

# Team spirit key element at Top Flight

"Team spirit" was the overwhelming feeling that wing members had in their minds following Top Flight III May 7-8 at Randolph AFB, Texas.

The two-day competition tested the command's UPT wings in flying and maintenance capability. The Reese team consisted of two four-person teams of instructor pilots and two five-person maintenance teams. Representing Reese at the competition were "D" flight of the 35th Flying Training Squadron and "F" flight of the 54th FTS, along with T-37 and T-38 team leaders and crew chiefs from Lockheed.

The 18 competitors from Reese were part of a wingwide effort, as numerous wing members had a hand in the team's performance at the competition. One area where this was especially true was in preparing the jets for the competition. ATC officials choose the jets that each wing uses several days before Top Flight, so last-minute preparations can make a big difference at the competition.

T.O. Hilley, maintenance operations manager, said that virtually every shop in Lockheed contributed to making the jets ready for the event. He added besides the "round-the-clock" effort by Lockheed, there was one maintenance program that also played a big role.

"Our ongoing cockpit rehabilitation

History says that 40 Air Force members will die in offduty mishaps May 30 through Sept. 7, the 101 critical days. Most deaths will be traffic-related mishaps while drowning makes up



the next largest group. Last year at Reese we had only one reportable water-related mishap. This is the time we all need to work to continue our great safety record from 1991.

Everyone's job

Safety is not just the job of commanders and safety representatives—it's an "attitude" which needs to be adopted by each and every member of the wing. Everyone can keep an eye open for potential problems. If you have a friend with a bad traffic record, safety violations, domestic disputes, health problems, poor work performance or other problems, you may be looking at someone who is likely to use poor judgment or demonstrate lack of self-discipline where safety is concerned. There are many people who are ready to help members with their problems, such as chaplains, social actions or the family support center. Remember, it's everyone's job to prevent mishaps from occurring.

There are many things that increase the

hazard potential for this period.

Increased retirements and separations during this summer will cause an increase in the number of parties. Problems show up as a result of poor party planning in these situations. Everyone needs to consider ways to control alcohol and get everyone home safely after the party. Remember, you are a better friend if you take the keys away instead of letting someone drive drunk.

### Water activities

Water activities also require forethought and planning to avoid tragedies. Using common sense will improve your chances. Always swim with a partner. Know your own abilities as well as your partner's. Know the area where you are swimming or skiing. Fatigue and alcohol increase the likelihood of accidents. Be smart and be careful.

Long distance driving is also a killer. Fatigue, complacency, speeding and not wearing seatbelts can cause tragic accidents. Plan trips early for any long weekends, moves, TDYs, leaves or extended drives. You need to include time for rest stops, preparing maps and checking road conditions before your departure. Take your pre-departure safety brief seriously. It could remind you of something you've forgotten.

With the increased use of bicycles, bicycling mishaps have also increased — particularly head injuries. Follow the rules of the road and consider wearing a helmet at all times - even if you're just riding around the neighborhood.

Once again, safety is everyone's responsibility. It is especially the responsibility of the individual to act in a reasonable manner to prevent tragedy.

Let's all work together to enjoy the summer and be safe.

# Sergeant Glenn earns ATC recognition

As a former wing NCO of the year, SSgt. Aliane Glenn knows all about projecting a good image. In fact, the image she projects has, in a manner of speaking, been noticed more than 400 miles away.

Sergeant Glenn is one of two people chosen by ATC to represent the command in the National Image Inc. Meritorious Service Award competition. The award is presented annually to the enlisted person and officer who promote civil human rights, race and human relations, equal opportunity and public service programs.

Sergeant Glenn, NCO in charge of equal opportunity treatment and human relations education, said promoting good relations between people depends largely on "communication."

"People have to keep the lines of communication open; they need to let people know how they feel," the Detroit native said. "If they don't speak up about a problem, then

they're part of the problem."

Some of Sergeant Glenn's work that prompted her selection by ATC included presenting briefings to more than 700 people on base as well as to off-base agencies that requested her assistance; her "out and about" program whereby she keeps in close contact with base people and tries to prevent problems before they start; her staff assistance visits to wing units; and talks with 200 school-age children. She places special emphasis on the children.

"They're our future," she said.
"We have to teach them the importance of getting along with each other."

Although this recognition comes from ATC, the eight-year service veteran's efforts don't go unnoticed at the local level.

"Sergeant Glenn has well earned this recognition," said Capt. Kathleen Post, chief of social actions. "She's an outstanding professional and individual. We at social actions are extremely proud of her."





