



Del's Deli serving up sandwiches, salads

A new eatery opened in Tahoka this week, with Del's Deli opening their doors at 11 a.m. Monday to serve a variety of sandwiches and salads in the downtown area of Tahoka. Located at 1515 South 1st Street (formerly Tahoka Donuts), the new restaurant is owned by Jon Luna, who also owns Jolly Time restaurant at 2220 Lockwood in Tahoka.

Del's Deli is named after Luna's mother, Delia Luna (nicknamed Del), and the Del's Deli signage on the front door features a caricature of Delia, which Jon commissioned. Delia and her husband Juan Luna are longtime Tahoka residents, and

she was the owner of Delia's Hairstyling for many years here before retiring. She will be at the new restaurant on a semi-regular basis.

The new eatery is open for lunch on weekdays only, from 11 a.m.-2 p.m. Monday through Friday. Dine-in or carryout is available, and there is a drive-up window on the west side of the building.

The daily menu features a variety of sandwiches named after family members, some local characters, or employees - ask them who they are honoring with The Golden Girls Special (a twist on the BLT), The Judge (a roast beef sandwich), or The Hammie (ham

New gym, fieldhouse project moves forward; school accepts donation of church building

new gymnasium and fieldhouse project is moving forward for Tahoka Independent School District, and TISD trustees voted to accept a property donation of the Tahoka Church of Christ building, in action taken at the Jan. 9 meeting of the Tahoka ISD Board of Trustees.

Groundbreaking for a new gymnasium and fieldhouse for Tahoka ISD is expected to be held by the end of January, as the project moved to the next step with the Board of Trustees unanimously approving a guaranteed maximum price from Lee Lewis Construction for the two facilities.

After the board approval, TISD Superintendent Dick Van Hoose signed a contract with Lee Lewis Construction Company for a guaranteed maximum price of \$8,851,735 for both the gym and fieldhouse projects. Both projects are part of a bond project approved by TISD voters in 2019. Van Hoose told The News that groundbreaking ceremonies would take place soon, towards the end of January, at a 31acre tract of land located northwest

of the intersection of North 5th and Ave. P, where the new facilities will be erected.

In other action, the Board voted unanimously to accept property given by the Tahoka Church of Christ, who formally closed their doors after final services on Sept. 29, 2019. The church facilities, including a large brick building housing a sanctuary, offices, classrooms and large fellowship hall, as well as surrounding parking area, was offered to Tahoka ISD to be used however best suits their purposes.

"The Board did choose to accept the donation of property," Supt. Van Hoose told The News. "There are lots of possibilities for repurposing that will be discussed at some point, including options such as moving the school daycare

program there, administrative offices, testing facilities, or after-school program facilities. However, at this time, there are no immediate plans for using or remodeling the church building. Our focus at this time is on the gym and fieldhouse projects," he explained.

The remainder of the meeting was routine, with reports from campus principals Kelly Kieth, Donnie Scott and Don Worth, Athletic Director Stephen Overstreet, and Special Education Co-Op Director Brandi Parker. Monthly bills were also approved for payment.

Trustees present for the meeting included Board President Clay Taylor, Doug Green, Blanda Watt, Lea Swinford and Slate May. Trustees Jon Luna and Drew Stone were






