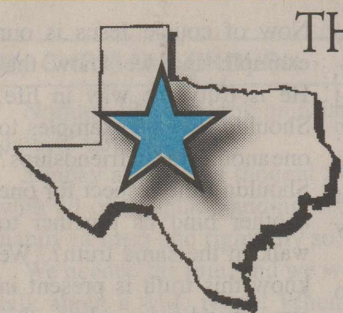

## German foreign exchange student reflects on her American experience

Last August, a new student graced the halls of Benjamin school. Now, with only 40 days left in the United States (specifically in Benjamin, Texas), foreign Exchange Student, Julia Rudowicz sat down with Knox County News and reflects on her American experience.

"I love Ranch dressing, I can live without fast food" are two of the things that Julia has learned about herself while being in Texas. Hailing from Duesseldorf, Germany (located south of Cologne, next to the Rhine river), Julia has more people living on her street in Germany than the entire population of Benjamin Texas... Her high school is bigger than Benjamin, and this small town took Julia a little by surprise. When she opt to become a foreign exchange student, Julia had the choice of picking a country-which she knew she wanted to come to America, but rather than picking WHERE in the U.S. she wanted to spend her year abroad, she left it up to chance... and found Benjamin, the welcoming home of Fred and Nancy McGregor, life long friends

like Raquel Acevedo, Jessie Vanderpol and Shelby Russel, and a town who is more like a family than like neighbors. Before ever leaving German soil, Raquel Acevedo found Julia on social networking site, Facebook, and inquired about her sports skill and told her everything she needed to know before arriving here.

Julia arrived on August 27, 2009; and was inundated with a new group of friends and pseudo- family. At the first pep-rally of the school year, Julia found out that she was on the volleyball team (which she had never played volleyball before). Julia was a member of the 2009 District winning Volleyball team, the 2010 district champ girls basketball team, threw shot put and discus in the track team, was one of the leads in Benjamin High's One Act Play (where her accent actually helped her character come to life) and was crowned Benjamin's 2009 "Fall Fest Queen".

At first her English was confusing because of the teenage, Texas slang that can only be learned in school hallways or in regular conversation. Now, after many months of Texas English with teenage slang mixed in, Julia is a regular pro. She also speaks Polish, French, Russian and German fluently too.

While in the United States, Julia has seen NYC before she found her way to Benjamin, and with the McGregor's, Julia has been able to visit Austin and Dallas, and get more of a taste of Texas.

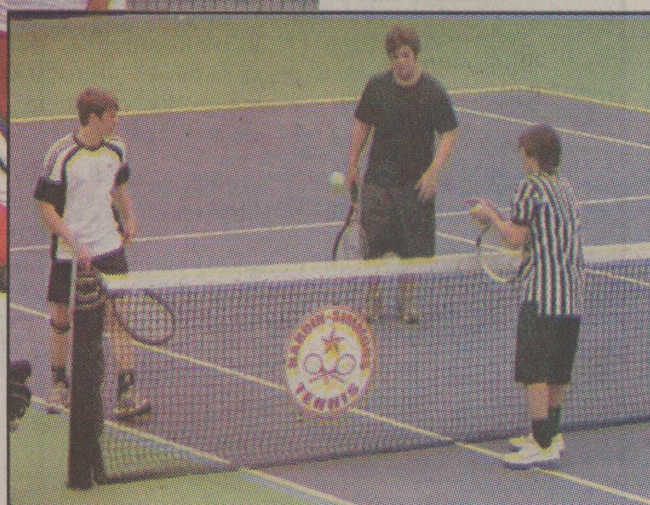

## Knox County Commissioners hold regular meeting

Knox County Judge Travis Floyd, called the Regular Meeting to order at 1:30 P.M. Commissioners Johnny Birkenfeld, Jimmy Urbanczyk, Dan Godsey, and Johnny McCown were present. Also attending were County Attorney Megan Suarez, County Clerk Annette Offutt, County Sheriff Dean Homstad, County Tax Assessor/Chief Appraiser Mitzi Welch, County Treasurer Rosie Ake, County Court Coordinator Michelle Esquivel, Charlie Schur and Kenny Pruitt with NRCS, Charles Griffith and members of the Knox County Historical Commission. The Court considered the following matters as posted and filed for Record in the office of the County Clerk April 6, 2010.

