Jim Leser, Extension Entomologist from Lubbock, will be here to discuss pest problems, look at pests and life (See Cotton Turn Row, Page 4)



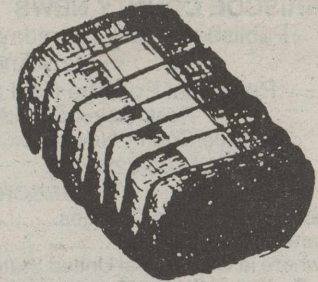

**Accident Claims  
Life of Charles  
Emery Bomar**

Charles Emery Bomar was one of two persons killed in a single car rollover on the same stretch of road within three days.

According to the Texas Department of Public Safety, "Charlie", as he was fondly called here in his home town of Silverton, died just after midnight on Monday, July 15, 2002. Charlie was southbound on FM 2301, about five miles southwest of Vigo Park when he ran off the side of the road. A DPS spokeswoman said he over-corrected which caused his 1998 pickup to roll four times.

He was not wearing a seatbelt and was pronounced dead at the scene.

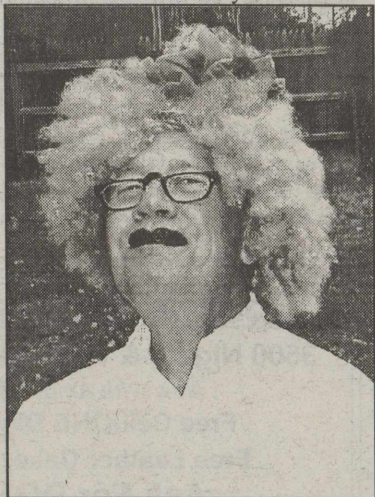
The other person killed near there was Deborah Parker, of Tulia. Her accident happened within two miles of Charlie's rollover. She also over-corrected said the DPS. She was traveling north on FM 2301 at a high rate of speed. She was not wearing a seatbelt either and was ejected when her car rolled several times. Her accident happened Monday morning.

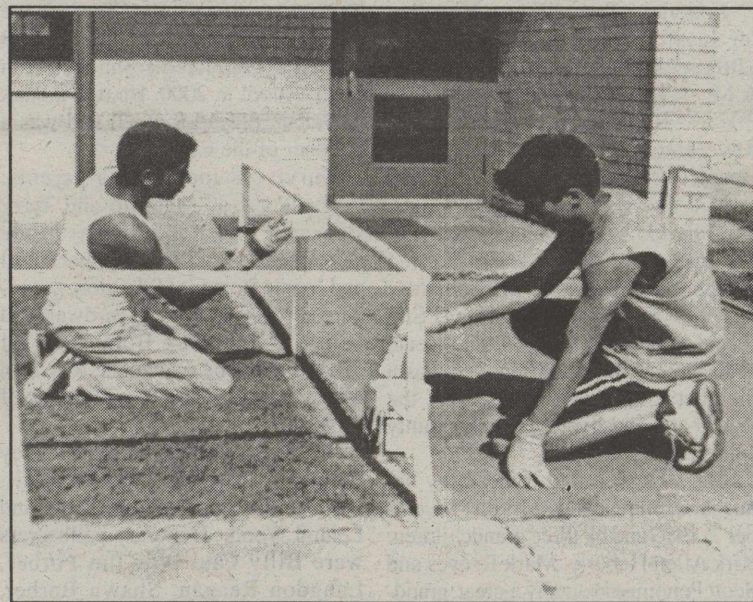

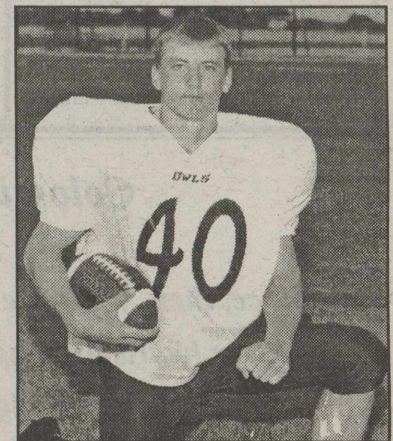

ESL Audit Rating**

On May 22, 2002, representatives from the Texas Education Agency visited the Silverton Independent School District (SISD) to review the extent to which the district is in compliance with state requirements for the Bilingual Education/English as a Second Language (BE/ESL) program as outlined in the Texas Education Code (TEC) 29.062. The on-site visit included a review of the District Effectiveness and Compliance indicators for the BE/ESL program. It also included the opportunity for parent information gathering and for teacher interviews. These discussions and interviews were scheduled as part of the review process to include parent and teacher perceptions of the effectieness of the BE/ESL programs and their suggestions for improving services to students.

The peer review team acknowledges Silverton ISD's effort to provide quality education to Limited English Proficient (LEP) children in the district. These efforts are reflected in the TAAS explemplary performance accountability rating of the district. The district is also to be acknowledged for the individual support given to families of LEP children. As a result, the district is receiving very positive parental support. The district was in compliance with all 27 indicators that were applicable.

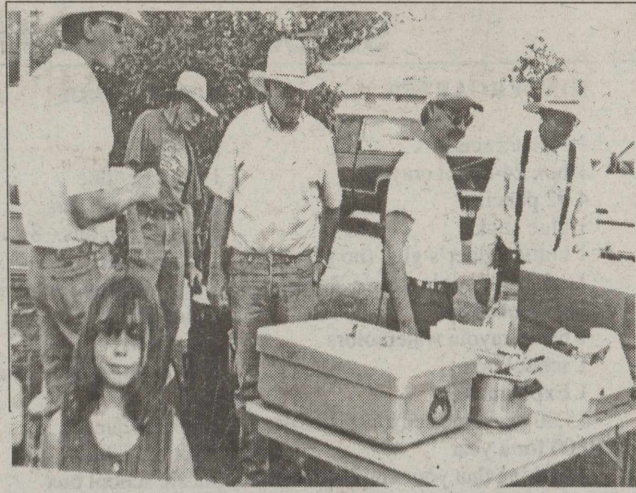

## Briscoe County Celebration

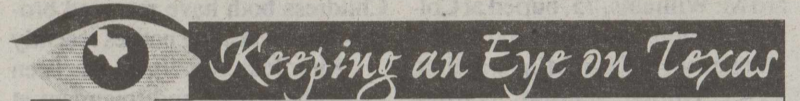

### Taking Flight

The Aircraft Pooling Board (APB) was created in 1979 by the 66th Legislature to establish and operate a pool for custody, control, operation and the maintenance of aircraft owned or leased by the state.

As of September 1, 2001, there were 36 aircraft

owned by the state. This figure does not include 15 single-engine aircraft operated by the Texas State Technical College (TSTC) for pilot instruction in Waco. The APB operates nine passenger aircraft for use by all state agencies.

Through August of fiscal year 2001, APB aircraft had flown 2,581 flights with 8,652 passengers for a total of 609,160 miles and an average load of 3.62 passengers.

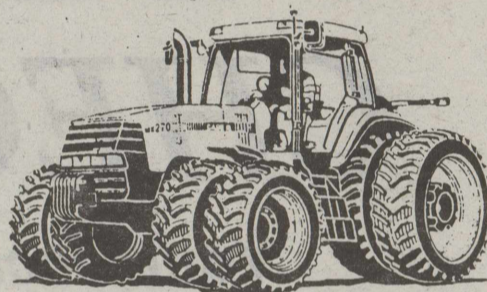

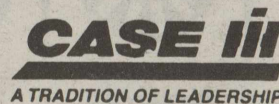
