Filing period now open for May 4 elections

The filing period for city, school and hospital board elections in Lynn County opened last week, with Wednesday, Jan. 16 the official first day to file for a place on the ballot at the main offices of the respective entities. Filing will continue through Feb. 15, with elections to be held on May 4.

As of early this week, four candidates have filed in three elections, according to reports from each entity. One filed for the mayor position in Tahoka, one filed for a Wilson City Council seat, and two filed for O'Donnell City Council seats.

Lynn County Hospital District will have an election for two directors, for three-year terms. City elections in Lynn County are for two-year terms, and school board trustees serve three-year terms (unless designated as an unexpired term).

Following is a complete list of terms expiring in the upcoming May 4 elections.

Lynn County Hospital District: Two directors. Terms expiring: Mary Gayle Raindl, Manuel DeLeon.

City of Tahoka: Mayor and two Council members. Terms expiring: Mayor John Baker. Council, Dist. 1: Johnny Rosas; Dist. 3: Shiloh Braddock. Filing: John Baker for Mayor.

Tahoka ISD: Four trustees (three 3-year terms, one unexpired term). Terms expiring: Pct. 1 Slate May; Pct. 2 Jon Luna; Pct. 5 Doug Green; Unexpired Pct. 4 Lea Swinford.

City of Wilson: Three council seats. Terms expiring: Pat Cates, Helen Stephenson, Angela Taylor. Filing: Pat Cates.

Wilson ISD: Three trustees. Terms expiring: Les Walker, Tracy Kendrick, Bonnie Schwertner.

City of New Home: Mayor and two council seats. Terms expiring: Mayor (Mayor Pro-Tem Jim Olsen has been filling in after the death of Mayor David Gandy). Council: Jim Olsen, Brady Gass.

New Home ISD: (Election is in November, filing at a later date.)

City of O'Donnell: Two council seats. Terms expiring: Jesse Perez, Bruce Vaughn. Filing: Paul Hale, Bruce Vaughn.

O'Donnell ISD: Three trustees. Terms expiring: Billy Edwards, Landon Mires, Melissa Pedroza.

Backflow devices: Commercial/residential owners may be required to install backflow devices on waterlines, says city

Commercial business owners in Tahoka have been notified by letters from the City of Tahoka that their business may be required to install a backflow device on their city waterlines, in order to comply with Texas Commission on Environmental Quality regulations. Residential waterlines will also fall under the same state regulations, say city officials, and the cost of installing such devices will fall on the owners.

The good news, however, is that not every commercial or residential owner will be required to install backflow devices on their waterlines, according to information provided by city officials at Tuesday night's public meeting, which few people attended.

A backflow device is a mechanical assembly that can be placed on a waterline, near the meter, that protects the distribution system delivering drinking water to homes or businesses. Backflow is water flowing in the opposite of its intended direction, either from a loss of pressure in the

supply lines or an increase in pressure on the customer's side. When the water backflows, it can carry contaminants with it into the water lines.

The requirements for backflow devices will be based on certain criteria, explained City Administrator Jerry Webster and City Engineer Matt Hopper.

"Basically, for residential homes, if your property has a private well, or if you have a sprinkler system for your lawn - whether or not it is on a separate meter - or if you have a pool, you will be required to install the backflow devices on all of your home water meters," Webster explained, adding that if any homeowner is unsure whether they would need to install the device to contact City Hall.

"For the commercial accounts, if your business just has restroom or break room kitchen facilities, most likely a backflow device will not be required. However, every commercial account must

have an initial city inspection to determine whether the backflow device is required, and that inspection must be documented and placed on file at City Hall," explained Webster. Any business with commercial kitchens, chemical usage, dedicated waterlines for fire suppressant systems, soda fountains, private wells, holding tanks, or various other cross-connection contamination possibilities, will be required to install the backflow devices.

Webster said that the city has two certified staff members trained as Customer Service Inspectors to inspect homes or businesses to determine whether the backflow devices will need to be installed, as well as a Certified Inspector who will inspect the backflow device after installation.

"The city will schedule a Customer Service Inspection with each commercial account, and will notify each business to let them know when their inspection will occur. If the designated time

for inspection needs to be changed, the business owner must contact City Hall to re-schedule the inspection. A nominal inspection fee will be charged per inspection.

A commercial account includes businesses, churches, schools, or any account that is non-residential. Residential inspections will not be scheduled, but homeowners who are unsure if they need the device may contact City Hall for an inspection.

