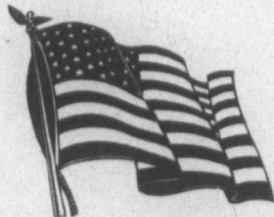

Variety of animal calls, motorcycle incidents, in weekly call sheet reports

Dogs, cats, a horse, and a deer were the subjects of calls to the Lynn County Sheriff's Office during the past week, a motorcycle accident north of Tahoka resulted in two people with injuries, and a motorcycle chase from Lynn to Dawson County had officers in pursuit of the bike that reached 104 mph.

Two people were reportedly found lying on the ground after a motorcycle accident on FM 400 north of the Tahoka Landfill on Friday evening, at 5:48 p.m., according to the call sheet information at Lynn County Sheriff's Office. Two Lynn County Hospital EMS units were dispatched to the scene. The driver, John Dalton Linton, 55, and passenger, Jenny Lynn Linton, 62, were transported to a Lubbock hospital by ambulances for treatment of injuries that were reportedly serious but not life-threatening. Both were reportedly released from the hospital on Monday. DPS, Tahoka Police Dept. and Lynn County Sheriff's officers all responded to the accident.

A motorcycle chase on Saturday night had DPS, Lynn County Sheriff's Office and Tahoka and O'Donnell Police Depts. involved in a pursuit where speeds reportedly reached 104 mph. The chase of a man on a white motorcycle began 2 miles north of Tahoka on US 87 southbound at 7:51 p.m., and ended in Dawson County where the motorcycle was stopped at the old WalMart parking lot in Lamesa. The driver was taken into custody by DPS.

An injured deer was reported at 8:55 p.m. last Thursday, after a driver reported hitting a young buck 11 miles south of Tahoka on US 87. He told the Sheriff's Office that his vehicle did not have any damage, but the deer was still alive and suffering. A Game Warden was notified, but the driver said the deer died a few minutes later, and he moved it off the roadway.

A caller reported what was believed to be animal cruelty on Saturday, reporting a brown and white horse that looked very skinny, on the north side of FM 211 at a residence near CR 11. A deputy responded, however, that this residence was a place that rescued mistreated horses and nurses them back to health.

A woman in New Home called Saturday about 8 p.m. to report that a stray cat had showed up at her home and was foaming at the mouth. A deputy arrived but could not locate the cat. The next day, at 9:24 Sunday morning, the woman called again and said the cat was back, and was now foaming at the mouth and hissing at her anytime she gets near her door. A deputy and an animal control officer attempted to catch the cat, but were unsuccessful. A cat trap was set up at her residence.

Two reports of aggressive dogs in Wilson were on the call sheet. Last Tuesday a caller said a large black dog kept showing up at her residence in the 1700 block of 13th Street in Wilson and she was afraid it might bite her. The next day, a caller from the 1600 block of 14th St. in Wilson reported that his dog was attacked by another dog, and that he needed an officer there before he shot the attacking dog, which was reportedly injured and aggressive. A deputy responded, and said that a neighbor was going to watch the dog until the owner arrived to take care of him.

