## City gets bridge for walking track

The solution to a major part of the walking track around Lake Gordon was announced Monday night during the city council's meeting.

A steel bridge -- the oldest steel bridge in Wichita County, which is located on South Peterson Road -- has been donated to the city by the Wichita County Commissioners Court.

Mayor Tim Hunter reported that he and Administrator Mike Price had attended the Commissioners' meeting that morning to make a formal request for the bridge, and it was approved by an unanimous vote.

Hunter said Commissioner Harold White had offered the motion and it was seconded by Commissioner Gordon Griffith.

The council had been trying to decide how the walking path around the lake could be completed at the north end, which is low and always had standing water.

At first, Hunter had been told by the Texas Highway Department that an old bridge in the southwestern part of the county was available. However, word was later received that the bridge would not be available for another two to four years.

An alternative solution was considered, which included constructing a bridge.

That solution, however, was less desirable, from an esthetic point of view. Because the bridge will be located immediately along side US 287, council members felt an old steel bridge would be more attractive.

Hunter told the council that an engineer would study the Peterson Road bridge and where it would be located on the walking path, and make a determination of how it would be enforced.

The mayor said he told Commissioners that the city would be removing it from its location within three months.

The old bridge has not been used for several years, since a low-water concrete crossing was constructed.

### OTHER BUSINESS

Other business conducted during Monday's meeting included:

\* Sheria Fowler was sworn in as the city's newest police officer;

\* Three appointments by the Mayor were approved, including Charles Seets to the Planning and Zoning Commission, Freddy Daume to the Wichita Appraisal District board, and Eddie Sasser to fulfill a vacancy on the Board of Adjustments created by the resignation of Jan Clapp;

## Hawk -Lion game has great importance

Iowa Park-Vernon, enough said. It doesn't take a lot of rah-rah talk to get the Hawks ready to play the Lions, no matter what the sport.

It doesn't matter if it's the District 5-3A title on the line in girls' volleyball that's being played in Vernon today. Or if it's Friday night's showdown between a pair of teams needing a win to assure themselves of a playoff spot, or if it's someone from Iowa Park against someone from Vernon in a game of marbles. The Hawks and Lions are bitter rivals in everything.

So when the two teams take the field in Vernon Friday night at 7:30, you can assure yourself that both teams will be at the top of their game.

It seems like every year, it comes down to the Iowa Park-Vernon game to determine who wins the district and who finishes second. And for the last three years it's been Vernon coming out on top winning the District Championship, while the Hawks had to settle for the second playoff spot.

Well this year there's a new sheriff in town.

The Childress Bobcats, with a win over 2-6 Graham Friday night will be the District 5-3A Champions, leaving the Hawks and Lions to battle it out for second and third. The good news is that for the first time ever, three teams will qualify for the State playoffs in each district with the school with the largest enrollment going to the Large School Division

and the other two going to the Small School Division regardless of the way the teams finish in league play.

If the three teams making the playoffs include Childress, Iowa Park and Vernon, Vernon would go to the Large School Division, Childress would go as the top team in the Small School Division and Iowa Park would go as second-place in the Small School Division.

But it might be a bit early to be making playoff reservations for either school. A Graham upset over Childress this week would really put things in a jumble with a possibility of a three-way tie for second and third, with one of the teams tied staying home.

As it stands heading into Friday night's games, Childress is in first at 6-2 overall and 3-0 in district, while Iowa Park and Vernon are both 6-2 overall and 2-1 in district play. Bowie, 4-4 overall and Graham 2-6 overall, are tied at 1-2 in district play, while Henrietta is last at 0-8 and 0-3.

Friday night's matchup between Iowa Park and Vernon is a huge game in the playoff picture as is the Graham-Childress game. The other game of the week is Bowie at Henrietta.

"If we win, we pretty much assure ourselves of a playoff spot," said head coach Weldon Nelms, who has taken his team to the playoffs three straight years. "When Iowa Park plays Vernon, you can throw out the records, it's always going to be a big game for both teams. They'd just as soon beat us as anybody and we'd just as soon

beat them. We haven't beaten them since 1993 and that's too long.

"They lost to Old High and to Childress and struggled with Graham," Nelms stated. "So our kids

know that they can play with them. It's going to be another big challenge for us just like it was in the Bowie game. We knew if we lost that game we were in a big hole and we came out and got the job done on the road. We need to respond that way again this week in Vernon. As far as the playoffs go, we need Childress to beat Graham and put them out. If Graham wins that changes things tremendously."