Matt Hopper, City Engineer for the City of Tahoka, said that the reason the city is now requiring the backflow devices is that TCEQ's regulatory division has become more stringent in requiring compliance, in order to prevent contamination of city water systems.

"The City of Tahoka has had a city ordinance in effect since 1979 that gives the city authority to protect city water systems by enforcing backflow devices if needed," Hopper added.

If a business or home-

owner is required to have the backflow device(s) installed, the cost of each device is determined by the size of the waterline and other pertinent factors, Hopper explained. Devices for a 3/4-inch line range from \$160 to \$270, and for a 2-inch line from \$515 to \$630, and more for larger lines. The devices must be installed by a licensed plumber, and must be inspected by the City Inspector upon completion. The inspection documentation must be on file at City Hall, and TCEQ requires an annual testing/inspection on each backflow device.

"We are beginning the process with the commercial accounts first, to get a customer service inspection at every business," said Webster. "After the commercial accounts are taken care of, then we will begin focusing on the residential accounts."

Webster said that anyone with questions about the backflow devices or inspections may contact him at Tahoka City Hall, 561-4211.

DPS warns of the dangers of Puffing

The Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS) warns motorists the dangers of Puffing which refers to leaving unattended vehicles running waiting for it to warm-up. As the temperatures around the state drop, many motorists leave their vehicles unattended as they try to warm-up the car.

Puffing is very serious for two reasons. The first concern is if you leave your engine running for 10-15 minutes, that is a lot of emissions released into the air and a waste of gas. Secondly, car thieves are on the lookout for the white puffs emitted from

tailpipes on cold days and when the car is unattended, this makes for an easy target.

Authorities in Amarillo reported 939 stolen vehicles in 2018. Out of those reported stolen, 819 vehicles had the keys inside and the car was left running. That is 87% of the total number of stolen vehicles.

