COTTON VARIETY TEST

The dry land stripper variety test plot that the Cotton and Fertility Committees have planned was recently planted on the dry land farm farmed by Mr. McGreger of Benjamin. This plot is located on US Highway 82, one mile east of Farm Road 267. There are six varieties in the test plot that will be stripped, weighed and graded according to the staple length and grade. The committee, in making the plans for the test plots, decided that the varieties should be numbered and that only after the ginning information is available should be identified. The varieties that have been numbered in the variety test on Mr. McGreger's farm include: Northern Star 5; Gregg; Watson B29;

Western Stormproof; TSTA 41; and Paymaster 101A. There are two other similar test plots located in the county. There is an irrigated all "picker" variety test on the Gene Thompson farm south of Munday on US 277 and an irrigated "stripper" and "picker" plot on the Lloyd Waldrip farm on Texas 222 east of Knox City. These plots will be staked this next week and the public is invited to attend the demonstration plots.
