Voters in the Tahoka school district may vote early at the Lynn County Clerk's Office, 1627 Ave. K, from 8 a.m.-12 noon and 1-5 p.m. Monday through Friday. Two 12-hour early voting days will be conducted, from 7 a.m.-7 p.m., on Monday, April 22, and on Tuesday,

Tahoka ISD canceled their trustee elections with unopposed candidates, so the only issue on the special election ballot will be the \$7.5 million bond proposal. Proposition A will read: "The issuance of \$7,500,000 of bonds by Tahoka

Early Voting for the May 4 Independent School District for the construction, acquisition, renovation and equipment of school buildnew school buses, and the levying gymnasium, baseball field, softball field, field house and football practice field, and make improvements to the high school building. 


