

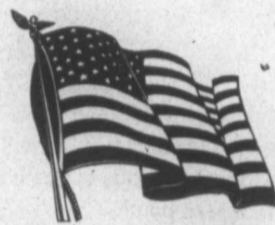

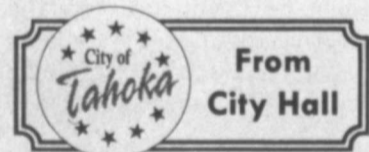

Commissioners consider fireworks regs; thank DPS Trooper Raney for her service

Lynn County Commissioners met for just over an hour Monday morning at the County Judge's office, approving an order regulating fireworks among other routine business. The fireworks order prohibits the use of missile/fin type fireworks in the county's unincorporated areas that may be fire hazards, such as hay/grassy areas, during the Texas Independence Day (March 2) holiday.

Lynn County's DPS Trooper Wanda Raney Mason announced her upcoming retirement from DPS in February, and she expressed her appreciation to county officials for their cooperation with the DPS during her time here.

"I wanted to let you know how much I appreciate everything you have done, and how much I appreciate the agencies working together so well," said Trooper Raney, now Mason. "Through all the phone calls you always answered my questions, and the county's budget for DPS was adequate for our needs,

you've never turned us down when we asked for something. Thank you for all you have done," she added. Trooper Mason has served in Lynn County since 2003.

County officials also expressed their gratitude for her services as well, saying, "We definitely have appreciated you here."

She informed the group that

must be requested during the current budget year as those instances occur, she explained. Commissioners took no action on the request.

Deputy Pete Vallejo presented the Sheriff's Dept. report, noting that sheriff's deputies have responded to 109 calls during the month of January (as of Jan. 27), and that four patrol units have

logged approximately 2500 miles per unit during the month. Some of the calls during the month included 10 calls for livestock on roadways, 12 accidents, 5 ambulance assists, 9 fires, 6

alarms, 3 theft reports, 16 reckless drivers, 5 motorist assists, 2 active house watch/close patrols, 2 unattended deaths, and other calls. He also noted that the Sheriff would be taking applications for another deputy position to fill, since one of the deputies has resigned to take the O'Donnell Chief of Police position.

Judge Mike Braddock led the session, with all commissioners present including Larry Durham, Don Blair, John Hawthorne and Matt Woodley, and others.