A resident in Wilson reported last Tuesday that his house was

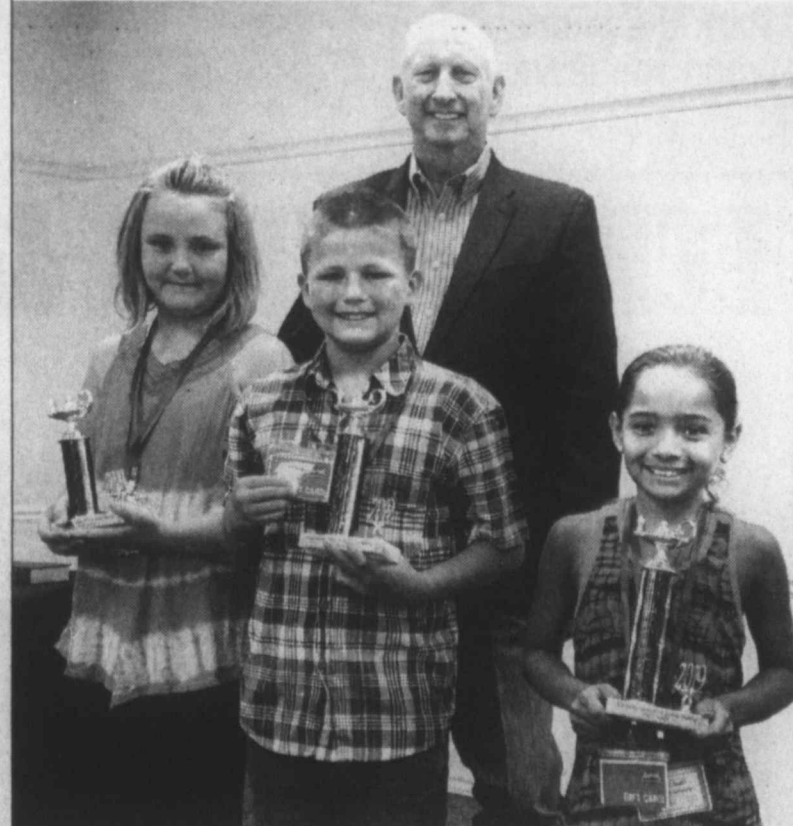

Summer Reading...

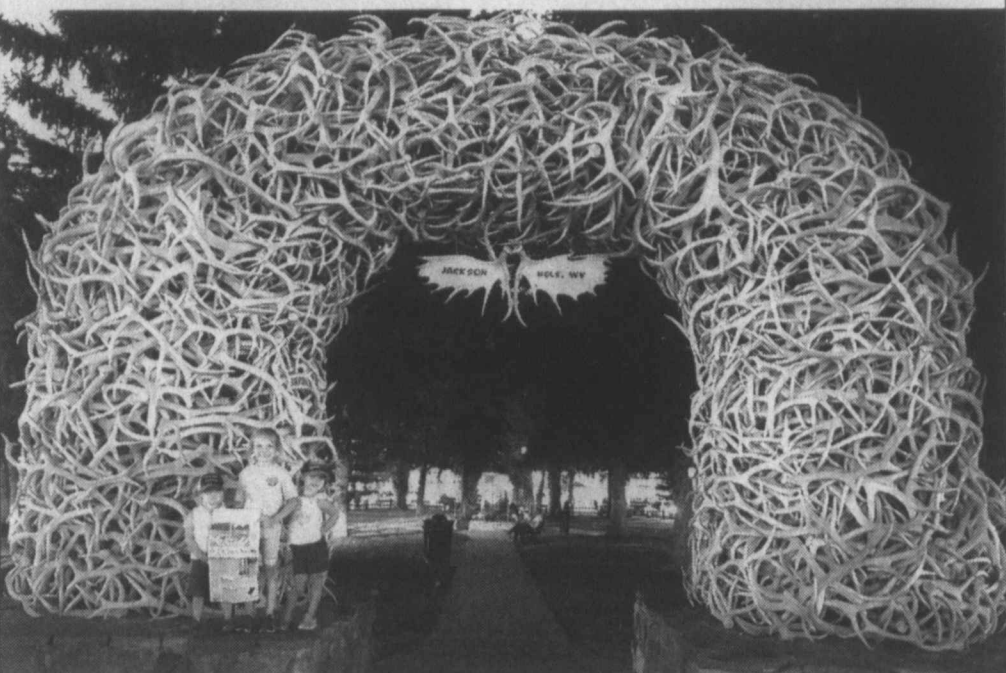
Summer Reading was a huge success at the Library this summer with 5,506 books logged.

From City Hall

To All Home Owners:

The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality has notified the City of Tahoka all residences that have an irri-

gation system, water well or a swimming pool be equipped with a back-flow prevention device. This device will prevent any contaminated water to back flow into our public water system. The back-flow prevention device must be installed on your water supply service line.