General McPeak ...says morale "very good"

# Chief of staff says members holding up well

At a time when the Air Force is facing one of the biggest drawdowns in its history, the Air Force chief of staff publicly stated that he is very proud of the way people have responded to manpower cuts.

During a televised interview May 5, Gen. Merrill A. McPeak said despite thecutbacks, the Air Force still has very good morale. "People still walk with a spring in their step, and that's the kind of Air Force you've got."

Asked if it's hard to maintain morale while "sending good people out the door," the chief of staff admitted that it is a very hard thing to do, and said, "It does have a damaging impact on morale shrinking."

In terms of how far the Air Force will have to downsize, General McPeak said the overall force will be cut about 36 percent between 1986 and 1995.

"We're cutting everything: flying squadrons, maintenance people, Air Force bases around the nation. And so the entire organization is going to be a third or so smaller during this drawdown."

At the same time, General McPeak was quick to point out that "we're very good. We've always been very good. But we're not content to rest on our oars. We're going to keep getting better. And so every day when I go to work I set a goal, we're going to be better than we were yesterday."

Moreover, General McPeak said he feels "you either lead into the future by staying current when the organization is and staying relevant or you begin to level off and get moldy. And we're not going to do that."





program really paid dividends," said Mr. Hilley, explaining that the work accomplished just before Top Flight concentrated on the aircraft exterior because of the rehabilitation program. He said that the exterior work was still "massive" and that "every crack and crevice was looked at."

The work paid off. Reese T-37 No. 3508 took top honors in the aircraft appearance and condition competition. To win there, attention to detail was

'We don't know beforehand what they'll look at (on the jet)," said Mike Hall, T-37 maintenance team chief, adding that, "Any jet could be in-

The total team effort continued at Randolph, as maintainers and pilots worked closely together. Mr. Hilley said this teamwork did not go unnoticed among the other competitors, especially the maintainers.

Reese air crews were the only ones to land and begin helping their maintenance team prepare the jets for the critical competition inspection that was scheduled three hours after arrival. Mr. Hilley


said other maintenance teams voiced their admiration of the Reese air crews' support of the maintainers.

Though the top T-37 award was the only first place the wing captured, wing officials said they were near the top of every category. Edgar Kuenstler of the T-37 maintenance team just missed top honors for top Tweet crew chief, losing out in what Mr. Hall said came down to a tight three-person contest.

The operators also did well, getting off to a good start when the T-37 and T-38 four-ship formations came in within two seconds of their timeon-target test. Later in Top Flight, the pilots had their hands full handling what they described as a thorough test of their abilities.

"The sorties were a cross-section of everything we teach in pilot training," said Capt. Mike Kennedy of the T-38 team. "We all felt our flights went really well."

"All our people gave an outstanding performance at Top Flight; they did a super job of representing Reese," said Col. Bob Negley, wing vice commander. "Everyone who was at Randolph saw that we were in the thick of the competition."

# Russian jets visit U.S. Air Force bases

OFFUTT AFB, Neb. part of a reciprocal exchange program between the United States and the Commonwealth of Independent States, two TU-95 "Bear" bombers and an AN-124 "Condor" transport aircraft will visit Air Force bases in the United States May 9-15.

The first portion of the exchange program took place March 4-8 when Strategic Air Command sent two B-52 bombers and one KC-10 refuelingcargo aircraft to the CIS.

During that visit, aircrews and support people from the 2nd Wing, Barksdale AFB, La., joined CIS aircrews in the celebration of 50 years of longrange aviation in the former Soviet Union.

Barksdale will now host the CIS visitors, on the first leg of their U.S. visit, when they attend the Proud Shield bomber competition awards symposium at Barksdale May 9-10. (Air Force News Service)

## Last Minuteman launched by SAC at Vandenberg

VANDENBERG AFB, Calif. — The last Minuteman III to be launched under the Strategic Air Command took place May 5 when the ICBM was successfully tested after a flight of about 30 minutes from Vandenberg to a target area at the Kwajalein Missile Range, 4,200 nautical miles southwest of the Marshall Islands.

The 153rd Minuteman III launch marked the 25th year of airborne launch control system tests at Vandenberg under SAC's direction. On June 1, Minuteman III test launcheswill be conducted at Vandenberg under the new Air Combat Command. (Air Force News Service)





# Pharmacy aims to serve base

The 64th Medical Squadron is working to ensure that pharmacy service isn't a "bitter pill to swallow."

"Our main goal is to serve the people who come to us," said MSgt. Steven Hastings NCO in charge of pharmacy services. "We're here for them."