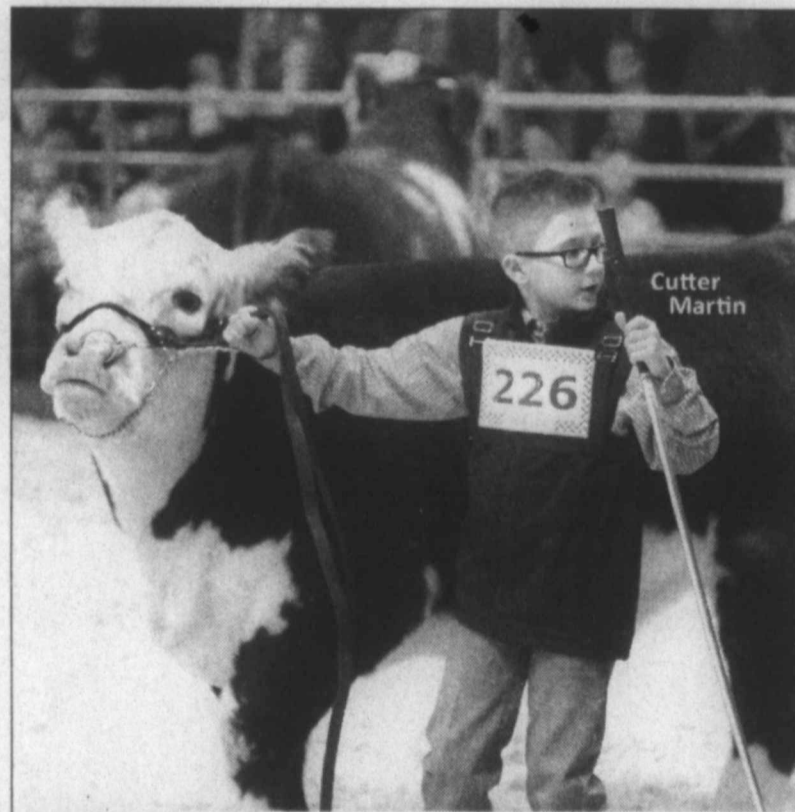

Fajita Dinner fundraiser set Sunday at St Jude

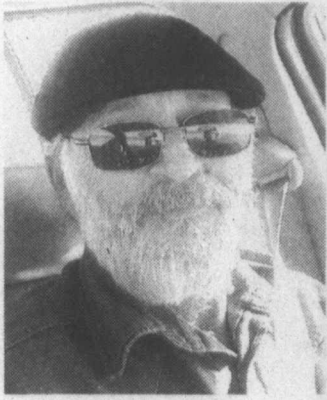

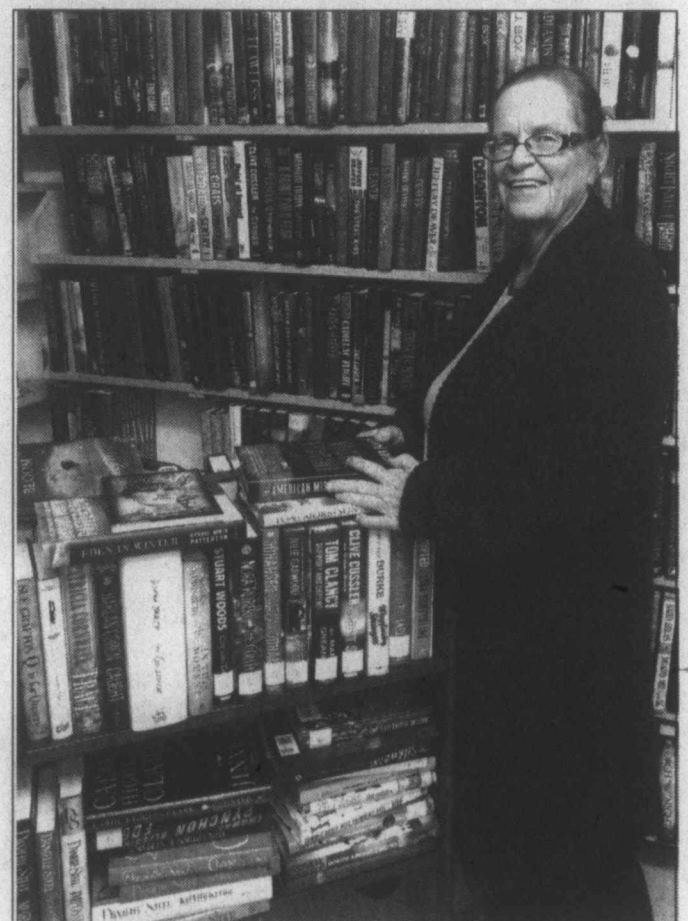

Traffic accidents, debris on road, loud music in law reports this week

Two traffic accidents were in Lynn County Sheriff's Office call sheet reports this week, both occurring on US 87. A caller reported at 10:08 a.m. last Tuesday, Jan. 22, that a white pickup had hit some type of animal on US 87 about 2-3 miles south of O'Donnell, and that it was lying in the center median. A responding deputy said the wreck was north of Allsup's on US 87 and that the vehicle had hit a dog, which had been killed. A veterinarian driving by reportedly picked up the dead animal.

At 2:22 p.m. last Wednesday, Jan. 23, a silver Nissan driven by Joanna Villanueva of Odessa ran into the back of an 18-wheeler driven by Manuel Gomez of Lubbock. The Nissan driver told officers that the 18-wheeler had pulled out in front of her about 11 miles south of Tahoka on US 87. No injuries were reported.

