LCHD Board approves comprehensive renovation project for local hospital

The Lynn County Hospital is going to begin undergoing a comprehensive renovation this year, including some new additions, and possibly add a new long-term care nursing home facility, if all goes according to plan. Lynn County Hospital District (LCHD) Board of Directors approved an ambitious \$20-million project proposal in unanimous action at their meeting on Jan. 7, to completely renovate the current hospital facilities and to add a nursing home facility on hospital property west of Lynnwood Independent and Assisted Living Center.

The hospital facilities, located on the western edge of the Tahoka city limits on US 380, were built in 1970, and opened its doors in January of 1971 providing inpatient and outpatient services and emergency room services. Now celebrating its 50th year, Lynn County Hospital is one of only a few remaining independent hospitals, and is overseen by a seven-member locally-elected Board of Directors, which currently include W. Calloway Huffaker, President, and Sharon Isham, Dr. Ed Smith, Manuel DeLeon, Mary Gayle Raindl, Jana Bishop, and Connie Donald.

Dr. Melanie Richburg, Chief

Executive Officer of LCHD, said that while some areas of the hospital have been updated to better serve their needs, such as the recently-completed lab facilities, a more comprehensive renovation project has been under consideration for some time, to update all areas of the hospital.

"It has been screamingly evident that our facilities were not prepared for handling Covid-19, and if we want to keep our hospital going forward, we need to make some significant changes," Dr. Richburg told *The News*.

Updates include new hospital rooms that are single occupancy

(not the current double-occupancy design, which despite the two-beds per room has hardly ever been used in that capacity), with new wheelchair-accessible bathrooms in each room, and a separate wing of rooms that have independent ventilation systems, as well as some patient rooms designed for special-needs patients. The plan calls for tearing down the current clinic/administrative wing on the west side of the hospital and constructing a new ER wing, including a bay for ambulances to unload patients into the ER treatment area, and an easily-accessible ER admissions and waiting room area. The Fast Track clinic currently in the west wing would be in the new ER wing, and administrative offices would be relocated in the hospital.

To fund the project, LCHD is applying for a loan through USDA, instead of asking voters to pass a bond issue.

"We are seeking a USDA loan at a fixed rate of 2.1%," stated Dr. Richburg. "The loan application process takes about nine months

for approval, and we believe we can get funding approved for 90% of the \$20-million project. We are moving forward during this application period to line up our plans, so that when the loan is approved we will be ready to break ground on this project."

