The report shows that the tax office collected \$36.246 from the two per cent use tax, thus sales of new and used cars totaled \$1,812,300.

Titles on 1,547 vehicles were issued by the tax office which also licensed 5.873. The lichnse plates cost the car owners \$149,

# HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE PAST TO THE PRESENT

Highlights from the Past to the Present has been rather scarce in the past couple months. But this we we again take up with the story and visit in the home of Mr. and Mrs. J.A. (June) Balentine, one of the early families who strived through the good and lean years to rear their six children and to become one of the well-known Hansford--County Pioneer families.

We will begin this week looking into the past life of Mr. June Balentine as we find he was born May 28, 1871, in Nash County, North Carolina. In 1882 he accompanied his family to Texas where they settled in Grayson County where June Balentine grew to manhood. On December 24th, 1895, June Balentine and Ola Lawson were married in Red River County, Texas.

Ola Lawson was born in Red River County, Texas in July of 1875. Her grandparents were early residents of Texas and moved to Red River County in about 1832.Mr. Lawson, Ola's father, was born in the Republic of Tex-

Mr. and Mrs. June Balentine made their home in Red River County where they farmed several small places with with negro share croppers. Mr. Balentine bought his cattle along the Red River and in the Indian Territory; then shipped them to Fort Worth. Two children, Una and Robert A. (Bob), were born while the couple lived in East Texas. The hot weather of East Texas did not appeal to Mr. Balentine so he began searching for new and a bet-

ter section of Texas. In 1899 Mr. Balentine came to the Panhandle of Texas and pur chased two sections of land from J.E. Southwood. The land was located some seven miles north-east of the town of Panhandle at the head of the East Dixon Creek. Returning home to East Texas he told his famioy of his purchase and they began to prepare for the move. Mr. Bal. entine came ahead in the covered wagon and brought all of the family's belongings. Mr. Balentine was accompanied by Dip Conley who just recently passed away in Du-

Mr. Balentine built a dugout to accomodate the living facilities for the family. The dugout was built on the--creek. He soon purchased some cows from Mr. Bates who lived on the North Fork of the Red River near the present town of Lefors.

Mrs. Balentine with Una and Bob came to Claude, Texas by train and then on to Panhandle and to their new livquarters by wagon. The family remained on their land in the area of Lanhandle for some two years before Mr. Balentine had the opportunity to sell to Mr. Gillispie and to move further north.

Finding land he liked in Hansford and Hutchinson areas, Mr. Balentine purchased a relinquishment from Alex Martin on the south fork of the Palo Duro Creek. Here he dug a dugout for their home in the hillside and hand duga well to supply the family water. Their remaining four children were born in Hansford County on their ranch and were, John A. (Ab), Myrtle, J.P. (Put), and J.M. (Mike).

Mr. Balentine began work at once to build stables and corrals from the cotten wood lumbered purchased and hauled from the saw mill on Moores Creek. The supplies and needs for the family were purchased at Guymon and Texhoma and freighted to their home by wagon.

One of Mr. Balentine's specialities was his Hereford Bulls and he was one of the first to have Hereford Bulls in Hansford County. He took pride in his stock and saw that they were the best of their kind. Mr. Balentine was also one of the first to feed cotton seed cake to his cattle. He first fed the cake to his stock in 1903.

Trying to practice practical and economical methods, Mr. Balentine would raise enough hay and feed to supply the feed for his stock through out the long winter months

which lay ahead Another of Mr. Balentine's economical practices was that he would never invest more than what he had the money to pay for when buying livestock or supplies. He also did a majority of the work himself with the help of

As the railroad land came on the market, Mr. Balentine purchased another section of land just south of the Tyler Headquarters. The family suffered through an epidemic of measles in the early 1900's. Mrs. Balentine was the only member of the family who escaped having them. Mr. Balentine became quite ill and doubts rose at one time as to whether he would recover, though he did. Another incident recalled by the family was the big prarie fire of about 1908 which solled through the area, the Balentine property was left without much damage.

