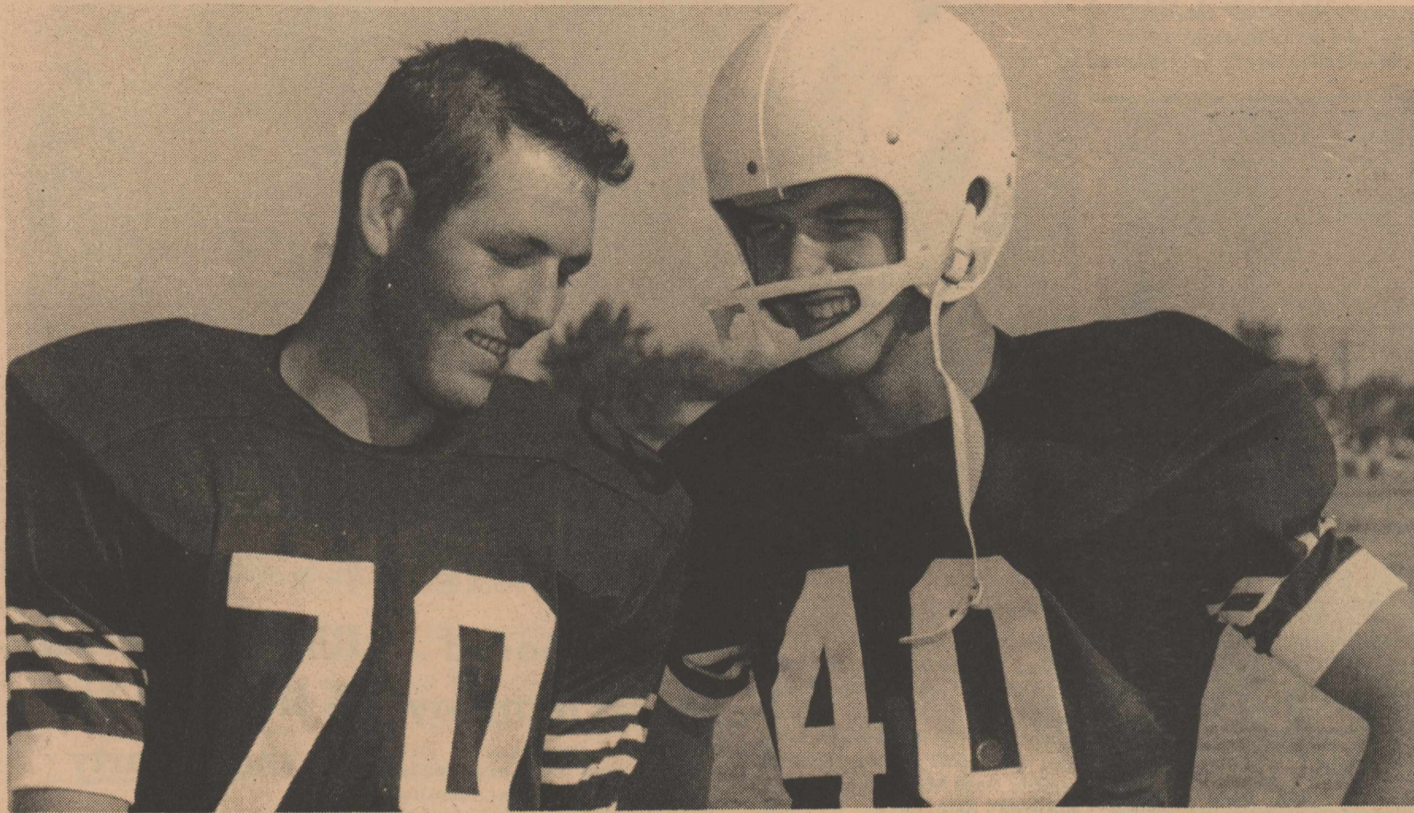

Horns Open Season Saturday

Canyon B team here Saturday night in the season opener for both teams. Game time is 8 p.m.

Canyon B Is Opponent

Hart's Longhorn football team, which wasn't supposed to be strong enough to scare anybody off this year, wound up having to hunt up an opponent for the season opener.

The Longhorns were scheduled to meet New Home here Friday night, but the game was canceled by New Home, due to a shortage of players.

As a result, the Longhorns will take on Canyon's B team as the curtain rises on the 1962 football season here Saturday night.

