Bizarre car chase ends at funeral location where many law officers had gathered

A trio of teenagers who led officers on a high-speed chase as they drove a stolen vehicle through Lamesa and across parts of two counties had little chance of fleeing on foot when the pursuit finally came to an end in Tahoka Friday morning. They had driven right into one of the largest gatherings of law enforcement officers in the state, at the Tahoka High School football field where funeral services for Lynn County Sheriff Abraham Vega were about to take place.

Vega, a longtime Lynn County law enforcement officer who was seeking a second term as sheriff, died Saturday, July 11, at the age of 48 after a three-week battle with COVID-19.

The funeral on Friday morning drew more than a hundred law en-

forcement officers from across Texas and elsewhere. Barricades had been set up on streets surrounding the football field, to allow law enforcement vehicles to park near the school for the services.

About 30 minutes before the 10 a.m. services were scheduled to

begin, a black Toyota Forerunner came barreling westward on N. 4th Street through the barricade at the intersection of N. 4th and Ave. Q, turning south onto the street on the west side of the football field, with a Lamesa deputy in hot pursuit with sirens screaming.

With a crowd in the home stands watching the bizarre scene unfold, and many law enforcement officers standing near the field in preparation to enter when funeral services began, the Forerunner hurtled at speeds estimated at upwards of 60-70 mph behind the football field, and entered the N.

2nd and Ave. Q intersection where DPS officers directing traffic were forced to scramble away on foot to escape injury from the vehicle as it careened around the corner and turned eastward onto N. 2nd. It veered up on the front lawns of the residential area before it turned back northward onto the school's practice field behind the stadium, picking up speed as it hurtled across the grass towards a sidewalk with a metal canopy over it, in front of the high school.

Dozens of law officers were rushing to assist, running (See CAR CHASE, page 3)

Wanda Mason appointed Lynn County Interim Sheriff

Lynn County Commissioners met in special session Tuesday morning, July 21, voting unanimously to name Wanda Mason of Tahoka as the Interim Sheriff of Lynn County. Mason was administered the Oath of Office at just before noon Tuesday, and will take over her duties immediately at the Lynn County Sheriff's Office. She will fill the position of interim sheriff until midnight Dec. 31, 2020.

After the July 11 death of Sheriff Abraham Vega from COVID-19 complications, county commissioners faced the task of filling the interim position from among a slate of five candidates who had applied for consideration. Two candidates were from within the Sheriff's Office and three candidates were from outside the department. Commissioners met in special session at 10 a.m. Tuesday to make that decision,

discussing the issue in executive session for just over an hour before returning to open session and making a unanimous decision in favor of Mason. She is the first female sheriff of Lynn County.

Interim Sheriff Mason is a Tahoka citizen who was formerly a DPS trooper with the Texas Dept. of Public Safety for 17 years - with more than 15 of those years serving the Lynn County area. She retired from the DPS in February of 2019, and is well known in the law enforcement field in this area.

"Basically, the first thing I will do as interim sheriff will be to meet and greet, get to know those in the Lynn County Sheriff's Office that I do not know. I do know some of them, from my days in the DPS before I retired," Mason told *The News* on Tuesday. "I'm pleased to be named Interim Sheriff for Lynn (See INTERIM SHERIFF, page 4)

Tahoka loses its third citizen to Covid-19 Annabelle Cantu touched many hearts

Tahoka and Lynn County lost its third citizen to complications of COVID-19 last week, with the death of Annabelle Cantu, 54, of Tahoka. It is the second time within a week that Tahokans have grieved for the loss of one of its unique and caring citizens because of the 2020 global pandemic of coronavirus - and it's three lives too many that have been lost to this terrible disease.

Annabelle passed away on Tuesday, July 14, 2020, after battling COVID-19 for over five weeks. She and her sister, Mary Lou Saldana of Tahoka, both tested positive for COVID-19, and

both entered a Lubbock hospital for treatment on June 8. It was to be the last day that any of the family were able to see Annabelle in person. Thirty-six days later, Annabelle succumbed to complications

of the disease. Mary Lou, five years younger than her sister Annabelle, recovered and was released from the hospital on June 22.

