## Commencement set for 95 county seniors

One of life's important milestones is marked by graduation ceremonies. Four high schools in Lynn County will hold commencement ceremonies for graduates, with two ceremonies set for Friday night, one scheduled for Saturday morning, and one set next Friday. In all, 95 seniors from four school districts are receiving high school diplomas in the county.

Tahoka High School has 35 seniors in the Class of 2021, with this year's commencement ceremonies slated for 8 p.m. Friday, May 21, at Bulldog football stadium. New Home High School has 29 seniors graduating in ceremonies to be held at 7 p.m. Friday, May 21 in their high school gymnasium.

## Aircraft reports laser lights up cockpit when flying over county

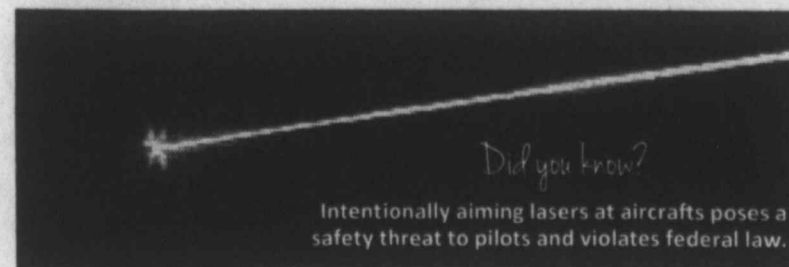

An unusual call to the Sheriff's Office came last week from the DFW Metroplex Airport reporting an incident in Lynn County from an aircraft enroute to Big Spring.

LCSO received a call from the DFW Metroplex Airport at 11:03 p.m. Thursday, May 13, that said they had a report from an aircraft that was enroute to Big Spring. The crew reported they had a laser illuminate the cockpit of their aircraft as they were flying overhead in an area south of US 380 at FM 179, before FM 213. The airport staff reporting the call said that it was FAA protocol for them to report it to the local law enforcement office. A deputy responding to the area was unable to locate any lights. The report did not indicate

whether the aircraft was a small plane or commercial aircraft, but Sheriff Wanda Mason contacted the DFW center to speak with an airline official about the incident.

"This happens all the time," Sheriff Mason said she was told. "He said that usually the laser is a red or green light, and that people do not understand how far-reaching these lasers can be," she told *The News*. "He said that these lasers can even light up a cockpit of a commercial aircraft flying at 40,000 feet, and that it is a safety concern. People think it's fun to point these

lasers at something in the sky, but they don't understand how it can light up a cockpit and become a real safety issue for the pilots," she reported.

"Laser strikes on aircraft remain a serious threat to aviation safety. Intentionally aiming lasers at aircrafts poses a safety threat to pilots and violates federal law. Many high-powered lasers can incapacitate pilots flying aircraft that

may be carrying hundreds of passengers," stated information from faa.gov.

"Because this incident happened at 11 o'clock at night, I wondered if maybe this was possibly a hunter, but my deputy was unable to locate anyone in the area," the Sheriff said.

## Cities, county get monthly sales tax payments

Texas Comptroller Glenn Hegar announced he will send cities, counties, transit systems and special purpose taxing districts \$1.06 billion in local sales tax allocations for May, 28.4 percent more than in May 2020 and 21.9 percent more than in May 2019. These allocations are based on sales made in March by businesses that report tax monthly.

Lynn County's net payment for the month was \$17,166.92, based on a half-cent sales tax rate, making the total payment to date \$66,210.56.

The City of Tahoka's net payment for the month was \$25,653.56, based on a 1.5-cent sales tax rate (including a half-cent collection for the Tahoka Economic Development Corporation), making the total payment to date \$101,007.24.

The City of O'Donnell's net payment for the month was \$4,187.30, based on a

1-cent sales tax rate, making the total payment to date \$17,071.80.

The City of Wilson's net

payment for the month was \$3,249.74, based on a 1-cent sales tax rate, making the total payment to date \$13,471.26.

