

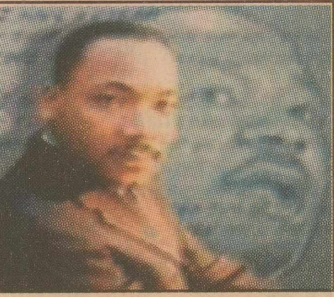

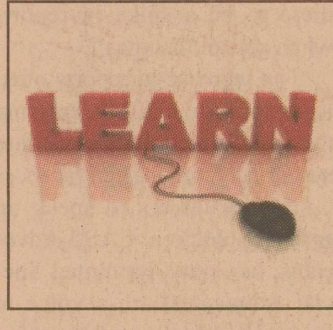
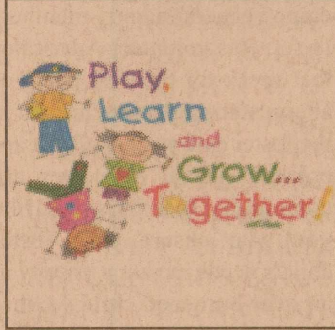

## Greg Stevens Named Lubbock Chief of Police Last Week

The Lubbock City Council voted to confirm Greg Stevens as Lubbock's new police chief on Thursday evening, August 27, 2015. He was appointed as police chief on Thursday, August 21, 2015, by City Manager James Loomis.

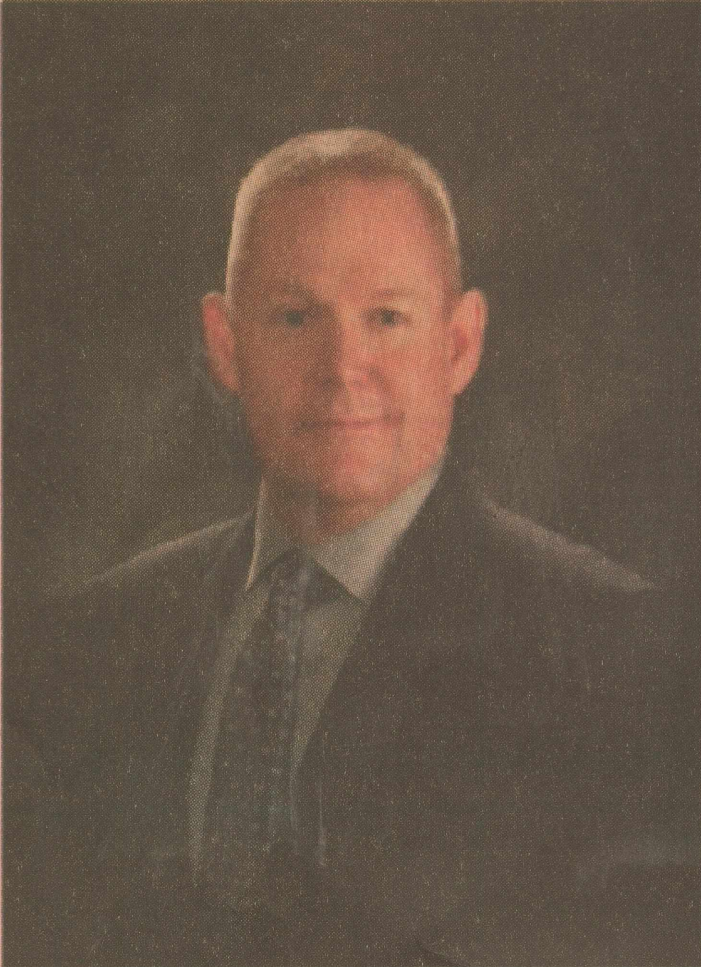
The Lubbock City Council's unanimous 7-0 vote came during the Thursday evening meeting at City Hall.

Stevens was sworn in as the new chief on Friday afternoon, August 28, 2015 in a room filled with officers, elected officials, and city staff. Among those present included Lubbock County Sheriff Kelly Rowe.

Immediately after he was sworn in, the audience erupted with a loud applause, and afterwards, Stevens shook hands with many of those in attendance.

A representative of the Southwest Digest, Larry Alexander, was present. Alexander said, "Those present were very excited what he was going to do. They were excited about the program he will bring forward." He went on to say it was just a very inspiring event.

