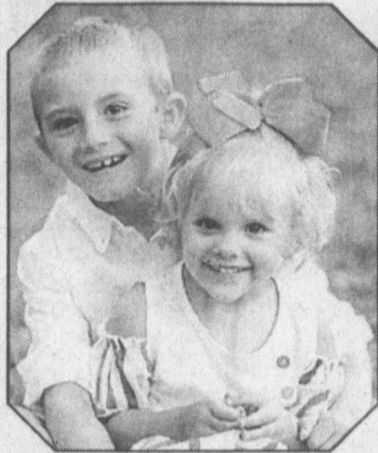

## Julie Arrington named City Administrator

Julie Arrington, a woman with more than 25 years of municipal government experience, has been named the City Administrator for the City of Tahoka. She is coming to Tahoka from Clarksville, where she was the City Manager.

Tahoka City Council chose Arrington as the finalist for the position in their Jan. 18 meeting, after conducting interviews from among the finalists under consideration. Arrington later met with current

City Administrator Jerry Webster and Tahoka Mayor John Baker to discuss the terms of her contract, and last week she verbally accepted the position. During Monday night's council meeting this week, the council officially approved the contract, and Arrington was officially sworn into office during the meeting.

She begins her duties here this week.

Webster officially retired as

City Administrator here on Jan. 22, but is staying on in a consulting position for the transition period. Citizens are invited to say farewell to Webster and greet Arrington at a Meet & Greet on Thursday (today) from 2:00-5:30 p.m. at the City/County Library, 1717 Main Street in the Life Enrichment Center.

## Covid vaccine in short supply here, residents urged to go elsewhere

Area residents who have been on a wait-list for the Covid-19 vaccine through Lynn County Hospital District may want to consider getting their vaccine elsewhere, as LCHD has had no further shipments since the first 100 vaccines were sent. Those 100 vaccines were given in one day, and no other vaccines have been shipped here since.

It is a frustrating situation for LCHD CEO Dr. Melanie Richburg, who has been requesting more vaccines every week here.

"The state is focusing on the vaccine hubs for the distribution," stated Dr. Richburg. "We have to request/order vaccines every week... so we submit an order every Monday. We watch the list of sites that will receive vaccines over the next few weeks. Today (Wednesday, Feb. 3), we are not on the list for the next two shipments, so for the next two weeks we will not receive any.

"I think we will get some more vaccines eventually, but when and how many I cannot predict. I don't want people to wait for us and it be another two or three weeks, plus, when I get some it will probably only be another 100," she added.

"It is very disappointing and frustrating when you are tasked to take care of a community and the supplies you need are allocated to larger populations. It disappoints me that I have to ask or tell a patient to go to Lubbock. We are Healthcare Closer to Home... but it does not feel that way right now. We have had the same issue with testing supplies for Covid... we could either get none or so few that it could not even begin to help us care for our patients.

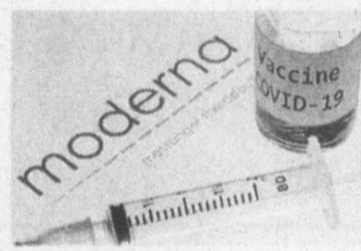
"I feel, once again, rural com-

munities are overlooked. The time and resources it takes for me to administer 100 doses could just as easily take care of 1000 doses, if we had them," said Dr. Richburg.

