The Tahoka Independent School District Board of Trustees met in special session Monday night, Jan. 24 and approved the hiring of Cody Bounds as the new Athletic Director and Head Football Coach for the Tahoka Bulldogs.

Bounds has been an AD at Lindsay and Bonham school districts. While serving as AD at 2A Lindsay ISD, LISD won multiple state championships in boys and girls sports and were Lone Star Cup champions multiple times. The UIL Lone Star Cup honors the best overall athletic and academic programs in Texas, and is awarded annually to only six high schools, one in each of the six UIL classifications. While Bounds was at Lindsay ISD from 2006 to 2012,

the school was awarded the Lone Star Cup for Class 2A five times. He was AD/Head Football

Coach at 4A Bonham ISD from 2012 to 2015, and prior to that was a Defensive Coordinator at 6A. Plano ISD. Most recently, he was a Defensive Coordinator and assistant coach at 2A Wolfe City ISD. Bounds will begin his duties

here on Monday. Six of seven trustees were pres-

ent for the special session, which included a half-hour closed session for deliberation of personnel. Upon return to open session, the board voted unanimously to hire Bounds, and then adjourned shortly after-

wards. Trustees present for the special session included Clay Taylor, Drew Stone, Tamesha McClendon, Carol Miller, Lea Swinford, and Slate May. Trustee Jon Luna was absent.

In regular session on Jan. 18, the Board of Trustees voted to adopt a redistricting map, unanimously approving the choice submitted by the community redistricting committee. The map will have slight changes from the current map for trustee district boundaries, to allow for any population changes in the 2020 eensus.

In other business, trustees postponed an evaluation of Superintendent Price that was originally scheduled for the meeting, choosing to postpone until all board members could be present. Two trustees, Lea Swinford and Tamesha McClendon, were not present at the Jan. 18 meeting.

Patrick Herrera presented information to the board regarding school internet issues, including servers, switches and hardware/software issues. After some discussion, the board voted unanimously to update the system at a cost of approximately \$180,000, to ensure that students and staff have proper access to the internet and access to all teaching protocols that are needed.



## New Home Leopards continue amazing 54-game district winning streak

inning takes talent, to repeat takes character. 77 That's a quote credited to John Wooden, notable NCAA basketball coach who won ten NCAA national championships in a 12-year period as head coach for the UCLA Bruins. He knew something about winning traditions.

Athletic Director and Head Boys Basketball Coach Koby Abney at New Home Independent School District knows something about winning traditions too.

Abney's varsity boys basketball team is part of a tradition of winning that is in its sixth season of consecutive victories in district games. As of Monday this week, the Leopards are on a 54-game district winning streak, and are working hard to keep the tradition going.

"We are on a 54-game district winning streak," said Coach Abney on Tuesday morning. "We lost to Meadow in late January of 2016, then won the last three district games that year. We went 10-0 in 2017, 2018, 2019, 2020 and 8-0 in 2021 to finish last year with a 51game district winning streak," he explained.

"Starting out 3-0 this year has pushed that to 54 consecutive games," Abney added.

The Leopards, who moved up from 1A classification to 2A last year, lead 2A Region I District 6, a district that includes Ropes (2-1), Smyer (1-1), Post (0-2) and Tahoka (0-2). The Leopards beat Smyer 75-27, crushed Ropes 70-16, and blasted Tahoka 64-14 in their first three district matches. They were headed to Post on Tuesday this week before starting the second round of district matches in February.

Coach Abney credits the talent and hard work of his players over the years for keeping the Leopards' winning tradition going strong.

"We were led by All-State players such as Billy Castro, Blaine Kirkland, Carter Abney and Kaleb LeClair, but many others were crucial parts of those teams," said



Abney. "The seniors of 2020, Kaleb LeClair and Blake

Buckelew, as well as the seniors of 2021, Ryan Weeks and Trevor Wilson, were able to graduate without ever losing a district game. This year's senior class - Jordan Moore. Holt Heinrich, Jake Tabor, Kadence Power and Ryan Bundy - are hoping to join them as classes who can make that claim," he said.

The winning streak is a proud tradition, but it can also lead to some pressure on those who are working to keep it going.

"We don't ever talk about pressure - but we do talk about expectations," said Coach Abney.

