
Nov. 19 Town Hall Meeting to offer triple the info: hospital/city/school

Wilson ISD voters approve \$7.6 million bond election

Wilson Independent School District voters approved a \$7,660,000 bond for school improvements by a vote of 92-60 in the Nov. 5 special election, according to WISD Superintendent Jerry Burger. He reported the results to The News after the election concluded, but noted that the numbers are unofficial until the WISD Board of Trustees officially canvasses the results.

According to Supt. Burger, the bond funds will be used for school improvements, including some new construction. New construction will include a new ag facility, and the current school auditorium will be renovated into a new science facility. Other improvements include roofing, electrical, plumbing, installation of air conditioning for the gymnasium, security fencing, and additional security for entryways at school facilities.

With the bond approved, the school district will add a 36-cent I&S tax rate to pay for the bond-

ed indebtedness, Supt. Burger explained. Before the election, the property tax rate for Wilson ISD was \$1.06835 in the M&O (Maintenance and Operating) tax rate, with no additional I&S (Interest and Sinking) tax rate, as the district had no bonded indebtedness. With the additional I&S rate, the total tax rate for Wilson ISD will be approximately \$1.42 per \$100 of property

Supt. Burger said that the timing of the bond election will take

advantage of funding from the wind energy projects within the school district, explaining that approximately 70 percent of the bond will be paid by funding from the wind energy projects, with citizens paying about 30 percent. The wind energy projects receive a tax abatement on M&O tax rates, but pay full value on the I&S tax rate. To take advantage of those values, school officials seek bond elections when those wind farms are new and at their highest value.

Whether it's bringing in a new business, expanding established businesses, finding buyers for commercial property or helping landowners find contacts for interested commercial buyers - he wants to offer his assistance.


"Just call me The Facilitator," says Partlow, whose new position was created by the Tahoka Economic Development Corporation (TEDC).

The TEDC, formerly known as the ACT Board (Advancing the Community of Tahoka), is comprised of volunteer members, all of whom have been approved for appointment by the Tahoka City Council, who meet monthly to consider economic development and enhancement of Tahoka. The TEDC operates under the auspices of the City of Tahoka, and utilizes funds collected from a half-cent

sales tax that can be used only under specific criteria.

Because all the board members have other jobs and are volunteers. who have neither the expertise/ background in economic development nor the contacts needed for the task, the Board chose to hire someone with such expertise to bring viable options to the table for consideration.

David Partlow fit the bill, as he has 28 years of experience in economic development, and a contact list built from those years of experience that could allow him to hit the ground running for the TEDC.

Filing period continues for county offices in March elections

The filing period opened chairman in Lynn County. Nov. 9 and continues through Dec.9 for candidates interested in filing for elected county positions that will be in the March 3 Republican and Democratic Primary elections. As of early Tuesday afternoon, no candidate had officially completed the filing process, according to Republican Party Chairman John Baker, who is the only party

There are five county positions that are up for election, as well as the District Attorney seat for the 106th Judicial District, which includes Lynn, Garza, Dawson and Gaines counties. Local offices up for election include the County Sheriff, County Attorney, County Tax Assessor-Collector, and Pct. 1 and Pct. 3 County Commissioners. All are four-year terms that will begin Jan. 1, 2021.

Candidates must file with the local Party Chairman.

In Lynn County, the Republican Chair is John Baker, and he may be reached at 806-789-1257. However, there is no local Party Chairman for the Democratic party. Since Lynn County does not have a Democratic Chair, candidates must file with the State Democratic Chair.

Before filing with the Party Chairs, a candidate must fill out an Appointment of Campaign Treasurer with the Lynn County Clerk. One cannot announce before this form is filled out and filed at the County Clerk's Office, according to information from County Clerk Susan Tipton, who is also the Election Administrator for Lynn County.

A candidate may pay a filing fee of \$750 or submit a petition in lieu of the filing fee, rections. Make sure to get to the Party Chair.

Early voting for primary elections is Feb. 18-28. The Republican and Democratic Primary elections will be held March 3, 2020, with the winners from the primaries having a place on the ballot in the November 2020 General Election.





Chosen from among several qualified candidates, Partlow began his duties here at the beginning of October, and he is eager to bring economic development opportunities to Tahoka.

His first job was to create and manage a website for the Tahoka EDC, and to begin creating the marketing material and data needed for potential site selectors interested in looking for property.

"A good website is of utmost importance," Partlow says. "In the old days, site selectors would contact economic development leaders and inquire about potential properties. Those days are long gone - it's all done online now. And if you don't have the data they are looking for, as well as the munity profiles, and other related facts, you're not in the running," he explained.

He also researches criteria that companies are looking for in building or expanding their companies, and then he puts together packets of information that he can present to these companies that shows what Tahoka has to offer. He specializes in rural industrial development and rural community development.

Already, Partlow says he has three packets targeting national restaurants ready to go out, and he will be reaching out to these companies through his contacts base.

Part of what he will do here will be to approach local property owners of possible sites for restaurants or other commercial or industrial businesses, work with those property owners to create marketing fliers (at no cost to the property owners), and to make those fliers available to targeted businesses that are looking to build or expand in this area.

However, he encourages owners of commercial or land property to contact him immediately if they are interested in selling property. "It won't cost you anything to talk to me, and I will let you know if I can help. If I can help, it won't cost you anything for me to develop a marketing flier for your property and to facilitate a possible buyer," Partlow marketing materials, the com- says, adding that if a potential buyer is found, then it is up to the property owner to negotiate the price with the buyer.

The TEDC may also consider incentive packages to entice potential buyers to consider properties here.

Tahoka has never had a director of economic development, so it is perhaps a new concept for local citizens.

"We will have a TEDC website that anyone can look at, but that information will mostly be targeting site selectors for companies. But we will also soon have a Facebook page, and that information will be mainly to show the citizens of the area what the TEDC is doing," Partlow added.

With Partlow's background in business recruitment, economic development for rural communities, target marketing expertise, and funding from state and federal agencies (including grants and financial assistance), he should prove to be an asset to the Tahoka Economic Development Corporation. 