The Covid-19 vaccines are be-

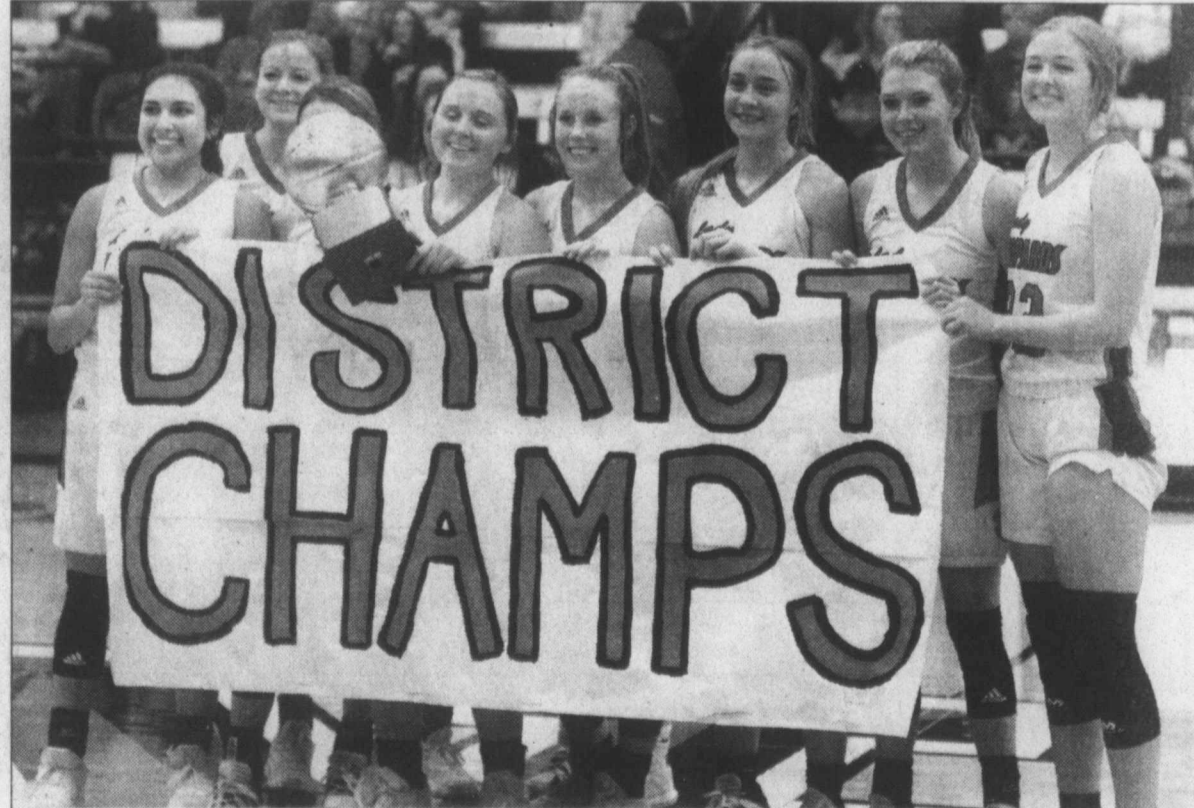

Memorial donations can be made in Juanita's name to the American Cancer Society.