Stevens told the excited body of people, "I appreciate the support from all the LPD officers throughout my career here." He went on to say: "I appreciate the confidence the city manager placed in me by nominating me. I appreciate the unanimous vote by the City Council; they put a lot of trust and a lot of confidence in me. And I'll do everything I can to continue to earn that confidence every single day."

He went on to say, "This is our department, and now that I'm not on the street taking those calls, I want to tell my officers that this is your department. It will be what you make it."

Lubbock City Councilman, District Two, Floyd Price, said, "Stevens is the best chief

around, and it's a privilege to have him in Lubbock."

Lubbock City Councilman, District One, Victor Hernandez, stressed the process and wanted to make sure the public knew this decision wasn't taken lightly.

Hernandez also said he had met with Stevens prior to his election as the new chief and the entire city council met with him during executive session prior to the public meeting on Thursday evening.

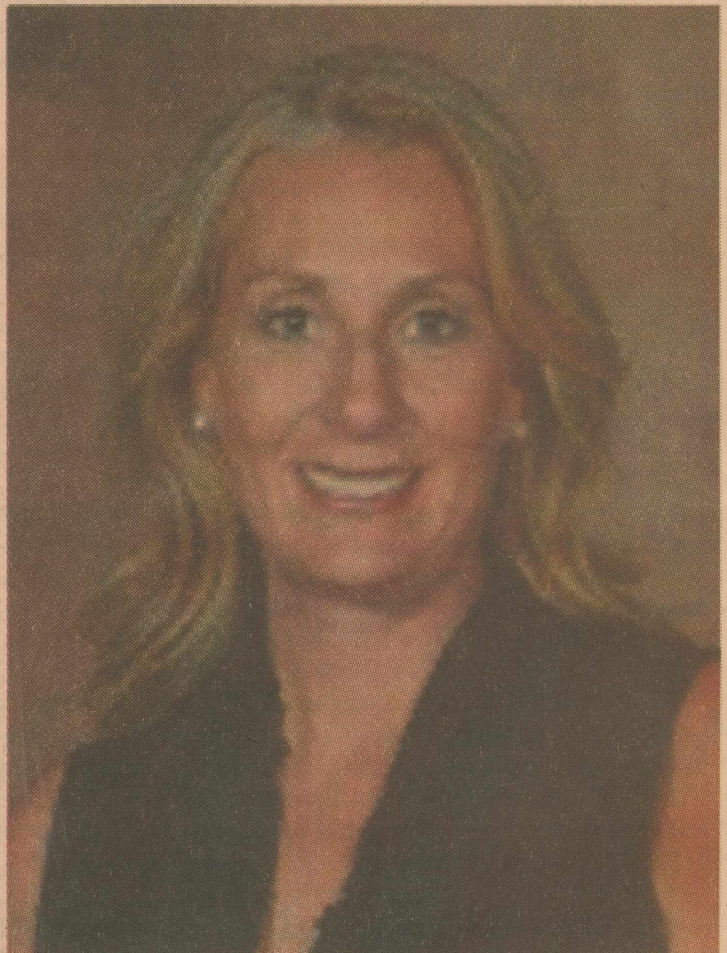
This is where we should march:

Let's head down to the board of education. Teaching is a

The actions of rogue police officers take black lives one at a time. Our public school system has destroyed black lives not in the ones and twos, but in whole generations.

The schools don't teach and our children don't learn. Too many public schools are controlled by teachers unions focused more on the convenience and compensation of adults rather than the education of children who started out far behind. Their failures don't kill as quickly, but they do kill as surely as a bullet.

Let's confront the entertainment industry that lines its pockets by glamorizing a life where black men are thugs and our women are trash. Let's tell them we plan to start talking with our wallets

The status quo is inadequate and passing more restrictive policies is unacceptable: our constituents deserve action on the issues that actually impact women. Progress has been stalled for far too long. It's time to update the economy with policy changes that reflect the modern realities facing millions of women who are working both inside and outside the home to support themselves and their families. These women care much more about the concrete actions that legislators take to improve the lives of the women they represent than about fruitless political debates and restrictive policies that stand in the way of women making progress in our state, leaving families worse off than they are now.

Ultimately, it will take more voices and votes from women and men, asking each elected official to stop focusing on wedge issues that divide us. It's time for us all to stand with women and demand that they start focusing on policies that will help ensure "equality for all."