### County mourns death of Dawson deputy

LAMESA – Shock turned to grief and mourning Tuesday morning as word spread that a longtime Lamesa resident who had been a deputy sheriff here up until just a couple of weeks was killed in the line of duty at his new job in Eden.

Deputy Samuel Leonard of Lamesa, age 26, and fellow Concho County Sheriff's Sgt. Stephen Jones were both shot and killed Monday evening in Eden.

Another individual identified as an Eden city employee, was critically injured in the same incident, according to a Texas Dept. of Public Safety spokesperson.

Funeral services for Leonard, who leaves behind a wife and young daughter along with numerous other family members, were planned for 2 p.m. Monday at First Baptist Church in Lamesa.

Leonard had worked as a patrol deputy for the Dawson County Sheriff's Department for about a year and a half before leaving last month to return to the Concho County Sheriff's Dept. where he had begun his law enforcement career.

"He was a really good deputy," Dawson County Sheriff Matt Hogg said.

Leonard graduated from Klondike High School in 2013. His parents are longtime employees of the school, father Randy as the information technology director and his mother Letha as an art teacher. Also mourning for the family is the staff at North Elementary School in Lamesa, where Samuel's wife Morgan is a first-year fourth-grade teacher.

### Registration for Texas 4-H summer camps now open

Atkinson noted last year's camps were held at about 50% capacity, and additional safety protocols were put in place due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

"We developed a plan

based on guidance from the CDC, American Camping Association, the governor and local health officials," he said. "Camper safety is the primary goal for all of our camps, and we look forward to expanding our camp offerings while providing for the health and well-being of our campers."

Atkinson said as planning moves forward with this year's camps, they have again considered input from these same sources.

"Our camps will continue with enhanced cleaning protocols for the safety of all our campers," he said. "But as the risk of COVID has lessened, we will be relaxing some of the guidelines we had in place last year while keeping others."

Atkinson noted that because most camp activities will be outdoors, the risk of contracting COVID is significantly less than if campers spent most of their

time indoors.

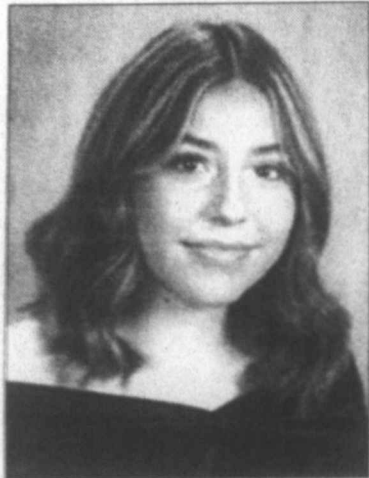
"Along with our enhanced cleaning protocols, we will be reducing the number of high-touch areas and setting a maximum limit for room occupancy," he said. "We will also be providing drive-through sign-up like we did last year. And there are other safety measures we put in place last year that will be continued for this year's camps."

Atkinson said the ability to hold camps at full capacity again has also allowed them

to offer additional camp opportunities.

"We will offer a variety of summer camps focused on wildlife, fishing, outdoor challenges, photography and STEM, as well as our County Camps, Horizons, Adventure Camps and Mission Possible Camp," said Tyler Cheely, 4-H youth program director at the center. "Our goal is to provide a variety of camps that address a range of youth interests."

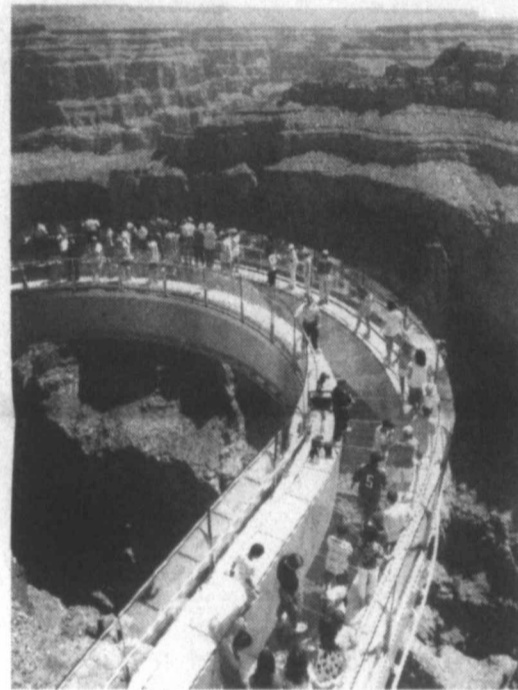
A look back at ...