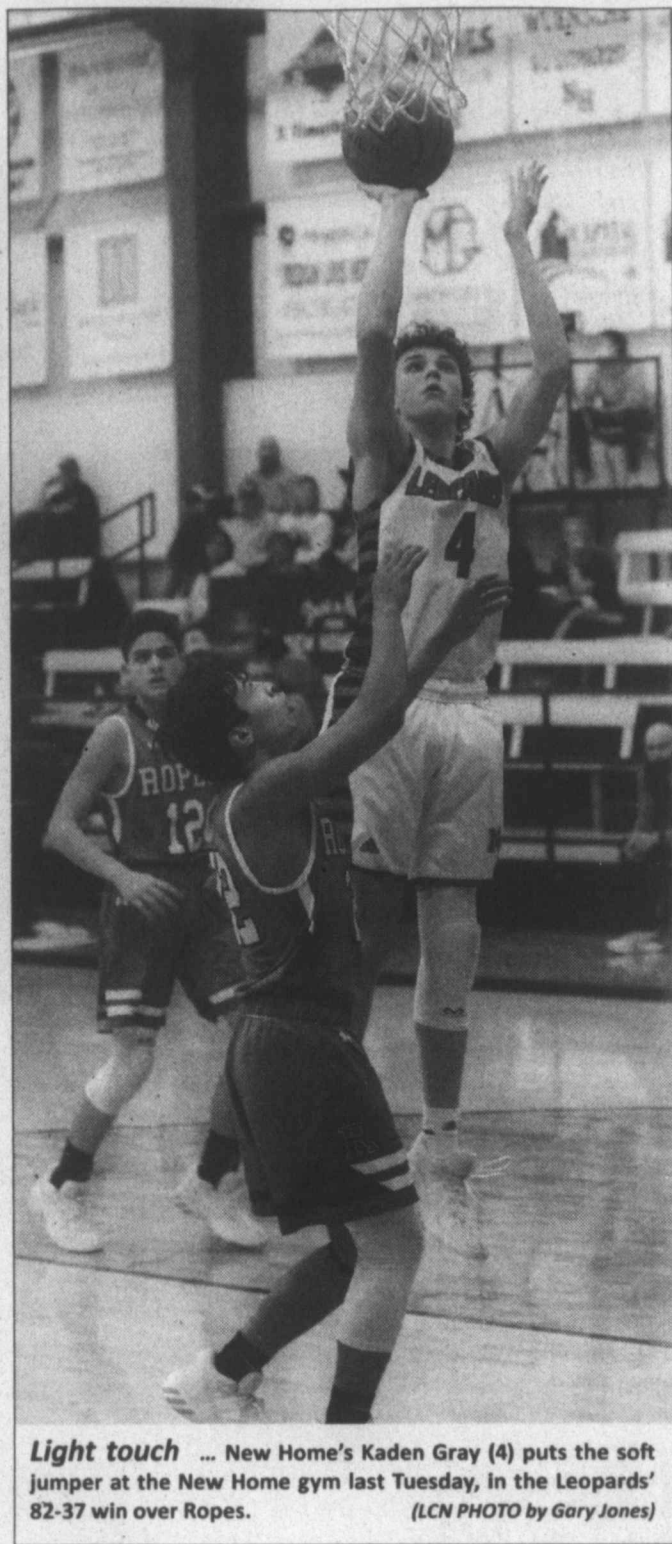
**June Nungester**

June Nungester passed away peacefully on January 29, 2021 from kidney failure.

June was born in Lubbock, Texas, on December 3, 1932, a few minutes before her identical twin sister, Jean. After a short stay in Lubbock, June and her sister were taken by their parents, Ethyl and John Covey, to their home in Wilson, Texas. She graduated from Wilson High School and attended Texas Tech in Lubbock and Hardin-Simmons in Abilene, Texas. On February 10, 1951, she married Lawrence "Pinky" May. They had two sons, Wade E. May of Buhl, Idaho, and Scott B. May of Watunga, Oklahoma.

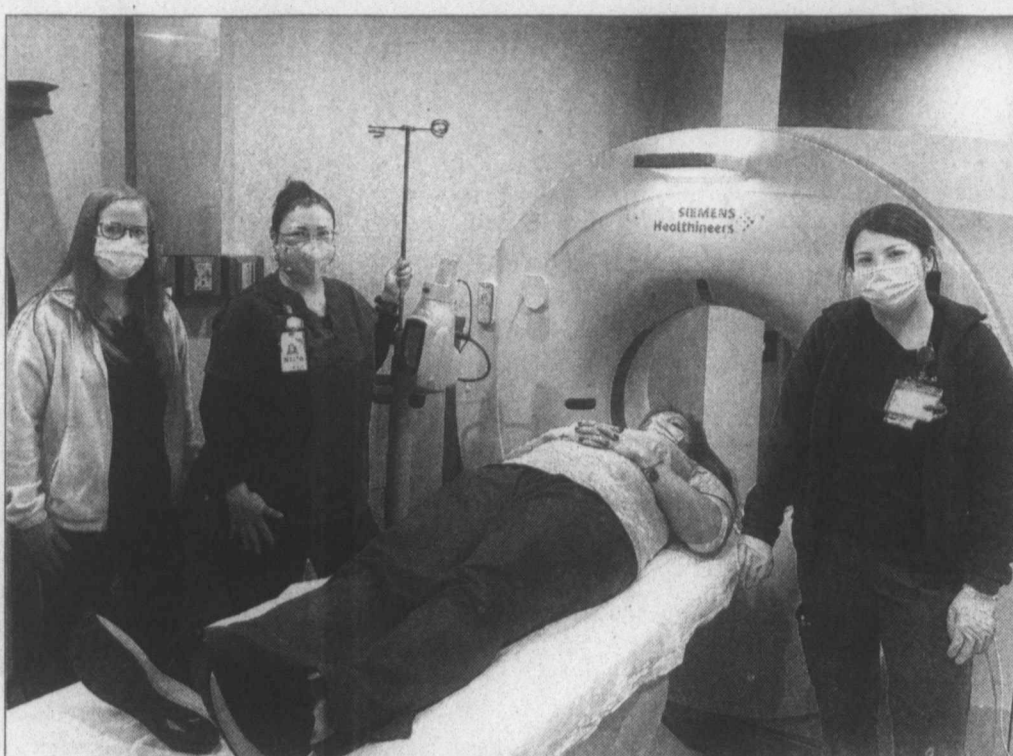
## New CT scanner at LCHD detects coronary calcium

The Lynn County Hospital District (LCHD) Radiology Dept. is now offering Coronary Calcium Scoring Tests with a new Siemens CT scanner. A cardiac CT for coronary calcium is a non-invasive way of obtaining information about the presence, location and extent of calcified plaque in the coronary arteries – the vessels that supply oxygen-containing blood to the heart muscle. Because calcium is a marker of CAD, the amount of calcium detected on a Cardiac CT scan is a helpful prognostic tool. The findings are expressed as a Calcium Score.