The back-flow prevention device may be installed by the home owner, or a certified plumber. After installation it must be inspected by a certified back-flow assembly tester. You may use any certified tester. However, the city does have a certified tester on staff if you want to use him.

You may be required to have the back-flow device inspected annually. It will depend on what type of back-flow prevention device you are required to install. If it has to be inspected, a copy must be furnished to the city.

The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality has requested the city begin the program as soon as possible.

We will be driving the neighborhoods to determine which houses will be have to be inspected. To speed up this process, we are asking all home owners who have an irrigation system, well or swimming pool to contact city hall as soon as possible. A Customer Service Inspection will be conducted to determine the type of backflow prevention device that will be required.



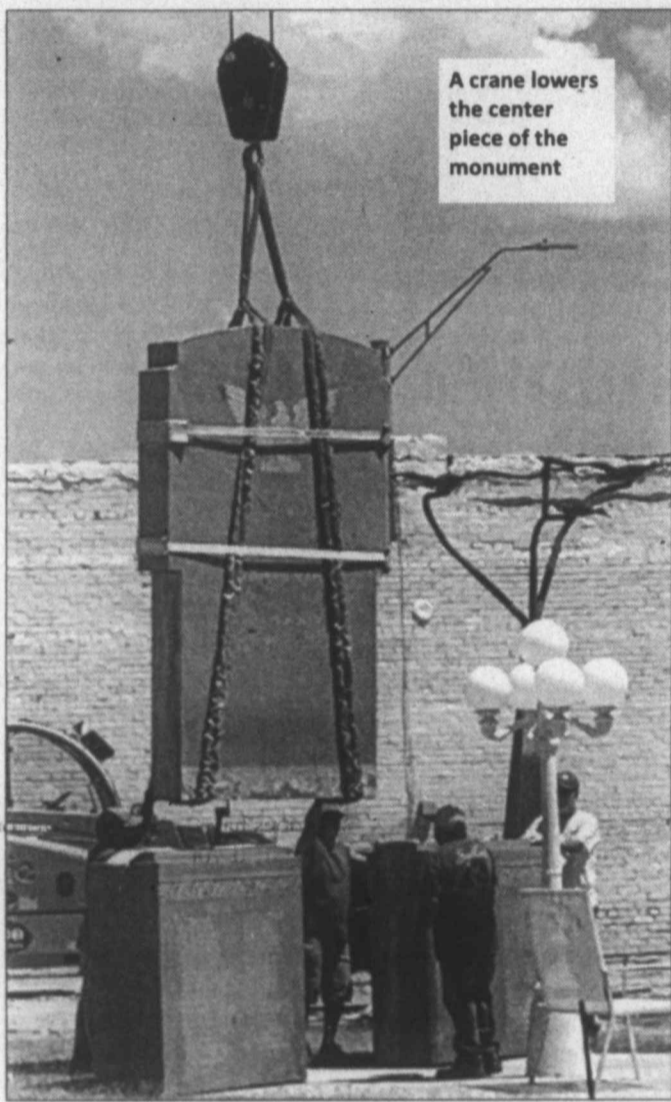

LCHD publishes notice of effective tax rate for 2019

Inside this issue of *The News*, Lynn County Hospital District is publishing their Notice of Effective Tax Rate, which is about a penny lower than last year's tax rate of \$0.258800, at \$0.248067 per \$100 of property value. The effective tax rate is the rate that would collect the same amount of total taxes as last year. The tax base for the hospital district has increased by \$21,764,824, according to the figures on the notice. Last year's tax base was \$522,649,246, and this year's adjusted tax base is at \$544,414,070. The effective tax rate of \$0.248067 is the maximum rate that the hospital district can set, unless LCHD publishes notices and holds public hearings. The rollback tax rate for this year is \$0.267912. A rollback rate is the maximum rate that can be set without triggering an election process that taxpayers can start tax rollback procedures.

