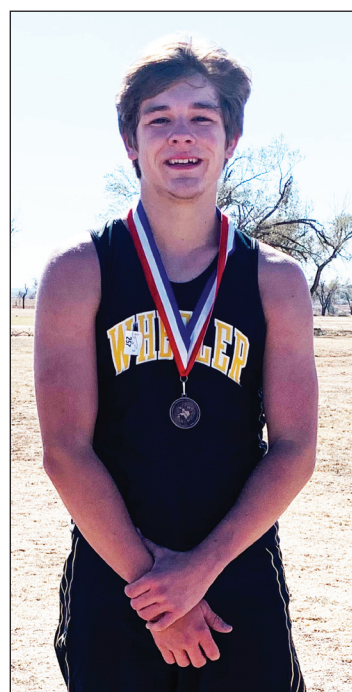

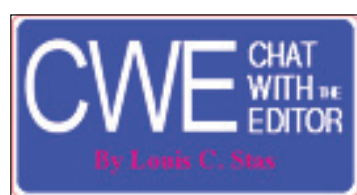

A couple of weeks ago I wrote about having been off of some of my routines, recently. My deviation continues, as I have still not returned completely to those routines which I have determined are helpful to me. Based on the teachings of a mentor who I follow, the deviation from routine and the lack of inspiration are likely linked, to some degree. Think of the mother, who may not be excited about the prospect of preparing a meal for her children. The children are most likely unaware of the mother's lack of inspiration, yet even if they were aware, the imperative to eat would remain, and would supersede concern or allowance for the feelings of

their mother – if not immediately, at least after a time.

Merely (from Page 1) examples that can be thought of without much effort – any public service job, role, or function – for those who fill these roles, they must perform whether they feel like it or not. Even the creative roles such as artist or performer – perhaps they might deliver a better performance under the influence of inspiration and heightened mood, but, if they are commissioned to work, they must work regardless of their feelings on the matter.

So doing the work is a given, but the quality can vary. Yet, despite the occasional frustrations associated with this reality, it also is a source of intrigue. I find this to be one of the more fascinating things about sports, live music, or any kind of performance – the variability of the performance, owed to the humanity of the performers. It is fascinating to consider an ace pitcher who may be the best there is at his craft, and who most of the time retires batters much more often than not, but on a particular day, that pitcher might allow so many hits that he doesn't last two innings. The fans do not get a refund, and the athlete (provided he is paid) does not return his payment for that day's work. Similarly, people seem to expect musicians to be little more than robots, who deliver the music flawlessly, or with minimal flaws (and the introduction of computers into music-making has greatly blurred the line between musician and robot; it has certainly obscured the line that indicates talent), so that is what the musicians tend to aim for. I think it is a bit of a shame. Part of the allure of a live performance of any kind is the variability of it, where one doesn't know what will happen, or how it will take shape. You might see a group on a day they have bottled lightning, or you might see them on a day when the junior high band could have

outperformed them. It is a mixed bag. But that is part of the paradox of humanity – the capability for greatness and for ineptitude; sanctity and depravity – all contained within the same vessel that is man. Therefore each day can, in a way, be likened to scratching off a new lottery ticket – one can't fully control the outcome, and you don't

ALERT: Never Answer A Phone Call From These 5 Area Codes

Police have issued a warning to everyone in the country. If you're eager to keep your personal information out of the hands of hackers and scam artists, you need to pay attention to this alert. If you have a telephone with caller ID, you've undoubtedly seen calls coming in from strange area codes. While you probably wonder, "who is calling from Boise, Idaho or Tacoma, Washington?" you need to forgo your curiosity can refuse to pick up calls - from five high risk area codes. But the mystery makes people answer, and when they do, they put themselves at risk for getting scammed. The fast talkers on the other ends of the lines know exactly what to say to get private information from you. And if you miss the call? You probably want to call back. But police are urging people around the country not to return these strange calls And here is why...

A new telephone scam is brewing. And if they're not careful, it can cost innocent

people thousands of dollars.

Police are calling this the One-Ring scam. The scammers use international phone numbers to call people in the United States. But they only let it ring once, which is enough for it to get picked up on the caller ID. This makes the receivers of the call curious and eager to call back and see who was calling. If the person calls back, they make themselves vulnerable for the scam.

These international numbers are chosen because their three-digit area codes resemble domestic phone numbers. But they're not - they are international. But if you call them back, you're connected to a pay-per-call phone line that eats into your money and YOU'RE the one getting charged per minute.

Even if you don't get connected, you can still be charged for the call. So do not call these strange numbers back.

If you do call back, the scammers try to sell you services you don't need. For example, they've been known to convince people to sign up for expensive services and need personal information to do it. They usually want your credit card information and

your current address. Police officers urge you not to give this information out.

The Federal Communications Commission (FCC) has issued an official warning about the One-Ring Scam.

And they've identified the area codes that are most likely to be involved.

-268 - which comes from the Caribbean countries Antigua and Barbuda.

-809 - which comes from the Dominican Republic

-876 - which comes from Jamaica

-284 - which comes from the British Virgin Islands

-473 - which comes from Grenada...

The FCC write: "Remember, you should always be cautious even if a number appears authentic. Criminals may also engage in caller ID 'spoofing' - deliberately falsifying the information transmitted to your caller ID display to disguise their identity. (See our consumer guide on Spoofing and Caller ID.) Bottom line: Avoid answering or returning any calls from unfamiliar area codes or calls you suspect may be spoofed."

Beware the One-Ring Scam.

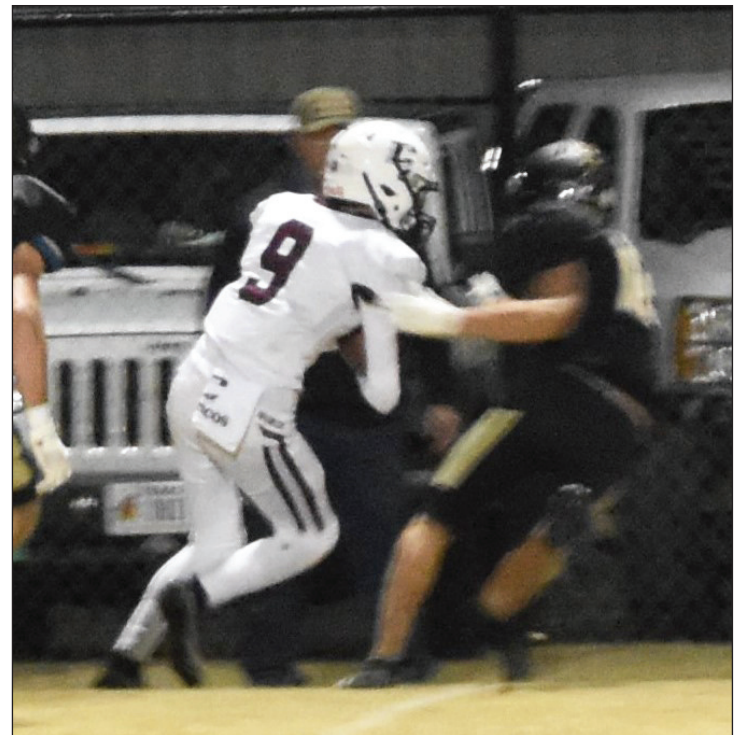
