## Tahoka ISD Board of Trustees call for Bond Election on May 4

Tahoka Independent School District Board of Trustees met in special session Monday night, unanimously approving an Order calling for a Bond Election relating to the possible issuance of \$7,500,000 in school district bonds, providing for the conduct of the election, and other matters incident thereto, and authorizing the Board President, Board Secretary and/or Superintendent to execute any and all documents necessary. The Special Election will be held in conjunction with the upcoming May 4 general trustee election.

On the ballot, voters may mark 'For' or 'Against' Proposition A, which will read: "The issuance of \$7,500,000 of bonds by Tahoka Independent School District for the construction, acquisition, renovation and equipment of school buildings in the district, the purchase of new school buses, and the levying of the tax for payment thereof."

TISD Superintendent Dick Van Hoose explained that the Board of Trustees has several proposals to

consider if the bond is approved, the first priority of which is to build a new gymnasium. The new gym proposal is being considered for the N. 5th Street land that the school district acquired years ago but has yet to build any facilities there. It encompasses approximately 30 acres, and is currently leased in ag production. The proposal may also include new baseball/softball facilities at the new location. Also under consideration is constructing a new athletic field house, some remodeling of the high school facility, and possibly the purchase of new school buses.

In a previous session, the TISD Board approved hiring Chapman Harvey Architects, Inc. of Lubbock to design a proposal for a new high school gymnasium for the school district. Trustees rated three contractors for the construction proposal, rating Lee Lewis Construction as their top rated choice for Construction Manager At-Risk for the proposed project.

## Man dies after gunshot wound at shooting facility in county

A 21-year-old man was fatally injured in a shooting incident Monday afternoon at Lubbock Shooting Complex, a shooting range facility located on County Road 1 in the northwestern area of Lynn County. The man, identified by officials as Avery Isaiah Watkins from the Dallas-Fort Worth metroplex area, allegedly was renting shooting space/target and a gun and ammunition at the facility, when the self-inflicted gunshot wound occurred at approximately 2:30 p.m. Lynn County EMS and Lubbock Aerocare EMS both responded to the scene. The Texas Rangers are assisting the Lynn County Sheriff's Office with the ongoing investigation, and the Lynn County Justice of Peace has ordered an autopsy.

Three individuals were sentenced in 106th District Court proceedings held in Tahoka on Jan. 22, after entering guilty pleas in front of 106th District Judge Reed Filley. Two were sentenced to state jail facilities, and one was sentenced to community supervision.

Judge Filley sentenced the following:

- Barbara Antu, 36, sentenced to 10 months in a state jail facility, commencing Jan. 22, 2019 with 119 days credit for time already served, plus court costs; for the offense of Endangering a Child that occurred June 28, 2018.

- Anthony Silvas, Judgment Revoking Community Supervision, sentenced to 10 months in a state jail facility, plus original restitution of \$5,235 to Virginia Paris; for the offense of burglary of a building that occurred July 24, 2017 with

original punishment assessed of 4 years Community Supervision plus restitution.

- Lisa Cruz, 23, sentenced to 4-years Deferred Adjudication of Guilt/Community Supervision plus restitution of \$9,308 to the Texas Dept. of Health and Human Services, plus \$500 fine, plus court costs; for the offense of Execution of a Document by Deception \$2500-\$30,000 that occurred on Oct. 5, 2015.

Lynn County deputies responded to 8 calls reporting reckless drivers during the past week, including one that resulted in the arrest of a 34-year-old Tahoka male on charges of Driving While Intoxicated after a deputy followed the vehicle from US 87 and stopped the vehicle at Ave. J and N. 4th, at 7:50 p.m. Jan. 31.

County deputies assisted with a chase in progress southbound on FM 179 in Lubbock County at midnight Feb. 2. The vehicle went through Lynn County but ended up back in Lubbock County on FM 1585, where two subjects were taken into custody.

A possible hunter was reported on land 2 miles east of FM 1054 about 7:15 p.m. Feb. 2, after lights were seen in the area. The Game Warden was notified and responded to the scene, but was unable to locate anyone.

Lynn County Jail held 42 inmates during the past week, including 27 for Ector County, 4 Dawson, and 11 for Lynn County. Local charges included one for FTA-Speeding, and one for Driving While Intoxicated.