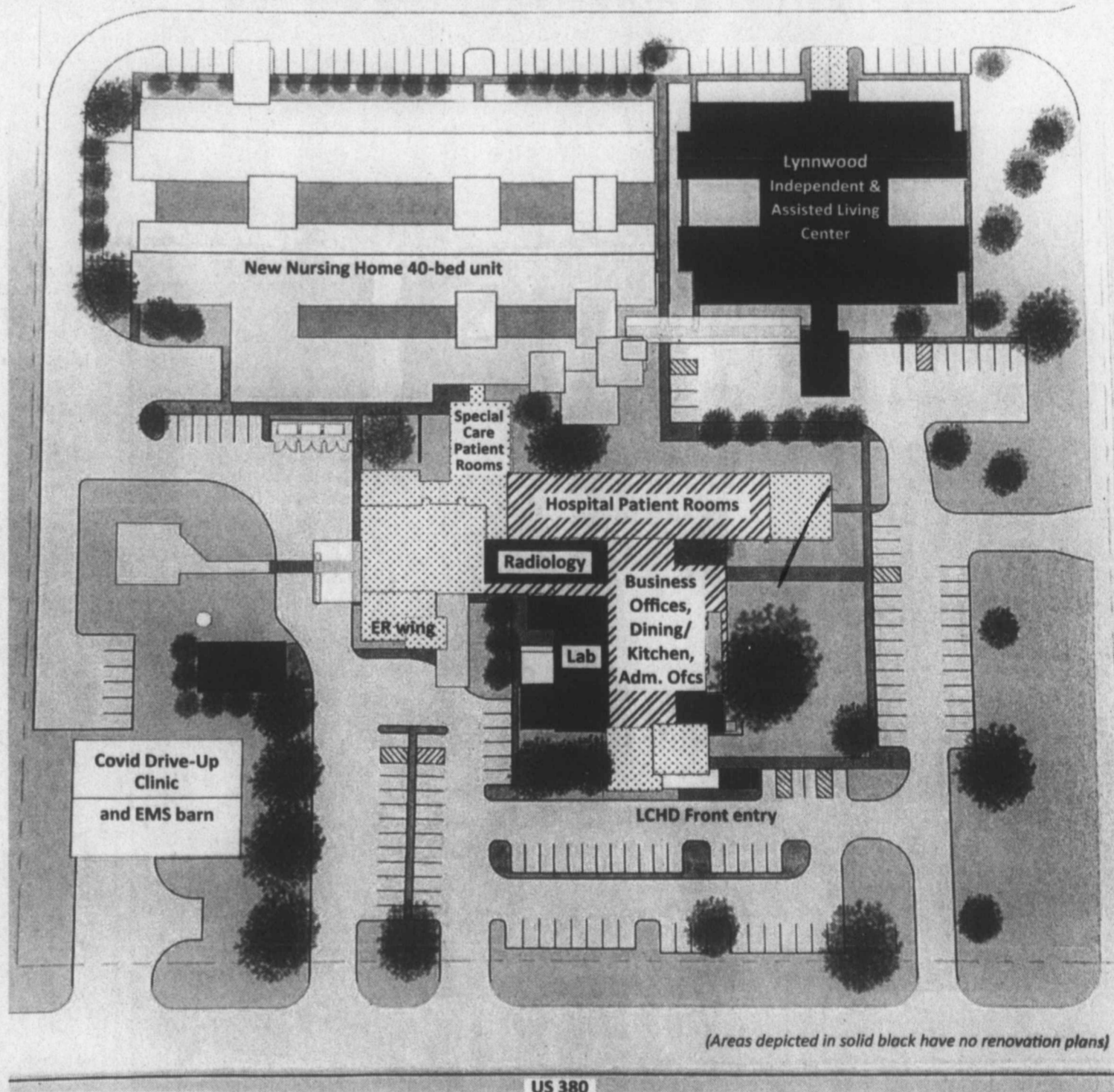
The CEO said that, based on Medicare patient reimbursement policies, the hospital will be reimbursed for 100% of funds expended that relate directly to providing healthcare for Medicare patients. That reimbursement, she explained, should provide more than \$700,000 of an estimated \$900,000 annual loan payment for the project.

"We will be reimbursed 100% on Medicare patients, which will pay us an estimated additional \$720,000 per year just on Medicare patients alone, to help meet the note," said Dr. Richburg.

"That means we will have to come up with about \$200,000 annually on our part, and we believe that can be done by careful planning to shave off some costs in other areas.

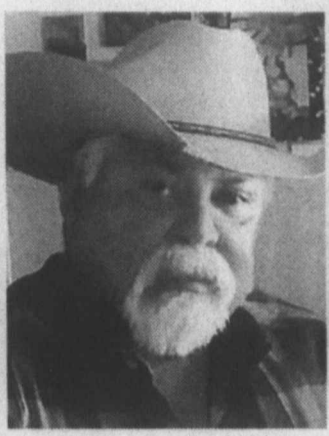
Belia S. Albarado

One arrested after accident on US 87

A female driver was arrested after an accident with another vehicle on US 87 last Tuesday evening about 6 p.m. A caller to Lynn County Sheriff's Office (LCSO) 9-1-1 reported that a woman driving a 2013 silver Ford Fusion was driving erratically in the northbound lanes of US 87, just passing FM 211, at speeds estimated at 90-100 mph. While on the line, the caller then said the vehicle had just rear-ended another vehicle and then slid off the roadway, and that smoke appeared to be coming from her vehicle. LCSO, DPS, Lynn County EMS and Wilson Volunteer Fire Dept. responded to the scene. The vehicle that was struck was a 2017 silver Chevy pickup. All parties involved reportedly refused transport by EMS, and the woman driving the Ford Fusion was arrested by DPS on unspecified charges and taken to Lynn County Jail.