There were no Public Comments.

Commissioner Godsey made the motion seconded by Commissioner Birkenfeld to approve the minutes of the Regular Meeting held March 8, 2010.

The motion passed five to zero.

Judge Floyd presented The Knox County Historical Commission with the Distinguished Service Award for outstanding preservation work.

Commissioner Birkenfeld made the motion to approve and certify TXDOT's County Road Inventory; Commissioner McCown seconded, the motion passed five to zero.

The issue concerning the Walking Path Project in Knox City was tabled

until a later date.

Commissioner Urbanczyk made the motion seconded by Commissioner Godsey to pass on the job estimate from M.B. Statewide Asphalt to repair the potholes in the Knox County Courthouse parking lot; all agreed.

Judge Floyd Proclaimed April 27, 2010 as Conservation Day in honor of the 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Natural Resources Conservation Service of the State of Texas.

The Court signed the resolution declaring the month of April as County Government Month.

After discussing the issue concerning the request from Buddy Tolson to put a gate on the Cemetery Road Commissioner Urbanczyk made the motion seconded by Commissioner McCown to deny the request; the motion passed five to zero.

Commissioner Urbanczyk made the motion to accept the bid of \$4,000.00 made by Mati Quintero for Parcel # 3990, Block 32, South 1/2 R.P. Munday Addition City of Munday, Commissioner McCown seconded, all agreed.

Commissioner Godsey made the motion seconded by Commissioner McCown to accept the bid made by Gregg Fix & Patricia A. Wild in the amount of \$100.00, for Parcel# 7105, Block 67, Lots 1,2,3, East 1/2 of Lots 9&10, Original City of Goree. The motion passed five to zero.

Commissioner Birkenfeld made the motion to accept the bid of \$125.00 made by Gregg Fix & Patricia Wild for Parcel # 3212, Block 73, Lots 1-6 Original City of Goree, Commissioner Urbanczyk seconded, the motion passed five to zero.

Commissioner Godsey made the motion seconded by Commissioner McCown to accept the bid of \$20.00 made by Breeze Hankammer for Parcel # 13335, Block 1, Lot 17, Original City of Goree and the bid of \$500.00 made by Clint Lewis for Parcel # 6742, Block 26, Lots 17-18 & N 50' 15-16, Original City of Knox City, all agreed.

After considering the issue concerning the request of the Munday Chamber of Commerce on paying part of the utilities for the City/County Library Commissioner Urbanczyk made the motion to table the issue, Commissioner Birkenfeld seconded, the motion passed five to zero.

The Extension Activity Report, Aging Services Report, 911 Report, and Road and Bridge Report required no activity.

Commissioner Godsey made the motion to approve Financials, Budget and pay the bills for March, 2010; the motion was seconded by Commissioner, McCown the motion passed five to zero.

There being no further business to come before the Court the meeting of the court was **ADJOURNED**.

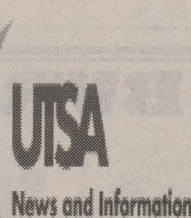

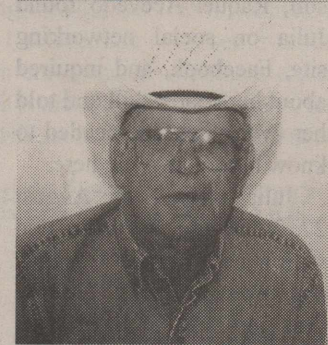

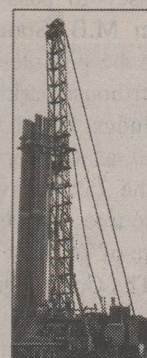
Kenneth was preceded in death by his parents; two brothers and one grandson.