In 1909 Mr. Balentine built a house two miles down the creek where there were trees and water along the creek. He purchased the lumber for their home at Tex-

homa and freighted it to the homesite. A great set-back faced the farmers and ranchers of the area when the bad winter of 1911 and 1912 was so distructive. Mr. Balentine, as did many of the other--ranchers, lost a large portion of his livestock in this

winter blast. Increasing his land ownings and ranching empire Mr. Balentine purchased another section from Jim Cator in 19 15 and two other 1/2 sections were added in 1916 and 1924. One of the places he purchased was the Boss Davis place.

In 1929 Mr. and Mrs. Balentine sold all their land except their home place but by 1930 they had it all back except the Davis place. The land sale was a way to get a

large part of the grass land plowed into far m land. A ranch in Hartley County was purchased by Mr. Balentine in 1928, but the depression and drouth of the 1930 's hit holding things at an almost standstill for the family. I n 1935 Mr. Balentine suffered a stroke. He sold his ranch in Hartley County in 1940 and shortly after thathe suffered two more strokes before he passed away in August of 1944. His wife's death followed his in January

The daughter, Una married George Willburn in 1915. She and her husband had five children and made theirhome in San Pedro, California. In 1948 she passed a-



Making his home in Amarillo is John A. (Ab) Balentine who has worked on ranches during his younger----years. He has served as Deputy Sherriff and is presently Brand and Animal Health Inspector in Amarillo.

The youngest child, J.M. (Mike) Balentine makes his home on the home place east of Morse where he is en-

gaged in livestock and farming. Ha has two children. Pioneers such as the Balentine family have truly made our area and county the fine place it is today. Mr. Balentine was never interested in being a public figure, he enjoyed working and managing his farm and ranch. One of his pride and joys was to have good cattle. He developed some of the best herds of cattle in the early days of the county. Again we say how fortunate we are to have have families such as these to be the fore-fathers of Hansford County.





AUSTIN---With the help of powerful new drugs, to-day's physician can treat patients whose conditions would have been hopeless a few short years ago. Yet, because drugs also can cause harm, their potential dangers have received increasing attention in the press as well as from regulatory bodies and even Congress.

Such publicity 'has given rise to an alarm which at times borders on hysteria,' writes Dr. Arthur Grollman, Dallas, in an editorial on drug toxicity in the January issue of TEXAS MEDICINE, published by the Texas Medical Association.

All human advances bring with them the possibility of danger; for example, the automobile, despite its multiple benefits, causes an enormous number of deaths. In considering the potential

For many years the carp was considered absolutely to find a supply of catchable worthless. It was rated as a carp. They are literally everypest that contaminated our where. All of our man-made waters and did no good whatlakes carry an astronomical population. So do our streams.

Then an angler caught one of these bronze-colored scrappers on sport tackle. That incident shed new light on the carp's personality. Anti-carp sentiment began to waver slightly. Maybe, just maybe, this carp wasn't as bad as most people led us to believe.

When it comes to public relations, the carp is about the sorriest fish that swims. It has carried this stigma of being a pest for so long that it doesn't know how to act in its newest role, that of a sport fish. But many people don't cuss the carp anymore. They're too busy having a ball catching it. Five years ago it was rare

to see anyone fishing for carp; today carp fishermen are fairly commonplace on all our Texas lakes. There is good reason for this upsurge in popularity. A piscatorial survey in the Highland Lakes of Central Texas a few years back revealed, for instance, that the balance of fish population was something like 70 per cent rough fish and 30 per cent game fish.

This means, quite simply, that your odds of catching a rough fish are much better than a game fish.

Which brings us back to a much-debated question. Just what is a game fish? One that will hit an artificial bait? If Ask about buying Bonds the carp can't be classified as a game fish. But on the business end of a fishing line, this stubborn battler does itself proud. It is a strong, grudging scrapper that doesn't know what the word "quit" means.