The goal of cardiac CT scan for calcium scoring is to determine if CAD is present and to what extent, even if there are no symptoms. It is a screening study that may be recommended by a physician for patients with risk factors for CAD but no clinical symptoms.

The major risk factors for CAD are: high blood cholesterol levels, family history of heart attacks, diabetes, high blood pressure, cigarette smoking, overweight or obese, and physical inactivity.

### Did you know?

#### Moon Tree planting commemorates 50th Anniversary of Apollo 14

Monday, Feb. 8, 2021, a seed that is a descendant of a Moon Tree seed that journeyed to the moon and back aboard Apollo 14 in 1971 was planted at the Leach Teaching Gardens at Texas A&M University in College Station, to serve as an inspiration to others of what is possible.

Jan. 31-Feb. 9, 2021 marked the 50th anniversary of the Apollo 14 mission where Alan Shepard and Edgar Mitchell walked on the Moon while Stuart Roosa, a former U.S. Forest Service smoke jumper, orbited above in the command module.

Packed in Roosa's personal kit were hundreds of tree seeds, part of a joint NASA/USFS project. Upon return to Earth, the seeds were germinated by the Forest Service. Known as the "Moon Trees" the resulting seedlings were planted throughout the United States, many as part of the nation's bicentennial celebration in 1975-1976.

Today, they stand as a tribute to the Apollo program and to the astronaut Roosa.

Texas A&M Forest Service has a genetic copy of an original Loblolly Pine Moon Tree whose seed journeyed to the moon and back aboard Apollo 14 in 1971. The tree was obtained from research conducted at the USDA Southern Research Station.

## County Commissioners approve grant requests for SO assistance

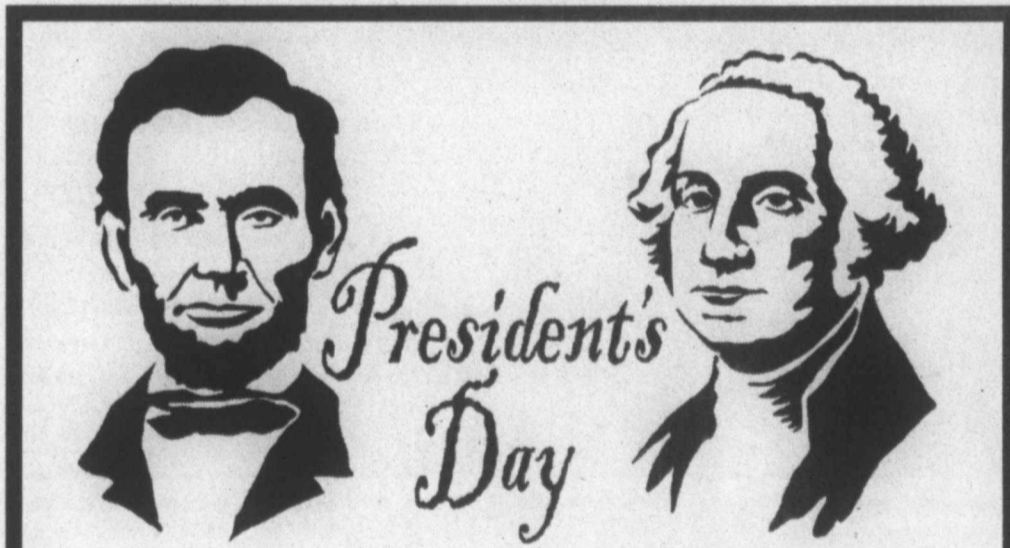
Several resolutions were approved for grant requests for the Sheriff's Department, at Monday morning's regular session of the Lynn County Commissioners Court. Grant requests included assistance for reentry transition service for inmates; counseling fitness and vocation for inmates; mental health assistance for inmates; a grant program for law enforcement vehicles; and a grant program for Sheriff Office Vehicle/Portable Communications. A K-9 Grant for the Lynn County Sheriff's Office was also approved for requesting grant assistance.

