## Tahoka woman jailed after calling police to report "missing lampshades" at her home

A woman who called police saying someone had "stolen her lampshades" ended up in jail this week. Tahoka Police responded to a residence in the 1700 block of South 2nd at 9:45 a.m. Sunday, June 6 in response to the call, where the woman told officers that someone must have come into her home and stolen her lampshades. During the investigation the officer reportedly saw narcotics and narcotics paraphernalia in plain sight in the residence. The female, Guadalupe Vargas/Garcia, was arrested on felony charges of possession of narcotics and narcotics paraphernalia.

Another female was arrested at 2:50 p.m. Sunday, after Tahoka Police were called to a location at South 6th and Ave. D in response to a caller reporting a suspicious vehicle on the property. Officers discovered narcotics inside the vehicle, and arrested Kristall Munoz for felony possession of narcotics.

Police arrested a man on charges of disorderly conduct and public intoxication, after responding to a residence in the 2000 block of N. 4th at 3:30 a.m. Friday, June 4. A fight reportedly occurred between two males, and one male was arrested at the scene, with charges reportedly pending on the other male as well.

At 2 p.m. Friday, a woman in the 1600 block of Ave. L told police that while she was standing outside a man pulled up in a vehicle and reportedly asked if she was interested in having a sexual relationship. She gave a description of the man and vehicle to police. Officers were unable to locate the vehicle but were patrolling the area to watch for it.

Police responded to the Tahoka Elementary Gym at 8 p.m. June 4, for a report of criminal mischief. Someone had spray painted obscenities on the west side of the building's exterior wall.

Criminal mischief was reported at 6:30 p.m. June 1, at a resi-

dence in the 1700 block of South 3rd. A woman told police that her boyfriend punched her television and caused damage to it.

Tahoka Volunteer Fire Dept. was called to a residence in the 2300 block of N. 5th St., where a shed in the back yard was reportedly on fire, at 8:30 p.m. June 5.

Police were called to a location at South 3rd and Ave. E at noon June 1, where someone was reported to be burning wood/limbs outdoors on the premises. Police informed the resident that outdoor burning was illegal inside the city limits, and the resident complied, putting out the fire.

Lynn County Sheriff's Office responded to several calls for minor incidents during the past week, including a report of an unwanted person at 7 p.m. June 2, when a caller reported that a 9-year-old boy riding around in a toy Jeep in Wilson was causing her dogs to bark and that he was throwing

rocks at the dogs. A deputy responding to the scene said that no crime was committed by the child, who was being supervised by his grandmother.

Suspicious activity was reported near CR FF and CR 3 at 8 p.m. June 3, with a caller reporting that a white pickup with the passenger window busted out, was driving erratically in circles and then was parked and the two occupants of the vehicle had left walking. Another call reporting the same color pickup with the passenger window busted out was reportedly parked at the same location at 11:43 a.m. June 6. A deputy located the vehicle, noting that it was wanted in relation to a Garza County case, and had the vehicle towed.

Other calls to law enforcement included assisting a motorist, a report of debris in the roadway on US 84, a domestic disturbance, reckless drivers, an unwanted person, and welfare concerns.

I eat breakfast only a couple of times a week, unless coffee and a muffin counts. My favorite breakfast would be eggs and bacon or ham and biscuits with lots of butter and jelly.

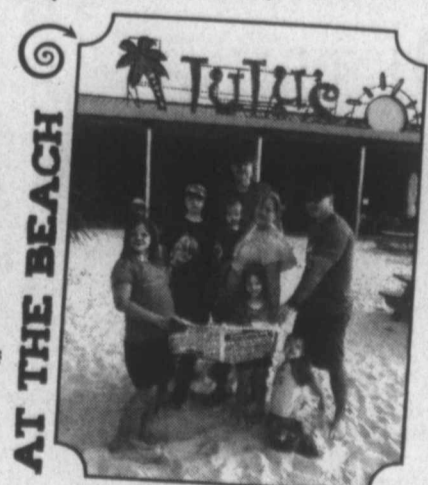
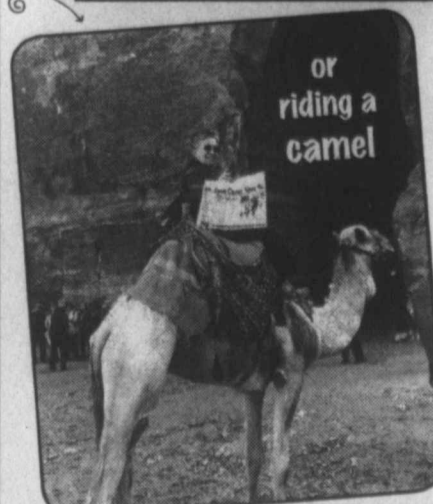

