THE COUNTY **DIVISION OUESTION**

SMALL COUNTIES CAN BE MORE ECO-NOMICALLY ADMINISTERED THAN LARGER ONES.

"In the past few years the Territorial Legislature has created thirteen new counties. Only a few years ago the people living in the western part of Rio Arriba county requested the Legislature to cut off a portion of the county and create a new one. San Juan county is the result. Since then the residents of what are now Me-Kinley, Union, Eddy, Chaves, Sierra, Guadaloupe, Otero, Quay, Roosevelt, Luna, Sandoval, and Torrance counties have petitioned and created the above named counties. In each instance the people of the mother county have protested, deluged the Legislature with petitions and spent large sums of money to prevent the diinstance they In each vision. have declared that the creation of the new county meant bankruptcy for both the old and the new but in every case the reverse has

"Every one who is conversant with the recent history Mexico is aware of the fact that the smaller counties are more mically administered than the larger ones, and that the new counties with a small area are in a better financial condition than the larger ones."

The above is the opinion and statements of Hon. J. S. Dunesn. Councilman-elect from San Miguel county and president of the Territorial Board of Equilization.

San Miguel county as it now is contains but 4500 square miles with a bonded indebtedness of \$486,500. Artesia county would have an area of 4,000 square miles with a total indebtedness of \$8,-758.

There is a growing sentiment in favor of smaller counties which the coming legislature will no doubt recognize and add at least counties to those already existing.