The Lions are once again led by Chedrick Ricks, a 185-lb. senior tailback. Ricks almost single handedly beat the Hawks last year and is having another stellar season this year.

"Ricks is still the best player on their team," said Nelms. "We have to try and slow him down. You can't stop him, but we have to do a better job of containing him than we've done in the past. He's killed us the past two years. I don't think his offensive line is as good as it's been in the past two years and that should work to our advantage."

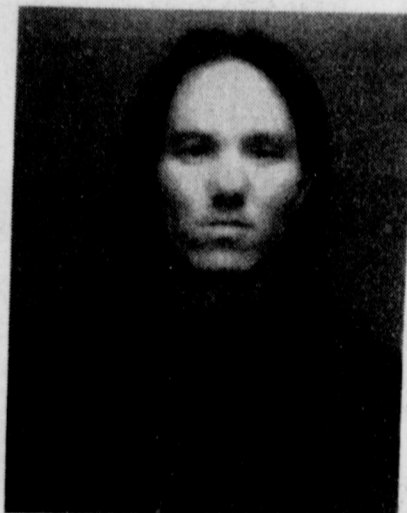
Joining Ricks in the backfield are quarterback Jason Klappenbach, fullback Micky Ricks, Chedrick's little brother, and wingback Willie Cherry.

Vernon's offensive line averages only 202-lbs and is young and has had trouble this season against

## Local couple indicted

An Iowa Park couple is free on \$10,000 bond each, after being indicted last Wednesday by the Wichita Falls grand jury.

Mary Jane Rulo, 28, was indicted on two counts of indecency with a child and one count of aggravated perjury.

David Howard Rulo, 46, was indicted on one count of indecency with a child, and re-indicted on one count of sexual performance by a child.

The indictments are in connection with an incident which allegedly occurred on or about Oct. 7, 1993, in which David Rulo took polaroid photographs of Mary Rulo with two juvenile females in "an indecent position," according to Rick Mahler, assistant district attorney.

David Rulo was originally indicted for sexual performance by a child on March 23, 1994, but was re-indicted March 4 of this year and again this week on the same charge. The re-indictments were due to the fact that the district attorney's office "couldn't get the language right" in the original indictments, according to Mahler.

According to police documents, a Child Protective Service case worker turned over polaroid pictures to a child advocate official. One photo showed a nude female with two children, one of which was also nude. Another photograph was a sexually explicit picture of one of the two children in the first photograph.

Mahler said he anticipates pre-trial hearings to be set in the next 60 days.

In order to advance to the state competition, Iowa Park earned a Division One 17th consecutive year.

## Tuesday is election day

Early voting in the general election will continue through 7 p.m. Friday.

Interest in the election is evident by the numbers who have cast early ballots at the Wichita County Tax Office here in Iowa Park.

Mrs. Leroy Threet, election judge, reported 401 ballots had been cast by 1 p.m. Tuesday.

Elementary, 800 S. Texowa; Pct. 34, West Wichita Co-op Building in Valley View, and Pct. 35, Chaparral Baptist Assembly, 3784 Church Camp Road.

Besides the state and national offices being on the ballots this year, likely the greatest interest locally is the number of Wichita County offices on the ballot.

With the exception of Precinct Three Commissioner Gordon Griffith, the entire commissioners court will be changed, including county judge and commissioners of Precincts One, Two and Four.