But just because they are plentiful doesn't mean they contrary. Carp, and its kissin' cousin the buffalo, can be just as ornery as a bass at times. The man who succeeds day in and day out, of course, is the person who knows his ABC's of carp-fishing technique.

fished on a tiny treble hook (about the No. 10 size) since the carp has a small, round mouth. Simply mold the bait around the hook, throw it out and sit back to wait. Carp fishing isn't a fast sport. The person who succeeds at it is long on patience.

A carp roots along the bottom, sucking up food with its round mouth. It will pick up a bait which is lying still on bottom but will ignore one that is moving at all.


A carp telegraphs its bite in a series of light taps. The secret is having a delicate feel, letting the carp get the bait fully inside its mouth before driving the steel home.

Any kind of tackle is suitable for carp fishing. A medium-sized spinning outfit seems to be the universal favorite. Contrary to popular belief,

carp aren't too bad on the dinner table. Secret is knowing how to prepare them. Best method we've found is to chunk the fish and cook in a, pressure cooker until the

meat falls away from the bones. After removing the bones, mold the meat into patties and fry, just as you would fry salmon croquets. When they're a rich, golden





# MENTAL RETARDATION PREVENTABLE IF DETECTED EARLY

phenylketonuria, is one cause of mental retardation in children that can be easily detected, tretted, and prevented by treatment which consists of a relatively simplet special diet.

Fhenylketonuria, or PKU as it is more commonly called, is a metabolic disease which occurs only once out of each 10,000 births. It is rare but, because it could lead to some mental retardation early treatment is essential and, therefore, early detection is necessary.

In more technical terminology, PMU is the result of an inborn error of metabolism. The absence of the enzyme phenylalanine hydrozylase in the liver permits an abnormally high level of the amino acid, phenylalanine, to accumulate in the serum. This probably results in failure of development of the brain. If the abnormalty is not detected early by the first month of life or soon thereafter---subsequent treatment will not prevent some mental re-

tardation. The treatment of PKU con consists of administration of a diet low in phenylalanine, since the affected individual lacks the enzyme which normally permits utilization of this amino

PKU is easily detecable with simple tests. Three tests are now being used and two of these tests can even be performed by a parent in the home. Many Texas physicians are now routinely testing newborn babies for PKU in hospitals and their offices, and more are doing these tests each year.

In 1963, the Texas Medical Association, in cooperation with the Texas Association for Retarded Children and the Texas Hospital Association, began promoting a "do-ityourself" test kit for PKU in certain hospitals. The TMA kit, which was given to each mother when she and her newborn baby left the hospital, included an addressed postal card on which the mother marks and reports the results of a simple urine test, a three by five card containing instructions for administering the test, and a folder explaining PKU. The test is performed by pressing the end of a test strip to one of the infant's freshly wet diapers. Any color change of the test strip is then noted on the return postal card and mailed back to the hospital. A second type of test

being used also requires a diaper wet with urine. In this test, a drop of 19 per cent ferric chloride is placed on the wet diaper and any resulting color change ss noted.

The third type of PKU detection test, known as the Guthrie inhibition assay test, requires a drop of blood taken after the baby has been fed for several days. The State Department of Health is performing the Guthrie test and has encouraged hospitals throughout the sate to set up their own detection programs.

It is estimated that the early detection and treatment of PKU would eliminate one to two percent of the future residents of institutions for the mentally retarded. The results of early detection and treatment is dramatically shown by the case of two brothers with PKU. One child, not diagnosed until he was three, now has an 81 of 40 and is confined to an institution; the other, diagnosed at two weeks, was placed on a special diet and now,

> TMA, the State Department of Health, and TARC are engaged in a constant educational program concerning PKU, both to physicians and the public. The ultimate goal is to have all newborn children tested at the proper times so that this rare but tragic disease will be a thing of the past.