At 3:13 a.m. Thursday, Jan. 14, Lynn County EMS reported seeing a silver Mustang in a ditch on FM 1054, and asked LCSO to check it out. A deputy responded to the scene, and reported that the male driver was stuck in the ditch, but did not want help getting out of the ditch. The call sheet reported that the man told the deputy that he was "just going to hang out there for a bit and take a nap, before getting out of the ditch."

A motor home at location on FM 179 was reported to have been broken into sometime during the past two months, with the owner reporting several items missing including personal paperwork and other items.

LCSO deputies responded to several other calls during the past week including a report of tires dumped in a ditch east of Wilson on FM 211, welfare concerns, a runaway juvenile, and a report of a theft at rental property in the 1300 block of Vanham Ave. in Wilson.

Tahoka Police responded to several domestic disturbances during the past week, as well as calls reporting reckless drivers, security alarms, fireworks, providing a funeral escort, assisting LCSO with a warrant arrest, and criminal mischief.

At 5:45 p.m. on Saturday, police responded to the baseball field complex on South 8th in response to a call reporting criminal mischief, finding the concession stand building had been broken into, with some damage reported and some of the buildings spray painted with graffiti.

Police came to the rescue of a man residing in the 2000 block of N. 4th last Thursday afternoon, after receiving a call reporting a welfare concern when no one answered a phone call at the location. When police knocked on the front door repeatedly there was no response, but the front door was not locked and the officer entered the residence to find a male lying on the floor in distress. Lynn County EMS transported the man for medical treatment.

Police received a call from Lubbock County law enforcement to assist in locating a vehicle owner with a Tahoka address, after Lubbock officers found the unattended vehicle fully engulfed in flames. Tahoka Police located the owner, to put him in contact with Lubbock law enforcement.

Police responded to a call at 2 a.m. Saturday in the 1800 block of N. 6th, from a woman complaining that a repossession company was trying to repo her vehicle. Upon arrival, police discovered the woman had multiple outstanding warrants from another county, and arrested her, and the repo company took possession of her vehicle.

Charges for those incarcerated at Lynn County Jail during the past week included one for public intoxication, one for possession of dangerous drug, one for possession of controlled substance, one for abandon/endanger child imminent danger, one for tamper/fabricate physical evidence with intent to impair, and one for evading arrest with a vehicle or watercraft.

LCHD's new COVID Drive-Up Clinic is now open

Lynn County Hospital District broke ground in early October 2020 for a new COVID Drive-Up Clinic adjacent to hospital grounds, and the new clinic opened recently for drive-up Covid-19 testing. The new facility also houses the Lynn County EMS ambulances and offices. It is located just west of hospital grounds on the western edge of Tahoka, on US 380.

Citizens wanting to request a Covid-19 test must call the LCHD Covid-19 Hotline at 806-561-2076 to make an appointment time for testing, and they will be given instructions on how to proceed.

Funding for the project was through the government's Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act, which provides funding to support hospitals to prevent, prepare for, and respond to the coronavirus-related (COVID-19) public health emergency.

"We are very pleased with our new COVID Drive-Up Clinic, not only to get our nurses and lab technicians out of the weather to perform the testing, but also to offer some privacy to our citizens who drive up for testing, so that they are not sitting out in a public parking lot as they get tested," said John Baker, EMS/Special Projects Director at LCHD. "This new facility provides an indoor climate-controlled testing site, out of the wind and weather, while still providing convenient testing for patients who will remain inside their vehicles for the procedure."

The Covid Drive-Up Clinic is in an 86x70-ft. pre-engineered metal building that features three drive-in

bay areas, an EMS office, men's and women's restroom/shower facilities, two small rooms available for on-call ER physicians or EMS, and large storage areas. A large sign designating the Covid Drive-Up Clinic is posted at the entrance/exit onto Hwy 380.