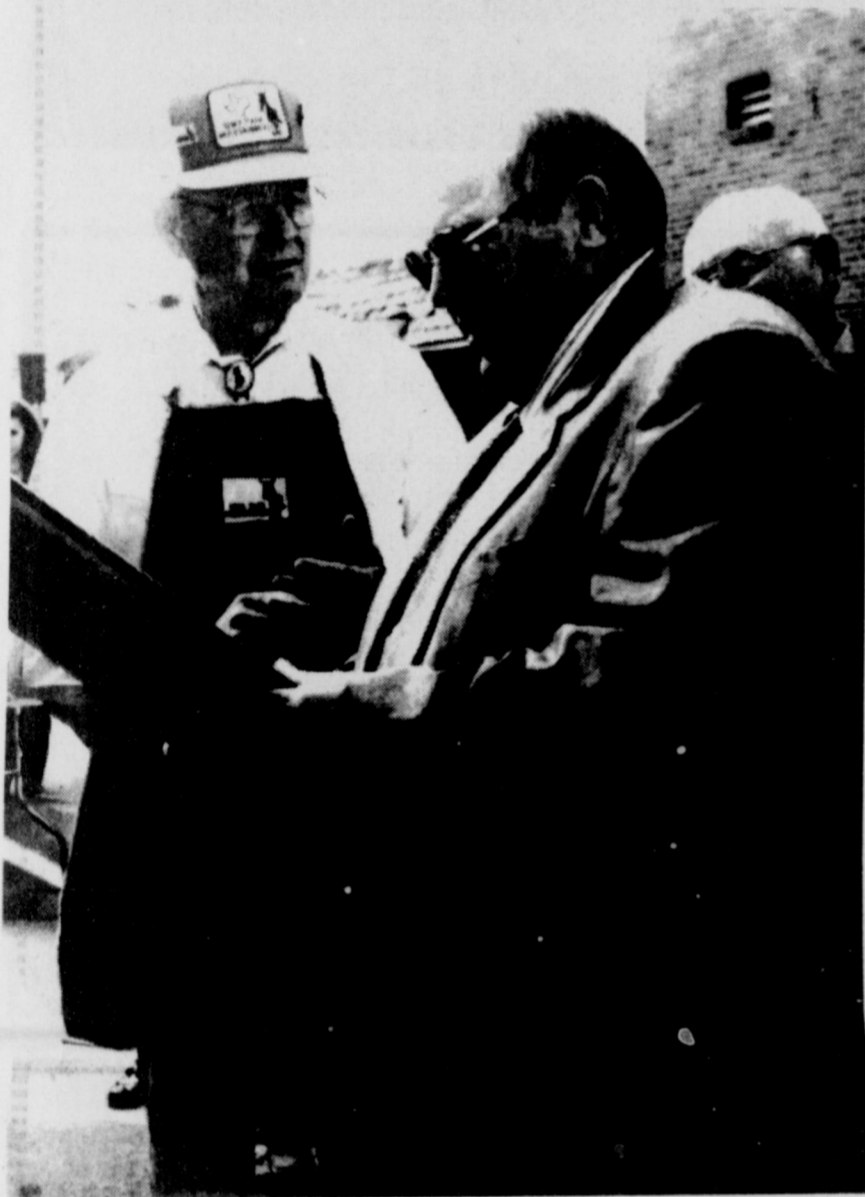
\* Approved the purchase of video cameras for two police department patrol cars;

## Sealed Air reports third quarter results

Sealed Air Corp. reported Monday third quarter operating results that are in line with its previously-announced projections.

Basic earnings for the third quarter were \$0.29 per share before charges that were incurred in carrying out the restructuring program that the company announced on July 27.

Those charges, which amounted to \$137,074,000, resulted in the company reporting a net loss for the third quarter of \$0.85 per share, also consistent with the company's previously-announced expectations.

The restructuring and other charges arose out of the review that the company made of its operations following the merger of Sealed Air and the Cryovac packaging business of W.R. Grade & Co. at the end of March 1998.

As the company previously announced, the review was made to develop a combined operating plan for Sealed Air and Cryovac.

Commenting on the company's performance, T.J. Dermot Dunphy, chairman and chief executive officer, stated, "Despite current economic conditions, we have achieved results within previously-announced expectations. Our gross margin is increasing as we expected."

"As we have said, 1998 will be a year of transition as we work to integrate Sealed Air and Cryovac."

"While integration activities will continue in 1998 and 1999, we believe a substantial majority of the integration costs are now behind us. We expect to realize meaningful benefits from the merger in 1999, and more fully realize the benefits as we move into 2000."

The following is a summary of the company's operating results for the third quarter and first nine months of 1998:

\* Net sales for the quarter were \$684,302,000, an increase of 2% compared with pro forma net sales of \$667,799,000 for the third quarter of

1997. Pro forma net sales for the first nine months also increased 2% to \$1,998,094,000 from \$1,967,529,000 for the first nine months of 1997. Excluding the negative effect of foreign currency translation, on a pro forma basis, net sales would have increased 6% and 5% compared to the third quarter and first nine months of 1997, respectively, primarily due to higher unit volume.

\* Excluding the \$137 million of restructuring and other charges discussed above, pro forma basic and diluted earnings per common share for the third quarter were \$0.29, which is within the range of \$0.27 to \$0.32 for the quarter that the company

projected on July 27.

