WHERE'S MY VOTER

ynn County registered voters may have noticed that they have not yet received their 2022 Voter Registration cards in # the mail. Normally, the voter registration cards are mailed out in January, but this year there is a delay – and redistricting is apparently the culprit.

According to Lynn County Tax Assessor/Voter Registrar Donna Willis, her office is working diligently to print and mail approximately 4,000 voter registration cards after processing the information for new boundaries for county precincts, after Lynn County officials officially approved redistricting maps in December.

"We're working as fast as we can, but not only did the county commissioner precinct boundary

lines change, the Justice of Peace precinct lines changed as well, and we are also changing the number of voting box precincts in the county," explained Willis early this week "Lynn County officials voted to combine some of the smaller voting precincts, and will have only 8 voting precincts instead of 14. Changing the maps and changing the voting box precincts requires a complete change in all our data and we are still inputting the new infor-

mation. We hope to be able to mail out the new voter registration cards by early next week," she explained.

Redistricting - the process of redrawing the county precinct lines to ensure they have relatively equal population – is required after the U.S. Census is conducted every 10 years. County officials were using population numbers from the 2020 census in the redistricting conversations, and officially approved the new county commissioner and justice of peace precinct boundaries in mid-December 2021.

Most of the significant changes

in the Lynn County precinct boundaries affect Commissioner Precincts 3 and 4, due to the population growth in the New Home area.

Willis anticipates that Lynn County registered voters will have their new voter registration cards in time for Early Voting in the March 1 Primary elections. Early Voting begins on Monday, Feb. 14, and continues through Feb. 25, at the Lynn County Courthouse.

"If anyone does not get their new voter registration card in time for early voting in the primary elections, you can still vote by showing your Driver's License," Willis stated

New Texas Voter Registration cards are issued each year to registered voters, and expire on Dec. 31 each year. Unless a registered voter's physical address changes, there is no need to contact the Voter Registrar's office to renew the card, as registration is automatically

Fire department responds to Lynnwood, but no fire or danger to residents occurred

Tahoka Volunteer Fire Department and other emergency responders arrived quickly at Lyn nwood Independent and Assisted Living Center adjacent to Lynn County Hospital last Wednesday night, after staff and residents noticed a burning odor just after 9 p.m. It took a bit of time to figure it out, but the culprit turned out to be a recessed light fixture in the lobby where the wiring ballast had apparently burned out and was emitting a strong burning odor next to an intake vent in the building's heating system, which led to the odor being spread throughout the building. "There was no smoke and no fire, and no residents were evacuated nor were they in any danger." said Lynn County Healthcare System CEO Melanie Richburg. "But it did take us a bit to figure out ex-

actly where the odor was coming from, and to address the issue," she said.




Special Agents with the DPS and FBI obtained court orders for electronic data and online identifiers and tracked the suspect's location to a residence in Brownfield. On January 19, 2022, DPS and FBI personnel executed a search warrant to seize electronic devices such as laptops and smart phones from the suspect's residence. Analysis of those devices confirmed the presence of images and videos obtained from the internet that depicted the sexual assault and exploitation of children. The suspect was interviewed and arrested for Possession of Child Pornography and booked into the Terry County jail. At this time there are no additional suspects and it is not believed that the suspect was producing or making child pornography.