"I can hardly believe she's gone," said Mary Lou in a phone conversation with *The News*. "We all miss her so. On Sunday mornings Annabelle would call all of us to come eat breakfast. She loved to cook for her family. And everybody is going to miss her hot sauce - she made it for lots of people," said her sister.

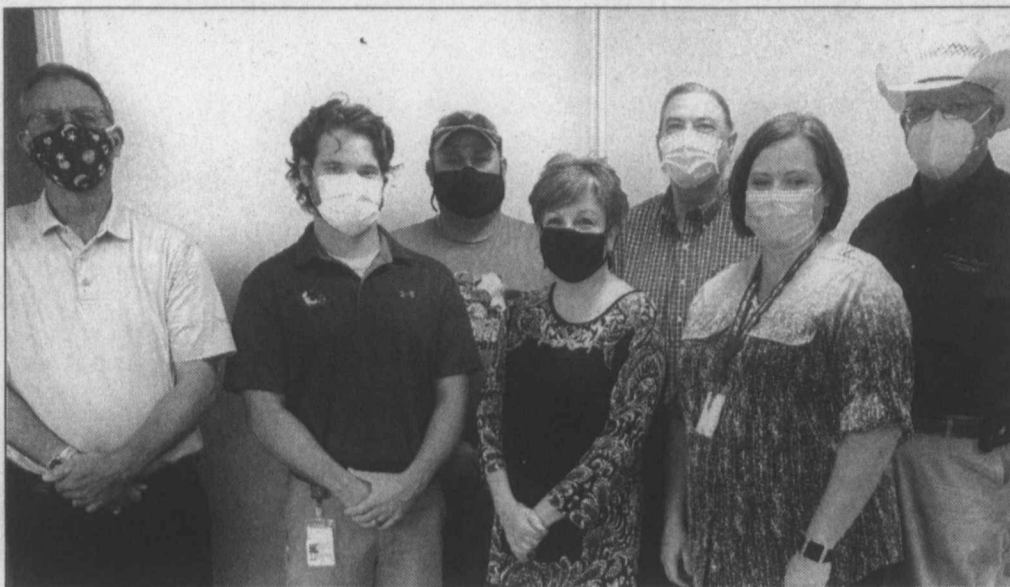
Mary Annabelle Cantu

Student eligibility changes:

TISD Board sets new policy for UIL, extracurricular activities

Tahoka Independent School District Board of Trustees this week approved a policy that requires any student wanting to participate in UIL or school-sponsored extracurricular activities to attend face-to-face in-person classes at the school. That includes football and other sports activities, according to TISD Superintendent Dick Van Hoose.

"Any student that is going to want to participate in any school-sponsored activity or event, UIL, band, sports, etc., must attend classes on campus in order to be eligible to participate," Van Hoose told *The News* after the board met in special session at noon Monday, July 20.

Parents will have the option of having their students attend classes on campus, or to choose remote instructional

options to learn from home. However, those who choose the remote options will not be eligible to participate in any extracurricular activities.

"We will be doing everything we can to keep our students and staff safe, and following COVID-19 safety procedures," added Van Hoose.

In other business at Tuesday's special session, trustees approved contracts for two more staff members for the upcoming school year. Clara Sanders and Casey Mellish were both hired as elementary teachers.

Trustees heard estimates for the construction of baseball, softball and practice football fields, and discussed how the district will address state/personal days for teachers if they are required to quarantine due to COVID-19.

Football two-a-days set to begin here Aug. 3

Tahoka ISD football practice will begin as scheduled on Monday, Aug. 3 with two-a-days, according to TISD Athletic Director and head football coach Stephen Overstreet this week.

The AD wants to remind student athletes, however, that the Tahoka ISD Board of Trustees this week approved a policy that requires any student wanting to participate in UIL or school-sponsored extracurricular activities to attend face-to-face in-person classes at the school. That includes football and other sports activities, Overstreet said.

"A student will only be eligible to participate in any extracurricular activities, including sports, band, and other school-related extracurricular activities, if they attend classes in person at the school campus," reiterated Overstreet. "If a student is going to be doing remote-learning from home, they will not be eligible to participate in these activities."