\* The effect of the conversion of the company's outstanding convertible preferred stock is not considered in the calculation of diluted earnings per common share because the effect would be anti-dilutive. That is, it would have increased pro forma diluted earnings per share to \$0.36 for the third quarter and to \$1.00 for the first nine months of 1998 excluding, in each period, the one-time \$8 million inventory charge reported in the second quarter of 1998. The \$0.36 per share figure is within the range of \$0.35 to \$0.40 for the quarter that the company projected on July 27.

\* As a result of the \$137 million

of charges discussed above, the company reported a net loss for the third quarter of \$54,103,000. The reported basic and diluted loss per common share was \$0.85 for the quarter.

# Hawks please homecomers with 44-3 victory over 'Cats

The only question in the minds of the packed house at Friday's Homecoming game against Henrietta was who was going to win the Homecoming Queen contest.

Everyone had already assumed that Iowa Park would roll over winless Henrietta, after all the Hawks were in the hunt for a playoff spot and the Bearcats hadn't shown that they could stop anybody.

They still haven't stopped anybody. Iowa Park rolled to a 44-3 victory over Henrietta to improve to 6-2 overall and 2-1 in district play, tied for second with Vernon. Both the Hawks and Lions have identical records of 6-2 and 2-1 and will square off tomorrow night in Vernon with a playoff spot hanging in the balance.

The Hawk defense held the Bearcats to only 19 total yards in the second half and to only 88 total yards for the entire game, while Iowa Park rolled up 477 total yards, with 398 coming on the ground.

Iowa Park got on the board with 8:29 left in the opening quarter on a 22-yard run by Chase Wright. Ross Dillard's point-after made it 7-0. One of the big plays in the 48-yard scoring drive included a 22-yard completion from Tyler Pulley to Bryan Miller.

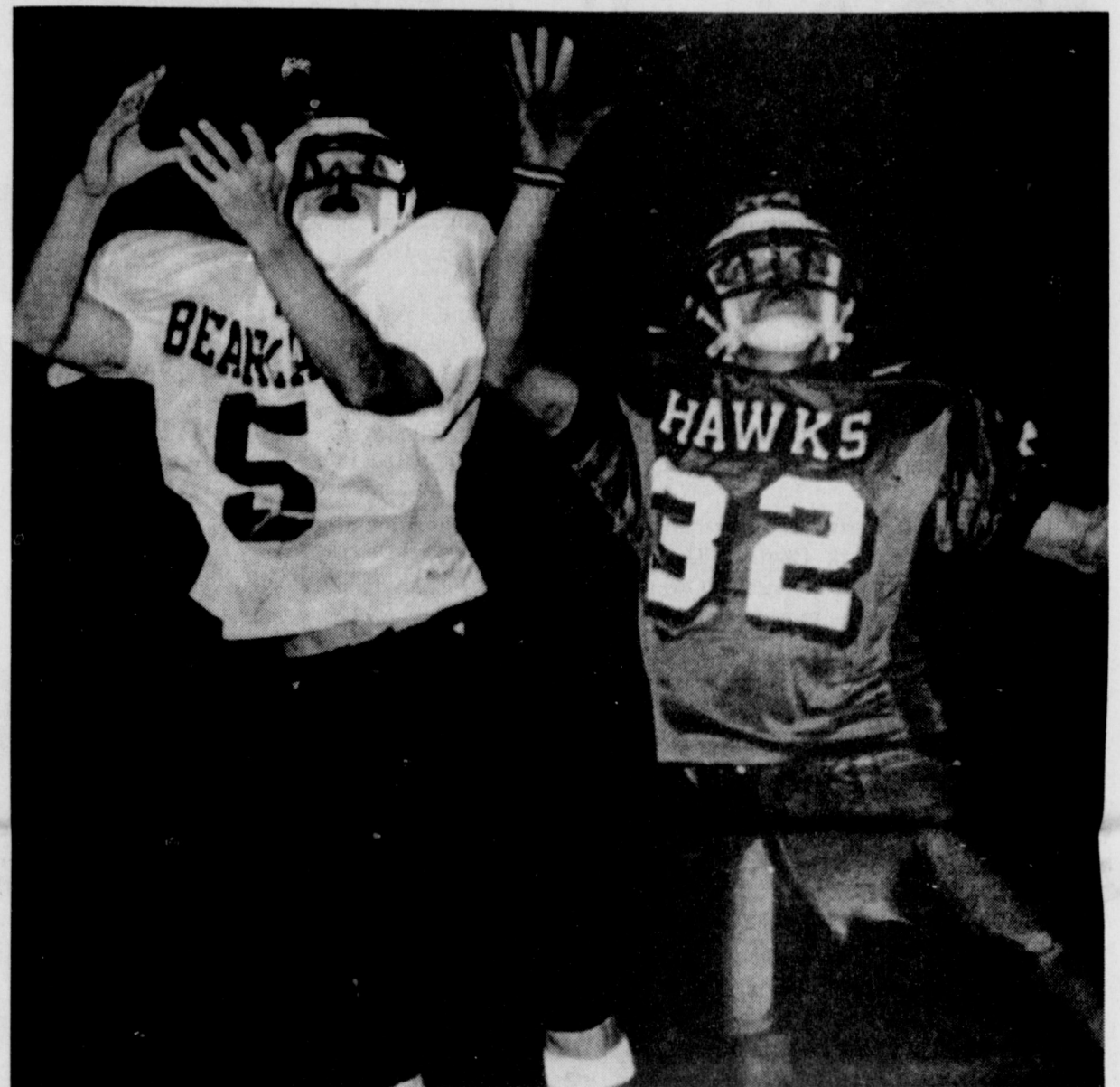
Less than four minutes later, Iowa Park made it 13-0 on a 49-yard touchdown run by Miller. The point-after failed, leaving Iowa Park on top 13-0 with 4:44 left in the first quarter. Miller finished the night with his best game of the season rushing, gaining 175 yards on only eight carries. Miller also scored two more touchdowns and caught a pair of passes for 46 yards.

