Clippings From An Ancient Library

A BOOK FROM A BROKEN HOME

By Rev. E. B. Thompson

The second of the eighth century prophets was Hosea, who lived a few years after Amos. He too was a protestant spirit and cried out against the same sins that had engaged Amos' attention. However life was far from kind to Hosea, and tragedy soon came to his home. His loved wife Gomer, deserted him, and went into a life of sin. Out of the struggle with himself which followed this incident, he changed his whole outlook, disposition and message

As was true of all early prophets, Hosea related every experience to God in some way. His first sermons were hard and caustic. To illustrate what he wanted to teach, hard and caustic. To illustrate what he wanted to teach, he named his children names that pronounced God's anger against the sinful people! His first son was named Jezrell—which meant "Gotl sows". Hosea said he was trying to show how God was sowing destruction for the rebel people! The second child, a baby girl, he called Loruhamah—"Without pity", and said God would be without pity in His judgement of sin! The third baby, another son, was named Loammi—"Not my people." and the prophet reached the bottom of despair, shouting that God no longer claimed or cared for Israel! or cared for Israel!

It was at this point in his career that his own tragedy came. With it came the great change in his message. For, lo, he found that he did not hate Gomer for her sin, but loved her still! Thus he came to see that God might even forgive Israel. He bought his fallen wife, and reestablished his home. In those days we hear the same prophet who was once stern and angry saying for his God. "I will betroth you to me forever... In loving kindness."

And so it was, that the first sermon on forgiveness was recorded and sent on its long flight across the years. We have it today in the example and prayer of Jesus, as bright as the splendor of a noon-day sun. But it began long ago and far away, in the soul of a heart-broken prophet who wrote—a book from a broken home.
