Arctic blast sends temps plummeting in week-long winter weather event

n epic winter weather event plummeted temperatures when an arctic air mass dropped ice-cold weather across the nation and into Texas as it dipped down into this area. Temperatures plunged below freezing last Tuesday night, dumping ice and snow on everything in its path, and stayed in the teens and 20s for the rest of the week, then dropped into the sub-zero and single digits on the weekend, with the freezing temps continuing this week. Temperatures were not expected to rise above freezing until today (Thursday).

When the winter storm entered the area on Tuesday night, it also brought an icy precipitation making extremely dangerous driving conditions. Lynn County EMS responded to 14 traffic accidents from early Wednesday morning. through Thursday, before the roads became more drivable - at least until the snowfall that covered the area on Saturday night.

Tahoka recorded its second-coldest temperature of -7 degrees at 3:05 a.m. Monday, Feb. 15. That followed a daytime high of only 6 degrees on Sunday, Feb. 14. According to the National Weather Service, Monday's low was the second coldest temperature ever recorded here, with the coldest temperature ever recorded 88 years ago, on Feb. 8, 1933, at -15 degrees.

Tahoka area residents awoke to approximately 4-inches of snow covering the frozen terrain on Valentine's Day (Sunday), and a temperature that only rose to 6 degrees throughout the frigid day. Many Tahoka residents began experiencing power outages just after 8 a.m. Sunday, and by noon the entire city was without power as Xcel Energy worked to restore power at the Tahoka substation. Lynnwood Independent & Assisted Living Center, located adjacent to Lynn County Hospital, was in one of the first areas to lose electricity, and by 8:30 a.m. Lynn County EMS volunteers were assisting in evacuating the 20 residents there to the hospital meeting room for the duration of the outage. With a backup generator, the hospital could operate at a limited level, with limited lighting and operations. "We helped move the 20 residents of Lynnwood to the hospital meeting room, and our hospital staff did an outstanding job with the limited resources on hand to make sure the residents were comfortable, and providing lunch and dinner. They held sing-alongs, told jokes, and played games to help entertain them. The power was restored by late afternoon at Lynnwood, and by 5 p.m. we (EMS) had them all back home," said John Baker, EMS Director at Lynn County Hospital. Baker, who is also the mayor of Tahoka, ordered the City's Community Room to open for anyone seeking a warmer place throughout the day on Sunday, as the city offices have a backup generator, and a few residents reportedly took advantage of the opportunity. Baker said that plans had been made for providing emergency overnight accommodations at the city building, with cots set up for sleeping, if the power had not been restored. "Fortunately, the power was restored throughout the city before that plan had to be put into place," Baker told The News on Monday.


The massive winter storm impacted much of the US, and all of Texas. According to Texas meteorologists, every single county in the state of Texas was under a winter storm warning, which was considered an anomoly that was described as "a once-in-a-generation event that you may never see again."

Rolling blackouts started across the state and in the South Plains area as energy companies urged customers to find ways to conserve power in the frigid temperatures. With many areas reporting negative wind chills and temperatures, home energy use was expected to go beyond what many power grids could provide to customers.

During the early morning hours Monday, the local electric cooperative headquartered in Tahoka that provides electricity to the rural areas of Lynn, Terry and Garza counties - Lyntegar Electric Cooperative, Inc. - issued a warning and said it had to manually shed its power load to avoid system-wide blackouts. In complying with the order given by the Electric Reliability Council of Texas (ERCOT), Lyntegar shut down some service lines, reporting 1,980 meters out of service. Many of its customers were without power in the Lamesa area from late Sunday night going into Monday morning. By noon Monday, Xcel Energy issued a warning that it was beginning controlled outages throughout this area as well. O'Donnell was reportedly without power starting about 3:30 a.m. Monday and lasting for up to 12 hours, and O'Donnell city officials reportedly opened the O'Donnell Community Center for residents to gather. Tuesday saw large-scale power outages throughout the area, including Tahoka and O'Donnell, for several hours, as the power grid could not sustain the usage.



I'm totally preoccupied with staring outside and cursing the elements while dreaming of those summer days when blast-furnace winds hit me in the face if I ventured outside. My dog is bored, my cats are fascinated by the starving, miserable birds on the porch, and my outside cats are looking at me like I'm a traitor.

This whole "weather event" confirms my grandfather's assertion that, if it had been left up to me, the West would still be unsettled. As in, with no settlers in it. That reminds me that I'm reading Empire of the Summer Moon with a student of mine, and it is really good. I thought I had read it, but I was thinking of some other book with Comanches in it.

This one is a fast-moving, densely packed, nonfiction narrative of Quanah Parker's life and the lifestyle of the Comanches, with parallel stories of the White people who settled, governed, and fought against the People of the Comancheria. To make it even cooler, we first read J. Evetts Haley's biography of Charles Goodnight, and that book is a source for this one, so it's like we keep running into an old friend in this new place.

If the electricity holds out and the water stays thawed downstairs, I will probably survive this, but Papa was right: I am no pioneer. Quanah and Goodnight would just be shaking their heads.







Icy weather to blame in more than a dozen accidents

wake of a winter ice storm that gripped the area, rolling into Lynn County during the overnight hours last Tuesday and causing dangerous driving conditions on highways in the county. Most of the accidents occurred from early Wednesday through Thursday, with road conditions improving by Thursday afternoon. However, the freezing winter weather continued, and snow blanketed the area on Saturday night, bringing more dangerous road conditions.

Lynn County Sheriff Wanda Mason said that DPS and LCSO responded to traffic accidents mostly last Wednesday and Thursday, but as of Monday morning had not responded to any accidents after Saturday's snowfall. She credited the local TxDOT office with working to provide treating area roadways.


