## Trustees hear parents' concerns

e school board during a meeting last Thursday night to voice concern ver the policy for calculating grade ranking.
The current policy, which has been in place for the last two years uses only grades from common core classes such as English, science, math and social studies to determine grade point averages (GPA) and class ranking. Advanced Placement or honors classes, such as calculus, are not used in the calculation. Deanne Schram, whose son has been in the Gifted/Talented program since elementary school and is conhas taken many accelerated courses to be prepared for college. She said only recendy did it come to her attenion that the policy had changed, and these classes wouldn't be included in his GPA. Mrs. Schram said math and science students will be penalized for laking advanced courses, and it is possible to have a valedictorian who ook no honors classes.
Diana Collins, a high school science teacher, said her son, who has graduated, took AP classes, in
which he made A's and B's, with no reward because they weren't included in his GPA. She said she has honor
