



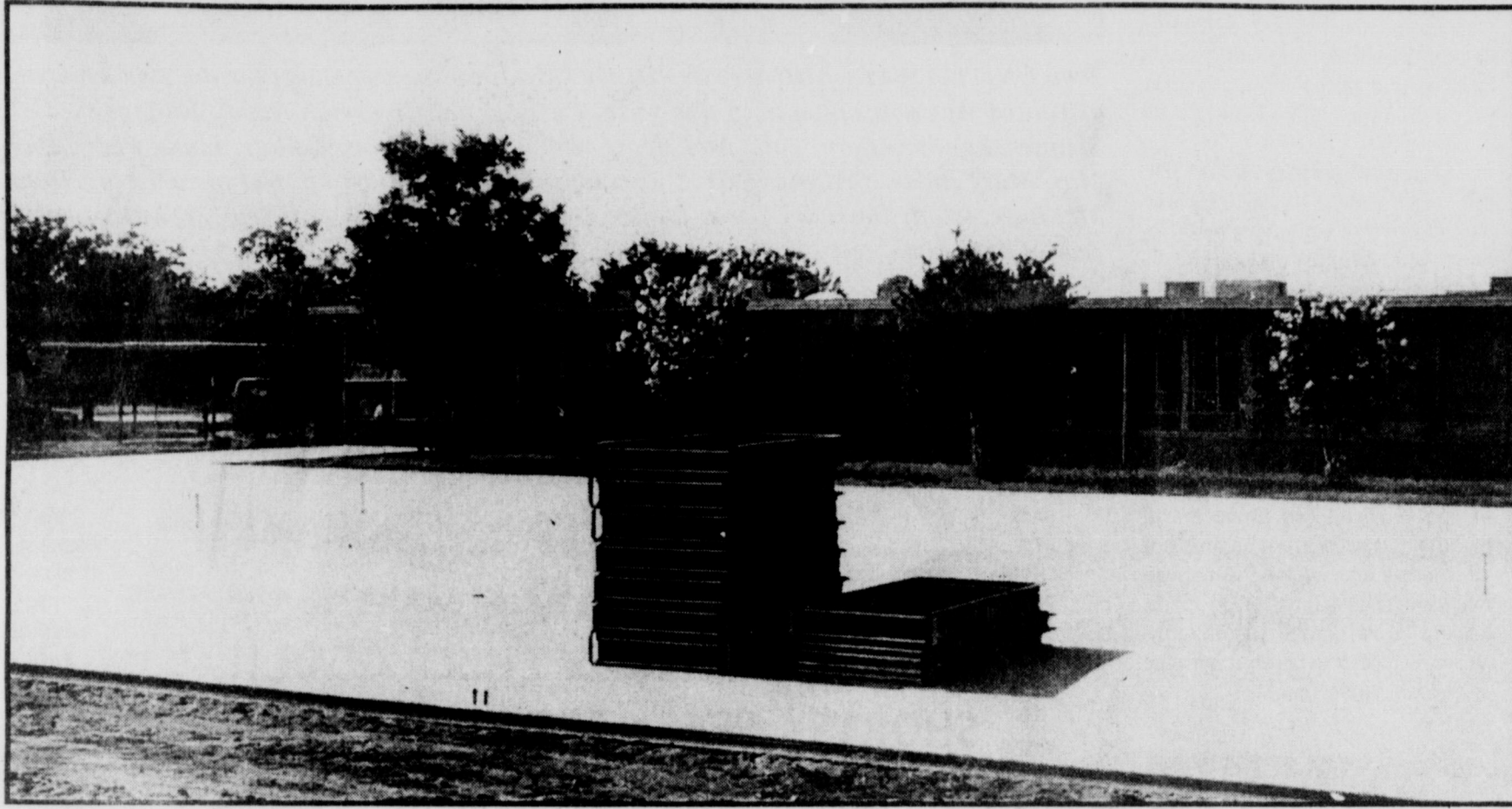

Personnel top trustee meeting

Two resignations were accepted and seven positions filled when the Iowa Park School Board met in a called meeting last Thursday night.

