Clayton, Jr., local insurance agent, being filed for mayor and Harvey Line, local groceryman, and Homer Hardberger, local farmer, being filed for councilmen. Mr. Line is currently on the council, and announced he was retiring, but consented to run again. R. Pelts is the retiring councilman and said he positively would not accept re-election. Mr. Pelts has made a very fine record of sincere and able service to his town during the past two years. A very light city vote is expected with the unopposed city ticket.

The School Trustee race saw Paul Mansell, local groceryman, filing for a place on the ticket. He has a son in the first grade. Mr. Mansell is War II veteran, and active in civic clubs. He is a former city councilman where he served with ability.