#### Updated Property Tax Information Now Available for Texas Taxpayers

New and updated property tax information has just been compiled by Lynn County Appraisal District and is available now to assist taxpayers. This property tax information is current and covers a wide range of topics, such as taxpayer remedies, exemptions and appraisals, and has information for select groups, such as disabled veterans and persons age 65 or older.

#### This includes information about the following programs.

 Property Tax Exemptions for Disabled Veterans - The law provides partial exemptions for any property owned by disabled veterans or surviving spouses and surviving children of deceased disabled veterans. Another partial exemption is for homesteads donated to disabled veterans by charitable organizations at no cost or not more than 50 percent of the good faith estimate of the homestead's market value to the disabled veterans and their surviving spouses. The exemption amount is determined according to percentage of service-connected disability. The law also provides a 100 percent homestead exemption for 100 percent disabled veterans and their surviving spouses and surviving spouses of U.S. armed service members killed in action.

 Property Tax Exemptions – Non-profit organizations that meet statutory requirements may seek property tax exemptions and must apply to their county appraisal district by a specific date. Businesses that receive tax abatements granted by taxing units; ship inventory out of Texas that may be eligible for the freeport exemption; store certain goods in transit in warehouses that are moved within 175 days; construct, install or acquire pollution control property; own and operate energy storage systems; convert landfill-generated gas; or store offshore drilling equipment while not in use may also be eligible for statutory exemptions.

 Rendering Taxable Property - If a business owns tangible personal property that is used to produce income, the business must file a rendition with its local county appraisal district by a specified date. Personal property includes inventory and equipment used by a business. Owners do not have to render exempt property such as church property or an agriculture producer's equipment used for farming

 Appraisal Notices – Normally, taxpayers receive a notice of appraised value from the appropriate local county appraisal district. The city, county, school districts and other local taxing units will use the appraisal district's value to set property taxes for the coming year.

 Property Taxpayer Remedies – This Comptroller publication explains in detail how to protest a property appraisal, what issues the county appraisal review board (ARB) can consider and what to expect during a protest hearing. The publication also discusses the options of taking a taxpayer's case to district court, the State Office of Administrative Hearings or binding arbitration if the taxpayer is dissatisfied with the outcome of the ARB hearing.

 Homestead Exemptions – A homestead is generally defined as the home and land used as the owner's principal residence on Jan. 1 of the tax year. A homestead exemption reduces the appraised value of the home and, as a result, lowers property taxes. Applications are submitted to the appropriate local county appraisal district.

 Productivity Appraisal – Property owners who use land for timberland production, agricultural purposes or wildlife management can be granted property tax relief on their land. They may apply to their local county appraisal district for an agricultural appraisal which may result in a lower appraisal of the land based on production, versus market value.


 Residence Homestead Tax Deferral Riexas homeowners may postpone paying the currently delinquent property taxes due on the appreciating value of their homes by filing a tax deferral affidavit at their local county appraisal district. This tax relief allows homeowners to pay the property taxes on 105 percent of the preceding year's appraised value of their homestead, plus the taxes on any new improvements to the homestead. The remaining taxes are postponed, but not cancelled, with interest accruing at 8 percent per year.

 Property Tax Deferral for Persons Age 65 or Older or Disabled or Disabled Veteran Homeowners - Texans who are age 65 or older or disabled, as defined by law, or who qualify for a disabled veteran exemption may postpone paying current and delinquent property taxes on their homes by signing a tax deferral affidavit. Once the affidavit is on file, taxes are deferred, but not cancelled, as long as the owner continues to own and live in the home. Interest continues to accrue at 5 percent per year on the unpaid taxes. You may obtain a deferral affidavit at the appraisal district.

 Notice of Availability of Electronic Communication – In appraisal districts located in counties with a population of more than 200,000 or that have authorized electronic communications, and that have implemented a system that allows such communications, chief appraisers and ARBs may communicate electronically through email or other media with property owners or their designated representatives. Written agreements are required for notices and other documents to be delivered electronically instead of mailing.

 Protesting Property Appraisal Values – Property owners who disagree with the appraisal district's appraisal of their property for local taxes or for any other action that adversely affects them may protest their property value to the appraisal district's ARB.