Commissioners accepted

a vehicle donation from the City of O'Donnell Police Department for SWAT and EMC Emergency Services.

A contract was approved with Armstrong Mechanical for \$7,500 annually with inspections twice a year with filter changes for units, and budget amendments were approved as presented. Monthly bills were also approved.

Lynn County Judge Mike Braddock led the meeting, with all commissioners present including John Hawthorne, Matt Woodley, Don Blair and Larry Durham; as well as other county officials.

The USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service in Texas is accepting applications for the Agricultural Conservation Easement Program (ACEP). While NRCS accepts easement applications on a continuous basis, applications for the next funding consideration must be submitted by March 1, 2021.

"Easements are sometimes

a perfect fit for a landowner who is looking to protect his or her land from future development or to protect and improve wetlands or provide critical habitat for wildlife," said Kristy Oates, NRCS state conservationist for Texas. "We encourage Indian tribes, state and local governments, non-governmental organizations and private landown-

ers to call their local NRCS office to find out how to apply." ACEP Agricultural Land Easements provide financial assistance to eligible partners for purchasing easements that protect the agricultural use and conservation values of eligible land. In the case of working farms, the program helps farmers and ranchers keep their land

in agriculture.

ACEP Wetlands Reserve Easements allow landowners to successfully restore, enhance and protect habitat for wildlife on their lands, reduce damage from flooding, recharge groundwater and provide outdoor recreational and educational opportunities. Contact USDA for info.

## A look back at ... Woodwork

**H**ERE IT IS already the second week in February, with Lincoln's birthday and Valentine Day coming up this weekend.

Abraham Lincoln, if he were alive, would be 200 years old today, and I think I am beginning to realize how he would feel. He was born poor and, although he is considered one of the greatest leaders of all time, he could never be president in today's political scene, because now you have to be pretty wealthy just to make a run at the job.

He was called Honest Abe, and may have been the last honest man ever to hold office in Washington. Well, maybe not, but an honest politician these days has little chance of success. I had a friend who used to say, "I don't want an honest man in office; I want a crook who is on my side."

He was assassinated while attending a play in a theater. I don't recall ever hearing what the play was all about, if it was almost over, or what.

VALENTINE'S DAY, once celebrated with machine gun fire up north, and originally based on some kind of Roman holiday where young girls were chased around and whacked with switches or some such nonsense, is better celebrated locally by grandparents bragging on their kids, and a lot of cute ones are shown in this issue of the newspaper.

St. Valentine was two people, the encyclopedia tells me. It was a name given to two Christian martyrs whose feasts were formerly observed on Feb. 14. One was believed to be a Roman priest martyred "during the persecution of Claudius the Goth, and buried on the Flaminian Way; the second was probably a bishop of Terni martyred in Rome. It is possible that these two legends were based on real people or, as some believe, one person. The association of St. Valentine's Day with love and courtship may have arisen from the coincidence of the date with the Roman festival of Lupercalia, a feast day dropped from the Roman church calendar in 1969."

SEMINOLE - The Seminole Economic Development Corp. (SEDC) unanimously approved allocating \$20,000 to fund three highway signs honoring local veterans.