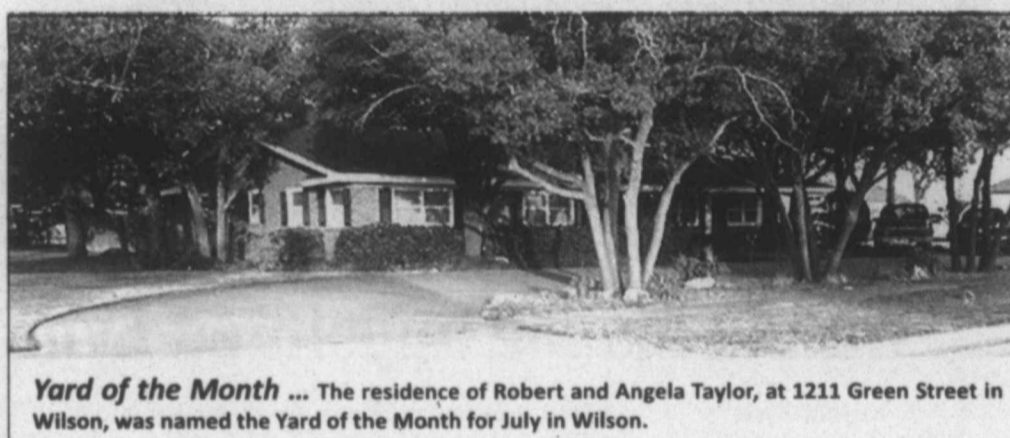

fallout behind the Forerunner, and other officers were running towards their vehicles to assist if needed. When the Forerunner hit the sidewalk, it struck the low-hanging canopy and it collapsed as the vehicle surged forward into the elementary campus, and seconds later was forced to a stop between two buildings. A large contingent of officers surrounded the Forerunner with guns drawn, but no shots were fired. Several officers could be seen dropping to the ground to peer beneath the vehicle, where apparently one of the male passengers in the vehicle had been pinned after jumping out of the Forerunner as it was still moving.

According to Lamesa Police Chief Josh Peterson who was at the scene, more officers rushed to the location and pushed the vehicle off of the man, who was later taken by ambulance to the Lynn County Hospital for treatment of unknown injuries.

Lynn County EMS sources here said that the 18-year-old male patient was uncooperative and antagonistic inside the ambulance, refusing to give his name or any other

information, and reportedly made threatening statements against EMTs who were tending to him as a patient.

Another male passenger in the vehicle reportedly jumped out and attempted to flee between two school buildings. He actually ran into an area where he was trapped by buildings on three sides and was quickly arrested by some 20 officers who went running after him, said Dawson County Sheriff Matt Hogg, according to an article in the Lamesa Press-Reporter.

The female driver of the vehicle, identified as 19-year-old Biace Tieonna-Lasha Gomez, also was arrested at the scene. Detrem Ward, 18, was identified as the passenger who was injured when the car ran over him, and the other passenger was identified as Camron Deiondre Lee Carl, 19.

The chase had started in Lamesa at 8:48 a.m. when a Dawson County deputy attempted to stop a black Toyota Forerunner for speeding southbound on Highway 87 a few miles north of Lamesa. The chase began immediately, with the deputy reporting speeds quickly topping 100 miles per hour. The Forerunner

turned east on FM 825 just before reaching Lamesa; and eventually turned back onto US 87 heading north towards Tahoka - but the Forerunner went northbound into oncoming traffic in the southbound lanes of US 87.

"They were going 112 miles per hour at one point in the chase," Chief Peterson said.

Reaching Tahoka, where officers from the Tahoka Police Department and Texas Department of Public Safety became involved, the Forerunner exited US 87 and turned west on U.S. 380, the main east-west route through Tahoka, and then into residential streets as it headed towards the Tahoka High School campus and football field area.

"Even then they were doing speeds of 80 miles an hour," Peterson said.

A Lamesa police vehicle - a 2019 Chevrolet Tahoe - was significantly damaged when the metal canopy knocked down by the Forerunner fell onto it as the chase was coming to an end, Chief Peterson said in the Lamesa Press-Reporter.

