WORN OUT SHOES

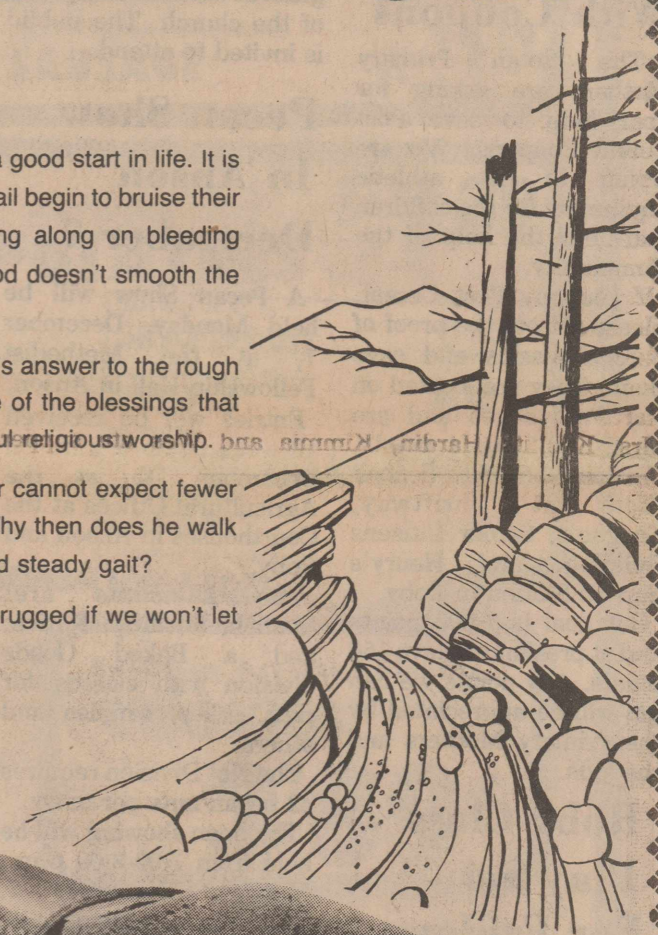

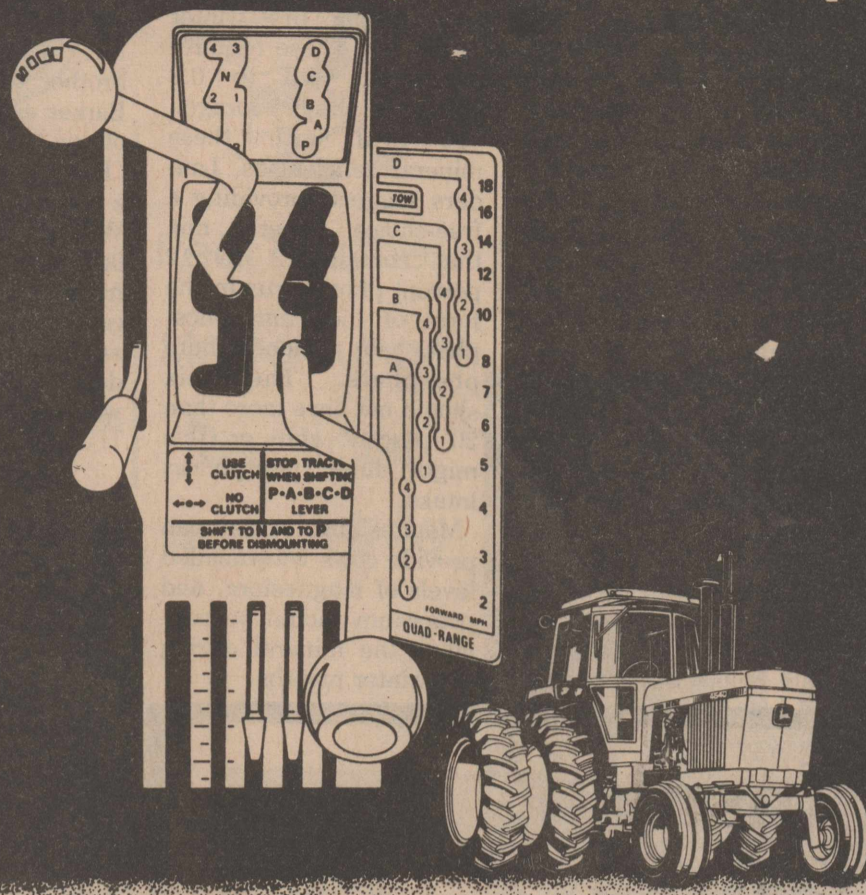

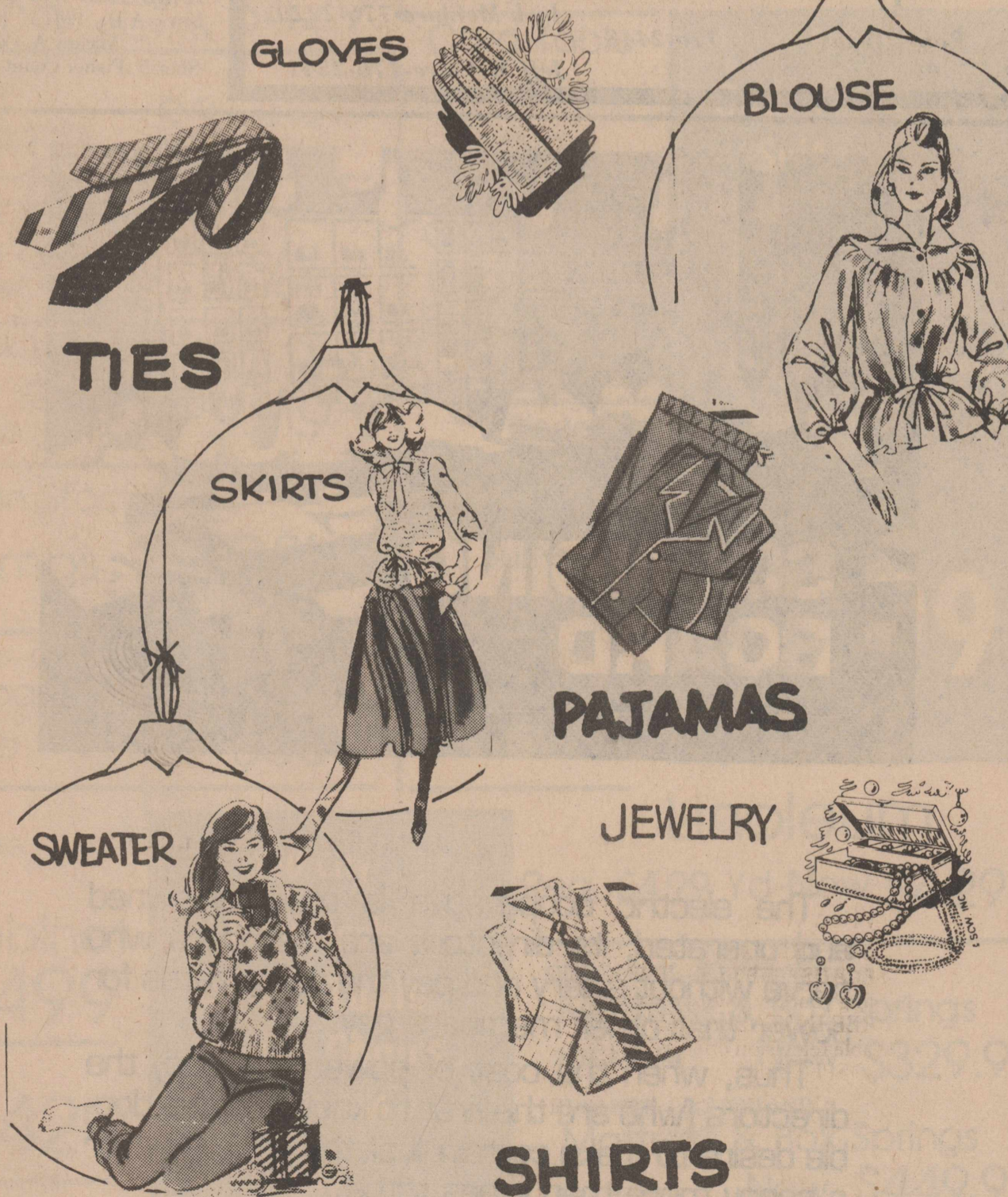

County Agent Report

Whether on lush green pastures in East Texas or on drier ranges in West Texas, cows need mineral supplements.

Most cows don't get enough phosphorus, magnesium and potassium from grazing, so they should be fed a mineral mix free choice the year round.

While dry cows sometimes get enough minerals during the spring when forages are making good growth, that's seldom the case for cows with calves.

Studies in both Schleicher County in West Texas and Hidalgo County in South Texas bear this out.

Phosphorus, in partic-

ular, is generally short in dry forage. Minimum requirements are 0.18 percent of dry forage for dry cows and 0.18 to 0.39 percent for those nursing calves, depending on productivity. As far as magnesium is concerned, dry cows need forage with 0.04 to 0.1 percent of this mineral while those with calves need about 0.18 percent. Range forages often provide enough magnesium for dry cows but certainly not for those with calves.

Potassium may be adequate for both dry and lactating cows during most of the year but generally falls below the minimum

level during dry winter conditions. These requirements are 0.6 to 0.8 percent of the dry forage.

To deal with these mineral deficiencies, Landers suggests providing a free-choice mineral mix that contains 8 to 12 percent phosphorus in the form of dicalcium phosphate or monosodium phosphate. The mix should not have more than 20 percent salt or this might limit phosphorus intake.

Magnesium oxide can provide cows with needed levels of magnesium, and potassium should be added to the mineral during the winter months.