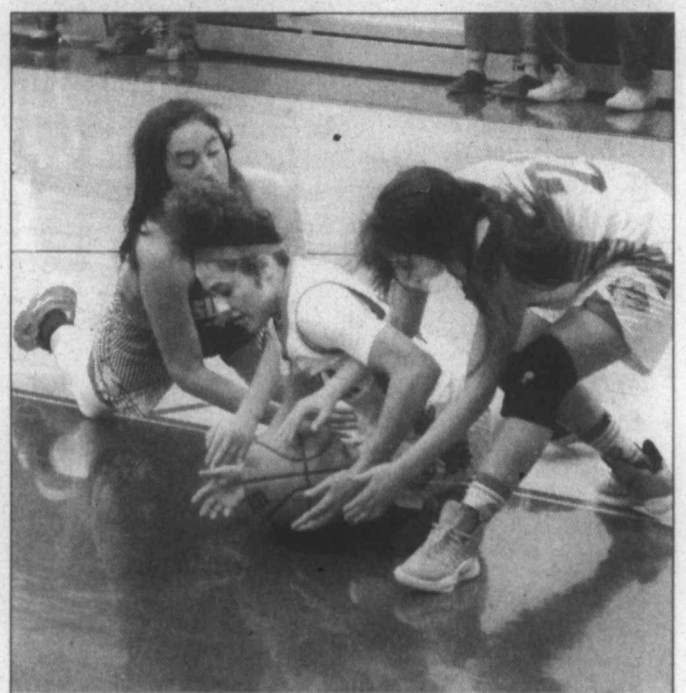

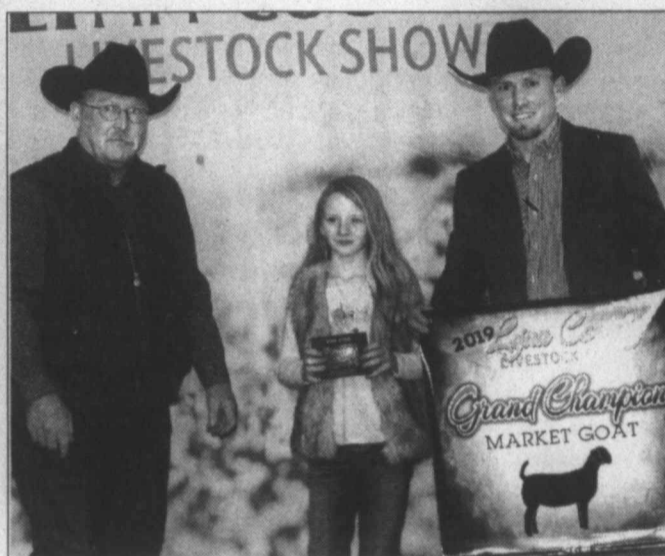

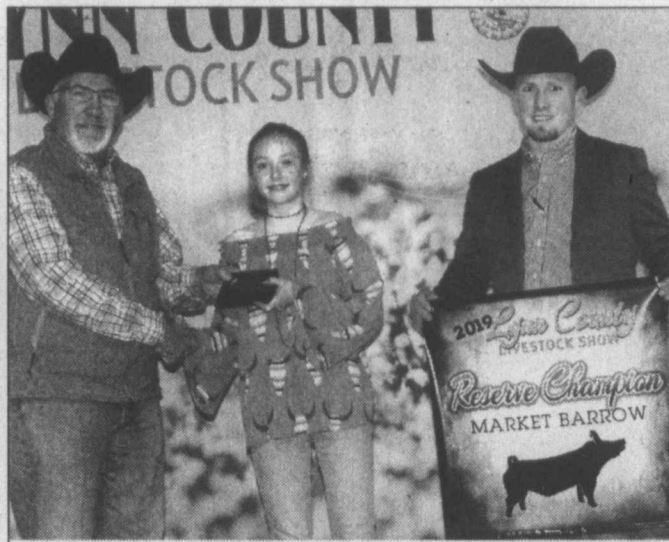

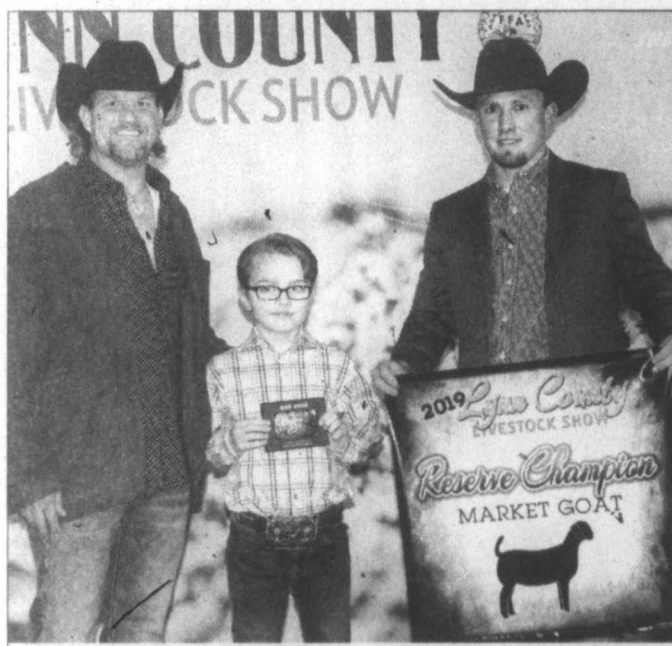

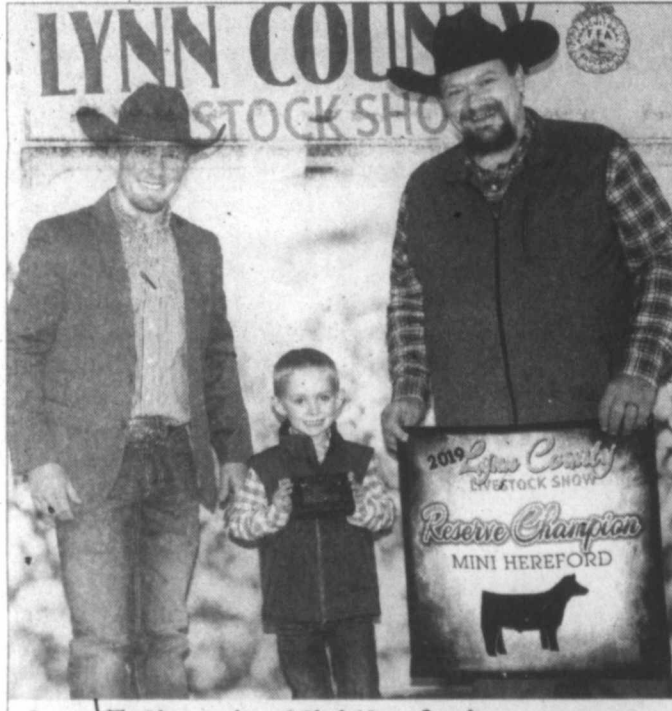

Traffic accidents, burglary in law reports

Two traffic accidents occurred during the past week, one of which involved hitting a deer on FM 400. Stephanie Yell of Wilson was the driver of a 2010 black Ford Escape that struck a deer on FM 400 just north of Tahoka at 4 p.m. last Thursday, Jan. 17. She told officers that both she and a passenger, her 17-year-old daughter, were cut by broken glass from the windshield. EMS responded, but no one was transported for further medical treatment.