Peterson said they were fortunate that multiple other vehicles were not damaged and no one attending the funeral was hurt.

"I don't know how they didn't wreck into at least five

cars, I really don't," he said. During the chase, officers learned that the Forerunner had been stolen out of Lubbock.

Gomez, the driver, is facing at least two felony charges, for Evading Arrest with a Vehicle, and for Unauthorized Use of a Motor Vehicle. The two passengers have each been charged with misdemeanor charges of evading arrest with a vehicle, according to a source this week at the Lynn County Sheriff's Office.

Peterson said officers worked quickly to try to clear the crash scene before the funeral for Sheriff Vega began just a short distance away.

"While we were trying to wrap it up, the funeral was starting," he said.



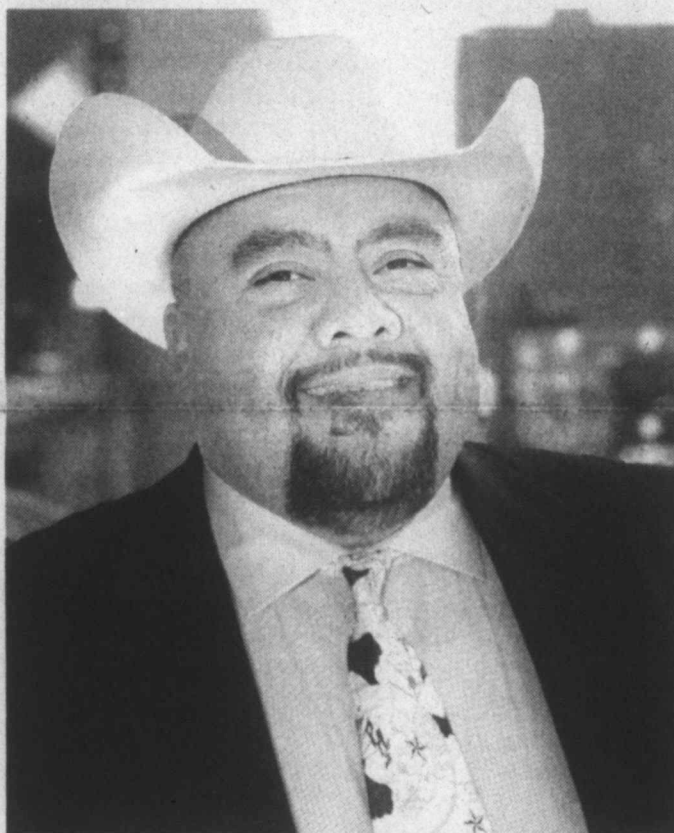

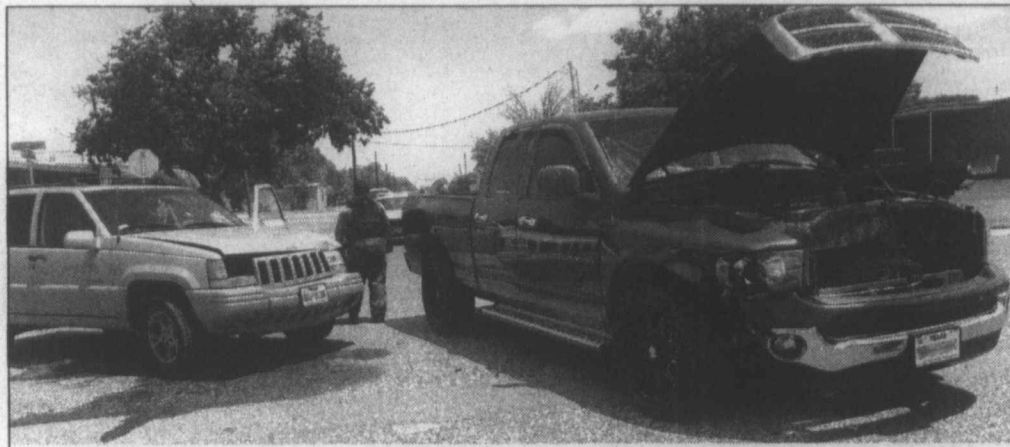

Accidents, several fires reported here recently

Three accidents and several fires were reported during the past two weeks in Tahoka and Lynn County.