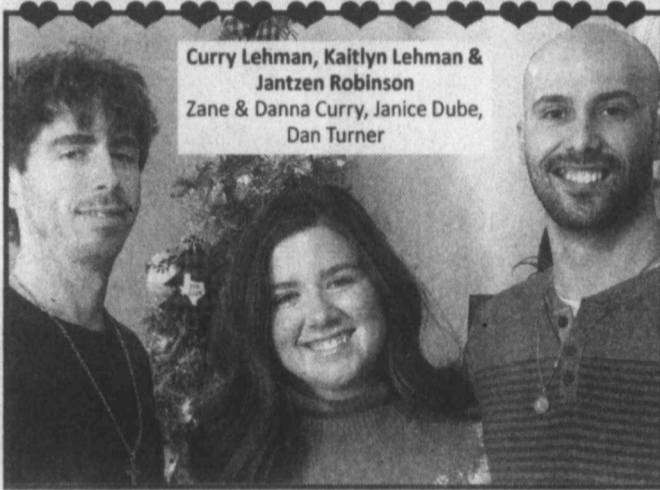

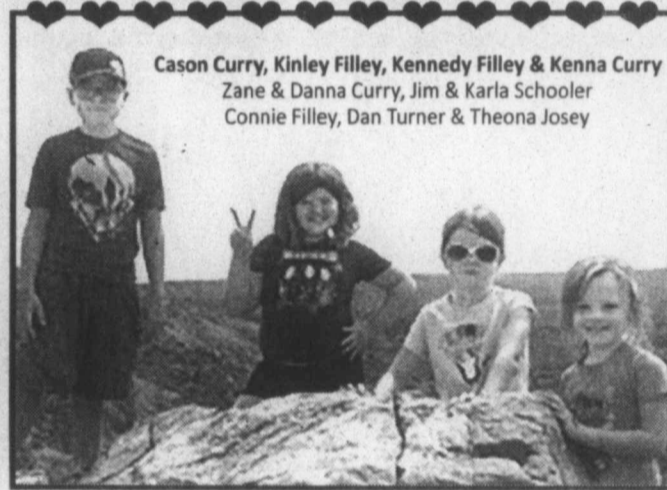

The motion passed unanimously.

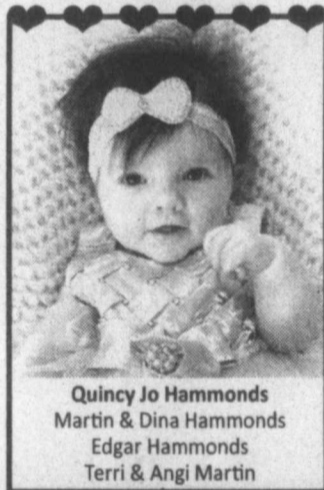

Tahoka High School hosted a Powerlifting Meet last Saturday, with Sundown, Seagraves, Olton participating.