LaRae Collins, high school counselor, and Lee Anderson, agriculture science teacher, both submitted letters of resignation to the board. Collins will be employed as a counselor with the Electra school district, and Anderson will be in charge of beginning a vocational program at City View.

To fill the vacancy left by Mrs. Collins, Eddie Wolsch was hired as high school counselor and district TAAS coordinator.

Last year Walsch was counselor at Morton High School, and previously taught school at Old Glory, Holliday, McCaulley, and Benjamin. He was counselor at Crowell for four years, and was employed four years as principal by the Rule ISD.

Alan Reed, who has been the agricultural teacher at Rochester I.S.D. since 1993, was hired to fill the position left open by Anderson. He received his Bachelor of Science degree from Tarleton State University in 1992.

Christopher Heskett was employed as assistant principal at W.F. George Middle School. This position was left open when James Skeeler was named assistant principal at Iowa Park High School.

Heskett was previously a teacher and coach at McNiel Junior High in Wichita Falls.

Others hired to fill teaching positions include Keri Heskett, middle school computer teacher; John Bruner, middle school special education teacher; Erin Christie Howard, high school biology and coach; and Marta Josa, part-time high school Spanish teacher.

Mike Marrs gave the board an update on facility construction in the district. He said that the steel for the buildings had arrived, and they should start seeing a lot of progress.

The bid proposal from Mutual of Omaha for \$14,376 for 2000-2001 student insurance was approved, as well as catalog discount bids for athletic supplies.

Board members looked over the first draft of the 2000-2001 budget, with expenditures totaling \$11,152,919.

Two charged with vehicle burglaries

Police arrested two 16-year-old males Friday morning on charges of burglary of a motor vehicle, and transported them to the county juvenile detention center.

The burglaries occurred in the same neighborhood in the West part of the city in late June.

One of the juveniles was charged on seven counts and the other on four, according to the police blotter. The charges are Class A misdemeanors.

But there was another group involved in the same activity and same area, according to police, and charges are expected against those individuals in the near future.

Now police are investigating reports of additional vehicle tire slashings, similar to others reported a couple of weeks ago.

Thirteen tires were slashed on buses and other types of vehicles that were parked at the school bus barn on Johnson Road some time Wednesday night of last week.

And two vehicles were attacked some time Tuesday evening of last week in the 1300 block of Sunset. Two tires on one vehicle were slashed, as well as the canvas top of a convertible.

Additionally, two tires on a trailer parked in the 400 block of North Hawthorne were slashed, police were told Monday morning.

Police have been extremely busy during the past week on numerous other cases besides those of thefts and vandalism, according to blotter entries.

Officers took Monty Keith Britt, 20, into custody Wednesday on three different outstanding warrants issued locally.

Britt was later released, but after paying \$526 on a commitment order

and signing a promise to appear in municipal court on the other two warrants.

Also taken into custody on outstanding warrants Wednesday was Lelani Lee Gibbs, 18. Gibbs was released after paying a \$163 fine and also signing a promise to appear in court, according to the police blotter.

A third person was taken into

custody Tuesday on outstanding warrants. Joshua Logan Menasco, 18, was wanted for capias pro fine public intoxication, no liability insurance and having an expired registration. He later signed a promise to appear in court and was released.

Monday, police went to a residence in the 500 block of South Colorado to serve a warrant on Tho-

mas Carlton Lindsay, 36.

Lindsay reportedly fled on foot, and was later taken into custody in the 400 block of South Jackson.

Officers were armed with three local warrants, and also with one from Austin, where he was wanted for parole violation.

After being transported to a hospital in Wichita Falls, having complained of chest pains, Lindsay was transported to the county jail.

Tuesday morning, Perry Lee Shelton, 40, was taken into custody on a warrant from Tarrant County, for aggravated assault with a deadly weapon. He was released to authorities at the county jail.

Police have filed a charge of unauthorized use of a motor vehicle against Rhonda Mae Houston, 32.

