


That explanation process is especially difficult in light of the fact that obstacles continue to pop up that act to delay approval of the Senate's version of Farm Program legislation.

Agricultural Research Service says staggering the seeds in an offset or diamondshaped pattern promotes higher yields than planting in single- or twin-row patterns. Plants don't have to compete for sunlight, water and nutrients. This method also cool, moist and better protected crops.