"We don't know a thing about the Canyon team. . . don't have the vaguest idea of what they'll run," Coach Dub Cleveland said Tuesday.

The game is scheduled at 8 p.m. Saturday in Longhorn Stadium.

The Hart strong point this year is its backfield, which is manned by four returnees---- Quarterback Joe Rubalcaba, halfbacks Dennis McLain and Billy Farris, and Fullback Johnny Kittrell.

"All of those boys can go if we can just open up a hole for them," says Asst. Coach Eddie Nicholson.

The starting line will be manned by ends Danny Rodriguez, and Garry Heller, tackles Jerry Shive and Guy Scoggins, guards James Mitchell and Tommy Morrison, and center Carl Ward.

475 Enrolled As Hart Schools Open Year Filled With Activities

Hart schools opened Monday with 475 students enrolled and big plans for the year.

The enrollment is expected to go higher with more students enrolling this week.

The first football of the season will be played Saturday night here against the Canyon 'B'. A game scheduled with New Home for Friday night was canceled this week.

Hart will again play at home Sept. 14, taking on Springlake. Bovina Junior High will come to Hart Sept. 18.

Homecoming is set Sept. 21 when Hart will play New Deal.

Next game will be Sept. 28 here with Kress; Oct. 5, Anton there; Oct. 12, Silverton, there; Oct. 19, Bovina here; Nov. 2, Happy there; Nov. 9, Lazbuddie there; and Nov. 16 Vega here.

Junior High schedule, after the Bovina game, includes Happy Junior High, Oct. 2, there; Lazbuddie Junior High, Oct. 9, there; Vega Junior High, Oct. 16, here.

The first six weeks will end Oct. 12 and school will be dismissed for Thanksgiving holidays Nov. 21 at 3:55 p.m. The end of the second six weeks is Nov. 23. School will resume Nov. 26.

Christmas holidays will start

Dec. 21 and school will resume Jan. 2.

Mid-term exams will be held Jan. 14 through Jan. 18 and the third six weeks will end Jan. 18. The fourth six weeks will end March 1 and the fifth April 12. School will be dismissed May 24.

Teachers' meetings are scheduled Sept. 27, Nov. 1, Nov. 29, Jan. 3, Jan. 31, Feb. 28, March 28 and May 2. The District TSTA meeting will be held in Amarillo March 8.

Fire prevention week is scheduled Oct. 8 through Oct. 12.

Senior pictures will be made Oct. 31. The Southern Schools Assembly program will be held that same day and on Jan. 21, Feb. 14 and April 9.

Area I FFA leadership contest is set the first day of December.

For budding actors and actresses, the senior play is scheduled Dec. 14 and the junior play, Feb. 22.

Basketball will get underway Jan. 8 in the game with Happy here. Hart will then play Bovina there, Jan. 15, Nazareth, here Jan. 18; Lazbuddie there Jan. 22; Bovina, here, Jan. 29; Nazareth, there, Feb. 1; Lazbuddie, here, Feb. 5; and Happy, there, Feb. 8.

Fat stock shows will start with the Hereford show Jan. 17-19; Dimmitt show, Jan. 31-Feb. 2; Lubbock show, March 18-20; and Plainview show, March 27-29.

The Loyalty Dinner is set Jan. 24, the teacher-appreciation banquet, March 15; athletic banquet, April 6; and junior-senior banquet May 4.

Public school week will be observed March 4 through March 8.

The science fair is scheduled March 11.

The school doors will open each morning at 8:30 a.m. and the tardy bell will ring at 8:35. Students will be admitted to their rooms but are asked to remain in the rooms until class time.

Students will use the gym during the noon period if the weather is bad but will remain outside at other times.

Graduation from Hart High School requires four units in English, three in math, two and a half in history; three in natural science, two in physical education and six and a half in electives. This is a total of 21 units required for graduation.

In determining honor students for the year, work done during

the four years in high school is considered. The last year must have been done at Hart High School and the student must have taken at least four solid subjects. Honor students will be determined at the end of the fifth six-weeks period.

Absences, other than those when a student is away from school under the direct supervision of school authority, will be unexcused.

On school trips, students will be required to go in school-arranged transportation. They will also be required to return in the same way, unless parents arrange with the sponsor to pick up the student.

They will be required to make up work missed during school trips and to be passing in three unit courses on Friday preceding the trips.