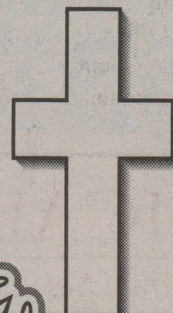

So where's a good breadboard when you need one? I need one.

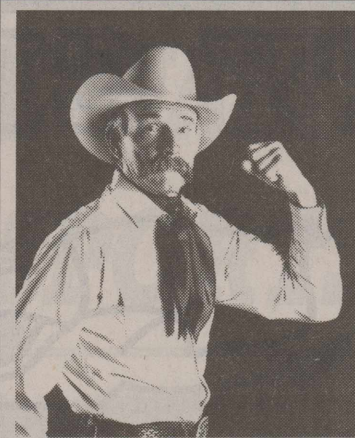
It's not like I want to roll out a piecrust. I'd just like to walk up to the kitchen counter, pull out a breadboard...

LARGE ANIMAL VET MED; A GLOBAL VIEW

Typically smaller, more rural communities have no veterinarian, or at least none that will take a calving call or a horse colic emergency.

Veterinary schools, veterinary associations, concerned farmers and isolated ranchers continue their search for new veterinarians interested in practicing Food Animal and Equine medicine.

If we look to our fellow professionals in human medicine, it is not uncommon to find yourself being examined and treated by a foreign-born physician.

To our own social credit, Americans have realized money isn't everything. Family time, sharing, enjoying life, and dependence on government, corporations or unions as a security blanket, have now become our Nirvana.

How about organizing a group of selected national universities to teach and graduate veterinarians licensed to practice Large Animal Only (equine and food animal).

You may ask why I think foreign graduates would even be interested? Because they know that on a level playing field they have a 50% chance of being accepted...

I can't say if it's too soon, but the next time you've got a wounded horse or a C-section in the middle of the night, and the nearest capable Large Animal Veterinarian is 2 hours away, you might give it some thought.

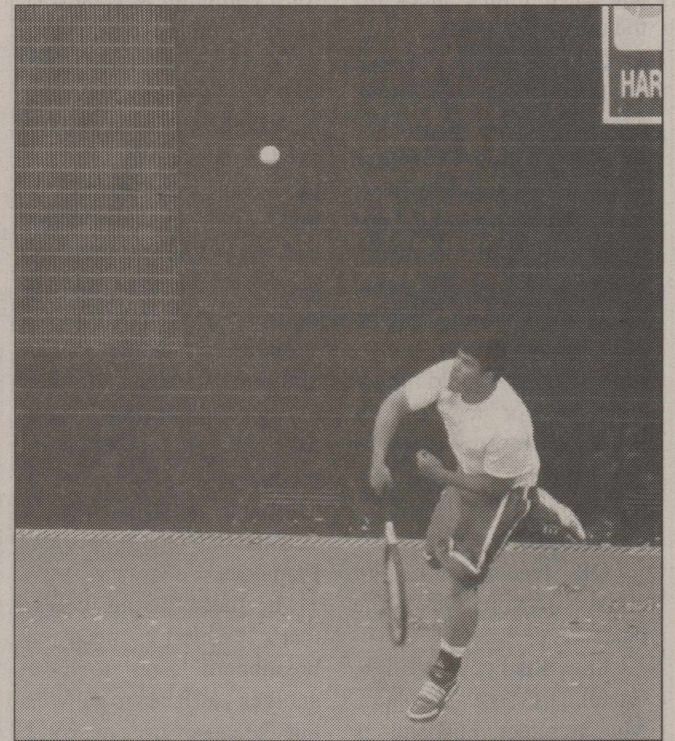
## 4-Her's Compete at District Shoot

the district tennis meet. Cody Propps and Mitchell Ham won the district in doubles play, they will now go on and compete at Area.