The vehicle reportedly was taken from the 500 block of East Lafayette some time between July 20 and 23.

The department was later informed by customs authorities in Eagle Pass that they had run a check on the vehicle's license plate when the vehicle was returning Monday into the United States from Mexico.

The council will hold a called meeting at 7 p.m. Aug. 8, to finalize work on next year's budget.

The meeting will be in council chambers and is open to the general public.

County continues burn ban

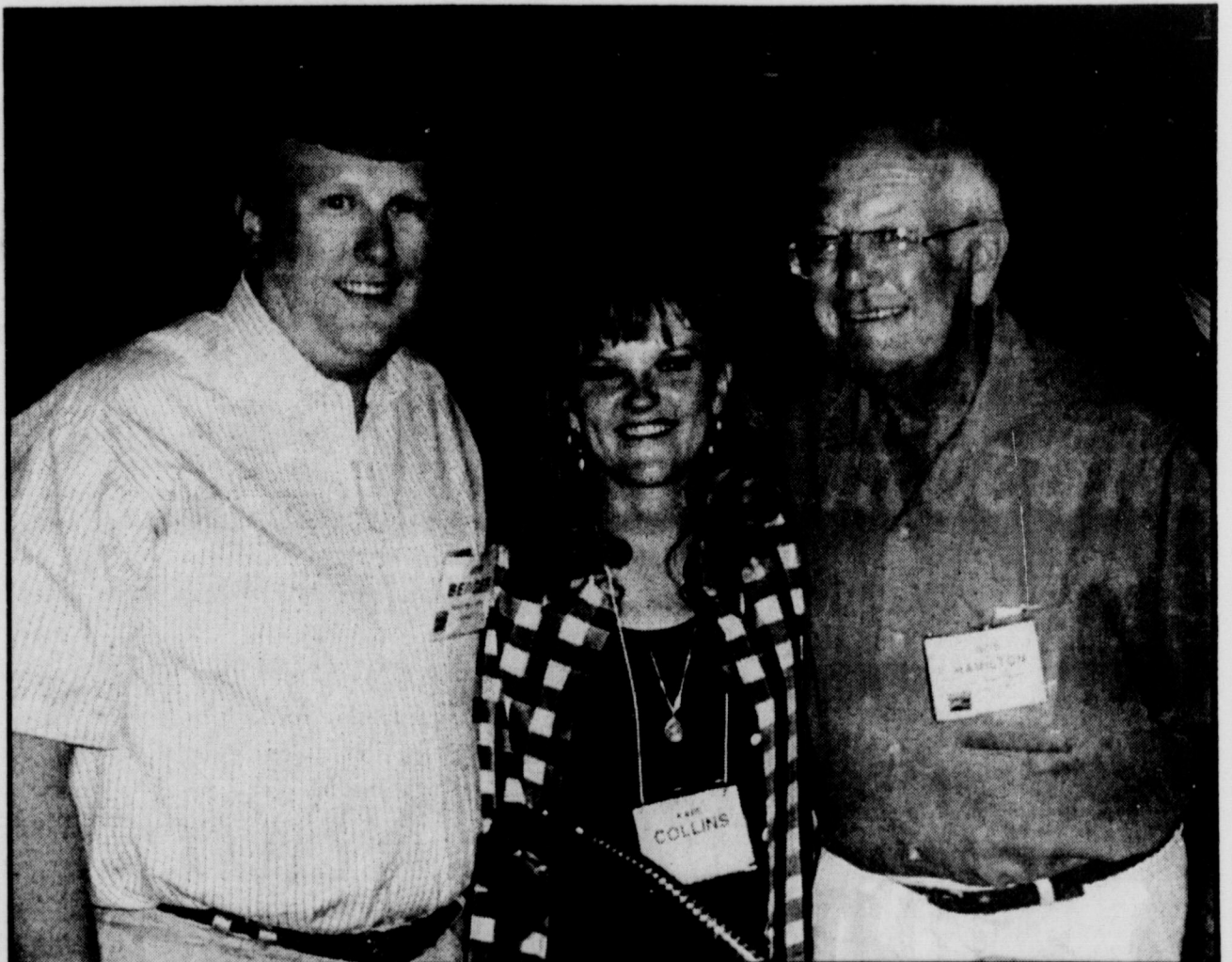
The ban on burning will continue in Wichita County.