## Text to 9-1-1 is now available in Lynn, surrounding counties

Lynn County's emergency 9-1-1 system is now capable of accepting an emergency text to 9-1-1, which can be used in an emergency if someone is unable to make a regular voice call to 9-1-1. The upgrade to the 9-1-1 system is not only to the Lynn County 9-1-1 emergency system but the entire South Plains area as well, according to information this week from the Lynn County Sheriff's Office.

"As of Jan. 28, Lynn County can now accept emergency texts to 9-1-1," said Lt. Luis Vasquez, Communications Supervisor at the Lynn County Sheriff's Office. "However, this option should only be used in situations when someone is unable to make a voice call," he explained.

Texting to 9-1-1 is a good option if someone is deaf or hard of hearing, or if a person's safety could be

compromised if speaking out loud. Such situations might include domestic violence, home invasions, abductions, or school shootings.

Texting to 9-1-1 is no different than sending a normal text message. Simply enter 911 in the recipient field, compose a message, and then press send. If Text to 9-1-1 is not available in an area, then the sender will receive a bounceback text message that requests that you call 9-1-1 for help.

"Whenever possible, you should always make a voice call to 9-1-1 for the quickest help," says Vasquez. Just like other text messages, delays are possible, which is why it is always best to call 9-1-1 if able.

Please note, Text to 9-1-1 cannot receive video or pictures via text messages at this time.

As with voice calls to 9-1-1, tex-

ting to 9-1-1 should only be used in true emergencies. If you accidentally call or text 9-1-1, do not hang up - stay on the line and explain to the 9-1-1 dispatcher that the call was an accident.

The telephone number 911 is for emergency calls in North America. To use it for any other type of calls, such as a prank call, could be considered a crime. Some Public Safety Answering Points (PSAPs) report that 15%-20% of incoming 911 calls are non-emergencies. An emergency is a life-threatening situation where every second counts, such as a heart attack, uncontrolled asthma attack, child birth in progress, any event involving large amounts of blood, uncontrolled fire, a life-threatening event such as a knife fight, an armed robbery in progress, or a serious car accident (not a fender bender).

- Over 240 million calls are made to 911 in the U.S. each year.
- The first-ever 911 call in the United States happened on Feb. 16, 1968, in Haleyville, Ala. It wasn't until 1999 that Congress directed the FCC to make 911 the universal emergency number for the United States for all telephone services.

## Chapman, Sullivan make ATSSB All-State Band

For only the third time in the history of Tahoka High School bands have two students qualified for the All-State Band in the same year, once in 2000 and in 2004. This year THS senior Dalton Chapman, a contra-alto clarinet player, and sophomore Nathaniel Sullivan, a clarinetist, both qualified for the Association of Texas Small School Bands' All-State Bands. Dalton is the son of Tracey Chapman and Nathaniel is the son of James and Michelle Sullivan.

More than 10,000 high school band students from across Texas auditioned in 22 different regions for a place in their respective Honor Bands. The top chairs in each region advanced to one of the five area auditions held in January across the state and only 280 of these 2,288 students were selected for all-state honors.

The ATSSB All-State Bands will rehearse in San Antonio, February 13-16, and will present a concert beginning at 9:00 a.m. on Saturday, February 16, 2019 in the Lila Cockrell Theatre of the Henry B. Gonzales Convention Center in downtown San Antonio. Directing the A-AA-AAA All-State Concert Band will be Dennis Johnson of Murray State University of Kentucky. Dr. Cody Birdwell of the University of Kentucky will be the clinician-conductor of the 4A All-State Symphonic Band.

"Needless to say, we are extremely proud of these two outstanding young men and for all the hard work they have put in to rise to this high honor. In the past 24 years only 18 students from Tahoka have made the ATSSB All-State Band," stated directors Carroll Rhodes and Cristal Burse.

HERE IT IS already the second week in February, with Lincoln's birthday and Valentine Day coming up this weekend.

Abraham Lincoln, if he were alive, would be 200 years old today, and I think I am beginning to realize how he would feel. He was born poor and, although he is considered one of the greatest leaders of all time, he could never be president in today's political scene, because now you have to be pretty wealthy just to make a run at the job.

