Cotton Coming in At a Lively Rate

Weigher Busby reports that the receipts of cotton at the yard totaled 3200 bales Thursday night, about 250 bales being received that day.

More pickers are coming and with continued good weather it is expected that the gins will be kept busy during the next two months. Mr. Busby estimates the crop will reach between 18,000 and 20,000 bales.

Owing to the recent showers and damp weather, the buyers state that the staple has greatly deteriorated the past week. The price has been running from 21 cents to 22 75.

Cecil Abel of Lamesa Opens Dry Goods Store

As soon as it was known that the dog had hydrophobia, the Pasteur treatment was administered and until the first of the week the lady seemed in her usual health.

Deceased was twenty years of age at her death and leaves a husband and six months old child. She was the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. E. Francis. Rev. Brasswell of Tahoka, conducted the funeral.

Superintendent Suggests Prompt Payment of Taxes

The money from the state does not come in rapidly enough to meet expenses, so the board is forced to borrow money. Ten Commandments Coming

It required eight months of preparation before the production was started in desert locales closely duplicating Israel's exodus from Egypt and stay in the Sinaiatic wilderness. More than 2,500 people were employed in the biblical scenes of the picture, fifteen tons of modeling clay, 300 tons of plaster, 550,000 feet of lumber, 25,000 pounds of nails and 75 miles of cable and wire used in building the immense sets. Sixteen miles of cloth were used to make 3,000 costumes, three tons of leather were made into 250 sets of Egyptian chariot harness. Ten tons of hay were required to feed 900 horses, 200 burros, 50 camels, 500 sheep and 1,000 cattle.

AN ORDINANCE
Prohibiting the erection of any tent within 600 feet of a private residence, to be used by a carnival show or any place of amusement in connection with a carnival show, etc.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of O'Donnell:

It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation or any employe of any firm or corporation, to construct or assist in constructing any tent to be used or occupied by a show, skating rink, or other place of amusement, not hereafter excepted, within 600 feet of a private residence in O'Donnell, Texas.

It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation or any employe of any person firm or corporation, to operate or assist in operating any tent show, skating rink, or other place of amusement not hereafter excepted from these provisions, in any tent within 600 feet of a private residence in said city.

Provided- However, that said provisions shall not in any manner be applicable to Chautauquas, nor to reputable Dramatic shows, provided, that the latter two classifications of entertainments shall be licensed to operate only upon Special Permit through the City Council, and be further subject to approval by the residents and property owners within 600 feet radius of the proposed show grounds.

That, any Ordinance or part thereof enacted, in conflict with this Ordinance, is hereby expressly repealed, and this Ordinance, and all provisions hereof shall be in full force and effect from and after its publication as required by law.

AN ORDINANCE

Prohibiting and fixing penalty for maintenance and operation of punch boards, slot machine, or other device for gaming etc.

It shall be unlawful for any firm, corporation, or association or persons, or any agent or employe of any person firm or corporation or association of persons, to maintain or operate for the purpose of gaming, (or permit any gaming device upon his premises, or possess or permit same to remain upon his premises) any punch board, slot machine, or any device for gaming, regardless of Name, or whether same has a name, shall upon conviction thereof in the Corporation court of the City of O'Donnell, Texas, be punished by a fine of not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$50.00

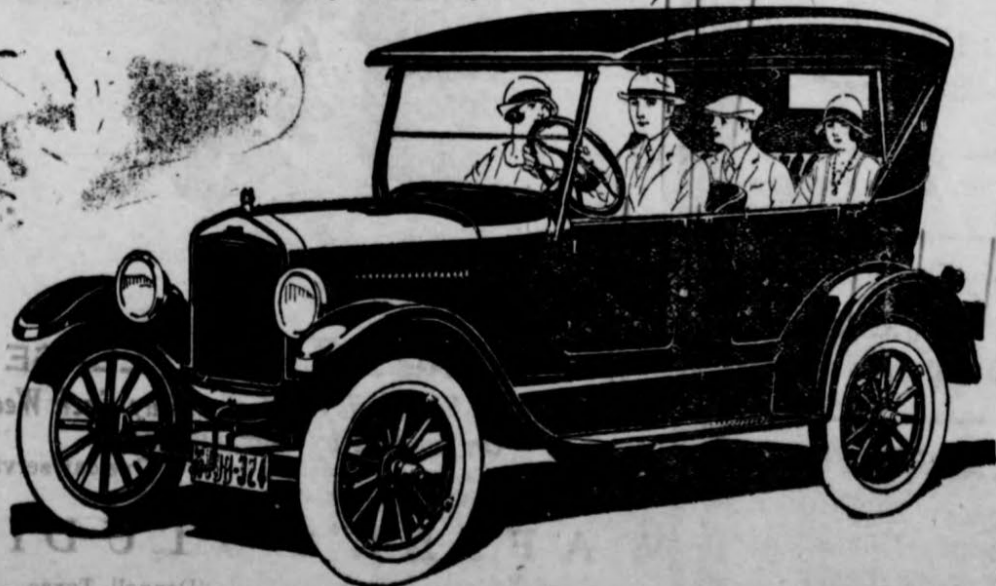

When King George and Queen Mary visited the British Empire exhibition at Wembley recently the official time card prepared by the King's advisors permitted a five minutes' stay at the Ford Motor Company's exhibit, but when the royal couple reached the exhibit they became so interested that they remained for half an hour.

Each asked eager questions and manifested deep interest both in manufacturing methods and demonstrations of Ford car quality. An assembly line, similar to the one which drew so much attention in New York during the Automobile show season last January, particularly attracted their majesties.

"Wonderful," exclaimed the King as a completed car was driven off the line and skilfully turned around in the narrow space available.

Both the King and Queen asked numerous questions about the welfare of the employes. Working conditions of the men and their living conditions and wages were of particular interest to the Queen, as was the incident of a laborer who started in the Ford plant at Manchester at the minimum wage and rose to a salary of 5,000 pounds a year.

Sighting the 250,000th British made Ford car, which was on display, King George was prompted to inquire the yearly production figures in England. He was informed that 40,000 Ford cars are made in England annually by British workmen.

"No wonder the roads are so crowded" was his Royal observation.

Before leaving, both the King and Queen signed the visitor's register.
