





Cities, county get monthly sales tax payments

Texas Comptroller Glenn Hegar announced he will send cities, counties, transit systems and special purpose taxing districts \$1.2 billion in local sales tax allocations for May, 11.8 percent more than in May 2021. These allocations are based on sales made in March by businesses that report tax monthly and sales made in January, February and March by quarterly filers.

Lynn County's net payment for the month was \$21,131.84, based on a halfcent sales tax rate, making the total payment to date \$83,132.34.

The City of Tahoka's net payment for the month was \$30,989.54, based on a 1.5cent sales tax rate (including a half-cent collection for the Tahoka Economic Development Corporation), making the total payment to date \$114,330.27.

The City of O'Donnell's net payment for the month was \$5,674.12, based on a 1-cent sales tax rate, making the total payment to date \$21,476.65.

The City of Wilson's net payment for the month was \$3,498.69, based on a 1-cent sales tax rate, making the total payment to date \$15,909.31.







Tornado swirls into Hermleigh

SNYDER - An F-2 tornado touched down in Hermleigh on Sunday night (May 1), according to the National Weather Service.

Traveling 150 yards and reaching winds of more than 115 miles per hour, it was on the ground for nine minutes and traveled over U.S. Hwy. 84, causing destruction between County Road 4116 and an RV park located on Willis Ave.

According to West Texas Mesonet, 3.34 inches of rain fell in a little over an hour's time in Snyder, with Hermleigh receiving 3.98 inches during the storm.

Many reports of hail were recorded in Scurry County.

Depending on the location, residents reported pea- to marble-sized all the way up to baseball- and even softball-sized hail.
