Basketball Camp Set June 14-17

The "Nothing But Net" Basketball Camp will take place in the Silverton School Gym July 14-17. The cost will be \$20.00, and sessions will be held from 9:00 a.m. until 1:00 p.m. daily. The camp will be directed by Silverton coaches and former players for incoming fourth through eighth grade students.

Checks are to be made payable to the "Nothing But Net" Basketball Camp, and mailed to Coach Ryan Dukes, P. O. Box 608, Silverton, Texas 79257. Payments will be due at the end of June. Registration forms can be picked up at Allsup's and City Bank in Silverton.

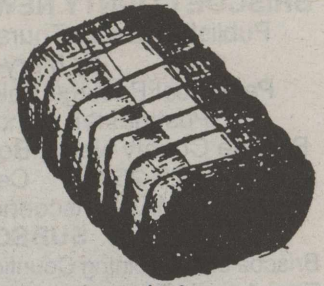

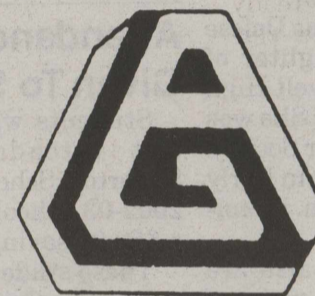

McMurry University awarded Dustin Hale a grant in the amount of \$2,786.00 for the 2003-04 academic year.

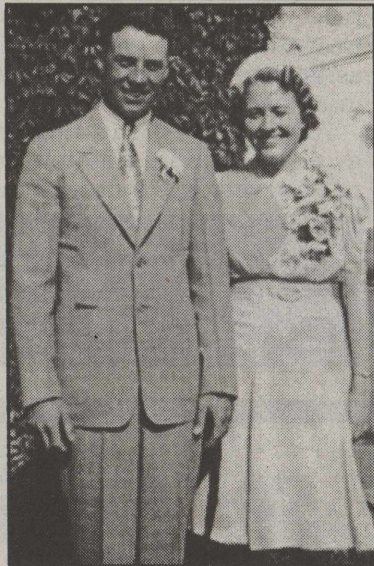

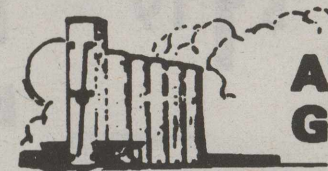

Environmental Quality Incentives Program Available in County

Farmers and ranchers in Briscoe County have until June 13, 2003 to make application for participation in the Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP) funded through the USDA Natural Resources Conservation Ser-

vice (NRCS). These funds are part of the conservation provisions contained in the 2002 Farm Bill.

Eligible program participants may apply for cost-share assistance for eligible conservation practices that address the natural resource concerns identified by the Local Work Group. In Briscoe County, the resource concerns include wa-

ter quantity, invasive species, and soil erosion.

Conservation practices applicable for cost share to address these resource concerns include irrigation pipeline, irrigation sprinkler conversions, irrigation sprinkler installations, microirrigation systems, brush management, ponds, livestock pipeline, watering facilities, livestock wells, ter-

aces, and grassed waterways. Cost-share rates for financial assistance have been set at the local level.

Additionally, funding is available to address statewide natural resource concerns, in-

cluding animal feeding operations.

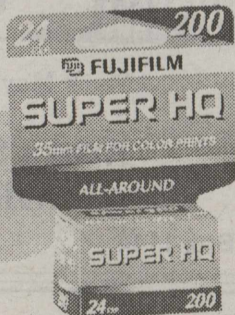

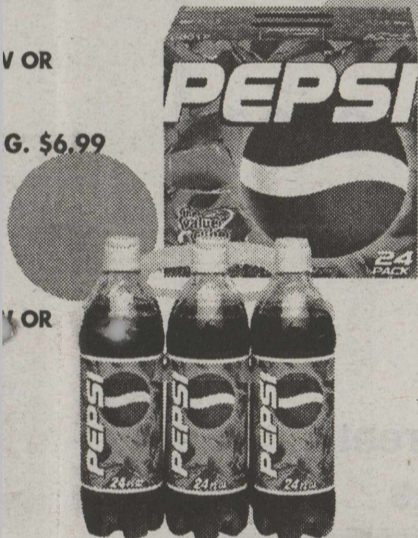