Another accident occurred on FM 400 just after 4 p.m. on Monday, Jan. 21, north of Tahoka. A 2017 white Ford Escape driven by Frank Orlando Reyna of Tahoka reportedly clipped the bumper of a red 2016 Chevy pickup driven by Michael Norwood

of Lubbock, as the Chevy was stopping to turn on FM 400 just south of the Tahoka City landfill. No injuries were reported.

Tahoka Police arrested a 49-year-old male on charges of Burglary of a Habitation, after an officer on routine patrol at 11 p.m. Jan. 17 in the 2200 block of Ave. J observed an open window at a residence that had been placed on close patrol due to a prior break-in involving theft of property. No one was living at the residence at this time, but the officer found the man, who had no permission to be at the residence, hiding behind a couch inside the home. Frank Sepeda Jr., 49, was taken into custody on second degree felony burglary charges.

Several calls regarding suspicious vehicles were

on the Sheriff's Office call sheets, and an abandoned vehicle was reported a half mile inside the Lynn County line on US 84 at 4 p.m. Jan. 15. A red SUV parked on the side of US 84 was tagged by deputies for removal.

Criminal mischief was reported at 11:44 a.m. Jan. 14, when a caller reported that someone had vandalized his rearview camera on his pickup while parked at a residence at 1190 FM 211.

Possible poaching was reported at 10:42 p.m. Jan. 19, near FM 1054 and CR 17, when a caller reported that he and his friends, who had permission to be hunting on the land, had heard gun shots that sounded like machine rifles. He and his friends drove to where the sounds were coming from and saw a vehicle

take off speeding down a county road with no lights on. The Game Warden was notified of possible poached animals and will follow up on the case.

A bicycle that had been reported stolen a month previously in Tahoka was found on Jan. 16 at another local residence, but the owner of the bicycle did not want to proceed with charges against a juvenile male that was reportedly involved in the theft.

Lynn County Jail held 38 inmates during the week, including 18 for Ector County, 5 for Dawson, and 15 for Lynn County. Local charges included one for burglary of a habitation, one for possession of marijuana, one for unauthorized use of a vehicle, and one for driving while license suspended/invalid.

TCEQ will hold a public meeting if the executive director determines that there is a significant degree of public interest in the application or if requested by a local legislator. A public meeting is not a contested case hearing.

OPPORTUNITY FOR A CONTESTED CASE HEARING. After the deadline for submitting public comments, the executive director will consider all timely comments and prepare a response to all relevant and material, or significant public comments. Unless the application is directly referred for a contested case hearing, the response to comments, and the executive director's decision on the application, will be mailed to everyone who submitted public comments and to those persons who are on the mailing list for this application. If comments are received, the mailing will also provide instructions for requesting reconsideration of the executive director's decision and for requesting a contested case hearing. A contested case hearing is a legal proceeding similar to a civil trial in a state district court.

TO REQUEST A CONTESTED CASE HEARING, YOU MUST INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING ITEMS IN YOUR REQUEST: your name, address, phone number, applicant's name and proposed permit number; the location and distance of your property/activities relative to the proposed facility; a specific description of how you would be adversely affected by the facility in a way not common to the general public; a list of all disputed issues of fact that you submit during the comment period and, the statement "[I/we] request a contested case hearing." If the request for contested case hearing is filed on behalf of a group or association, the request must designate the group's representative for receiving future correspondence; identify by name and physical address an individual member of the group who would be adversely affected by the proposed facility or activity; provide the information discussed above regarding the affected member's location and distance from the facility or activity; explain how and why the member would be affected; and explain how the interests the group seeks to protect are relevant to the group's purpose.

Following the close of all applicable comment and request periods, the Executive Director will forward the application and any requests for reconsideration or for a contested case hearing to the TCEQ Commissioners for their consideration at a scheduled Commission meeting.

The Commission may only grant a request for a contested case hearing on issues the requestor submitted in their timely comments that were not subsequently withdrawn. If a hearing is granted, the subject of a hearing will be limited to disputed issues of fact or mixed questions of fact and law relating to relevant and material water quality concerns submitted during the comment period. TCEQ may act on an application to renew a permit without providing an opportunity for a contested case hearing if certain criteria are met.