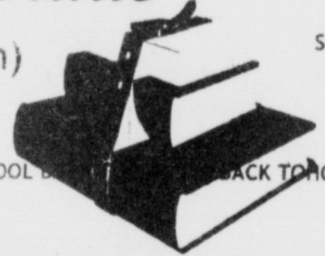

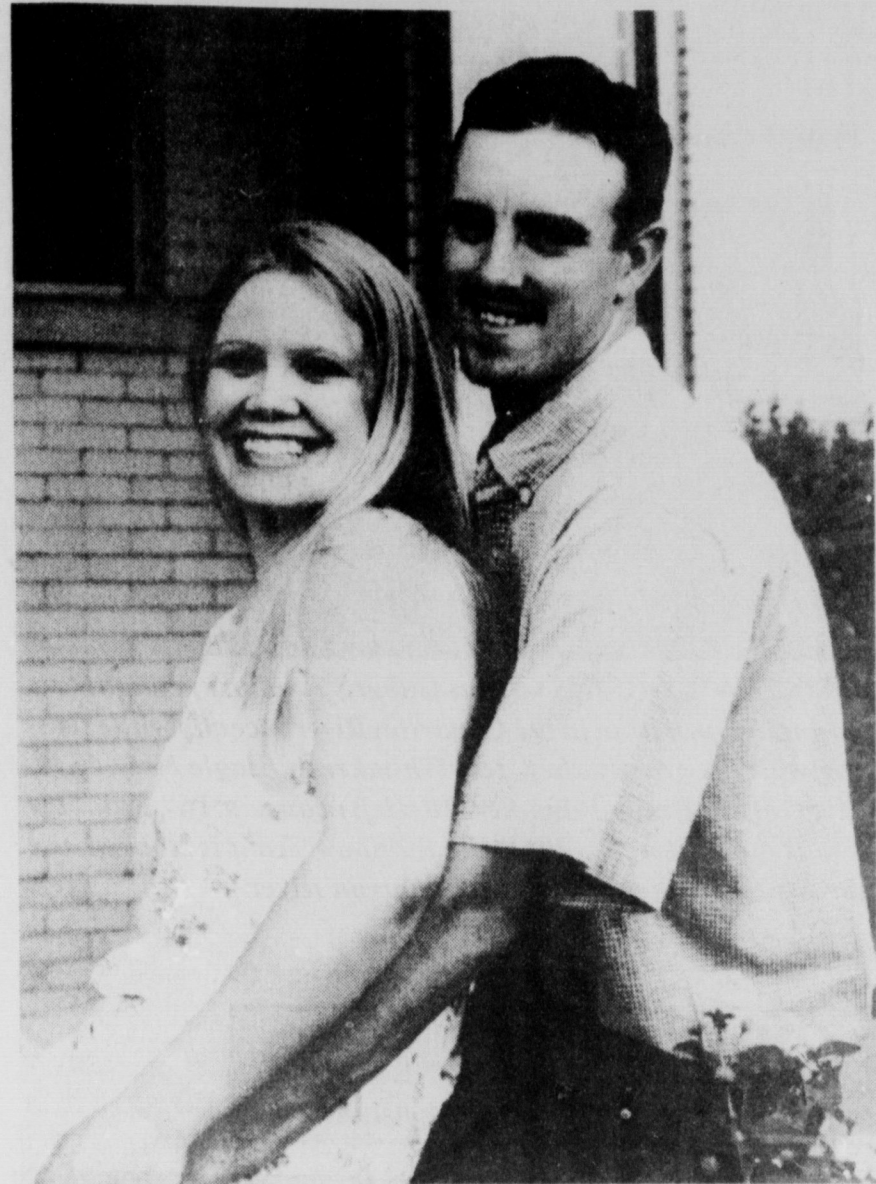

School and is attending Midwestern State University.