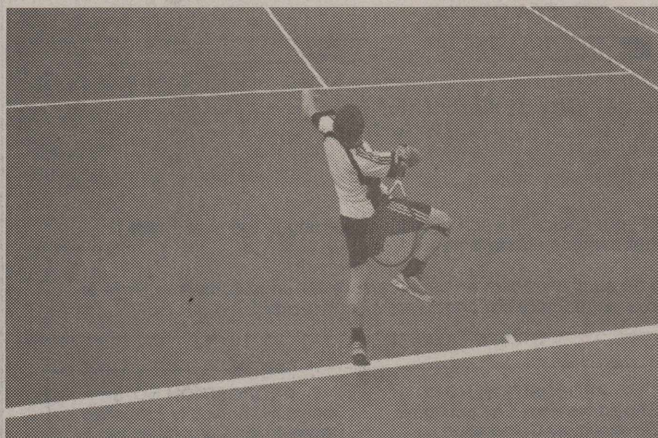

No new news on our ailing friends. Most are about as they have been. David Baldwin remains in a Wichita Falls Hospital. Not much change in his condition. He is in a

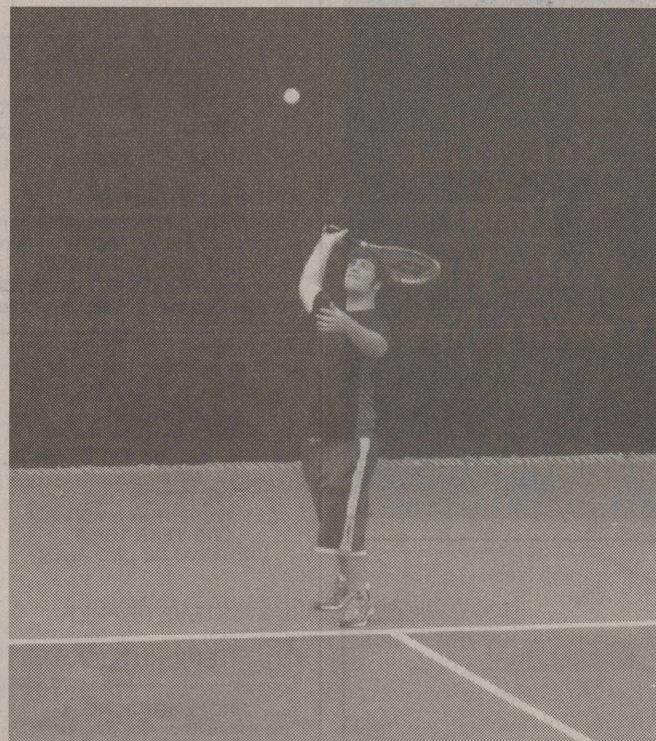
private room which makes it better for his family to be with him more. No word on the long-term prognosis, but hopefully he will improve enough to be home before too long.



### Gates' (not so) Secret Memo to the President

Here we go again. A secret memo from Defense Secretary Robert Gates to President Obama became known over the weekend revealing Gates' concerns that "the United States does not have an effective long-range policy for dealing with Iran's steady progress toward nuclear capability."

The memo, written last January, was described "as a wake up call" that among Gates' worries were "Iran could assemble all the major parts it needs for a nuclear weapon fuel, designs and detonators- but stop just short of assembling a fully operational weapon."

An administration official confided anonymously, "There was a line Iran would not be permitted to cross" that the United States would ensure that Iran would not acquire a nuclear capability."

Admiral Mike Mullen, the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff wrote in December "that a military attack (on Iran) would have limited results."

The administration has placed "patriot missiles" in several allied Persian gulf states of late to counter (one supposes) Iran's ballistic missiles that are capable of reaching Israel but significantly, carry only conventional warheads.

