



JUNE WORKSHOP SLATED FOR TASP PREPARATION

WTC will offer a PASS the TASP workshop for students beginning June 3. PASS the TASP is a one-week study-intensive workshop to help students review for TASP success. The goal of the workshop is to provide a fast-paced review of needed skills to help students pass the TASP. The class is not intended for students