### Economic slowdown impacts teeth of tots

It was inevitable that the lagging economy would force the tooth fairy to cut back on payouts to tots when they lose their teeth, according to the Association of Mature American Citizens. The newest Visa survey shows that when a kid leaves a lost tooth under the pillow, the child can expect only \$3.19 in the swap-24 cents less than what kids got last year.

Visa has conducted its tooth fairy poll for six years and reports that this is the second year in a row that lost teeth have lost value, much to the chagrin of boys and girls across the country. It used to be that children could expect \$74 for all the teeth they lose as they grow; they can now expect only \$64.

**Nationwide** — New research published by JAMA Oncology has revealed that the chances of dying from very early breast cancer are small. However, DCIS breast cancer (even if caught early) is much riskier for young women of all ethnicities, and black women of all ages. And to make it worse, the same disparities are seen when it comes to more advanced cancer.

### What is DCIS breast cancer?

DCIS (Ductal carcinoma in situ) breast cancer is the presence of abnormal cells inside a milk duct in the breast. It is considered to be the earliest form of breast cancer, and is non-invasive, meaning it hasn't spread out of the milk duct to invade other parts of the breast.

The study analyzed more than 100,000 women diagnosed from 1988 to 2011, and found that 20 years after being diagnosed, the average death rate of a woman with breast cancer is just 3 percent. But the death rates are twice as high for those younger than 35 at diagnosis and in blacks.

### But why are Black women more affected?

The findings did not reveal why this is the case, but it does re-open the debate on how to treat tumors that are discovered early on in women. Some tumors have previously been ignored if thought not to be cancerous or if was determined that the cancer would not spread.

## Tuskegee University Honor Student's Plight Is Among the Reasons Why President Obama Has Secondary Education Costs Near the Top of His Domestic Agenda

### Honor Student Seeks Public Donations to Complete 2015/16 School Term

*The President is calling on Congress to advance new reforms to give more hard working students a fair shot at pursuing higher education, because education is not a luxury: it is an economic imperative that every hard working and responsible student should be able to afford. President Obama has emphasized that the federal government, states, colleges, and universities all have a role to play in making higher education more affordable, by reining in college costs, providing value for American families, and preparing students with a solid education to succeed in their careers.*

Tracy, CA — 20-year-old Tuskegee University honor student, LaRae Adams, is among thousands of young people who are struggling with the costs of earning a college degree. She is looking forward to returning to school this month for her junior year. However, the resolute student will be unable to complete the 2015/2016 term if she cannot raise funds for tuition. The out-of-pocket apportionment of LaRae's school costs has increased, and her mom's recent job loss (24-year-old business that her mom managed recently closed its doors for good) leaves her unable to afford fall tuition installments.

In an effort to raise funds that will enable LaRae to return to Tuskegee for the 2015/16 school year, she decided to reach out to the public for help by placing an appeal on a GoFundMe page.

Unfortunately, in spite of her stellar high school GPA, numerous accomplishments and countless applications, LaRae was not awarded any major scholarships. Her first two years at Tuskegee were funded by a combination of loans (that must be repaid), grants and a significant out-of-pocket tuition apportionment paid by her mom.

"My one main goal in life has always been to put my daughter through college. It appears that recent financial circumstances may prohibit my ability to keep my promise," said LaRae's mother, Donna Muex.

"Today, the cost of higher education is too high for too many Americans. Too many folks are

priced out of a piece of the middle-class dream," said Vice President Joe Biden in an April 11th address. "And that's why the President and I have a straightforward plan to remove that barrier and expand the pathway to the middle class—by bringing the cost of community colleges down to zero."

President Obama has commented, "To reach a national goal of leading the world with the highest share of college graduates by 2020, we must make college more affordable." In a more recent dialog addressing student loan debt, the president said, "Today's college students borrow and rack up more debt than ever before. In 2010, graduates who took out loans left college owing an average

of more than \$26,000. Student loan debt has now surpassed credit card debt for the first time ever."

As a freshman, LaRae was named to the Tuskegee University Dean's List & Honor Roll. During her freshman and sophomore years, the National Society of High School Scholars (NSHSS) honoree earned monies for books and other necessities by taking advantage of a work study program that employed her part-time on campus as an Administrative Assistant in the Office of the Registrar. This opportunity may not be available to her this coming year.