IF YOU have nerves of steel, or if you have lived a full life already and your life insurance is worth more than you are, you soon may have the opportunity to stroll out on the new Grand Canyon Sky Walk, which will extend 70 feet out past the rim of a cliff, and there will be nothing between you and eternity except 4,000 feet of space, straight down to the Colorado River.

With this column is a picture of what the sky walk will look like, when it is finished, supposedly some time next year, on the west rim of the Grand Canyon, on the Hualapai Indian Reservation.

A friend sent me this picture by e-mail, along with a bunch of information about the project, along with the comment, "I can see you crawling on your hands and knees to look over the edge."

According to his e-mail, the walkway will have a glass bottom and sides, all four inches thick, and is designed to hold 72 million pounds, will accommodate 120 people at a time, built with more than a million pounds of steel beams and includes dampeners that minimize the structure's vibration.

Also included was a map showing the location of the Sky Walk, north of an intersection of AZ 66 and a road which goes southwest to Dolan Springs.

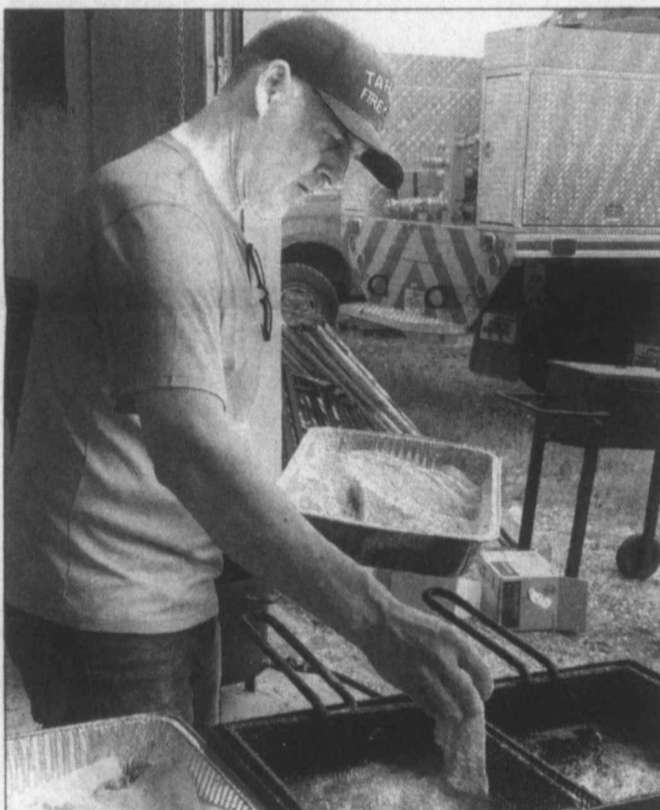
I figured the whole thing was a hoax, since I can't imagine anyone wanting to walk out on the walkway as shown. So I got on the internet and checked out the Hualapai Reservation. I found the Hualapai Lodge at Peach Springs AZ, 54 miles northeast of Kingman on AZ 66, the only town on the reservation. This lodge takes care of all kinds of sightseeing tours, fishing, hiking, boating and bus and helicopter tours, all of which sound pretty interesting. Then I telephoned the lodge to find out if there really is such a thing as the skywalk project.

A nice-sounding lady assured me that such an attraction really is in the works, but not much has been done on it yet. She agreed with me that only the very courageous (I wanted to say stupid, but I didn't) would want to go out on this glass limb which doesn't appear to have much support.

