True profitability has to be analyzed on an accrual Accrual income can be estimated fairly accurately by a series of adjustments to the cash basis data to account for changes in inventories, accounts payses. These adjustments are relatively simple, notes the economist, but they are critical because cash basis cover up developing profitability problems for as much as two years.