He was called Honest Abe, and may have been the last honest man ever to hold office in Washington. Well, maybe not, but an honest politician these days has little chance of success. I had a friend who used to say, "I don't want an honest man in office; I want a crook who is on my side."

He was assassinated while attending a play in a theater. I don't recall ever hearing what the play was all about, if it was almost over, or what.

VALENTINE'S DAY, once celebrated with machine gun fire up north, and originally based on some kind of Roman holiday where young girls were chased around and whacked with switches or some such nonsense, is better celebrated locally by grandparents bragging on their kids, and a lot of cute ones are shown in this issue of the newspaper.

St. Valentine was two people, the encyclopedia tells me. It was a name given to two Christian martyrs whose feasts were formerly observed on Feb. 14. One was believed to be a Roman priest martyred "during the persecution of Claudius the Goth, and buried on the Flaminian Way; the second was probably a bishop of Terni martyred in Rome. It is possible that these two legends were based on real people or, as some believe, one person. The association of St. Valentine's Day with love and courtship may have arisen from the coincidence of the date with the Roman festival of Lupercalia, a feast day dropped from the Roman church calendar in 1969."

Since the St. Valentines had their feasts on the same day the Romans had a love feast, so the day comes to be a day of love and courting. We observe the feast part by pigging out on chocolates.

The encyclopedia digressed into birthstones and associated beliefs, and told me that the purple amethyst is St. Valentine's stone and it also protects its owner from drunkenness. I never saw a purple amethyst; it sounds like some kind of demon. Nor do I need any prothesian from intoshication.

## Study program uses music to reconnect with seniors with dementia

AUSTIN — The Texas Health and Human Services Commission has selected 26 nursing facilities from across the state that have been certified as participants in the Music & Memory program for 2019. The program provides MP3 players to seniors with dementia to help them reconnect with the world through music-triggered memories, which can improve quality of life and quality of care.

Texas has invested nearly \$47,000 so far on the newly participating facilities' equipment and program certifications. Each facility received 15 MP3 players and iTunes gift cards for residents to purchase music for their personalized playlists.

A new research study, funded by HHSC, is being conducted by The University of Texas at Austin School of Nursing to measure the effectiveness of the program in

reducing the use of antipsychotic medications in Texas nursing facility residents with dementia.

"Our vision is to make a difference in the lives of Texans. The Music & Memory program fulfills that vision and offers a unique opportunity to boost quality of life for seniors in Texas who have dementia or other memory issues," HHSC Deputy Executive Commissioner Stephanie Muth said.

The 26 new participating providers include nursing facilities in the following cities: Allen, Atlanta, Austin, Ballinger, Castroville, Corpus Christi, Denison, Devine, Dallas, Granbury, Hamilton, Hillsboro, Humble, Houston, Lubbock, Pleasanton, Red Oak, Round Rock, San Angelo, San Antonio, Uvalde and Waxahachie.

The program, funded via Civil Money Penalties, has a

\$550,651 budget for the grant period April 27, 2017 to 2019. The grant includes the costs of 3,000 MP3 players for 200 participating facilities across the state. The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services imposes CMPs against Medicare- or Medicaid-certified nursing facilities found out of compliance with federal requirements. Sections 1819 and 1919 of the Social Security Act allow CMP funds to be used for projects and activities that benefit residents. The program was launched in 2015 as a pilot program in nursing facilities and launched at HHSC's State Supported Living Centers and Austin State Hospital in 2016. Since then, 485 nursing homes across Texas have taken part in the HHSC Music & Memory program. It is part of HHSC's initiative to reduce inappropriate use of antipsychotics in Texas nursing homes.

Taylor, President of the Board of Trustees, explained to *The News* that the district is considering a new gym proposal at this time to take advantage of tax funding from the now-operational wind energy facility that operates within the school district. Supt. Van Hoose said he wants to explain to the public how the wind energy projects can benefit the school district in building a new gym facility.

Trustees also took action Monday to hire Underwood Law Firm as bond counsel, approved an order calling for the General Trustee Election for District 1, 2 and 5, and a

Special Trustee Election for the remaining year of a 3-year term for District 4. A joint election agreement was approved with the City of Tahoka for the May 4 elections.

