



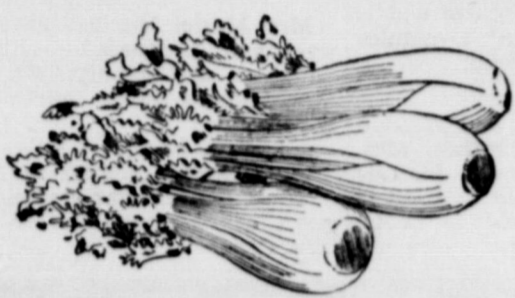

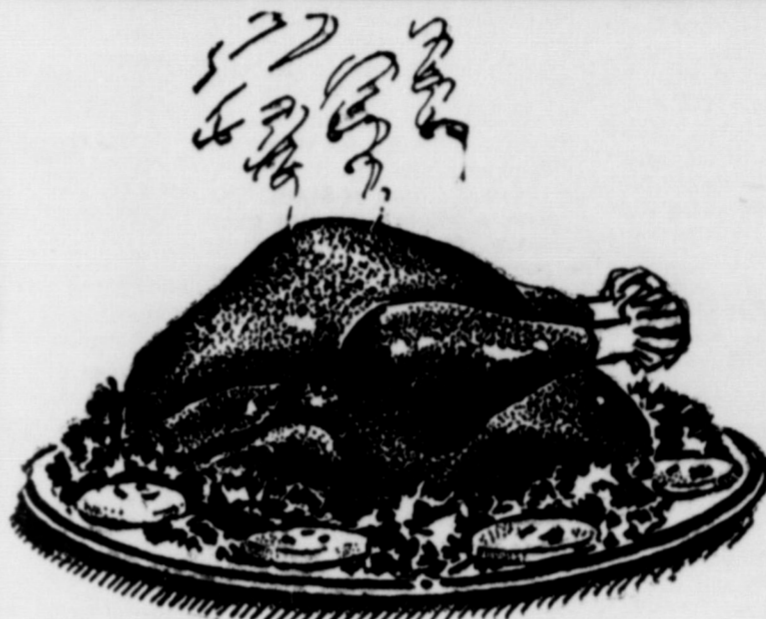

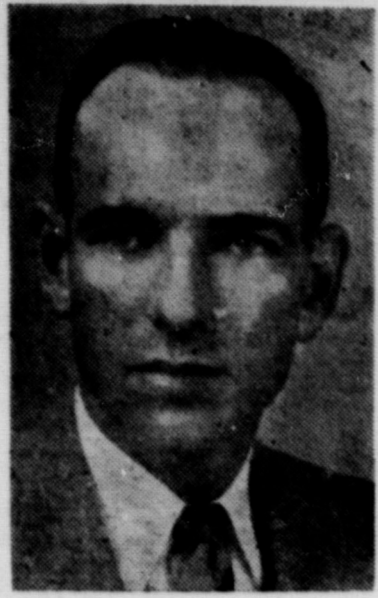








### Judge Purcell Of Wichita Falls In Congress Race

Judge Graham B. Purcell, Jr., Democratic candidate for Congress in the upcoming special election, says he will bring his campaign to every part of the 13th Congressional District.

Purcell, judge of the 89th District Court at Wichita Falls since 1955, paid tribute to outgoing Rep. Frank Ikard in his announcement and said that he'd feel it a privilege to be associated with the present administration.

"I am a life-long Democrat, have always been a Democrat and am running as a Democrat in this race."

Purcell, who has a long record of civic, religious and youth service in his community, stressed moral values in his announcement.

"Integrity in public office and strengthening the moral fiber of our entire citizenship is, in my opinion, an important duty of our national leaders. I will strive to carry out the duties of this office with this obligation in mind."

Purcell, a five-year combat veteran of World War II, has had experience and training which uniquely qualifies him for federal legislative office. He holds a bachelor of science degree in agriculture from Texas A&M College (1946) and a law degree from Baylor University (1949).

He is married and has four children.
