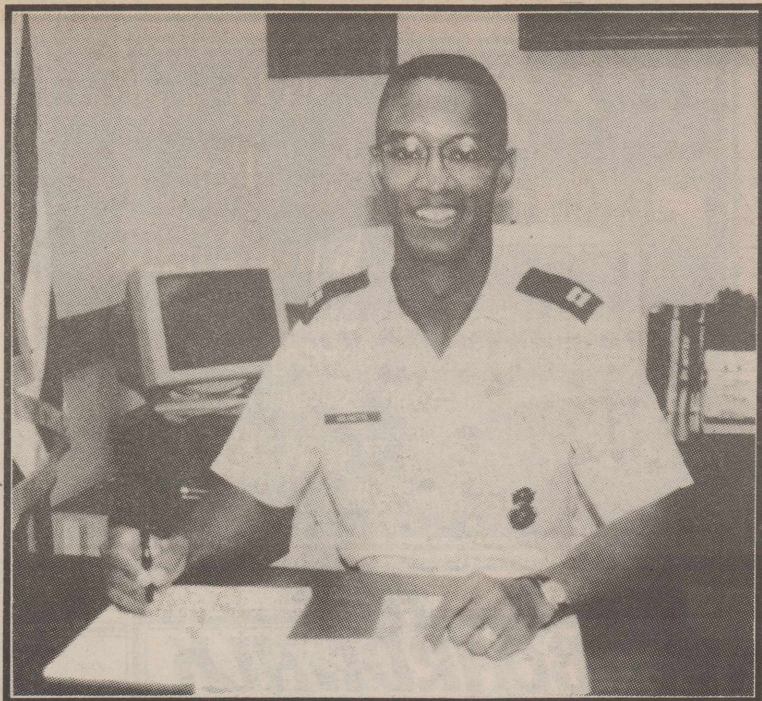

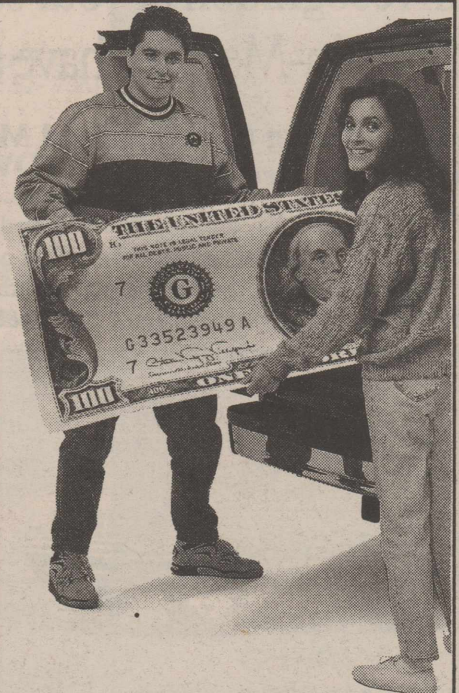
**Captain Jolivette**  
**Chief of base police to attend FBI academy**

Capt. Gerard Jolivette, commander, 64th Security Police Squadron, was recently selected to attend the National FBI Academy. Captain Jolivette is one of only four DOD personnel selected for the academy this year, which will run from Sept. 27 through Dec. 13 at Quantico, Va. Captain Jolivette said the FBI academy selection for a security policeman is similar to a pilot being selected to attend fighter weapons school, and is overwhelmed by the opportunity. "We fight crime the same way they do in the civilian community," he said. "The academy will teach me how things are done in the civilian sector so that I can implement them here at Reese."

The captain assures that he does not plan on becoming an agent, at least not yet. "I've thought about becoming an agent, but my main ambition is to enhance my skills as an Air Force officer," said Captain Jolivette. "What I learn I will bring back and use at Reese and throughout my career."

**CHAMPUS**

Advisor answers questions

As Reese's health benefits advisor, Carolyn Johnson hears a great number of questions about CHAMPUS and other health benefits. Some of the more recent questions are:



Mrs. Johnson

Q: Recently a doctor in Lubbock told me they would file my CHAMPUS claims for me. I assumed this meant he would accept CHAMPUS. Now I find out the doctor won't accept CHAMPUS, and I am being asked to pay him the difference between what he billed and what CHAMPUS allowed. Is he allowed to do this?

A: To answer your question, yes. A doctor can charge you the difference between his billed amount and the CHAMPUS assignment.

age of the allowable, and the patient is always responsible for a cost share.

Q: I went to the emergency room for treatment of a cold. I had to wait over an hour because the doctor was called for an emergency. I should have been seen sooner, since I am active duty.

A: Emergency care always takes precedence over all other care even when the patient needing non-urgent care is active duty. In your case, perhaps it would have been faster to call the central appointment staff at 3245 for a scheduled appointment or attend sick call held 7:30 to 8:30 a.m. weekdays. Remember if you cannot keep an appointment, please call 3245 to cancel.

This is confusing for most patients.

The correct "words" to ask your doctor is "Do you accept CHAMPUS assignment?" If your doctor does accept, this means he will accept the CHAMPUS allowable as full payment. Keep in mind CHAMPUS still only pays a percent-

bowling balls being dropped on them."

"In addition to the money that will be saved on maintenance, there are a lot of advantages to the new equipment that we don't even know about yet," she said. "Right now, we're just going to break it in."

"I think the new lanes are excellent," said Katrina Robinson of Lockheed. "They are a lot smoother than before. I think that these lanes will be a lot more consistent."

Gary Hamilton of Lockheed thinks the installers and bowling center staff have done a great job on the equipment.

"This is some quality equipment. The prices and equipment at downtown bowling lanes can't even compete with this," said Mr. Hamilton. "These people should be commended."

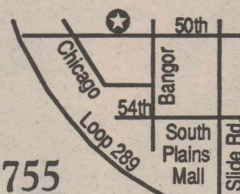