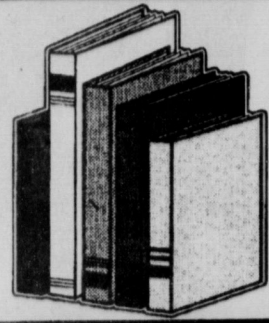

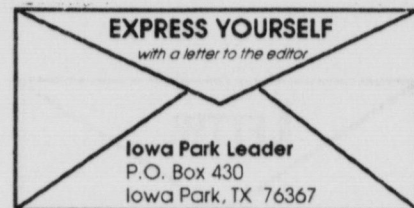

August 8: 9-11:30 - rehearsal

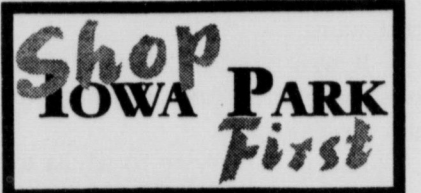

Cook of the WEEK



Carolyn Richter

Carolyn Richter has been a teacher at W. F. George Middle School since 1974. She has been the librarian for all of those years, and has taught a class in Texas History for the last 20 years.

In addition, Carolyn has been the cheerleader sponsor for 23 years, and is about to assume sponsorship of the middle school student council. For the last few years, she has kept the middle school library open during the summer months, from 7-9 p.m. on Tuesdays, so the students have a chance to keep up with their reading.

Carolyn moved to Iowa Park from Holliday in 1965, when she was in the eighth grade. She graduated Iowa Park High School in 1970, and then earned her BS degree in Education at Midwestern State University. She received her masters degree in Library Science from Texas Woman's University.

Carolyn has a daughter, Whitney, a senior at MSU, and a son, Will, who will enter MSU as a freshman this fall. The family pet is a pot-bellied pig named Bubba.

They are members of First United Methodist Church where Carolyn teaches a Sunday school class, sings in the choir, and plays hand bells. Like last week's featured cook, Carolyn is in the Sunday school class that prepares meals at the church on Wednesday nights for anyone who wants to come.

Carolyn likes to walk for exercise, and does all her own yard work. She enjoys reading, and reads most of the books before they are placed on shelves of the school library. This summer she has read 50 books written for young adults. For pleasure, she likes to read historical fiction and biographies.

As most busy mothers, Carolyn has a wealth of recipes that are easy and quick to prepare. Many of her recipes require little or no cooking, and a family favorite, "One-Step Lasagne," is cooked in a microwave oven. "Olive Garden Soup" is a dish she often prepares for the Wednesday night church suppers, and the "Milky Way Ice Cream" is a recipe given to her by Penny Nowell, wife of a former Iowa Park school superintendent.

Carolyn said that "Peanut Butter Cake" is her son's favorite, and she baked it this year for his birthday.

One-Step Lasagne

1 pkg. (8 oz.) lasagne noodles
1 lb. ground beef
1 jar (32 oz.) spaghetti sauce
1/2 cup water
2 cups ricotta or small curd cottage cheese
3 cups shredded mozzarella cheese
1/2 cup grated parmesan cheese

Brown ground beef. Add spaghetti sauce and water. In a 13x9 inch glass baking dish, layer 1/3 of the sauce, 1/2 of the uncooked lasagne, 1 cup cottage cheese and 1/3 of the mozzarella. Repeat layers, ending with sauce. Sprinkle with parmesan cheese. Cover with waxed paper or plastic wrap and microwave on high for 25-35 minutes in 10 minute intervals, turning pan at each interval. Let stand 5 minutes before serving. Freezes well.