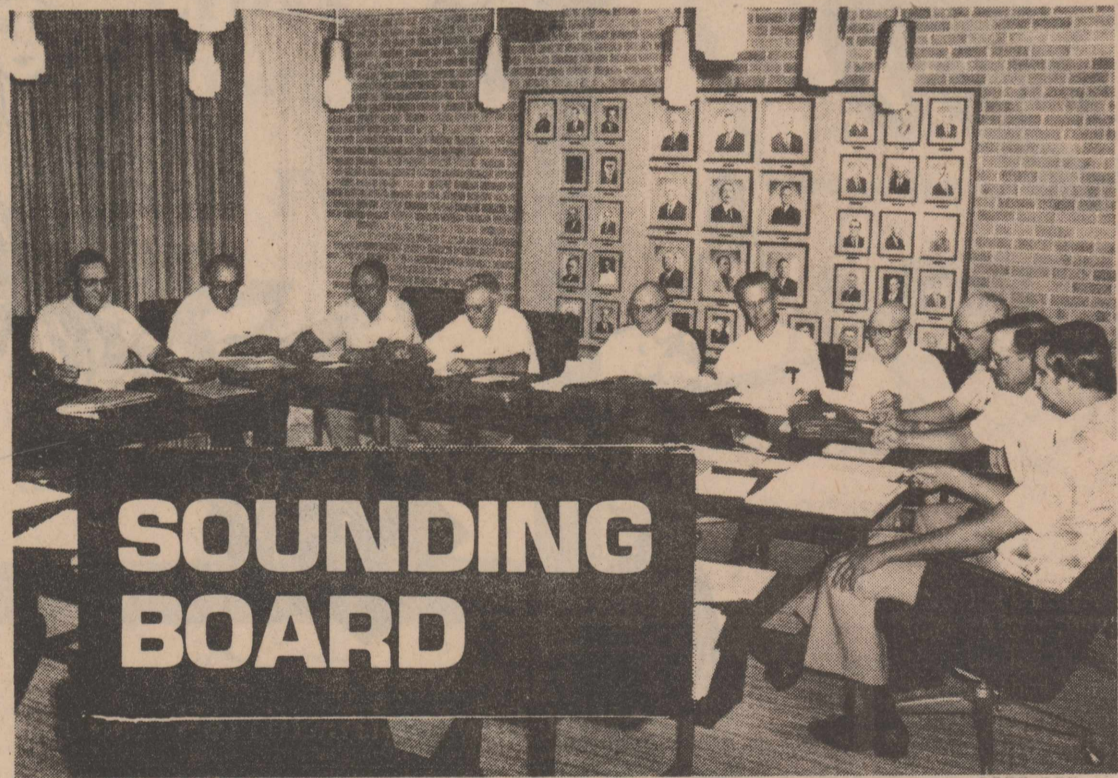

Cottonseed Prices Are Unchanged

Local cotton prices continue to trade at 2 to 2 1/2 cents above the Government loan support, for the week ending November 27, according to B.B. Manly of the USDA Cotton Marketing Services Office, Abilene, TX. Grade 42, staple 32 cotton miking 35 to 49 sold for 47 to 48.50 cents per pound. Lubbock Spot Quotations closed November 27 at 52.40 cents for grade 51, staple 34, mike 35 through 49, which was 14 points below loan prices and down 300 points from a week ago. Trading was slow to moderate.

Cottonseed prices per farmers were unchanged at 75 to 90 dollars per ton. Cotton sample receipts continued heavy as the harvest continues in its peak. About 60,000 samples were classed last week, which brought the season total to 307,000 samples classed.

The quality of cotton classed during the week showed little change from a week earlier. Grade 42

comprised 51 percent; grade 32 was 15 percent; grade 41 was 13 percent; and grade 52 was 12 percent. Staple length 31 was 48 percent; staple 32

was 35 percent; and staple 30 was 11 percent. Micro-naire readings were 93 percent within the 35 to 49 range. Fiber strength averaged 22 grams per tex

for the week and also for the season. About 6 percent of the samples were reduced on account of Bark, and one percent on account of Grass.

In summary, the gas cost adjustment (GCA) shall be determined to the nearest \$0.0001 per Mcf by Item B (1), Item B (2) and Item B (3) as follows: GCA = (Item B (1) + Item B (2) X Item B (3))

Item C Tax Adjustment. The tax adjustment shall be an amount equivalent to the proportionate part of any new tax, or increased tax, or any other governmental imposition...

Item D Cost of Service Adjustment. Each monthly bill for residential and commercial gas service shall be adjusted

for changes in the cost of providing such service as follows:

(1) Effective with bills rendered for the month of May, 1982 and annually thereafter each May thereafter, the residential and commercial monthly rate shall be adjusted for changes in the cost per customer of providing gas service...

The Gross National Product over the same period of time, the adjustment will be limited to a maximum change computed by multiplying the cost of service per customer of providing gas service by the ratio of the Gross National Product...

Item E. Schedule of Service Charges. (1) Reconnect Charge. In addition to the charges and rates set

out above, the Company shall charge and collect the sum of \$ 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday-\$20.00; 5 p.m. to 8 a.m. Monday through Friday-\$30.00; Saturdays, Sundays and Holidays-\$30.00.

as a reconnect charge for each reconnoiter or reinstallation of gas service, where service has been discontinued at the same premises for any reason, with the following exceptions: (a) For a builder who uses gas temporarily during construction or for display purposes.

Appliance Service Charges

8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday-\$18.00 per hour, 5 p.m. to 8 a.m. Monday through Friday-\$27.00; Saturdays, Sundays and Holidays-\$27.00 per hour. An additional charge of \$12 added to the above charges when a second employee (helper) is required.

