# PEDC Rejects Bids, Rents Houses

Post Economic Development Corp. (PEDC) directors voted last week to reject all 13 bids offered on purchasing three PEDC owned houses.

Bids were submitted by nine individuals, with bids falling between 64 percent to 50 percent below the appraised market values.

One house was bid at \$2,000, and directors agreed that the property could be rented at \$200 a month and produce enough revenue in a year to offset the offered buying price.

Other bids included \$15,265 and \$14,400.

All three houses will be rented by PEDC. The contract for sale of the

house at 201 N. Ave S was discussed, with a closing date set for March 15.

The net return to PEDC after closing costs and repairs is expected to be

Although no firm arrangements with tenants has been set, several firms have made inquiries about the

Consultant George Puckett reported that the interest of Continental Industries of Elkhart, Indiana was not dead and a proposal was being developed on how they might use the plant.


