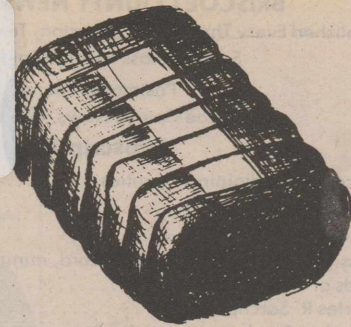

Students Do Well On Their Exit Tests

Silverton High School's tenth graders did very well on their exit tests, the exams that must be passed successfully before they can be awarded their diplomas at the conclusion of their senior year.

In 1993, 89.5% of the class passed the reading portion of the TASS, while in 1994 this portion was passed by 100% of the class.

On the writing test, 94.7% passed in 1993 and 95% passed in 1994, virtually the same.

In 1994, 68% of the class passed the math portion of the assessment, where 89.5% passed in 1993. This is somewhat of a disappointment, but is much higher than was scored in many of the larger high schools in this area. These students were taking the exit tests for the first time; they have several more opportunities to





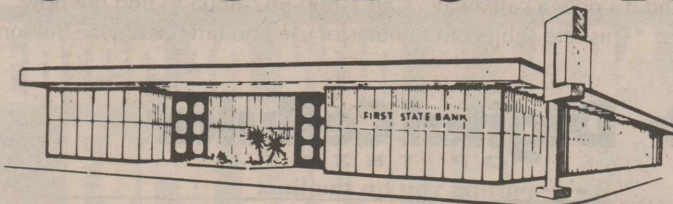

W. C. Smithee Family Reunion Held in Turkey

Descendants of W. C. and Edith Smithee met in Turkey May 7, 1994, to recall the years since they and their family of eleven children came to Briscoe County and opened a General Mercantile Store in Silverton in the Spring of 1898, after arriving in Plainview Christmas Eve in 1897 by covered wagon from Arkansas.

The store, which was operated until about 1922, was located where the First State Bank's Pioneer Room stands now. Thirty of 32 grandchildren were born in Silverton, and 19 survive. Many still have land holdings in Briscoe County.

Hosts for the occasion were the Willie and Lizzie Smithee family, Kathleen Smithee Green, Keith and Betty Green, all of Turkey; Hub and Einell Smithee Bramblett of Plainview, and Ted Hancock of Silverton.

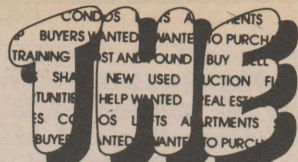


AFTER GRADUATION, LET'S ENROLL IN THE SCHOOL OF LIFE