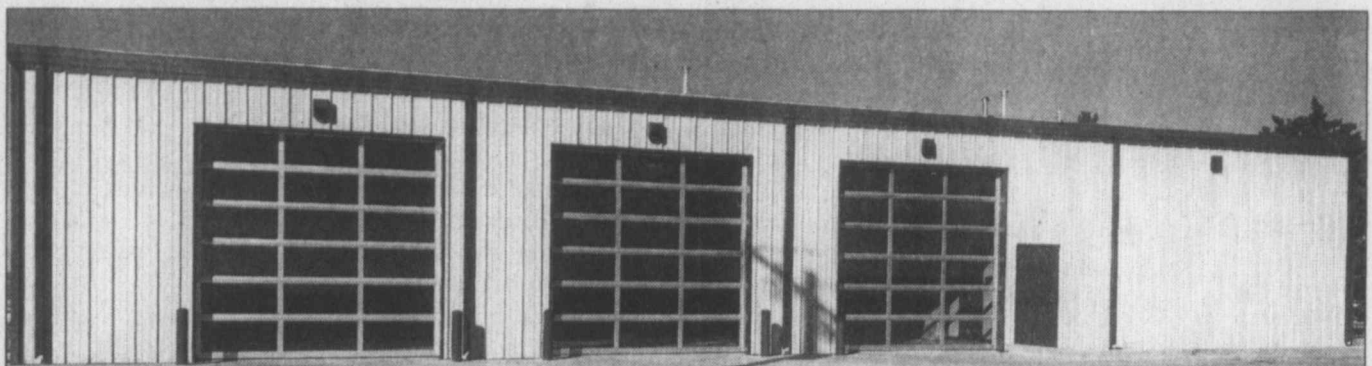
The clinic is phase one of a two-phase construction project, at an overall cost of just under \$900,000.

Phase 1, which is the new clinic, came in at \$497,000, and was primarily funded with CARES Act funds, although there was some funding earmarked from memorials and private donations, according to Baker.

LCHD qualified for CARES Act funding to respond to the coronavirus-related public health needs.

"If we don't use the CARES Act funding for the specific purposes it has been designated for, then LCHD would have to return those unused funds, and we would lose that funding," said Baker. "This project benefits the hospital, and benefits the citizens of Lynn County, and is directly related to providing services for COVID prevention and response."

"In addition, this COVID Drive-Up Clinic is going to serve a dual purpose for LCHD. Primarily it will be a COVID Drive-Up Clinic, but it will also be utilized as an EMS barn, with space for our ambulances," Baker told *The News*. "We have had some grant funds, donations and memori-

als specifically given to EMS; and some of those funds will be used for this project."

Phase 2 will include a community classroom and small kitchen addition, and an additional office and storage area, and is anticipated to cost approximately \$380,000. The classroom would be utilized for health-related education classes and training.

Baker told *The News* that he is pursuing education grants for funding Phase 2 of

the project.

"We do have some funding earmarked for this phase, including some grant funds, but we are aggressively seeking additional education grant resources for the second phase of the project. As much as possible, we want to complete this project without using any taxpayer funds," stated Baker.

and as a last resort, we may have to consider adjusting taxes minimally. We have not raised taxes in a couple of years, and we are still below the rollback rate. If we consider raising taxes, we're most likely only considering a very minimal increase," she added.

The \$20-million project includes about \$9 million for the hospital renovation, and \$11 million to build a new nursing home facility.

"The hospital renovation has got to be done," said Dr. Richburg. "If we are going to continue to offer quality healthcare closer to home, we must have the facilities to provide that care in a manner that is safe for our patients, and safe for our staff. If we want to continue for another 50 years, we must make these updates."

The LCHD Board, however, will be asking for input from the community on the nursing home portion of the plan. Community meetings will be announced as soon as they are scheduled.


"The nursing home addition is for 40 single-occupancy rooms, each with its own bathroom. Most other nursing homes have two beds per room, but really no one wants to share a room with someone else. One wing would be for memory-care, and the other wing for long-term nursing care," she explained.

"If we can build this long-term care facility, then if there are Lynnwood residents who are no longer able to care for themselves and need additional care, they can move over to the new facility and still remain under the care of LCHD," said Dr. Richburg.

"Our community has needed a nursing home for years. This is the perfect time to move forward on this project with the benefit of the USDA's incredibly low interest rate," stated Sharon Isham, LCHD Director.