Peanut Butter Cake

2 cups flour
2 cups sugar
1 tsp. baking soda
1 cup water
1 tsp. shortening
1 1/2 sticks oleo
1/2 cup peanut butter
1/2 cup buttermilk
2 eggs
1 tsp. vanilla

Combine dry ingredients, set aside. Bring to a boil, water, shortening, oleo, and peanut butter. Pour over dry ingredients; mix well; add buttermilk, eggs, vanilla and mix. Pour into a greased sheet cake pan (15x10x2). Bake 20 minutes at 350 degrees.

Icing for Peanut Butter Cake

1/2 cup peanut butter
1/3 cup milk
1 stick oleo
1 tsp. vanilla

Bring to a boil; add 1 box (4 cups) powdered sugar. Frost cake while the icing is still warm.

Ravioli

Meat Sauce:
1 lb. seasoned, browned ground meat
1 chopped onion, cooked with the meat

1 - 28 oz. spaghetti sauce
1 - 8 oz. can tomato sauce
Ravioli: Cook 1 bag Rosetto Ravioli according to package directions; drain well.

Assemble: Spray a large glass pan with cooking spray.

1st layer: meat sauce
2nd layer: ravioli
3rd layer: meat sauce
4th layer: ravioli
5th layer: remaining meat sauce
6th layer: 1 - 8 oz. bag grated mozzarella cheese (2 cups)

Cook in microwave until warm throughout and cheese is melted, or bake at 350 degrees until hot and bubbly. Freezes well.

Chocolate Eclair Cake

2 pkgs. (small) vanilla instant pudding
3 cups milk
1 cup powdered sugar
1 - 8 oz. ctn. Cool Whip
1 tsp. vanilla
1 box graham crackers
1 can chocolate icing

Mix pudding, milk, sugar, and vanilla until dissolved. Fold in Cool Whip. In 9x13 pan (oil bottom lightly) place a layer of graham crackers, then 1/2 of the pudding mixture, another layer of graham crackers, then the rest of the pudding mixture. Top with crackers and the chocolate icing. (Put the icing on the crackers before you put them on the pudding layer.) Refrigerate a few hours before serving.

Peanut Butter Cup Cake

Melt: 2 sticks oleo
Add:
1 box (4 cups) powdered sugar
1 1/2 cups peanut butter
1 cup graham cracker crumbs

Spread on a greased 15x11 pan. Melt 12 ounces of chocolate chips (1 use half milk chocolate and half semi-sweet) and spread over first mixture. Refrigerate until set. Cut into squares.

WHAT DOES GOD SAY?

By Ross Saunders

About the love of God? "He hath loveth not knoweth not God; for God is love" (1 John 4:8). Although God is love, He does not love everything. In fact, there are some things God hates. "Through thy precepts I get understanding; therefore I hate every false way" (Psalm 119:104). "These six things doth the LORD hate: yea, seven are an abomination unto him: A proud look, a lying tongue, and hands that shed innocent blood, An heart that deviseth wicked imaginations, feet that be swift in running to mischief, A false witness that speaketh lies, and he that soweth discord among brethren" (Proverbs 6:16-19). It was the evil imaginations of man's heart that prompted God to destroy man from the earth, with the exception of Noah and his family.

God hates "every false way" and inspires all of us to love the truth but He does not force His truth upon any of us. "And with all deceivableness of unrighteousness in them that perish; because they received not the love of the truth, that they might be saved. And for this cause God shall send them strong delusion, that they should believe a lie: That they all might be damned who believed not the truth, but had pleasure in unrighteousness in them that perish; because they received not the love of the truth, that they might be saved. And for this cause God shall send them strong delusion, that they should believe a lie: That they all might be damned who believed not the truth, but had pleasure in unrighteousness" (2 Thessalonians 2:10-12). It is extremely difficult to harmonize this love of truth with the modern concept that "it makes no difference what one believes." It is equal to saying, "It makes no difference what God hates and what He loves." God's truth alone makes one free from sin and it must be known (John 8:32).

The other "abominations" of Proverbs 6, mainly relate to our behavior and responsibilities to one another. We could never harm or destroy one another with God's truth, but we can hurt others by lying, misrepresentation, gossip and physical abuse. Marriage, family and social relationships are often destroyed by these. And even more sad is the effect these abominations have upon the spiritual relationships in churches. The absence of God's truth and the presence of "self" is the formula for disaster in any relationship.