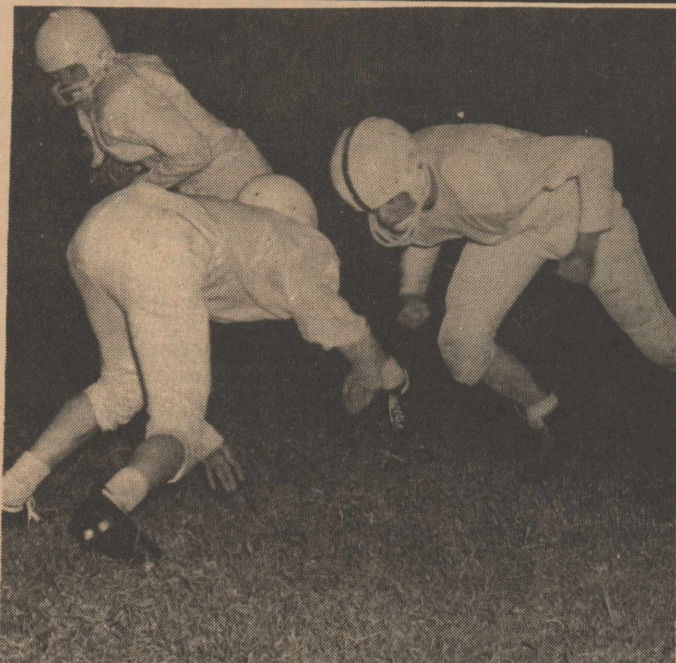

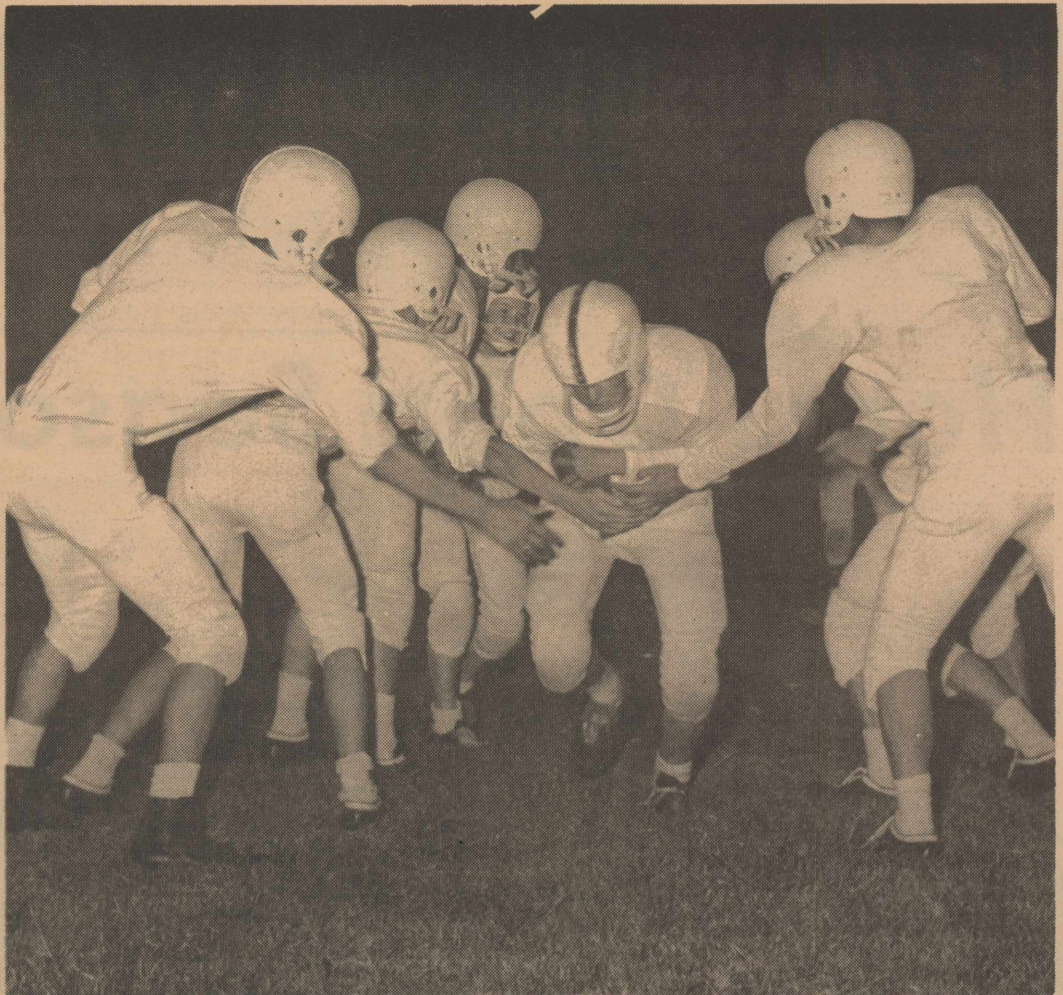

RECIPE OF THE WEEK

Here is one of her favorite recipes:

DEVILS FOOD CAKE

- 1 3/4 cups sugar
- 1 stick Oleo
- 2 eggs
- 1/2 cup buttermilk
- 1 heaping tsp. soda (add to milk)
- 1/4 tsp. salt (add to flour)
- 1 cup boiling water (pour over cocoa)