LaRae is looking forward to graduating from Tuskegee University with a B.A. degree in



## Hillary Clinton Has Controversial Closed-Door Meeting With "Black Lives Matter" Activist

Washington, DC — Democratic presidential candidate Hillary Clinton recently met privately with activists from the "Black Lives Matter" campaign, and during the meeting she suggested that the activists need to have strong policy goals if they want to create real change. She used the women's right movement and the gay rights movements as a comparison, but this did not seem to go well.

In a video, captured by GOOD Magazine, activist Julius Jones took issue with what Clinton said and told her: "This is

and has always been a white problem of violence. There's not much that we [black people] can do to stop the violence against us."

Clinton responded: "Respectfully, if that is your position, then I will only talk to white people about the very real problems."

Jones continues: "That's not what I mean. What you just said was a form of victim-blaming. What you were saying was that what the Black Lives Matter movement needs to do to change white hearts..."

Clinton then replies: "I don't believe you change hearts. You change laws, you change allocation of resources, you change the way systems operate."

She continues, "You can keep the movement going, and through it, you may change actually some hearts, but if that's all that happens, we'll be back in 10 years having the same conversation because we will not have all of the changes that you deserve to have because of your willingness to talk about this."

Later in the meeting Jones asked Clinton about tough crime policies that were established during her husband's presidency that nowadays target blacks and hispanics at a disproportionate rate.

She responded: "It's important to remember... that there was a very serious crime wave that was impacting primarily communities of color and poor people. And part of it was that

there was just not enough attention paid. So you know, you could argue that people who were trying to address that — including my husband, when he was president — were responding to the very real concerns of people in the communities themselves."

Clinton also highlighted her support and advocacy in the past families, specifically children. She also pointed out that her current campaign is making big efforts to address racial discrimination.

She told the group, "Let's get an agenda that addresses the problem as much as we can — because then you can be for something, in addition to getting people to have to admit that they are part of a long history in our country of either proposing, supporting, condoning discrimination, segregation, etc."

### A trip to remember

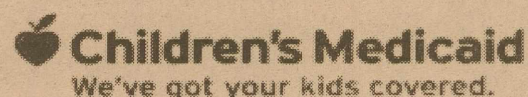

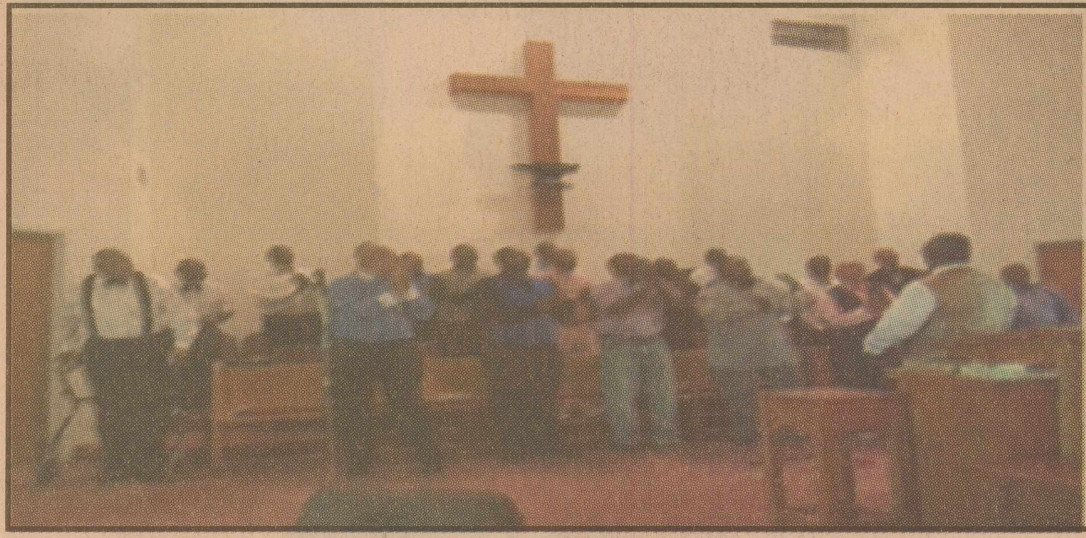

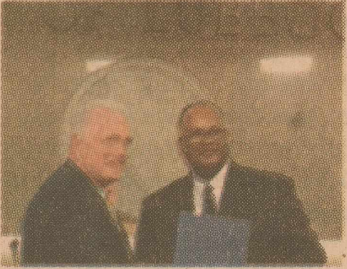