On Iowa Park's next possession, the Hawks took over on the Bearcat 39. On the first play from scrimmage, Tommy Duerson broke free and went 61 yards for the touchdown to push the Iowa Park lead to 20-0 with 3:04 still showing in the first quarter. Daron Blackerby kicked the point after.

The Hawks kept pouring it on to start the second quarter, scoring on a 24-yard touchdown pass to Miller from Toby Williams. In the drive Scotty Mitchell, who finished with 57 yards rushing on seven carries, broke off a big 17-yarder on third-and-11 to keep the drive alive for the Hawks.

Henrietta got its only points on the final play of the half on a 48-yard field goal by Jim Walker to cut the Iowa Park lead to 28-3 at intermission.

The second half was just more of the same for the Hawks as they scored 13 points in the third quarter to extend their lead to 41-3 after three

periods. And it didn't take long for the Hawks to get back in the scoring mode either. Iowa Park took the second half kickoff at the Henrietta 34 and one play later, Miller was off and running on a 66-yard touchdown.

Wright scored his second touchdown of the game on the Hawks' next possession on a 16-yard run to cap a five-play 60-yard scoring drive. Big plays on the drive included a 39-yard run by Miller and an 11-yard run by Duerson. Wright finished the night with 47 yards on four carries while Duerson added 86 yards on five tries.

Iowa Park's final points came off the foot of Blackerby with 51 seconds left in the game on a 31-yard field goal to make the final score 44-3.

The Hawks averaged almost 10 yards per carry, rushing 40 times for 398 yards. Henrietta on the other hand carried 26 times for only 49 yards. The only bad sign for the Hawks was the number of penalty yards marched off against

Iowa Park. The Hawks were flagged 11 times for 107 yards.

Defensive tackle Russell Duggins had to leave the game in the second half with a knee injury, but according to coaches, should be back in time for the Vernon game Friday night.

The Lions have outscored their non-district opponents 147-66, but have managed only an eight point margin against their district 5-3A foes, with a 77-69 advantage.

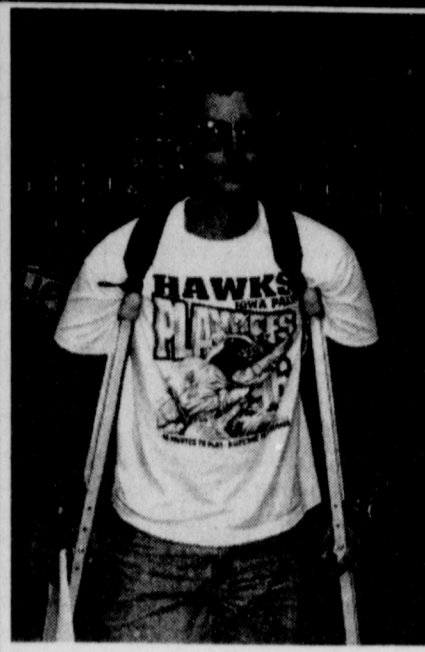