#### Updated Property Tax Information Now Available for Texas Taxpayers

New and updated property tax information has just been compiled by Lynn County Appraisal District and is available now to assist taxpayers. This property tax information is current and covers a wide range of topics, such as taxpayer remedies, exemptions and appraisals, and has information for select groups, such as disabled veterans and persons age 65 or older.

#### This includes information about the following programs.

 Property Tax Exemptions for Disabled Veterans - The law provides partial exemptions for any property owned by disabled veterans or surviving spouses and surviving children of deceased disabled veterans. Another partial exemption is for homesteads donated to disabled veterans by charitable organizations at no cost or not more than 50 percent of the good faith estimate of the homestead's market value to the disabled veterans and their surviving spouses. The exemption amount is determined according to percentage of service-connected disability. The law also provides a 100 percent homestead exemption for 100 percent disabled veterans and their surviving spouses and surviving spouses of U.S. armed service members killed in action.

 Property Tax Exemptions – Non-profit organizations that meet statutory requirements may seek property tax exemptions and must apply to their county appraisal district by a specific date. Businesses that receive tax abatements granted by taxing units; ship inventory out of Texas that may be eligible for the freeport exemption; store certain goods in transit in warehouses that are moved within 175 days; construct, install or acquire pollution control property; own and operate energy storage systems; convert landfill-generated gas; or store offshore drilling equipment while not in use may also be eligible for statutory exemptions. Rendering Taxable Property - If a business owns tangible personal property that is used to produce income, the business must file a rendition with its local county appraisal district by a specified date. Personal property includes inventory and equipment used by a business. Owners do not have to render exempt property such as church property or an agriculture producer's equipment used for farming. Appraisal Notices – Normally, taxpayers receive a notice of appraised value from the appropriate local county appraisal district. The city, county, school > districts and other local taxing units will use the appraisal district's value to set property taxes for the coming year.



• Property Taxpayer Remedies - This Comptroller publication explains in detail how to protest a property appraisal, what issues the county appraisal review board (ARB) can consider and what to expect during a protest hearing. The publication also discusses the options of taking a taxpayer's case to district court, the State Office of Administrative Hearings or binding arbitration if the taxpayer is dissatisfied with the outcome of the ARB hearing.

 Homestead Exemptions – A homestead is generally defined as the home and land used as the owner's principal residence on Jan. 1 of the tax year. A homestead exemption reduces the appraised value of the home and, as a result, lowers property taxes. Applications are submitted to the appropriate local county appraisal district.

· Productivity Appraisal - Property owners who use land for timberland production, agricultural purposes or wildlife management can be granted property tax relief on their land. They may apply to their local county appraisal district for an agricultural appraisal which may result in a lower appraisal of the land based on production, versus market value.

 Residence Homestead Tax Deferral - Texas homeowners may postpone paying the currently delinquent property taxes due on the appreciating value of their homes by filing a tax deferral affidavit at their local county appraisal district. This tax relief allows homeowners to pay the property taxes on 105 percent of the preceding year's appraised value of their homestead, plus the taxes on any new improvements to the homestead. The remaining taxes are postponed, but not cancelled, with interest accruing at 8 percent per year.

 Property Tax Deferral for Persons Age 65 or Older or Disabled or Disabled Veteran Homeowners – Texans who are age 65 or older or disabled, as defined by law, or who qualify for a disabled veteran exemption may postpone paying current and delinquent property taxes on their homes by signing a tax deferral affidavit. Once the affidavit is on file, taxes are deferred, but not cancelled, as long as the owner continues to own and live in the home. Interest continues to accrue at 5 percent per year on the unpaid taxes. You may obtain a deferral affidavit at the appraisal district.

 Notice of Availability of Electronic Communication – In appraisal districts located in counties with a population of more than 200,000 or that have authorized electronic communications, and that have implemented a system that allows such communications, chief appraisers and ARBs may communicate electronically through email or other media with property owners or their designated representatives. Written agreements are required for notices and other documents to be delivered electronically instead of mailing.

 Protesting Property Appraisal Values – Property owners who disagree with the appraisal district's appraisal of their property for local taxes or for any other action that adversely affects them may protest their property value to the appraisal district's ARB.
