

Obituary

JOE EARL DEAVENPORT

April 7, 2002 Joe Earl Deavenport died peacefully at his home in Pacific Beach, surrounded by his wife, kids and grandkids, after complications resulting from a stroke last September. Born in Silverton, Texas, January 6, 1926, he was the son of a farmer. He was interested in electronics from an early age, building radios and telegraphs from spare parts. He was valedictorian of his senior class in ered with a white lace cloth and Silverton in 1943, and enlisted in the Navy later that year. He attended boot camp in San Diego, and soon thereafter was accepted into the Naval Academy, where he studied electronics for two years. He married Mary Jo Watkins in cleaner were presented as gifts to 1948 while attending Texas Tech and earning a BSEE.

He moved to San Diego in 1950. He worked for the Naval Electronics Lab, Cubic Corp. and Electro Instruments. In 1961 he founded California Instruments, and in April 1961 he and Joel Naive started Wavetek, based in part on Joe's design for a new type of function generator. Back Seat Rider: Passenger or Projectile?

Are you one of those people who think there is no need to to control the forces of the second buckle up when riding in the back collision by not allowing the seat of a vehicle? In observance of EMS Week, May 19-25, Silverton EMS would like you to be aware crease the forces in the third colliof a few facts that just might change your mind.

A recent study at the University of Tokyo found that front-seat passengers who were belted in were less likely to survive a vehicle crash if the back-seat passengers weren't belted in. Researchers found that front seat passengers were injured, many times fatally, when the crash force threw the back seat occupants into the front seat passengers.

"It's hard to image how powerful a motor vehicle impact can be, until you see the aftermath, like we do," says Anthony Kingery, Paramedic and Silverton EMS President. Any vehicle collision is actually a series of three collisions, he said.

The first collision is when the vehicle impacts another object, bringing the vehicle to a relatively uncontrolled, fast halt. The second collision happens when objects inside the vehicle collide with the vehicle's interior and each other. The third collision happens when the body's internal organs collide into the front of the body.