Six of seven trustees were present at Monday's meeting, including Board President Clay Taylor, Jon Luna, Lea Swinford, Doug Green, Blanda Watt, and Slate May. Drew Stone was absent.

Voters approved a \$9-million TISD bond election in 2016 to demolish the original three-story high school building and build a new auditorium and middle school, place new windows in the elementary buildings, and other projects. Those projects are nearing completion. Currently the tax rate for Tahoka ISD is \$1.43, which includes \$1.17 for Maintenance and Operating, and 26-cents in the Interest and Sinking (I&S) fund which pays for the 2016 bond repayment. The debt obligation on that bond, after this year's payment, is \$11,929,325.

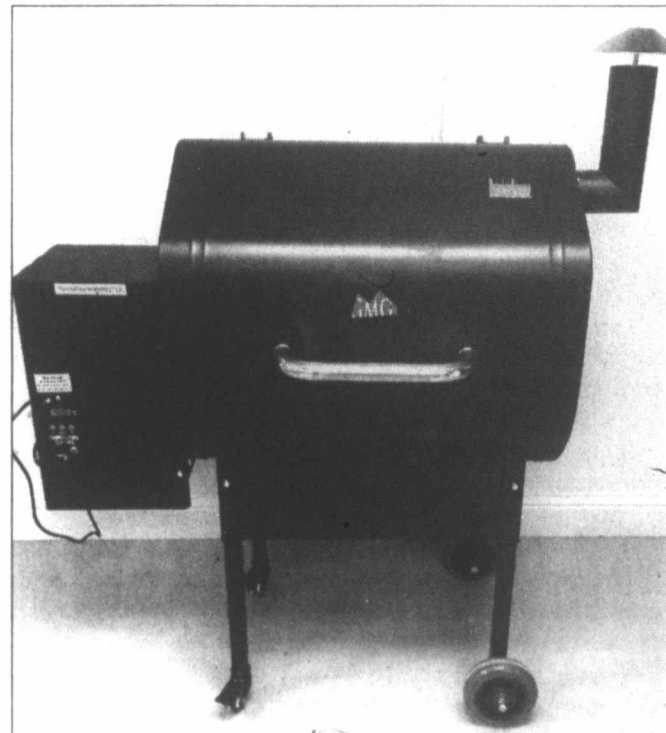

Teachers and school staff identify those students who are in need of the additional food.

All students remain anonymous. Volunteers pack the bags weekly and then the bags are discreetly placed in the students' backpacks on Fridays before they go home for the weekend.

"A student who is focused more on hunger simply cannot learn as well as other students. We think of hungry children as being in some other place but they are also right here in our own community. Snack Pack for Kids Tahoka funding comes 100% from donations," said the volunteer.

