Under the law certain people have always been exempt. people have always been exemption Some of these laws of exemption have been changed. The former law provides for the exemption of men over the age of 60. The law was changed by the recent Legisla-ture which provides that men and women both are exempt only when they become 65.

2. The law provides that the spouses of attorneys engaged actual practice of the law are ex-

empt from jury service. 3. Members of the National Guard during the period of time when they are actually on active duty are exempt.

4.Females who have legal cusody of children under the age of 16 years are exempt. 5. Nurses, both registered and practical actually engaged in the

practice of their profession are ex-6. The wife of a man summoned to serve on the same jury panel is exempt. She would not be exempt if she was summoned to serve on a

different panel. 7. The law formerly provided that druggists were exempt. This has been changed and the word drughas been omitted and registered pharmasists are now exempt. Under the change the druggist who s not actually a pharmasist himself not be exempt. 8. School teachers were formerly

They are so longer xempt. nder the law. 9. Publishers of newspapers were

formerly exempt. They are not since the effective date of this re-cent enactment of May 20, 1955. People who are exempt are

gible in every respect and will be sed as jurors usless they wish to elaim their exemption. in which case they are excused. There are a umber of other exemptions but hey remain unchanged, so no menion is made of them.

In criminal cases the law has always required that all members t the jury be kept together at all imes, from the time of their selec-ion until they were discharged after reaching a verdict. This remains unchanged except as follows: The law now provides that when a is composed of males and feales, then such jurors are permitt d to separate to the extent of housfemale jurors separate and at from male jurors." The law ther provides that there shall furnished facilities for the fele jurors separate and apart m facilities for the male jurors. therwise the law with regard to separation of jurors remains