We would do well to look to the Son of God to learn to stand firm for what is right, to uphold truth without compromise, to be compassionate toward others, concerned and caring without the self-centeredness that seems to have invaded our lives. "Let nothing be done through strife or vainglory; but in lowliness of mind let each esteem other better than themselves" (Philippians 2:3), is a truth of God that seems most difficult to employ in our lives. We should remember that all these things work in both directions and what we throw at others will ultimately come home to us.

"Love worketh no ill to his neighbour: therefore love is the fulfilling of the law" (Romans 13:10).

Know your local fireman

Bobby Williams Watson joined the Iowa Park Fire Department July 14, 1999.

He says he joined the fire department because he wanted to be a part of the team he had watched save homes and lives while riding with his mother, Sherrie Williams, to scenes to take pictures for the *Iowa Park Leader*.

He added that because he was such a "pain" as a teenager, when he moved out on his own he wanted to do something good. He says he felt besides helping people of the community by joining the fire department he would make his dad, Floyd Williams, proud.

Bobby says when he joined he never thought he would love it as much as he does. He says the thrill and satisfaction he gets each time he goes out and helps save a life or property is like nothing he has every experienced.

Besides feeling good about helping the community the camaraderie at the fire department is special to him. He says it's something he was never a part of during his school years.

He added most of the firemen refer to Francis Skinner, wife of Fire Chief Danny Skinner, as "Ma" and that Archie Layfield and his wife, Lennie, have become like a second set of parents to him.

Bobby says he had gone on many types of calls the last year and had been with the fire department one week short of a year when he went on his first call where the patient might be deceased. He says he felt helpless at the scene.

Just two weeks later he went on his second call of possible deceased patient. Again, Bobby said he felt helpless and more determined to someday become an EMT.

He explained he wants to be able to help the EMTs more and understand what they are doing and why.

Williams is employed at Cerbay and works rotating 12 hour shifts six weekdays and six weeknights, which prevents him from being able to attend EMT classes but he hopes to someday be able to.

Bobby explained when the firemen are toned to a call their goal is to get to the scene as quickly as possible without putting anyone in danger.

He says they come from all areas of town and each one has some sort of emergency lights on their vehicle alerting people they are responding to an emergency, but not everyone yields to them.

Just four months after joining the fire department, Bobby had a wreck responding to the station. He says the accident was a learning experience and he now watches other vehicles more closely when responding to a call.

Volunteer firemen are not allowed to exceed the speed limit by more than five miles an hour when responding to the station.

He recalled the first structure fire he went on was a mutual aid call for Burk Burnett. He said he rolled out of bed, jumped into his truck and off to the fire station. There he pulled on his bunker gear (fire protective suit)

before loading onto the truck.

After the fire was extinguished one of the veteran firemen told him he needed to take off his bunker gear. Bobby told the fireman he couldn't because he was not fully dressed under his gear. Now he always has pants near his bed.

He says when the firemen finish fighting a fire they are always soaked with sweat, not water. The gear keeps the water off them.

He says he prefers going inside the structure during a structure fire. "I can't explain why," Bobby said, "it's just where I feel I can do the most good."

Bobby says he would like to be a fireman full time. But, only as a volunteer. He says if he got paid to fight the fires and answer EMT calls he doesn't feel he would get the same satisfaction as he does when he is volunteering his time.

When all the dust had cleared, Weatherford was crowned as the Sectional Champion with a win over Abilene on Tuesday night.

Iowa Park opened play against Weatherford on Wednesday night, falling to the eventual champs 6-1. Leading hitters for Iowa Park included Swenson and Patterson, who both finished 1x3.

"Defensively we played excellent," said head coach Dennis Neal. "We had been off for a week and a half and our bats were just not there. Weatherford had a good team and a good pitcher. They pulled him after four innings and then changed every inning after that, and every pitcher they sent to the mound just kept throwing faster and faster."