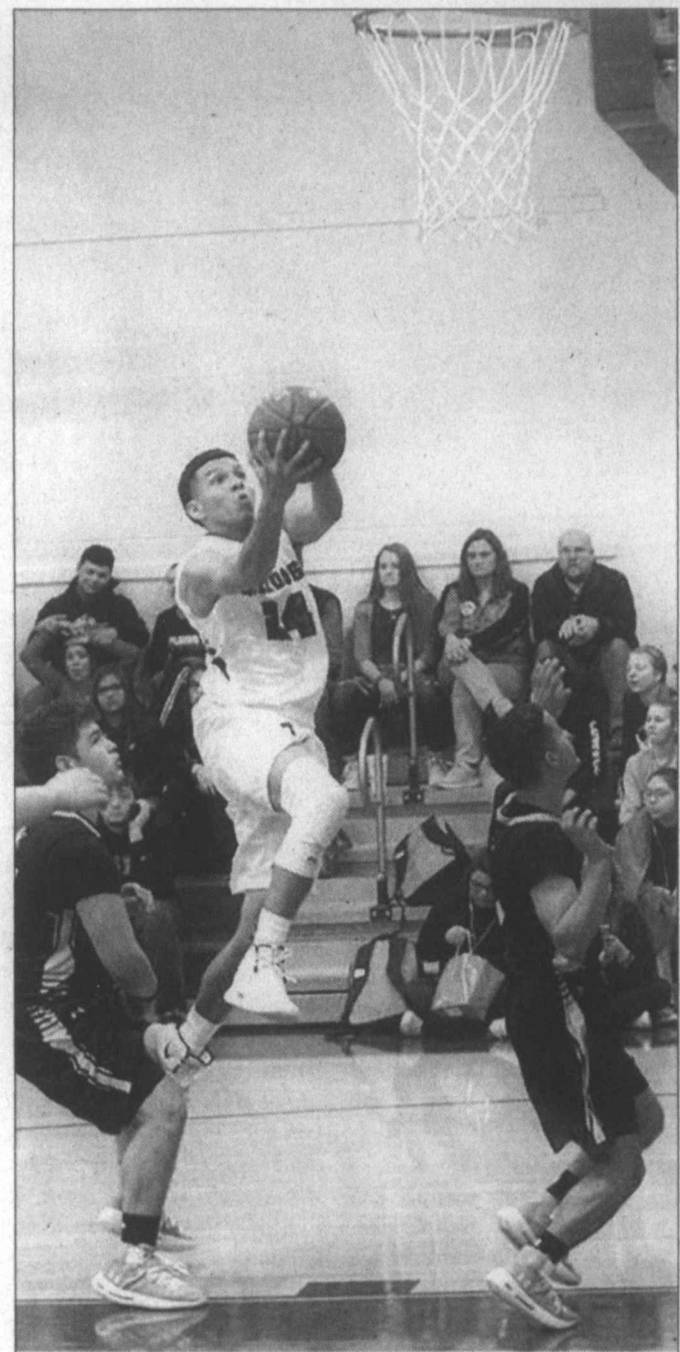

Through Feb. 15, 2019, Texas A&M Forest Service is accepting applications that could result in reimbursement to eligible recipients of up to \$2,500 for the cost of trees, weed barriers, planting contractors, drip irrigation systems, and other items associated with the creation of vegetative fuel breaks.

"This grant is intended to help protect communities in the high plains by reducing the risks of catastrophic wildfire events on both public and private lands," said Logan Scherschel, Wildland Urban Interface Specialist III with Texas A&M Forest Service. "Our hope is that landowners will apply for this grant and then construct vegetative fuel breaks on their property

ahead of fire season." Green vegetative fuel breaks are trees and shrubs that are systematically planted adjacent to fields, homesteads, or feedlots as a barrier to reduce or redirect the wind. As a result, the fuel breaks can impact wind-driven fire behavior that will allow time for residents or firefighters to evacuate before the fire impacts nearby homes or structures.

Fuel break projects eligible for the grant funds will consist of three rows of trees minimum and span at least 400 feet in length.

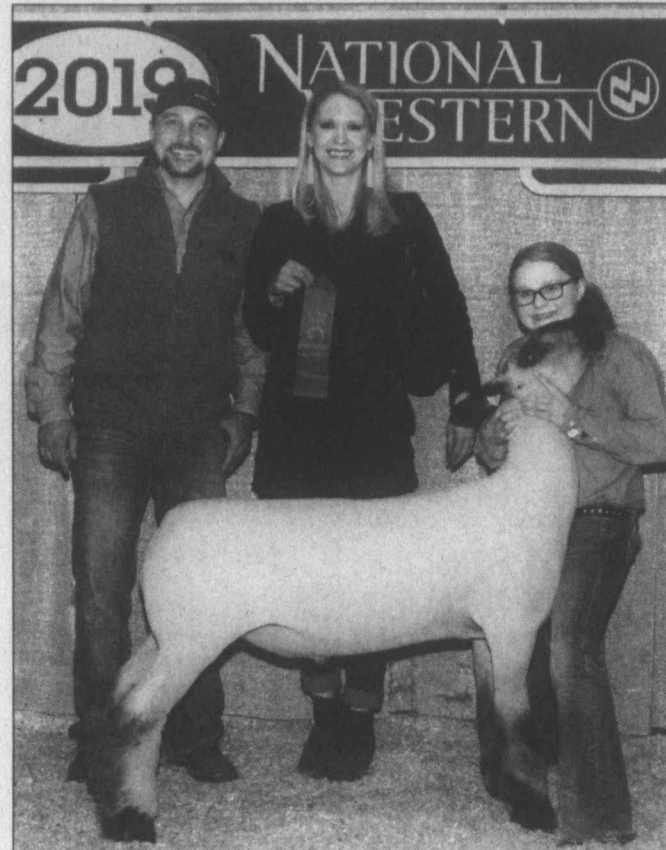
Scherschel said Texas A&M Forest Service representatives are happy to answer any questions landowners have regarding the application process or how a vegetative fuel break can mitigate the risk of property damage caused by wildfires.