I think I'd like to see that area of the Grand Canyon, and maybe even make that lodge headquarters while I'm there. And I'd like to see the Sky Walk when it's finished, too, but you couldn't get me out there on it at gunpoint. -- Nov 2005

**Board extends contracts for two TISD administrators**

The Tahoka ISD Board of Trustees met in regular session on May 12, approving contract extensions for two administrators and canvassing the election results.

Administrative contracts are revolving two-year contracts, and the board took Superintendent Torrey Price's recommendation to approve one-year extensions for Elementary Principal Donnie Scott and Middle School Principal Kelly Kieth. The contract for High School Principal Don Worth was a non-action item at this time, according to school officials.

The board canvassed the election results from the May 1 school board election, and Clay Taylor and Lea Swinford were sworn in to serve another three-year term as trustees for the two At-Large seats on the board. The board then reorganized and Clay Taylor was elected to serve another term as president, Drew Stone was elected vice president, and Lea Swinford was elected secretary.

Trustees awarded the school depository contract to Happy State Bank for September 2021 to August 2023.

In other business, trustees approved the purchase of a 71-passenger school bus, and also took action to repair and upgrade the culinary arts building. Phase II of the high school renovation project was approved, which was repair/update work that had been designated in the bond project, at a cost of \$998,749.

The board was notified of several staff resignations, including 5th grade teacher Jynna Bass, 2nd grade teacher Merritt Hammonds, MS history teacher/head girls basketball coach Jared Alderson, and business teacher Rebecca Rumpy, who is retiring.

During the public comment portion of the meeting, high school senior Nathaniel Sullivan and his father, James Sullivan, presented brief comments.

Principals presented monthly reports, and the superintendent discussed the furnishing of the new gym and field house and end of year happenings.

End of year student enrollment figures were reported, with 577 total students at Tahoka ISD - 287 in elementary, 137 in middle school, and 153 in high school.

The male, who was wearing a bright blue hoodie, reportedly seemed unaware of the traffic, waving his arms and talking to himself, and callers reported that vehicles were having to swerve to miss hitting him. A deputy located the male, allowed him to make contact with someone, by phone, and gave him a ride to a gas station where he was going to be picked up by another individual.

A caller to LCSO on May 11 wanted to file a report that his driver's license number was compromised, and told officers that he had been notified by a security organization that his DL number was being used on the dark web.

On May 13, a local company called the LCSO to request a deputy at their location due to having issues with a male employee. Shortly afterward, that employee walked in to the Sheriff's Office to report that he had been assaulted by the people at his employment. A deputy investigating the issue discovered that the male employee had an outstanding warrant out of Tarrant County for violation of probation on charges of Assault Causes Bodily Injury to Family Member, and the man was arrested.

A brush fire was reported about a mile north of the north roadside park on US 87 at 2:22 p.m. last Tuesday, but it turned out to be a controlled burn.

Sheriff's deputies responded to other calls during the week for welfare concerns, assisting motorists, and a report of debris on US 87 near Poka Lambro at 11:20 p.m. May 14. A caller reported that her vehicle had struck something in the southbound lanes of US 87, but did not know what she hit, and that some damage had been caused to the underside of the vehicle. A deputy responding to the scene was unable to locate any road debris.

Tahoka Police responded to a residence in the 1800 block of South 6th at 5 p.m. May 15, for a report of a burglary. Several items were reported missing.

Police responded to several residential and business alarms during the past week, but all were malfunctions or owner error, and responded to several domestic disturbances, disputes, reports of harassment, and reckless drivers.

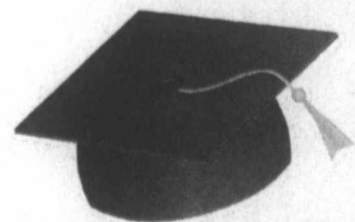
After being the Dragons' athletic director, head football, basketball and track coach this past year, Hodges is leaving Dawson for a similar job at Wilson.