Service and Charge:

Clean and replace mantles-\$5.00. Painting black and white and/or replacing glass panes-\$4.00. All new company sold gas lights serviced free of charge for 90 days, during standard working hours.

Air Conditioning Service. Schedule and Hourly Charge: Any hour Sunday through Saturday and Holidays-\$20.00.

Time in excess of one hour prorated in 15 minute increments, as follows: 15 minutes-\$5.00; 30 minutes-\$10.00; 45 minutes-\$15.00; 60 minutes-\$20.00.

No additional charge for second employee (helper).

Labor charges in excess of factory allowances for warranty replacement and repair will be passed on to the customer.

(3) Main Line Extension Rate (Residential). The charge for extending mains beyond the free limit established by Lone Star Gas, or any free limit established by city franchise is \$4.50 per foot except for large commercial and industrial consumers which are handled on an actual cost per foot basis.

SECTION 2. The residential and commercial rates set forth above shall be adjusted upward or downward from a base of \$2.4624 per Mcf by a Gas Cost Adjustment Factor expressed as an amount per thousand cubic feet (Mcf) of natural gas for changes in the intracompany city gate rate charge...

SECTION 3. Company shall also receive tax adjustments according to Item C, in the Attachment hereto which is incorporated herein.

SECTION 4. The residential and commercial rates set forth above shall be adjusted upward and downward by a Cost of Service Adjustment Factor expressed as an amount per customer for changes in the cost of service over a twelve month period ending December 31, according to Item D, in the attachment hereto which is incorporated herein.

SECTION 5. Rate case expense is not included in the calculation of proposed rates. If rate case expense is incurred in this current calendar year...

SECTION 6. In addition to the aforesaid rates, Company shall have the right to collect such reasonable charges as are necessary to conduct its business and to carry out its reasonable rules and regulations...

SECTION 7. The rates set forth in this ordinance may be changed and amended by either the City or Company in the manner provided by law.

SECTION 8. It is hereby found and determined that the meeting at which this ordinance was passed was open to the public, as required by Texas law, and that advance public notice of the time, place and purpose of said meeting was given.

ATTACHMENT TO ORDINANCE, CITY OF ROBY, TEXAS, LONE STAR GAS COMPANY, TARIFFS & SCHEDULES.

Item A. The following rates are the maximum applicable to residential and commercial consumers per meter per month for any part of a month for which gas service is available at the same location. Summer rates shall be applicable between the months of May and October. Winter rates shall be applicable at all other times.

Residential. Customer Charge: Winter-\$3.7500, Summer-\$3.7500. All Consumption: Winter-\$3.3256 Per Mcf, Summer-\$3.0756 Per Mcf.

If the service period is less than 28 days, the customer charge is \$ 1.339 times the number of days service.

Commercial. Customer Charge: Winter-\$7.0000, Summer-\$7.0000. All Consumption: Winter-\$3.3256 Per Mcf, Summer-\$3.0756 Per Mcf.

If the service period is less than 28 days, the customer charge is \$ 2.500 times the number of days service.

Bills are due and payable when rendered and must be paid within ten days from the monthly billing date.

Item B. Gas Cost Adjustment. Each monthly bill at the above rate shall be adjusted for gas cost as follows:

(1) The city gate rate increase or decrease applicable to current billing month residential and commercial sales shall be estimated to the nearest \$0.0001 per Mcf based upon:

(a) A volume factor of 1.0526 determined in establishing the above rates for the distribution system as the ratio of adjusted purchased volumes divided by adjusted sales volumes.

(b) The city gate rate estimated to be applicable to volumes purchased during the current calendar month, expressed to the nearest \$0.0001 per Mcf (shown below as "Re").

(c) The base city gate rate of \$2.4624 per Mcf.