This notice concerns 2019 (insert year) property tax rates for LYNN CO HOSPITAL DISTRICT (insert taxing unit name)

It presents information about three tax rates. Last year's tax rate is the actual rate the taxing unit used to determine property taxes last year. This year's effective tax rate would impose the same total taxes as last year if you compare properties taxed in both years. This year's rollback tax rate is the highest tax rate the taxing unit can set before taxpayers can start tax rollback procedures. In each case these rates are found by dividing the total amount of taxes by the tax base (the total value of taxable property) with adjustments as required by state law. The rates are given per \$100 of property value.

*Did you know?
... about dogs*

Tahoka FFA members awarded with Lone Star FFA Degrees at state convention

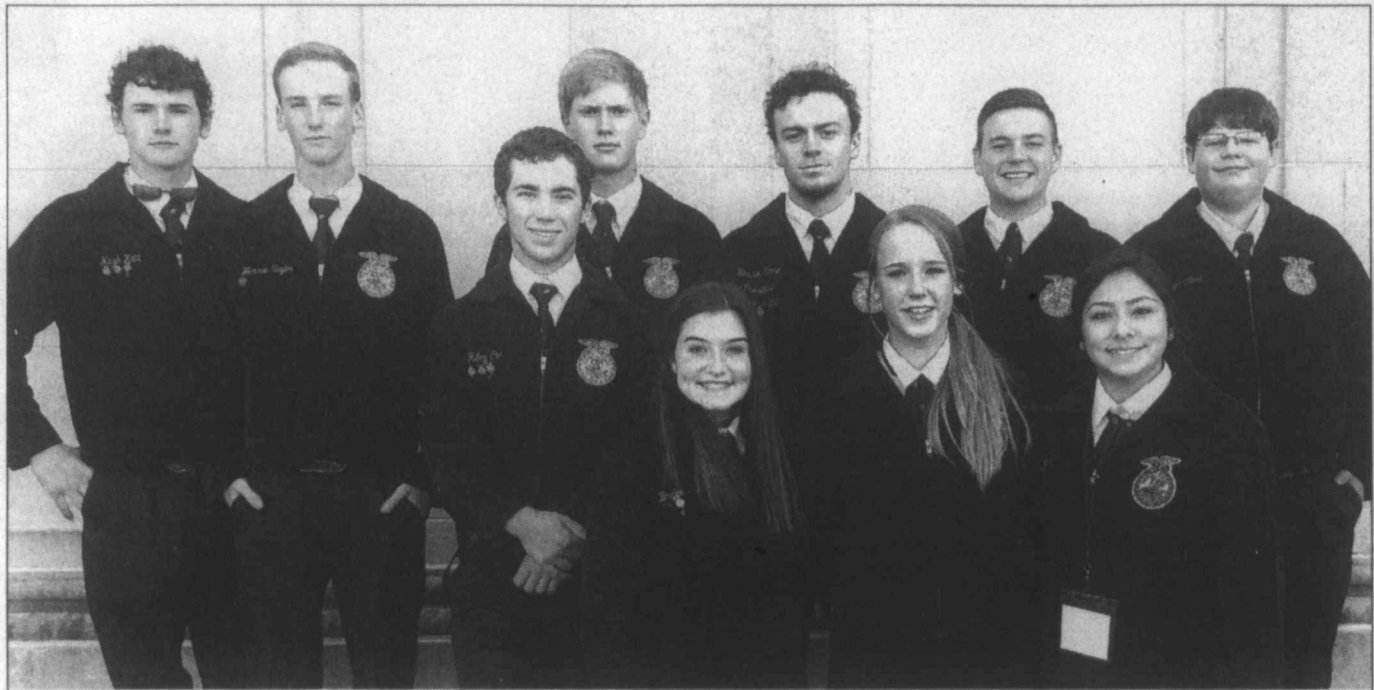

USDA opens signup for Market Facilitation Program enrollment

WASHINGTON, July 29, 2019 — Signup opens today for the Market Facilitation Program (MFP), a U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) program to assist farmers who continue to suffer from damages because of unjustified trade retaliation from foreign nations. Through MFP, USDA will provide up to \$14.5 billion in direct payments to impacted producers, part of a broader trade relief package announced in late July. The sign-up period runs through Dec. 6.

