## Students Do Well <br> On Their Exit Tests

Silverton High School's tenth graders did very well on their exit tests, the exams that must be passed successfully before they can be awarded their diplomas at the conclusion of their senior year.
In 1993, $89.5 \%$ of the class passed the reading portion of the TASS, while in 1994 this portion was passed by $100 \%$ of the class.
On the writing test, $94.7 \%$ passed in 1993 and $95 \%$ passed in 1994, virtually the same.
In $1994,68 \%$ of the class passed the math portion of the assessment, where $89.5 \%$ passed in 1993. This is somewhat of a disappointment, but is much higher than was scored in many of the larger high schools in this area. These students were taking the exit tests for the first time; they have several more opportunities to