Deputies assisted a motorist who ran out of gas at 2:34 a.m. last Thursday, Jan. 24 on US 87, south of FM 213. The driver said she ran out of gas while driving to work in Lamesa. The deputy gave the driver a ride to Allsup's

in O'Donnell to get some gas, and took her back to her vehicle.

A caller reported debris on the road about 3 miles north of New Home on FM 1730 last Thursday at 8:45 a.m. The deputy responding to the call found several firewood logs in the middle of the road at the double curves north of New Home, and he removed the logs from the road.

A caller reported loud music playing from a radio from a construction crew building a house nearby in the Palms Estates in New Home, at 2:07 p.m. last Wednesday. A deputy told the crew to turn down the music.

On Saturday at 6:20 p.m. a caller reported that there was a couple with a toddler walking southbound on the side of US 87 approximately 6-7 miles north of Tahoka, telling the Sheriff's Office he was concerned because the toddler had on a thin jacket and it was getting colder outside. A responding deputy was unable to locate the family.

Sheriff's deputies also responded to a domestic disturbance call in New Home, and a report of a phone scam from

a county citizen who said he had been receiving up to 7 automated calls daily on his cell phone. He reported the callback number to the Sheriff's Office.

A suspicious person was reported walking near the Lubbock/Lynn County line on US 87 at 7:25 p.m. Jan. 24. A deputy located the male subject at CR 1 and US 87 and reported that he was picked up by his mother.

Tahoka Police arrested a 42-year-old Tahoka female at 12:42 a.m. on Jan. 28 on a warrant for No/Expired Vehicle Registration, and arrested a 26-year-old Tahoka male at 11:50 p.m. on Jan. 25 on a warrant for ARP Child Support Violation out of Lubbock County.

Lynn County Jail held 42 inmates during the past week, including 27 for Ector County, 4 for Dawson, and 11 for Lynn County. Local charges included one for Driving While Intoxicated/Open Alcohol Container, one for possession of drug paraphernalia, one for a parole warrant, one for No/Expired Vehicle Registration, and one for Probation Violation-Child Support.

