Understanding how to identify plant problems and solve these problem will put more vegetables on your table. You also mse sedize cenain probgardener's control.

* Fertilize tomato plants with one
level tablespoon of 21-0-0 (Ammo-
nium Sulfate) per plant every four
weeks. Water after the application.
* Use soaker hoses and mulch to conserve water and avoid spraying the foliage with irrigation water

Tomato plants will shed their blooms if daytime temperatures ex-
ceed 92 degrees with night temperatures above 75 degrees. This is a common problem during the heat of summer. Plant heat-set varieties and early maturing varieties during more moderate temperatures.
