Ordinance No.39

An ordinance amending ordinance number 36, and providing for the issuance of city Hallbonds, of the city of Amarillo, Texas and providing for their payment, principal and interest.

Be it ordained by the city council of the city of Amarillo, Texas, as follows:

Section 1. That there shall be and is hereby ordered issued nine thousand dollars, in interest bearing coupon bonds of the city of Amarillo, Texas, the same to be issued in denominations of \$500. each, and to be numbered from 1 to 18 both inclusive.

Section 2. Said bonds shall be Issued for the purpess of erecting a city hall in and for said city of Amarillo, Texas and shall be known and styled "Amarillo, city hall bonds,

Section 3. Said bonds shall be dated the first day of January 1900 and shall become due and payable twenty years after date; they shall bear interest at the rate of five per cent per annum, payable semi annally, on the first, ayp of July and January of each year, both principal and interest payable in lawful money of the United States upon presentation of bonds, or proper coupons at the office of the National Park Bank, in the city and state of . New York.

Section 4. Wild bonds shall be signed by the Mayor, and counter signed by the city secretary, and shall bear impress of the seal of the city of Amarillo, Texas, on each of them. The coupons attached to have the signa. ture of the Mayor and city secretary of said city.

Section 5. It is further ordained by the said city council, that for the purpose of paying the annual interest, and creating a sinking fund for the said bonds for the current year, there is hereby levied and appropriated a tax of twenty-five cents, or a sufficient amount of this certain legy of twenty five cents upon each one hundred dollars valuation of all taxable property in said dity of Amarillo, Texas, to pay interest and create a sinking fund for the payment of interest, and principal of said

It is further ordained by said city council of said city, that for each succeeding year, while said bonds are out standing, a sufficient tax shall be annually levied, assessed and ollected and applied to the purposes named, above.

Section 6. That so much of ordinance No. 36 of the city of Amarillo, Texas, and all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict, with this ordinance, be and the same is hereby re-

Section 7. That this ordinance take effect and to be in full force and operation from and after its passage approval and publication.