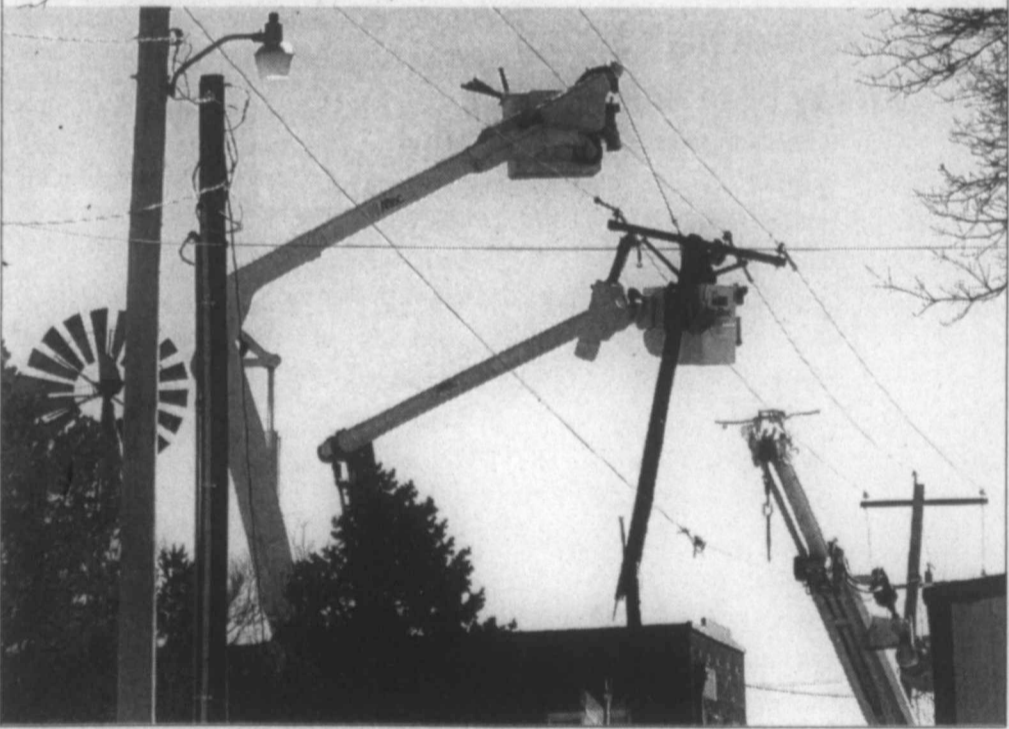

Commercial Turf and Ornamental workshop set Feb. 15 in Lubbock

The Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service will be holding its 2019 Commercial Turf and Ornamental Workshop on Feb. 15 at the AgriLife Extension office in Lubbock.

The workshop will be held at the first-floor auditorium of the AgriLife Extension office from 9 a.m. - 3 p.m., with day-of registration starting at 8:30 a.m. The registration fee covers the course, CEUs and a catered lunch.

The workshop will offer five Texas Department of Agriculture pesticide applicator continuing education units. The cost is \$35 if preregistered by 5 p.m. on Feb. 1, or \$45 at the door.

Checks can be made out to AgriLife Extension Account 272100 and mailed to Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service, 916 Main St., Lubbock, Texas, 79401.

"Although the talks will be targeted to professionals holding commercial pesticide applicators licenses, the information is useful for anyone who manages plants or a landscape," said Christina Reid, AgriLife Extension horticulture agent, Lubbock County.

"This will benefit everyone from homeowners to lawn and landscape care professionals and ag and horticulture specialists."

Topics covered will include:

- Managing rose rosette disease in the landscape.
- Turfgrass management for West Texas.

- New laws and regulations for pesticide applicators.

- Managing entomosporeum leaf spot.
- Herbicide resistant weeds in the landscape.

Oil and natural gas royalties paid to state up 18%, totaling \$2.0 billion in FY 2018

AUSTIN - The Texas oil and natural gas industry paid \$2.0 billion in royalties to the State of Texas in fiscal year 2018, up 18 percent over the previous year. The majority of these royalties are used to capitalize the Permanent School Fund (PSF), which benefits the public schools of Texas, and the Permanent University Fund (PUF), which benefits public higher education in Texas.

Oil and natural gas royalties constitute the only substantive new-money capital deposited annually to the PSF and PUF, according to the Texas Oil & Gas Association (TXOGA). In addition to state royalties, the oil and natural

gas industry pays billions of dollars in state and local taxes, figures that have also increased substantially. TXOGA will make its annual Economic Impact Announcement in February, detailing total state and local taxes and state royalties paid in fiscal year 2018. In fiscal year 2017, that number was \$1.1 billion.

"The Texas Permanent School Fund is the largest educational endowment in the nation because of oil and natural gas royalty revenue," said Todd Staples, president of TXOGA. "With a balance of \$41.4 billion at the end of fiscal year 2017, the PSF topped Harvard University's endowment, worth \$39.2 billion. It is remarkable that the PSF, seldom recognized outside of Texas, leads the pack among all educational endowments - and all Texans benefit from it."

According to the Texas Permanent School Fund's annual report for fiscal year 2017, "a distribution is made every year from the Fund to pay a portion of educational costs in each school district within the state. During the 2017 fiscal year, the Fund distributed approximately \$1.06 billion for education."

"With royalties up 18 percent in fiscal year 2018, we can only expect the balances of these important endowments to grow, providing meaningful support for our public schools and university systems," said Staples.

Other business sectors in Texas, such as grazing and land leases, that pay royalties to the state represent just one-twentieth of the total (\$0.1 billion).