Tahoka Police responded to the scene of a two-vehicle accident on Monday, July

13. A silver Jeep driven by Marisol Morin, and a maroon Dodge pickup driven by Dianna Shaver collided at the intersection of S. 2nd and Ave. K during the noon hour last Monday. Morin was transported by Lynn County EMS for treatment of unknown injuries.

A hit and run was reported at 1:46 p.m. last Tuesday, July 14, by a caller to the Sheriff's Office that reported a black Dodge Ram 2500 had struck him while he was standing by the side of the road on FM 1730 and Kitty Hawk Lane. The caller said he had injuries and requested an ambulance, and told officers that the Dodge Ram had turned into The Palm Estates. Lubbock DPS and EMS were paged to the scene.

A one-vehicle rollover had EMS, Sheriff's deputies, and DPS responding to the scene at the double curves at the intersection of FM 211 and FM 1054 at 11:27 a.m. Monday, July 20. Driver of the white Chevy pickup was Jamie Gonzales-Robledo, and the vehicle was registered to Rafael Gonzalez-Rodriguez of Post. The driver and a pas-

senger were reportedly inside the vehicle when it rolled, but reportedly had been able to exit the vehicle before officers arrived. No information was available as to extent of possible injuries or if anyone was transported by EMS for treatment.

Several fires were reported during the week, including a grass fire on the Double U Ranch that was reportedly ignited by lightning on July 14, to which O'Donnell Volunteer Fire Dept. responded. The fire re-started again the next day, with OVFD again responding. Wilson Volunteer Fire Dept. was paged out to assist Slaton Fire Dept. with a grass fire on CR EE and CR 3 at 2:47 p.m. July 14, and later the Lynn County EMS was paged to the scene on standby due to the extreme heat as firefighters fought the fire. O'Donnell VFD was paged to a grass fire and tank battery fire at CR 128 and FM 1054 in Borden County on July 14 as well.

Tahoka Police assisted Lynn County Sheriff's Office at 6:50 a.m. July 21 when a possible fire was reported about 5 miles north of Tahoka. Police investigated and discovered a house fully engulfed in flames, and Tahoka VFD was called out to the scene. The house was empty of any furnishings, no one was in the house, and no injuries were reported.

Several domestic disturbances, reports of reckless drivers, cows on the road, and suspicious person calls were investigated by Tahoka Police and Sheriff's deputies during the week.

Police had one call from a homeowner who said that they were in their backyard when a neighbor threw a bag of trash over the fence at them. Police responded and told *The News* that apparently the neighbor's grandson had

County. I believe you have to have courage to do this job, as well as commitment and leadership, and that is my intention," she added.

The interim term will be for just over five months, through the end of December, until a new sheriff is elected in the upcoming November 2020 General Election, taking office on Jan. 1, 2021 for a four-year term.

The late Sheriff Vega had won the Republican Party Primary election in May 2020 for the term of sheriff that would have begun on Jan. 1, 2021. He was unopposed on the Democratic ticket, which means that he would have been unopposed in the November 2020 general election.

However, due to the extenuating circumstances of Vega's death, Lynn County Republican Party Chairman John Baker said this week that he is petitioning the Secretary of State's Office to have Abraham Vega's name removed from the November General Election ballot as a Republican candidate.

With Vega's name removed from the ballot, it leaves the November ballot with no candidates for the Lynn County Sheriff position. Because the primary elections were held this past May, the county has now been placed in unusual circumstances for having candidates for sheriff on the November ballot.

Therefore, interested candidates for Lynn County Sheriff may now apply for consideration for a place on the November ballot, whether as a Republican, Democrat, Independent or Write-In candidate,

by applying with the appropriate officials. There is no Lynn County Democratic Party Chairman, which means that a candidate seeking to file as a Democrat may contact either the Texas Democratic Party or the Secretary of State's Office for application information. Any candidate seeking to file as an Independent or Write-In candidate must also contact the Secretary of State's Office for information.