- 2 cups flour
- 3 heaping tablespoons cocoa
- 1 tsp. vanilla

Cream sugar and oleo well. Add eggs and beat and then add buttermilk and soda mixture. Pour boiling water over cocoa and add last and beat well.

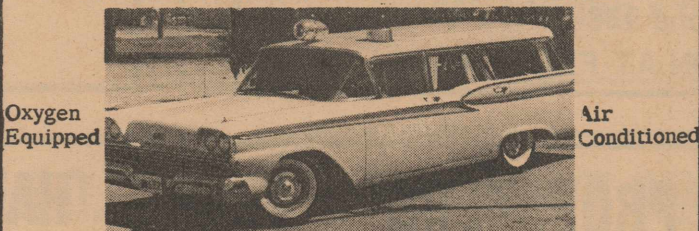

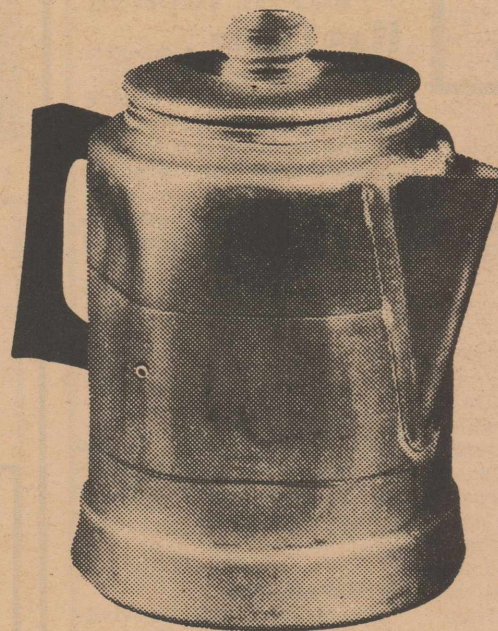
Gould was not injured.