Players must be at least four years of age by Aug. 1, to be eligible to play.

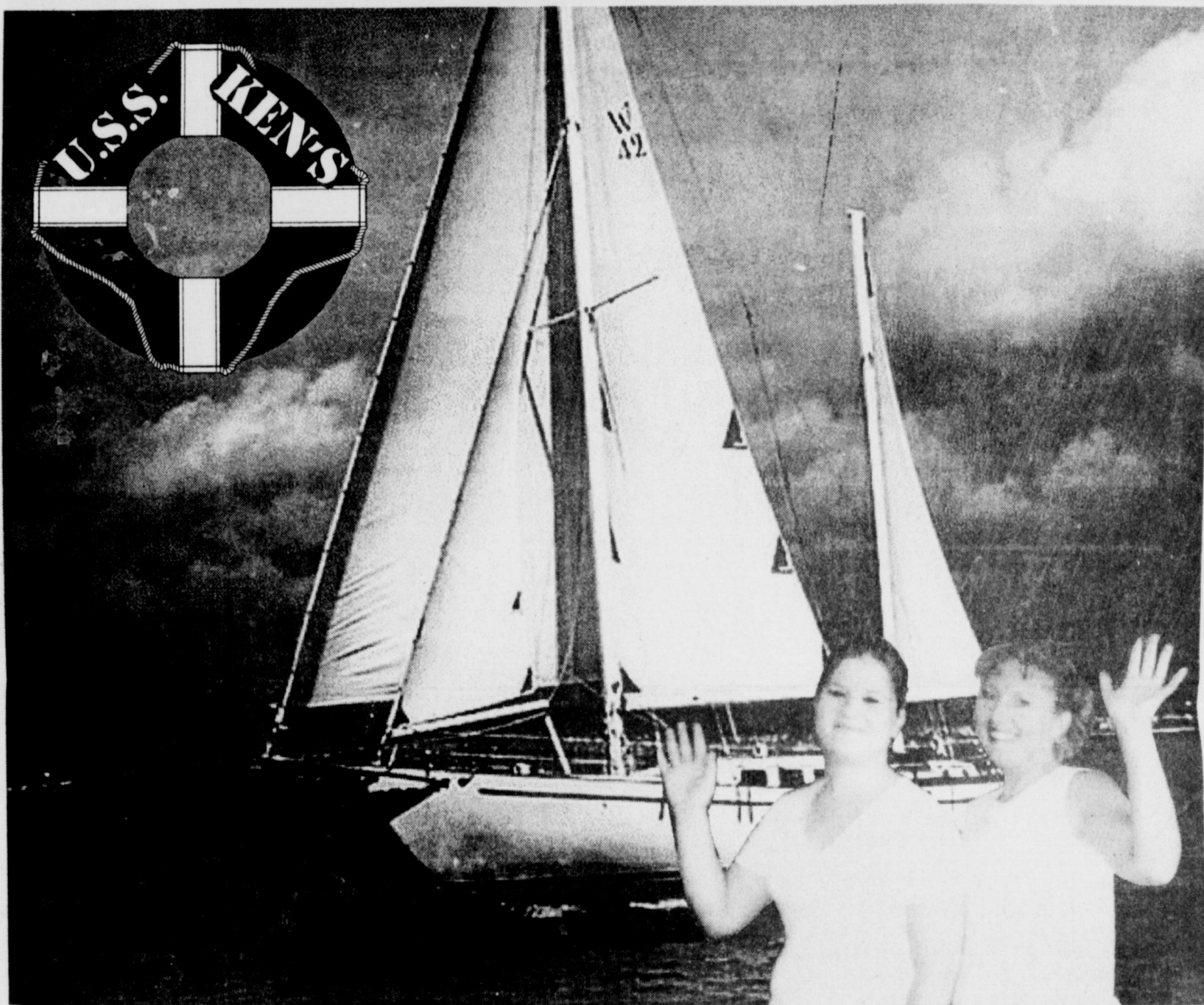