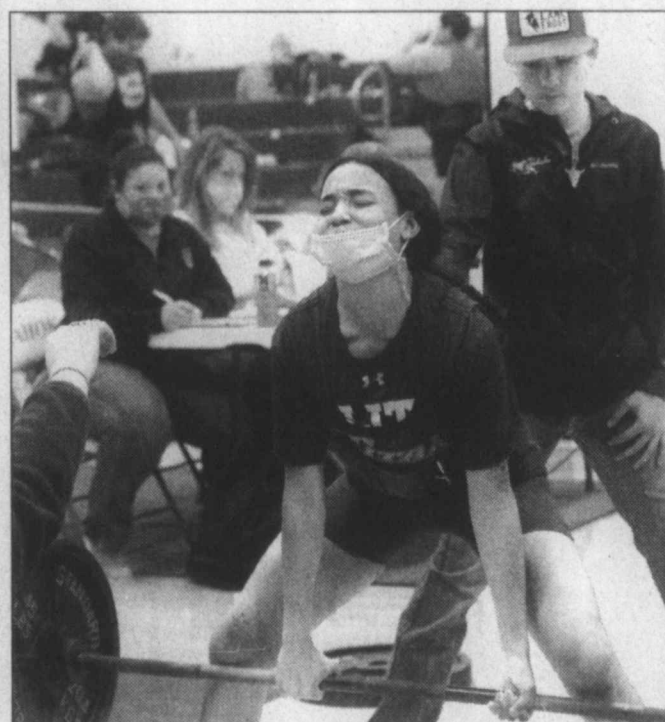

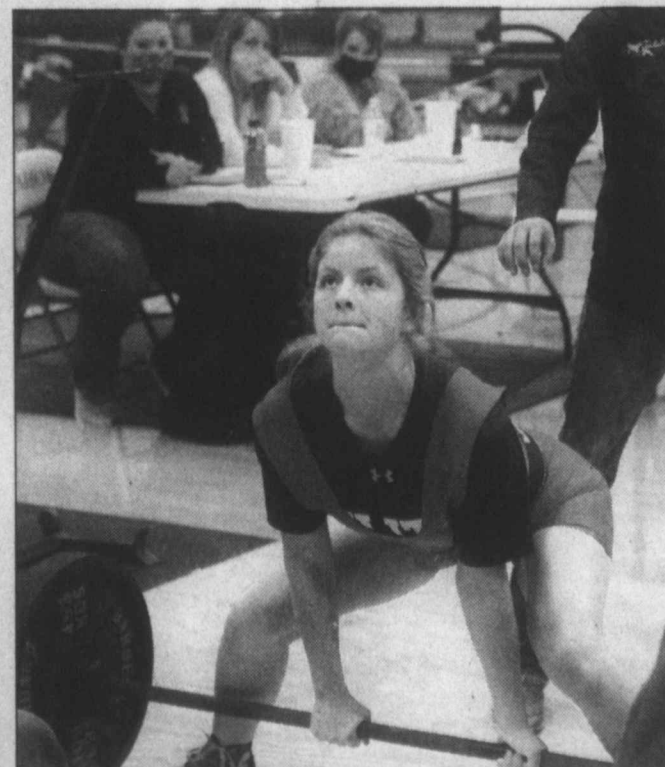

## NEED AN MRI? Lynn County Hospital's new MRI offers high-quality, low-anxiety procedure

The new MRI machine at Lynn County Hospital is state-of-the-art, but the best thing about it is that its operator, Amador Padilla, is focused on not only getting the best images feasible, but also wants to make the experience as anxiety-free as possible for his patients. He offers headphones that can provide music of the patient's choice, or noise-cancelling earplugs. If the patient gets anxious and breaks into a sweat during the procedure, he can turn on a fan inside the machine to make the patient more comfortable. He can talk to the patient while he watches the procedure from behind a safety window, and in many cases the patient can see him as well, depending on how they are positioned. What's more, each patient gets a squeezable "panic ball" to hold in their hand that sends a signal when squeezed, which he responds to immediately.

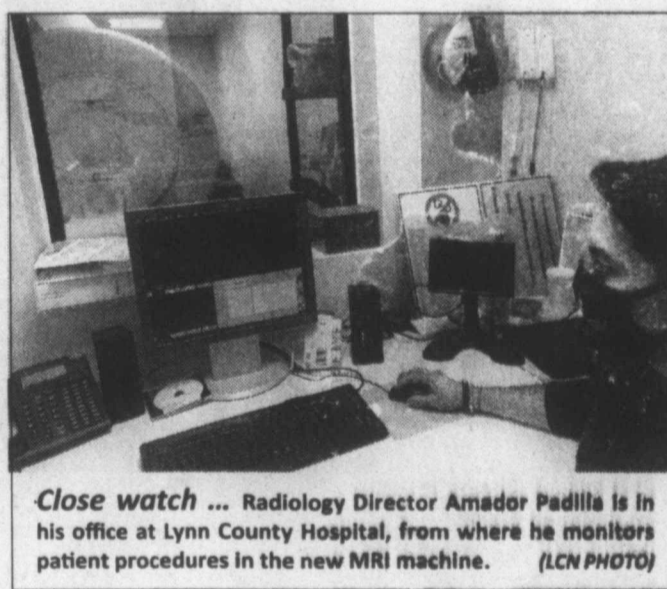
Padilla is the Radiology Director at Lynn County Hospital District (LCHD), and has 13 years of experience in radiology, with experience at several larger healthcare institutions, free-standing ERs, and private agencies before coming to Lynn County Hospital District. He has been with LCHD for 2-1/2 years.

He has a friendly, professional but easy-going demeanor, and is eager to make each patient's MRI procedure as comfortable as possible.

"I have been blessed to have years of experience in radiology, and a lot of interaction with MRI machines," he said. "We have state-of-the-art equipment here, and a great healthcare team. I want to be able to provide the best care for our patients, and want them to know that we can provide the same quality of care as available anywhere," he added.

Padilla is justifiably proud of the new Siemens Espree 1.5 Tesla MRI machine at LCHD. Magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) uses a large magnet and radio waves to look at organs and structures inside the body. Health care professionals use MRI scans to diagnose a variety of conditions, from torn ligaments to tumors. Unlike X-rays and computed tomography (CT) scans, MRIs don't use the damaging ionizing radiation of X-rays.

What the MRI does use, is magnetic resonance - and according to Padilla the 1.5 Tesla of LCHD's machine is 20 times stronger than the earth's magnetic field. The strength of the machine is standard for the industry, and offers the same quality images as available elsewhere. The machine here also can accommodate a patient weight capacity of

up to 550 pounds, which is in the higher range in the industry, and the table height is one of the lowest in the industry, which allows easier access for patients.

"This Siemens MRI is particularly good for people who suffer from claustrophobia in tight spaces, because it has the shortest bore (length of the tube) and the largest diameter bore in the industry for Siemens. Depending on the body part that needs to be scanned, if it is an upper or lower extremity, the patient's face is most likely outside the tube itself, because of the shorter bore length," Padilla explained.

