## LCHD to offer vaccines available to the public

ynn County Hospital District received their first shipment of the Moderna vaccines this week, and will begin scheduling appointments on Wednesday afternoon, Jan. 6 for the public to receive the Covid-19 vaccine (according to DSHS guidelines)

Dr. Melanie Richburg, Chief Executive Officer of Lynn County Hospital District (LCHD), told The News that they received a shipment of 100 doses of the Moderna vac cine on Tuesday, this week

We will begin scheduling appointments on Wednesday (Jan. 6) for administering the vaccines on Friday, Jan. 8, and then again the following Tuesday

As supplies are replenished, more appointments will be accepted.

## Wanda Mason, first female sheriff elected here, is sworn into office

hen Wanda Mason was sworn in to office on January 1, 2021, she became the first female ever elected to take office as Sheriff of Lynn County since the county was established in 1903. It was a historical moment for the county, for a female to break the glass ceiling in what has traditionally been a male role. Of the 254 county sheriffs in the state of Texas, Mason is one of only six females currently holding the title, according to information from the Sheriffs' Association of Texas.



There is an option for homeowners over age 65 or disabled, to pay their taxes in four installments instead of a one-time full payment. To make the installment payments, the homeowner must notify the Appraisal District before the end of January, by phone or in person, of their intent to pay their tax bill in this method.



The first payment is due by the end of January, with the other three payments due in March, May and July.\* The Lynn County Appraisal District will mail out reminder letters when the quarterly payments are due.

\* If payments are not made by the required dates, penalties may be assessed.