"Our team at USDA reflected on what worked well

and gathered feedback on last year's program to make this one even stronger and more effective for farmers. Our farmers work hard, are the most productive in the world, and we aim to match their enthusiasm and patriotism as we support them," said Agriculture Secretary Sonny Perdue.

MFP payments will be made to producers of certain non-specialty and specialty crops as well as dairy and hog producers.

Non-Specialty Crops

MFP payments will be made to producers of alfalfa,

hay, barley, canola, corn, crambe, dried beans, dry peas, extra-long staple cotton, flaxseed, lentils, long grain and medium grain rice, millet, mustard seed, oats, peanuts, rapeseed, rye, safflower, sesame seed, small and large chickpeas, sorghum, soybeans, sunflower seed, temperate japonica rice, triticale, upland cotton, and wheat.

MFP assistance for 2019 crops is based on a single county payment rate multiplied by a farm's total plantings to the MFP-eligible crops in aggregate in 2019. Those per acre payments are not dependent on which of those crops are planted in 2019. A producer's total payment-eligible plantings cannot exceed total 2018 plantings. View payment rates by county.

Dairy and Hogs

Dairy producers who were in business as of June 1, 2019, will receive a per hundredweight payment on production history, and hog producers will receive a payment based on the number of live hogs owned on a day selected by the producer between April 1 and May 15, 2019.

Specialty Crops

MFP payments will also be made to producers of almonds, cranberries, cultivated ginseng, fresh grapes, fresh sweet cherries,

hazelnuts, macadamia nuts, pecans, pistachios, and walnuts. Each specialty crop will receive a payment based on 2019 acres of fruit or nut bearing plants, or in the case of ginseng, based on harvested acres in 2019.

More Information

Payments will be made in up to three tranches, with the second and third tranches evaluated as market conditions and trade opportunities dictate. If conditions warrant, the second and third tranches will be made in November and early January.

MFP payments are limited to a combined \$250,000 for non-specialty crops per person or legal entity. MFP payments are also limited to a combined \$250,000 for

dairy and hog producers and a combined \$250,000 for specialty crop producers. However, no applicant can receive more than \$500,000. Eligible applicants must also have an average adjusted gross income (AGI) for tax years 2015, 2016, and 2017 of less than \$900,000, or 75 percent of the person's or legal entity's average AGI for those tax years must have been derived from farming and ranching. Applicants must also comply with the provisions of the Highly Erodible Land and Wetland Conservation regulations.

'Southern Cross' to open soon

LAMESA – Although no date has been set yet for the roadway to actually open for traffic, a ribbon-cutting ceremony was held Wednesday, Aug. 7 to mark completion of what has become known as the "Southern Cross" highway connection just south of Lamesa.

The all-new four-lane extends State Highway 349 directly to U.S. Highway 87.

The \$7.1-million project includes an overpass over State Highway 137 and a bridge over Sulphur Springs Draw.

Work began over two years ago – in May of 2017 – with Reece Albert as the contractor.

The date for the actual opening of the road to traffic has not yet been set, according to TxDOT Public Information Officer Dianah Ascencio.

"We are very close to getting that road open," Ascencio said. While the road surface was completed this week, Ascencio said some striping and signage still needs to be completed.

Memory care facility approved at hospital's strategic meeting

ANDREWS – Providing a memory care facility for dementia and Alzheimer's patients has been a primary ambition of those with the local (Andrews) hospital for several years.

The reason is because a strong demand exists for those services locally, Permian Regional Medical Center CEO Russell Tippin has said.

After the hospital district's \$7.2-million bond proposal for a 24-bed memory care facility was defeated in 2016, the hospital began contemplating a plan to finance a facility that would be attached to Permian Residential Care Center (the nursing home).

Tippin said the hospital board approved such a project during Monday's strategic planning meeting. The board will budget between \$7 million and \$8 million for the upcoming fiscal year to finance the project. The plan is to begin seeking designers and builders in October.

"We want to get a price and move forward," Tippin said. "We're in a position where we can pay cash for that."