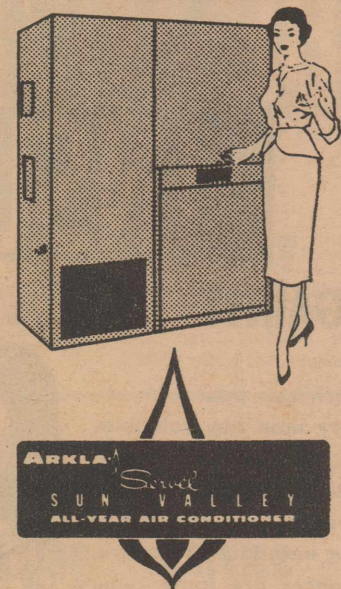

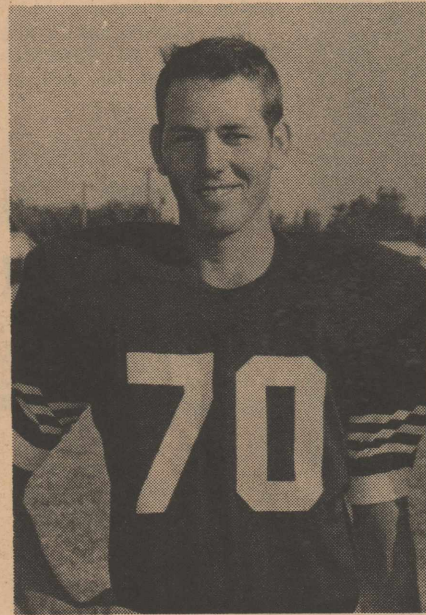

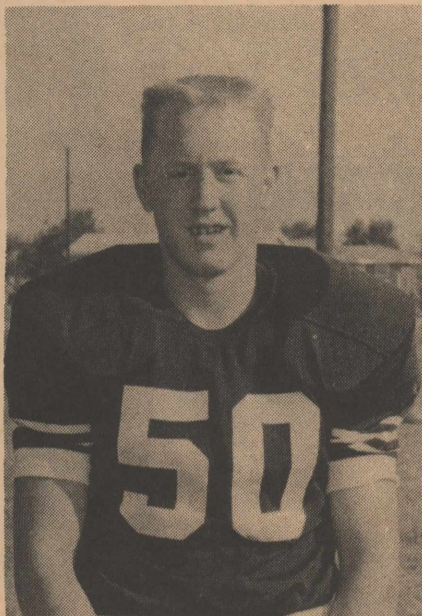

Scout Roundup Gets Underway

A meeting tonight at 7:30 at the Plainview High School Auditorium will kickoff the Boy Scout annual roundup.

Representatives of all units within the Haynes district, including Cub Scout packs, Boy Scout troops and Explorer posts, are expected to attend.

Tomorrow morning Glenn O'Neal, Haynes district Scout executive, will begin a 300 mile horseback ride from Plainview to each of the 13 towns in the district to help carry out the "From Horses To Rockets" theme of the roundup.

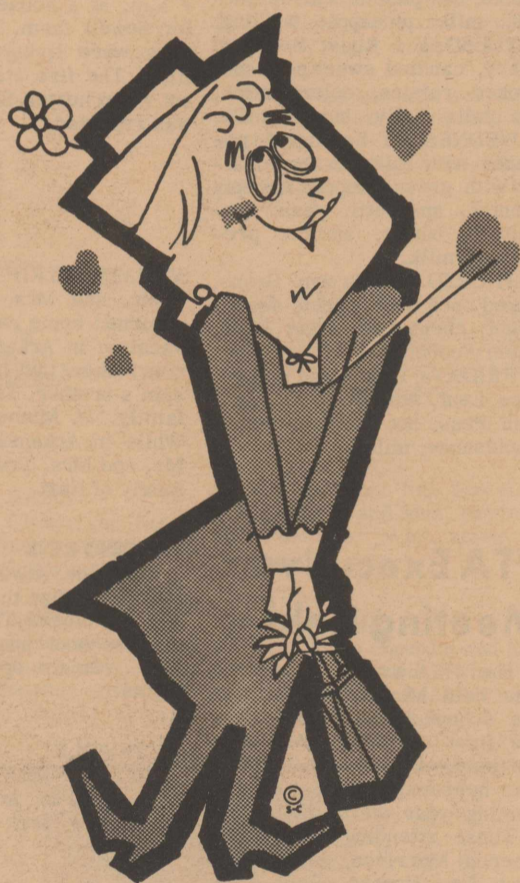

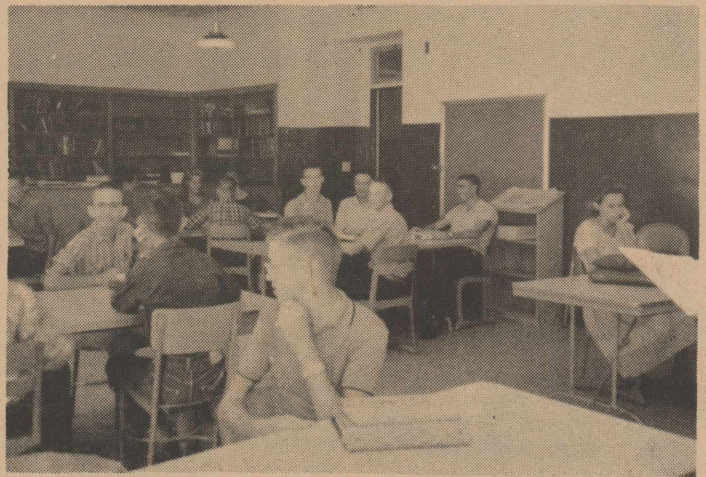