The pharmacy is open from 7:30 a.m. to 4:15 p.m. weekdays except on federal holidays. People who need to fill prescriptions should keep the following in mind:

☐ Some prescriptions can be refilled 11 times or for up to one year, whichever comes first. Check the label for clarification.

☐ A prescription for the following may be written by a person's doctor for a threemonth supply and for three refills: birth control and thyroid medications, prenatal vitamins, Premarin and Provera.

☐ Federally controlled drugs are not refillable. The exception are seizure-controlling drugs, which may be refilled five times or for six months from the date of issue, whichever comes first.

☐ Prescriptions for federally controlled drugs and antibiotics need to be filled within seven days from the date issued. Prescriptions for pediatric antibiotics should be refilled within two days of being is-

Besides going to the hospital for refills, people can call in their requests. Capt. Everett McAllister, chief of pharmacy services, said that a 24-hour telephone refill service is available at 6507. Refills made this way can be picked up the next duty day after 10 a.m. by the person ordering the prescription or a family member.

Customers should bring their empty bottles or labels with them for refills.

For convenience, Captain McAllister asked that people request their civilian doctors to sign the "product selection permitted" line on their prescriptions. That will enable the pharmacy to select prescriptions with the name brand or generic medication they have in stock



# International UPT students experience U.S.

During a career, many pilots will fly overseas as part of their ongoing proficiency training. However, unlike most student pilots here, 13 UPT students had to log thousands of miles from overseas before they even began thier initial training.

These thirteen international students come from Turkey (five), Kuwait (five) and Spain (three) and are here to earn their wings just as American students do.

Most student pilots contend with homesickness, but unlike their Yankee counterparts, these fledging aviators have to contend with unique forms of homesickness. One of the biggest initial challenges is getting used to something most of us take for granted.

"They don't have a variety of meals (here)," said Spanish air force 2nd Lt. Angel Herrero, Class 92-09.

"It took me two weeks to get used to the food," said Turkish air force 2nd Lt. Ozsev Erkal, Class 93-06.

Of course, there were other aspects to the "settling in" process. One thing the Turks noted was the difference between real Americans and what they "saw in the movies."

"We saw the extremes in movies—the very good and the very bad," said Lieutenant Erkal. "The people

are different, though."

One pleasant thing that all the international students said they have encountered is the attitudes of the American people.

"They're all really friendly, especially in Lubbock," said Kuwaiti air force 2nd Lt. Sulaiman Al-Dahham, Class 93-08. Like most international students, Lieutenant Al-Dahham was in San Antonio at the Defense Language Institute before coming to Reese.

"I thought the people would be more self-centered, but they've all been fantastic," said 2nd Lt. Cenk Hatunoglu of Turkey.

Some people were more surprising at first, though. Lieutenant Herrero said

that although he knew something of cowboys, seeing one in person was different from what he anticipated.

People weren't the only thing that was different. The young Spaniard observed differences between his homeland and here in the way clubs and social meeting places are set up. The indoor, "isolated" clubs of America provide a sharp contrast to the cafe-style, in-the-street motif of Spanish clubs. The only thing he's seen here that comes close is St. Mary's Street in San Antonio.


The Turks found a place reminiscent of home in an unlikely spot — Washington D.C. During a five-day trip to the capitol earlier this month,

Lieutenant Erkal noted the similar architecture of buildings there and ones in Europe and Turkey, saying some parts of Ankara and Istanbul look "exactly the same" as Washington.

With all the contrasts and comparisons, the students said that the lifestyle in America is mostly the same as in their homelands. Even the Turks, whose Moslem faith is considered more strict and demanding than that of many American denominations, said the differences in daily life are less than people might think.

"We're not fundamentalists," explained Lieutenant Erkal. "We know our religion and we obey its rules, but it (Turkey) is a modern society."

Another similarity in cultures lies with the Kuwaiti students. Much like the friendly rivalry that exists between certain people in the United States (Texans and Oklahomans. "Yankees" and Southerners and so on), the Kuwaitis have such tendencies too. Lieutenant Al-Dahham, who is from Kuwait City, kids classmate and fellow countryman 2nd Lt. Khaled N. Al-Otaibi about his Bedouin background. Much like the American "city slicker" who jokes with someone "from the country," Lieutenant Al-Dahham exclaims in mock incredulity, "I can't believe I'm traveling with a Bedouin!"





This day was first observed in 1984 thanks to a proclamation from President Ronald Reagan. It's aim is to recognize the spouse's impact on mission accomplishment.