"Our MRI offers the same high-quality images as available anywhere else, and at LCHD we can probably get you in quicker than our neighbors up north. We can do almost every body part that needs imaging. We are ready to accept any patients - you do not have to be under the care of an LCHD physician to get your MRI here. Simply ask your provider to write a script or give us a call, and we will get you in as quickly as possible," he said.

The digital images will be provided to the patient and/or the provider requesting the service.

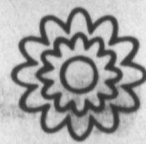
Padilla says that most MRIs typically last from 15-25 minutes, depending on the body part that requires imaging.

"I look to get the shortest time with the highest quality of images for each patient," he explained. "I can provide any type of music to help distract and lower the patient's anxiety level, and I can talk to them and watch them carefully throughout the procedure."

MRI services are available Monday-Friday from 8:00-5:00 at LCHD, but Padilla says he can provide the service after hours, or on a Saturday, if it is necessary for the patient.

"At LCHD, we strive to work with our patients to go above and beyond their expectations, in providing healthcare closer to home. We are open to discussing those needs on a case-by-case basis," he said.

# Pursuit ends in arrest made near Tahoka last Wednesday

Lynn County law enforcement departments assisted Dawson County in a pursuit/arrest that ended at the southern edge of Tahoka on US 87 last Wednesday morning. Lynn County Sheriff Wanda Mason and Tahoka Police Chief Jeff Parker, along with at least one other officer from each department, helped at the scene, according to information from the Lamesa Press-Reporter.

The incident began about 7:20 a.m., when Lamesa School Resource Officer Gabriel Flores and his K-9 partner Riot were driving to Lamesa from Lubbock, and he heard a radio call from the Lamesa Police Dept. about a reckless driver heading north on US 87 at a high rate of speed.

Flores, who was driving a marked patrol vehicle, spotted the suspect vehicle. After getting permission from his supervisors, Flores turned around to attempt a traffic stop on the 2014 Ford Fusion. The high-speed chase, with the suspect vehicle reportedly traveling at more than 90 mph, ended just south of the Tahoka city limits when the driver almost lost control at the curve and then stopped. Flores was quickly joined by officers from the Tahoka Police Department.

"The driver immediately said he was on Xanax," Flores said, according to the Lamesa Press-Reporter. Xanax is the brand name of a controlled substance which can be prescribed to treat anxiety and panic disorders.

"When I went up to the car I had like a slight smell of marijuana coming from the vehicle," Flores said.

That's when Riot, Flores' K-9 partner who has been trained to detect drugs, went to work.

"I walked him around the car once and Riot gave me two positives," Flores said.

A subsequent search found two bags in the back seat of the vehicle that contained drugs and cash, the officer said.

Seized were about two and a half pounds of marijuana, \$6,909 in cash, Xanax, and THC in both liquid and wax form. THC is the chemical responsible for most of marijuana's psychological effects.

Flores said a 9 mm Sig Sauer P365 pistol found on the floor board of the vehicle also was seized.

The driver, identified as 49-year-old David Haskell of Trinidad, Colo., was arrested on multiple charges which Flores said ranged from evading arrest to possession of a controlled substance and money laundering.

After being arraigned in Tahoka, Haskell was transported to Lamesa and booked into the Dawson County Jail.

Flores expressed appreciation for the assistance provided not only by the Tahoka Police Department but also by officers from the Lynn County Sheriff's Office and Texas Department of Public Safety in Lamesa who also arrived at the scene shortly after the vehicle was stopped.

It was the largest drug seizure yet for both Flores and Riot. Flores has been a licensed peace officer since 2008 and has partnered with Riot, a mix of pit bull and dalmatian, for about two years.

In other law enforcement reports here during the past week were numerous calls for suspicious vehicles, unwanted

persons, assisting motorists, domestic disturbances, welfare concerns, reckless drivers, debris in roadways, and harassment phone calls/posts on social media. There were also several reports of minor thefts, including some scrap metal reported stolen from property on FM 212, a tool box and tools reported stolen from a shop on

CR 1, and personal information believed to have been taken when someone picked a lock to gain access to a motor home on FM 179.

An investigation continues in O'Donnell where a caller reported her back porch was on fire in the 400 block of 4th St. just before midnight on Feb. 7. The homeowner said

it appeared as if someone had thrown something at the porch.

Tahoka Police are investigating a case involving a bb-gun shooting out the windows of a vehicle traveling in the 2300 block of N. 4th during the noon hour on Feb. 5. Two people inside the vehicle reportedly suffered minor injuries in the incident.