Lynn County Commissioners voted to lift the county burn ban, effective immediately, in action taken at their Jan. 12 meeting. The lifting of the burn ban means that non-incorporated rural areas may have controlled burns or other outdoor burning allowed, but county officials ask that any landowners planning controlled burns to notify the Lynn Sheriff's Office at 561-4505 of when the burn is scheduled, for fire department awareness.

In other action, commissioners approved an annual contract with O'Donnell Volunteer Fire Dept., and voted to accept a resolution for a VOCA grant to apply for funding for the Lynn County Victims' Assistance program.

Bonds were approved for county employees Felicia Moreno and Julia Charo, and commissioners approved an interlocal agreement for Terry County to house Lynn County inmates as needed.

Sheriff Wanda Mason presented a report from the LCSO, and some discussion was held on the possible

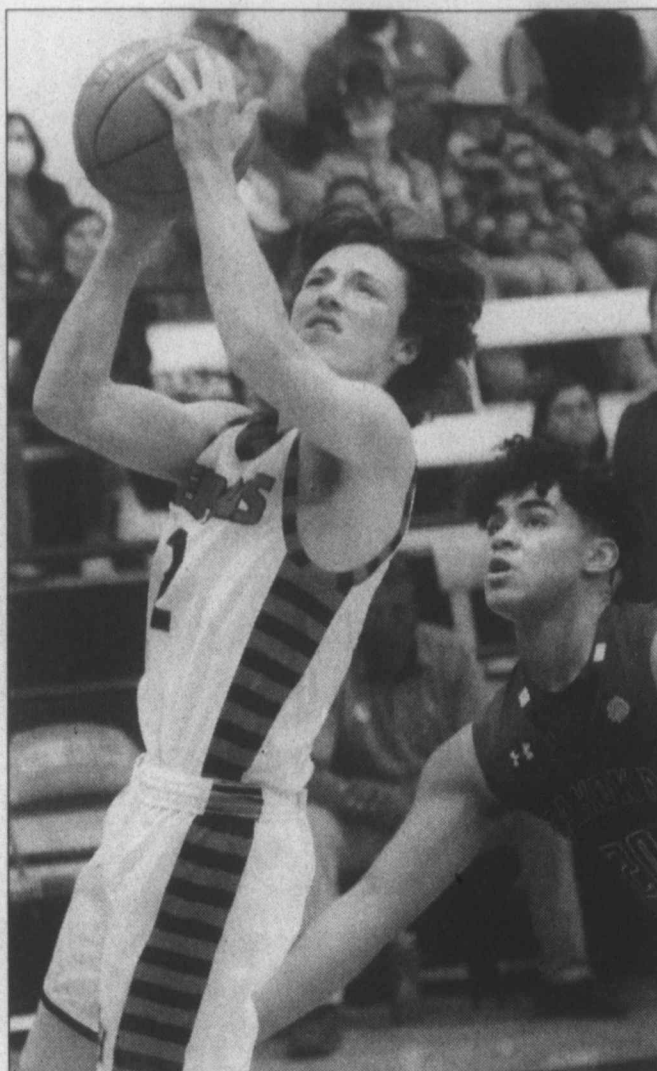
purchase of new vehicles for LCSO, but action was tabled on the issue for more information.

Commissioners went into executive session for approximately 45 minutes to discuss personnel matters.

Tax Assessor/Collector Donna Willis presented a report on her office, and monthly bills were approved.

Chief Juvenile Probation Officer Bill Schoemann introduced Bryant Sears to county officials. Sears is filling the position of Chief Juvenile Probation Officer and Lynn County Emergency Management director, as Schoemann is vacating these positions due to his upcoming retirement. Commissioners presented Schoemann with a plaque of appreciation and a US Flag that was hung on Veterans' Day in his honor.

County Judge Mike Braddock led the meeting, with all four commissioners present including Don Blair, Larry Durham, John Hawthorne, and Matt Woodley, as well as other county officials. The meeting adjourned at 11:30 a.m.

NRCS deadline soon for Conservation Assistance Funding

The USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) in Texas has established a second funding application deadline of Feb. 12, 2021, for the Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP).

"We are encouraging producers to call their NRCS office to discuss conservation planning and financial assistance options," said Kristy Oates, NRCS state conservationist for Texas. "Applications received by the February 12 deadline will be ranked for funding by early June."