Lynn County does have a County Republican Party Chairman, John Baker, who is coordinating efforts to process a Republican party nominee. Baker says that candidates wanting to apply for consideration as a nominee on the Republican ticket as a candidate for sheriff may submit an application to the Lynn County Republican Party. An advertisement in this issue of *The News* contains information on the application process.

Because only one Republican nominee for Lynn County Sheriff may be listed on the November ballot, an emergency/temporary Lynn County Executive Committee (CEC) is being formed that will be comprised of representatives from Lynn County's voting precincts. This committee will interview all applicants who submit an application to be considered as a Republican nominee for sheriff, and then the committee will choose one candidate to have their name placed on the November ballot, chosen by majority vote of the committee. Baker said he will chair the committee, but will not have a vote.

"Each member of this County Executive Committee will have one vote to cast in choosing a Republican nominee for the November ballot," Baker told *The News*. Whomever the committee chooses by majority vote will have his/her name placed on the November ballot as a Republican candidate for Lynn County Sheriff.

An advertisement in this issue of *The News* indicates that applications for the Republican nominee are being accepted until Aug. 7 for the CEC to consider.

The final deadline to have a name placed on the November ballot for Lynn County Sheriff is 5 p.m. August 24.

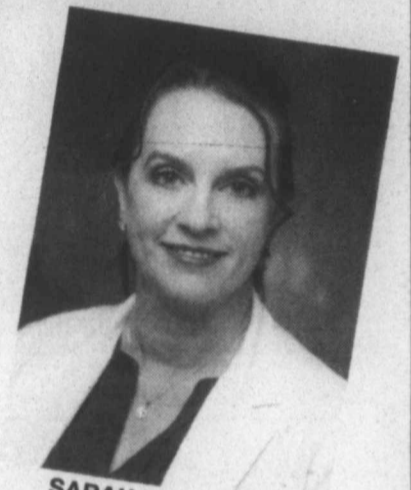

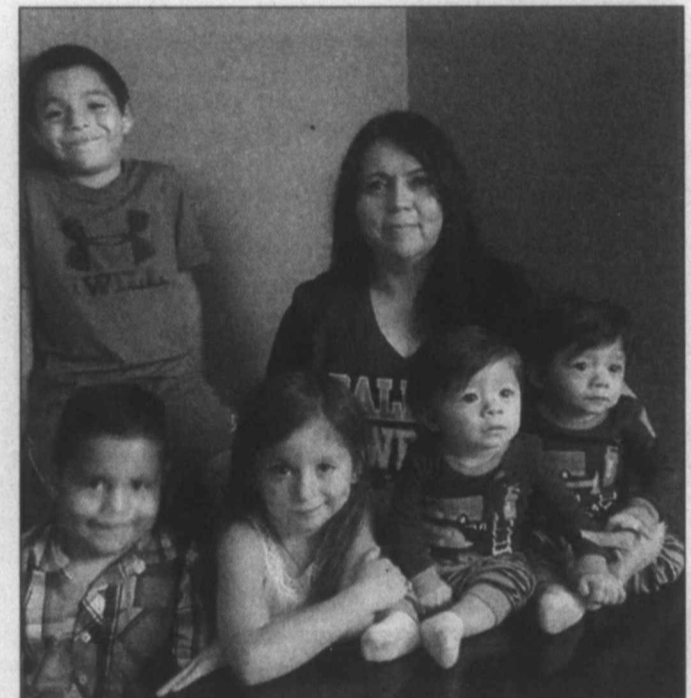

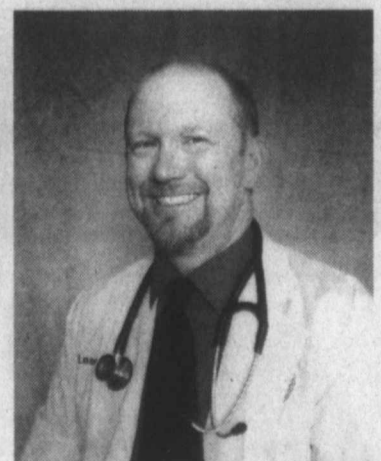