**Thomas Brothers Drug ...** This picture at the Tahoka Pioneer Museum shows the Thomas Brothers Drug Store building that was erected in 1916, following the devastating Dec. 30, 1915 fire that wiped out all buildings on the north side of the Tahoka square. M.E. Gilmore operated the first drug store here in 1903, sold to Dr. S.H. Windham, and Dr. Windham sold to A.I. and C.A. Thomas in 1906. W.C. Thomas soon bought A.I.'s interest. They sold to their nephew, Wynne Collier in the mid-1930s, and later it became Dayton Parker Pharmacy. Drs. Turrentine, Gallaway, and Singleton, various attorneys, and insurance agents, occupied the upstairs offices for many years, and a barbershop was in the downstairs east half of the building. Today, the building is the Lynn County Healthcare System Fitness and Rehab Center.

### City to provide containers for cleanup days

The City of Tahoka is providing free access to two large open top containers for the City-Wide cleanup, Saturday, June 12, and Sunday, June 13. 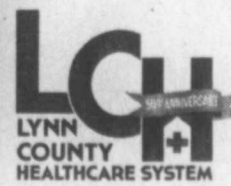

• Bolivar Flats, located at Bolivar Peninsula, TX, an area composed of beach, salt marsh, and mud flats, is designated a Globally Important Bird Area.

• Located entirely within Big Bend National Park, the Chisos Mountains are the only mountain range completely contained within a single national park.

**June 17-20 event explores Medicine Mounds, Comanche sacred site near Quanah, Tx**

The Medicine Mounds, four dolomite mounds southeast of Quanah, Texas, are culturally significant to many Comanche, and to the descendants of Quanah Parker. The Quanah Parker Society is hosting a 4-day event that allows public access to these landmarks, celebrates Comanche culture, and highlights the history of the area. Activities will take place both at the Mounds and in Quanah.

The four, conical mounds rising above the horizon just southwest of Quanah, Texas (collectively known as the Medicine Mounds) were seen by the Comanches as places of healing and vision quests for power. According to historian Bill Neeley, they "continue to be venerated like a Grandmother whose healing herbs restore health to the body and whose benevolent spirit gives guidance to the soul."

From June 17-20, visitors will be allowed to camp (RV/tent/tipi) at the Mounds as part of the first annual

Quanah Parker Medicine Mounds Gathering. Daytime, non-camping visitors are also welcome. There is no charge to participate in the daytime activities at the Mounds. A full schedule of events is online at [QuanahParkerMedicineMounds.com](http://QuanahParkerMedicineMounds.com).

On Saturday morning, a "Spiritual Journey to the Medicine Mound" led by members of the Parker family will climb the mound, preceded by an initial ceremony at 8 a.m. All are welcome to gather and attend the ceremony. Capacity for the journey is limited, and reservations are required. According to Neeley, "In the special sharing of their holy place, the Parker family and other Comanches reveal very personal beliefs, usually carefully hidden away."

The Gathering also includes a 5K Run/1M Walk at 8 a.m. on Saturday, June 19 (2nd and Mercer, Quanah); multiple concerts and free musical performances, including numerous national, regional,

and local performers as well as Comanche drummers; food vendors, both at the Mounds and in Quanah; and several history panels and speakers, including a panel with Parker family members and Bill Neeley; Joaquín Rivaya-Martínez of Texas State University, one of the foremost experts on 18th and 19th century Comanche history; and members of the Comanche Indian Veterans Association (CIVA) discussing the role of Comanches as codetalkers during World War II.

W.K. ("Kip") Stratton, Austin-based writer, will give the keynote address, discussing what really happened at Pease River in 1860, when Cynthia Ann Parker was recaptured by Sul Ross and other Texas Rangers. His January 2021 article in Texas Monthly explored this topic.