So what is one to make of Gates' memo? It could have been leaked intentionally (by the administration) to the press as a

new warning to Iran that the U.S. is determined to prevent it from acquiring a nuclear weapon and despite Obama's diplomatic overtures to Iran, the military option is still very much on the table.

But really, is there anything new here; or just some renewed bombast by us

Admiral Mullen's take of "limited results" occurring if we attacked Iran comes closest to reality but even his conclusion runs well short of the mark

Attacking Iran (by us or the Israeli's) would be catastrophic. And it would not completely destroy Iran's nuclear capability (which is located in various locations throughout the country and placed deeply underground impervious to conventional weapons' strikes) but would in all likelihood, ramp up its efforts to actually develop a nuclear weapon.

Israel would surely be retaliated against with Iranian conventional missile strikes.

Iraq would likely explode into renewed attacks against the American presence there.

The Strait of Hormuz would likely be bombed and blocked by Iran, crippling oil supplies from reaching the open sea and creating (unnecessarily) a world oil shortage crisis and quite probably a new world financial crisis.

The "green" freedom movement that erupted from Iran's fraudulent reelection of President Ahmadinejad last summer

would likely collapse and a renewed nationalism by most Iranians would coalesce around the defense of the Iranian nation and further solidify the power of Iatollah Khamenei.

Lastly, terrorism would likely explode in the West Bank, southern Lebanon (Hezbollah), in Israel proper and probably Europe and the U.S.

Preemptive wars in Afghanistan and particularly Iraq; just what has that accomplished besides instituting a Shiite regime in that country now closely allied and strongly influenced by Iran. A nuclear North Korea that didn't have a bomb (but when it was absurdly linked to Iraq and Iran by Bush in his "Axis of evil" speech in January 2002) rapidly developed its own nuclear capability).

What seems all too apparent is we have embarked on a strategy of endless war and hegemony throughout the world. We are the lone super power and we reign supreme, an empire in reality and a Republic in name only.

Is this what the signers of our "Declaration" had in mind in 1776? What Lincoln was determined to preserve? What Roosevelt and Truman did to defeat the imperialism of Germany and Japan?

### The Bum's Rush

On December 15th, 2010, the Financial Crisis Inquiry Commission is due to deliver its report to Barack Obama on the principal causes of the financial meltdown of 2007 and 2008.

Of course, there's a bit of a problem with this timeframe. Namely, the Senate is already fully prepared to begin debate on Senator Chris Dodd's financial takeover this week, as reported by CNN.com.

It is "a bill that Democrats say will prevent another Wall Street meltdown like the one that precipitated the U.S. recession."

Except, that's what the Commission — which Congress voted to create — is supposed to be doing in presenting its report. According to the Commission's website, it is tasked to "examine the causes of major financial institutions which failed, or were likely to have failed, had they not received exceptional government assistance."

Unfortunately, Congress is not waiting for these critical findings prior to passing

sweeping changes to the way the financial system operates. Instead, this is another example of the bum's rush by a Congress that wants nothing more than to shove another government takeover down the throats of the American people.

Chief among the institutions the Commission is examining are the failures caused by Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac. The now-nationalized mortgage giants bought some \$4.7 trillion of mortgages and sold them all over the world as securities, all the while overstating the quality of the underlying mortgage investments, as revealed by former Chief Credit Officer of Fannie Mae, Ed Pinto, in a recent article by Commissioner Peter Wallison of the American Enterprise Institute.

Writes Wallison, "By the end of 2008, Fannie and Freddie held or guaranteed approximately 10 million subprime and Alt-A mortgages and mortgage-backed securities (MBS)—risky loans with a total principal balance of \$1.6 trillion." That's more than one-third of all the securities Fannie and Freddie guarantee.

Sadly, credit rating agencies missed this mislabeling. In fact, they had little to no role in rating the Fannie and Freddie securities. Instead, securities issued by the Government Sponsored Enterprises' (GSE's) were automatically given AAA ratings simply because of their implicit backing by taxpayers.