All grant applicants will be notified of a decision by

March 15, 2019. Texas A&M Forest Service does not complete the actual planting and building of the vegetative fuel break but will conduct an on-site assessment of the landowner's property prior to the approval of an application. If an application is approved, Texas A&M Forest Service will then further discuss the project details with the recipient.

"This is a quick 30-45 minute application that can be completed and mailed. The application can be downloaded or a copy can be picked up at the Lynn County Emergency Management Office," said William Schoemann, Emergency Management Coordinator for Lynn County. 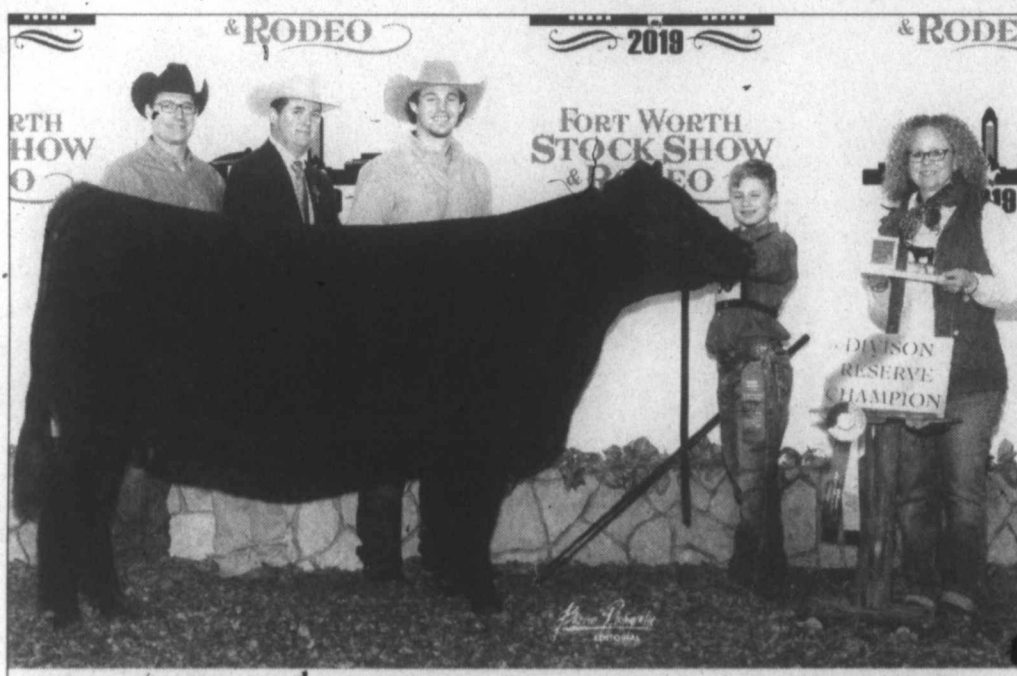

**NRCS announces 2019 deadline for Conservation Assistance Funding**

The USDA-Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) in Texas has announced the first funding application deadline of March 15, 2019 for the Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP). A second funding application deadline is scheduled for May 10, 2019.

Applications are taken year around for NRCS programs, but deadlines are announced to rank and fund eligible conservation projects. Producers interested in signing up for EQIP should submit applications to their local USDA service center or if already a USDA client, on-line via Conservation Client Gateway (CCG).

EQIP is a voluntary pro-

gram that provides financial and technical assistance to agricultural producers. Technical assistance is provided without a fee from NRCS specialists to help landowners and land managers plan and implement conservation practices to help them meet their land management goals, address natural resource concerns and improve soil, water, plant, animal, air, and related resources on agricultural land and non-industrial private forestland.