Applications are taken year-round for NRCS programs, but deadlines are announced to rank and fund eligible conservation projects. Producers interested in signing up for EQIP should submit applications to their local USDA service center. If already a USDA client, a producer can submit applications online via Farmers.gov.

EQIP is a voluntary program that provides financial and technical assistance to agricultural producers. Technical assistance is provided without a fee from NRCS specialists to help landowners and land managers plan and implement conservation practices to help them meet their land management goals, address natural resource concerns and improve soil, water, plant, animal, air, and related resources on agricultural land and non-industrial private forestland.

For additional information visit the NRCS Texas website at www.tx.nrcs.usda.gov. Applications for EQIP are accepted on a continuous basis. Producers interested in EQIP can contact their local USDA service center or visit the NRCS EQIP web page.

TISD Board calls for May 1 election for two At-Large trustee positions

The Board has begun a search for a new superintendent for Tahoka ISD. The TISD board of trustees has approved the ESC 17 to conduct the Superintendent search for the district. The application period has already begun. Following the deadline for applications, the Board will review all applications and select a specific number of candidates it wishes to interview. After the first round of interviews, the Board will narrow the field of applicants and conduct second interviews, and the Board will then name a Lone Finalist. As required by state statute, the Board must then wait twenty-one days before it can take action to employ that candidate. It is anticipated that the

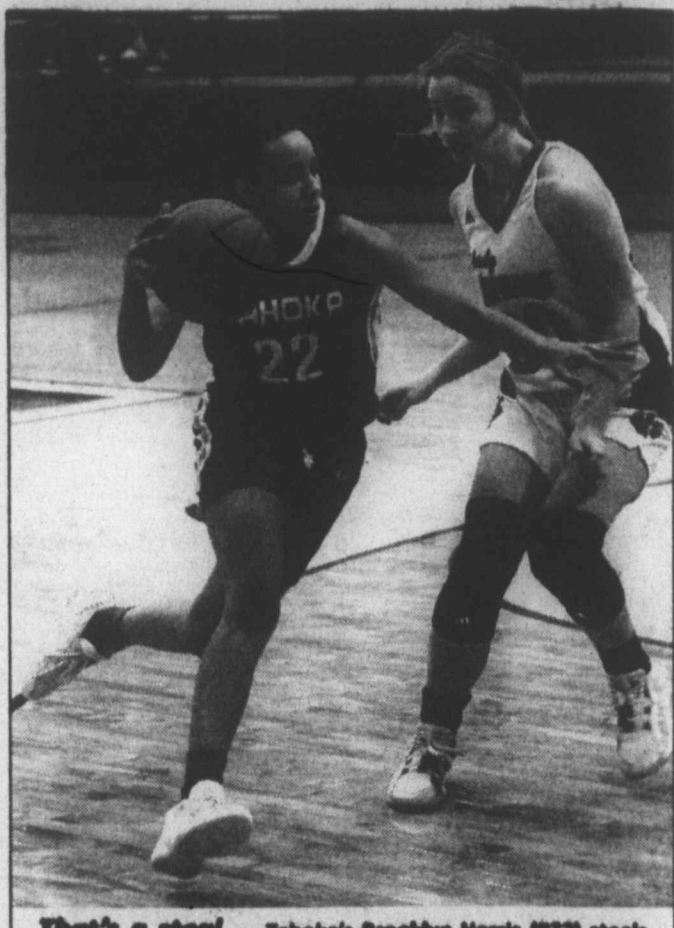
new superintendent will be employed sometime this spring and will be on the job on or before July 1, 2021, depending on his/her contractual obligations with his/her current district.

"It is important to note that once the search process begins, the Board will be obligated to keep the names of all applicants in complete confidence; therefore, please do not put any of our trustees in a difficult position by asking for information about who they are considering for the position," stated Supt. Harrell.

The Board also authorized the sale of a 2001 Chevrolet Suburban and a 2000 Chevrolet Express van.

The principals, athletic director, and special education Co-op director gave monthly reports to the Board.

The next regular board meeting is scheduled for Thursday, February 11th.