Most certainly, Fannie and Freddie's deception caused purchasers of the securities to wildly miscalculate the true delinquency and default rates of the underlying mortgages. This inherent feature is what made the assets "toxic," for purchasing them in large quantity was much riskier than was advertised by the GSE's.

Commissioner Wallison has already called this a "principal cause of the financial crisis."

That being the case, one might think the Senate would turn its attention to Fannie and Freddie, or wait for the critical findings of the Commission before reshaping the entire financial system. Regrettably, the Dodd bill does neither. Instead, the GSE's are startlingly omitted from the new legislation.

Although, this is not surprising when one considers the fact that Dodd was the top recipient of campaign donations from GSE employees and Political Action Committees, as revealed by OpenSecrets.org.

In fact, the Dodd bill does nothing to rein in Fannie and Freddie now or in the future. Nor does it seek to begin unwinding government control of the mortgage industry. Instead, Dodd is rushing ahead with legislation that gives government the power to seize any firm it deems "too risky," all the while perpetuating the crisis by leaving the ultimate fate of the GSE's in limbo.

In December the Treasury arbitrarily lifted the \$400 billion cap on the GSE bailout, and so far taxpayers have dumped \$129 billion into these two agencies. By rushing ahead with legislation that does not begin to unwind them now, the Senate is increasing the likelihood that the government will be unable or unwilling to unwind them later, even if that is what the Commission concludes is the proper course of action.

"When we begin to think that each of us has a role in conserving and protecting our natural resources, we can effect personal actions that will have a positive impact for creating healthy habitats of ecosystems found in and around our communities", Buckles added.

In America, the stewardship observance traces its origin to the Rogation Days celebrated more than 1,500 years ago in the neighborhood of Vienne, France. The custom began when bad weather and earthquakes brought crop failures and widespread hunger.

"The stewardship obser-

vance relies on locally led soil and water conservation districts nationwide sharing and promoting stewardship and conservation activities. From a national perspective, NACD represents the nation's 3,000 soil and water conservation districts which were established to encourage resource conservation across the country", said Buckles.

"Districts throughout Texas provide an array of activities to promote the observance such as conservation and stewardship field days, programs, workshops and other outreach efforts throughout their communities to educate citizens about the need to care for soil, water and related renewable natural resources", Buckles added.

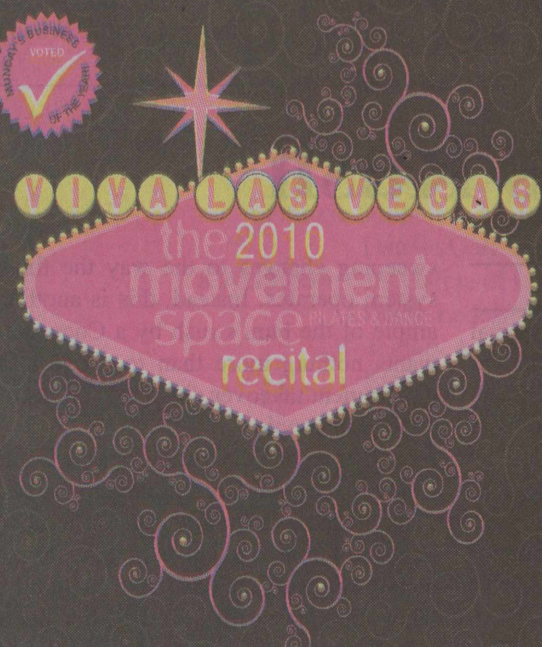

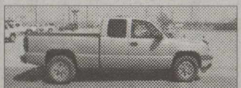

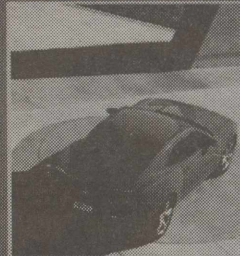
