

Hart Host To Springlake 11

Hart's Longhorns, fresh from a season opening victory over Canyon B, take on Springlake's tough Class A Wolverines here Friday night at 8.

Springlake will come into the contest following a heart-breaking loss to Bovina, 20-14.

The Wolverines and Bovina were tied 14-14 with 35 seconds left in the game when Bovina faked a field goal and connected on a five-yard pass for a TD.

Quarterback Jerry Been was the big gun for the Wolverines and is expected to lead the Springlake attack against Hart.

Been passed 23 yards to Don Sanders for one Springlake touchdown against Bovina, then ran 10 yards for the other. He also ran Springlake's extra points.

Hart used two short touchdown runs by Joe Rubalcaba to notch the Longhorns' victory over Canyon B.

Longhorns Stampede Over Canyon B, 12-0

Hart's Longhorns broke open a tight ball game with a pair of touchdowns to capture their opener with the Canyon B here Saturday night, 12-0.

The Longhorns tallied late in the third quarter and early in the fourth period, both scores on short runs by Quarterback Joe Rubalcaba.

It was a close, hard-fought battle that saw Hart capitalize on strong defensive play to set up the two scoring drives.

Hart led in first downs in the cleanly played game, 13-10. The Longhorns had only 10 yards in penalties, while Canyon was assessed for 25 yards.

Hart started a drive after the opening kick-off, but it died at the Canyon 35. Early in the second period, Canyon grabbed a Hart fumble at the Longhorn 45.

From there the Eaglets drove to the Hart 9, where stout defensive play by Tommy Morrison, Guy Scoggins, James Mitchell and Carl Ward helped stop the march.

Late in the first half, Rubalcaba passed to Dennis McLain for 24 yards to the Canyon 25. That Hart threat died a play later when Canyon picked off a Rubalcaba pass.

Early in the third period, Canyon elected to gamble on a fourth down play at midfield,

It took Hart just six plays to score, with Farris picking up seven yards on two carries and McLain getting 13 on two tries. Rubalcaba score from the four. The Canyon line again stopped Kittrell on the extra points try.

With Hart in the lead by 12-0 the Longhorns had to stand off a couple of last-ditch Canyon threats.

Kittrell, Gary Heller, Rubalcaba, Phil Green, Mitchell and Farris all got in some good defensive work to stall the final march.

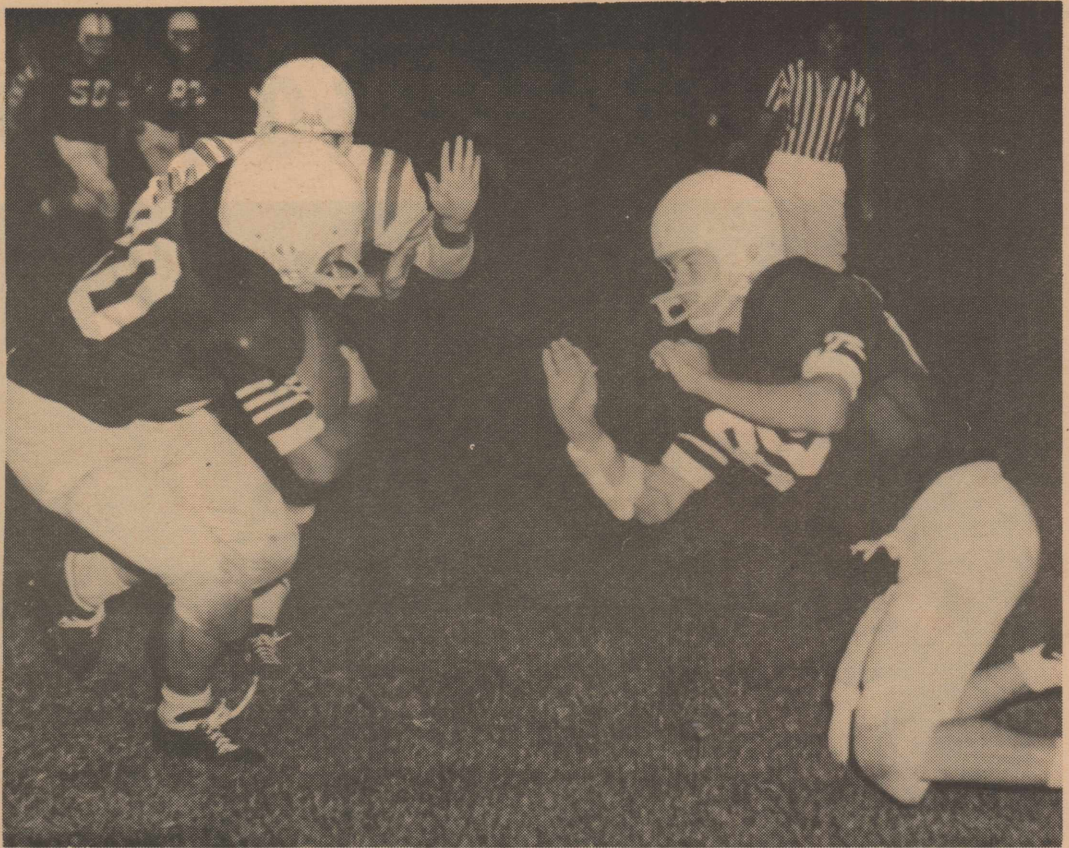
