They haven't lost the shirt on their backs, but several individuals and business owners in this area were also inspired to give to Western Texas College during our Kickoff Campaign these past few months, and especially to the

DeLoera's Challenge Gift during March. Over 40 area businesses and 70 individuals came through since November to get WTC off to a great start!

If you haven't heard, Darla and Albert DeLoera, who own Texas Finance, Inc. and Texas Rapid Returns, stepped up in February to donate \$10,000 for home game uniforms for the new WTC softball and baseball teams that will begin Fall '02. With their gift came the challenge for area businesses and individuals to match it with another \$10,000 to purchase uniforms for games away.

\$11,030 was given in response, with much of it coming during in the last week of March. The Kickoff Campaign finished out at \$43,065.

Like icing on a cake, a generous gift from the four Dupree families of Snyder was the final touch that took both campaigns sweetly over the goal. Richard and Donna Dupree, owners of Jack Dupree's Used Cars, approached me at last month's Chamber of Commerce Banquet (Thank you for the plug, David Holt!) to indicate their desire to make a donation to the college during the campaign, but with the idea of becoming donors for the long haul. But, if you know Richard Dupree, you could guess that he wasn't content to stop there.

Richard recruited his mother, Mildred Dupree, his uncle and aunt, Bob and Henrietta (Dupree Motor, Inc., now Henry's Auto Sales), and then his nephew and niece, Rodney and Teresa, who own and operate Friendly Flower Shop. Pooling their resources, these four families contributed a total of \$4000.

For those who want to make a donation to the school, but haven't, or those, like Richard and Donna Dupree, who plan to give again, more campaigns and opportunities that impact people's lives are coming soon.

## **GET\$** Scholarship **Program Rewards Academic Achievement**

A new program designed to reward area high school students for earning good grades was implemented last fall by Western Texas College. The GRADES EARNED for TUITION DOLLARS (GET\$) pro-

gram promotes academic achievement by awarding WTC scholarship dollars for grades earned by high school juniors and seniors from Snyder, Ira, and Hermleigh.

"This scholarship program is designed to give prospective WTC

students a way of investing in their own future through academic achievement," said WTC Dean of Student Services, Jim Clifton. "It is possible for them to pay for a large part of their college tuition by concentrating on good grades while in high school."

When a student is accepted as a member of the GET\$ program, WTC. will deposit funds into his or her scholarship account for grades earned in Math, Science, History, Government, and English/Literature. Following each six-week period, students will receive \$20 for each A, \$12 for each B, and \$3 for each C earned in one of these major subject areas.

In return, participating students agree to provide the college with a copy of their transcript in June of each year so that their scholarship dollars may be recorded. They also agree to attend Freshman Orientation at the beginning of their freshman year at WTC.

In order to be eligible for scholarship dollars, students must enroll at WTC within 12 months of graduation from high school and remain enrolled full time for at least one long semester each year until the scholarship dollars have been used. They must also maintain at least a C+ (2.5) grade point average each semester at WTC.

The program is retroactive for the first year only, allowing students who entered their senior year in 2001-02 to submit grades from both their junior and senior years for consideration in the program.

When eligible, students may receive up to one-fourth of their WTC scholarship dollars each time they register as a full time student. Interested students entering the eleventh or twelfth grades may pick up an application for the GET\$ program from their high school counselor or from the financial aid office at WTC.
